Adel City Council August 25, 2025 - Meeting Minutes

The Adel City Council met in regular session at Adel City Hall, 301 S. 10th Street, Adel, Iowa on Monday, August 25, 2025. At 6:00 p.m., Mayor Peters called the meeting to order. The following answered roll: McAdon, West, and Selby.

Staff Present: Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist, City Clerk Erickson, Public Works Director Overton, Police Chief Book, Library Director Jayne, Parks & Recreation Director Schenck, and Community Development Director Nichols.

CONSENT AGENDA

The Council asked each candidate to come to the podium and present why they were wanting to hold the office of City Council Member. The Council then proceeded with asking each candidate a series of questions.

William Oldes, 29456 Old Portland Rd., presented to the Council how he does a lot of volunteering and that was what interested him in the position of the City Council vacancy. Oldes is a foster parent and has adopted. He finds it important to teach kids to do what you can to make the world a better place little by little. By joining the City Council that would be his way of trying to make his corner of the world a better place. Council Member West asked if it would be Oldes intention to run for the open seats in the fall. Oldes responded that he is not planning one way or the other, but if he is helping people he will. West asked what Oldes sees as the main priorities for the City. Oldes responded that the biggest thing is this is a community where kids play outside together. There is a lot of potential growth and we want to make sure we don't lose what people move here for. Council Member McAdon asked Oldes what he considers to be the primary responsibilities of a city council member. Oldes resonded that he sees the first responsibility to be a filter for the community and second to be a responsible steward of the village.

Eric Trout, 1415 Rapids St, shared that he has been attending council meetings for awhile. He and his family moved here seven years ago and live in the older part of town. Before moving to Rapids Street they lived on the square and experienced the melting pot of Adel. Trout has four kids in the ADM school district and he spends a lot of time in the community as a pastor at a church in town, selling ice cream at Billy's and coaching baseball. Council Member West asked what Trout sees as the main priorities for the City. Trout responded that first the city needs more communication and collaboration, second public safety is a huge deal, and third field upgrades for parks and rec. Council Member Selby asked if Trout is planning on running for council this fall. Trout responded that he is. Council Member McAdon asked how Trout thinks his background has prepared him for becoming a council person. Trout responded that he has led volunteers and teams to work together for community events. He has also done a lot of training for strategic planning and goal setting where he finds it important to not just set goals for goal sake, but making sure they get done.

Nate Hawkins, 1106 Luther Dr, shared that grew up in Adel and loves Adel. Hawkins took advantage of the tax abatement when he and his family moved back from another town close by so he has seen both sides growing up in Adel and being part of the growth. Hawkins loves this town and he is trying to find ways to give back. He is the president of the ADM Alumni Association Board and he knows he has more capacity to give back. Council Member West asked what Hawkins sees as the main priorities for the City. Hawkins shared that first is the need for more ball fields, with the 40 acres by the water tower earmarked for parks and rec he would like to navigate the ways that we can move forward with that to attract tournaments to bring revenue, jobs, and hotels to the town. Second priority is commercial and manufacturing growth as it would be a positive economic impact for the city. There are ways to go about that like TIF out by Southbridge to help attract businesses.

Council Member Selby asked if Hawkins is planning on running for council this fall. Hawkins responded that yes, he has the forms printed off and needs to get the required signatures. Council Member McAdon asked how Hawkins thinks his background has prepared him for becoming a council person. Hawkins responded that being on the alumni board has taught him a lot about how boards function. Mayor Peters has taught him a lot about the importance of staying on task during meetings. Hawkins also volunteers around town and listens to residents as to what their concerns are.

John Sparling, 2909 Greene St, said that he saw there was a need and felt it is his time to jump back in. Sparling had his name on the ballot for mayor a few years ago, worked in Adel seventeen years for the police department and then went to De Soto as Chief of Police. Sparling commented that he's seen two different types of government and now that he's retired he can give back more. Sparling commented that he loves this town. Council Member West asked what Sparling sees as the main priorities for the City. Sparling responded that the first priority is bringing in more businesses. Second, Sparling sees a need to get the traffic issues in town under control and that the current traffic is atrocious. Third, Sparling will always have a focus on public safety. Council Member Selby asked if Sparling is planning on running for council this fall. Sparling nodded his head. Council Member McAdon asked how Sparling thinks his background in law enforcement has prepared him for becoming a council person. Sparling responded that he is ornery enough to argue, but he also listens. He believes it is important for the Council to be good stewards of the money and for the citizens in town.

Council Member West thanked the candidates for stepping up and applying to serve the community as a Council Member. There will be two seats opening up in fall and whatever the appointment is at this meeting, the Council encouraged all candidates to run.

2.b. Consider Approval of Resolution No. 25-61, To Fill Council Vacancy By Appointment Council Member West started the conversation about the applicants by mentioned that Eric Trout has been attending council meetings for 4-5 months, has been very engaged and openly declared that he will be running for one of the open seats that is up in the fall. By appointing Trout that will allow him to get his feet wet on Council if he would be elected in the fall. Council Member McAdon mentioned that the Council has been working on some complicated issues and it gives Trout a leg up as he has heard those discussions by attending meetings. McAdon also mentioned that there are four really good candidates, but the interest shown by Trout is valued. Council Member Selby agreed that it is very beneficial that Trout has been at meetings to listen to the discussions.

Council Member Selby brought up Nate Hawkins as another mentionable candidate. Hawkins brought some good information to his interview and he has some nice ideas on how to bring growth and revenue to the city. Hawkins grew up in Adel and knows Adel. He is the president of the ADM Alumni Association Board. There would be more of a learning curve, though. Council Member West seconded Selby's comments and said that it is positive to have some focus on commercial

development and he appreciates that Hawkins understands the history of Adel and as the city grows we need to pull our history along with us.

Motion by West, seconded by Selby, to appoint Eric Trout to fill council vacancy and approve Resolution No. 25-61.

Motion by Selby, seconded by West, to amend the main motion and to appoint Nate Hawkins to fill council vacancy and approve Resolution No. 25-61.

Roll: Nays - Unanimous. Motion to amend failed.

Roll on main motion to appoint Eric Trout to fill council vacancy and approve Resolution No. 25-61: Ayes - Unanimous. Motion Carried.

2.c. Oath of Office for Newly Appointed Council Member - Administered by Mayor James F. Peters Eric Trout took the Oath of Office for City Council Member, Administered by Mayor James. F. Peters.

Police Chief Book spoke to the Council that the invoice was related to moving costs for the proposed full-time police officer when he moved from Maine to Audubon, Iowa. As this certified officer would be leaving Audubon Police Department to start a full-time position with the Adel Police Department, this is the cost that would need to be paid to relieve him of his contractual duties with Audubon. The cost to put an uncertified officer through the police academy is roughly \$10,000. Motion by Selby, seconded by West, to approve paying the City of Audubon, Iowa, \$4,108.56 for contract costs.

2.f. Discussion / Possible Action on Moving All Regular City Council Meetings to the Library Community Room Starting January 1, 2026

City Clerk Erickson shared the concerns that have been rising over space needs for Council meetings as well as the desire to upgrade the audio/visual technology for public meetings. Erickson suggested the option of moving the regular City Council meetings to the Library Community Room as there is already some audio/visual setup there as well as more space. Council Member McAdon responded that microphones for each seat would be a good idea and recognized that having a presentation with any kind of audio/visual is tough in the current council chambers. McAdon was not sure about how video streaming would work, but live audio would be great. Council Member West said that he would like to see the cost options for both outfitting the current council chambers with the needed audio/visual technology as well as upgrading the technology in the Library Community Room. West asked what staff thought the current chambers could be used for if Council meetings were moved to the Library Community Room. Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist said that it creates an opportunity for more office space or a conference room. Sandquist also mentioned that the Library is a better location for the public to attend meetings as far as handicap accessibility and better restrooms. Library Director Jayne mentioned that there is the issue of storage in the Library and staff would need to figure out where to store council chairs. Council Member Trout mentioned that it is important to also consider who

would be in charge of audio/visual control during a meeting. West asked staff to determine the capacity of each room including square footage.



A noise permit shall not be transferable, and it shall be conspicuously displayed on or adjacent to the sound equipment.

- Application for Permit. Applications for noise permits shall be made in writing to the City Clerk and shall contain the following information:
- A. Name, address, phone number(s) and signature of applicant.
- B. The purpose for which the sound equipment will be used.
- C. The location where the sound equipment will be used.
- D. The number of days of use and proposed hours of operation of the sound equipment.
- E. A general description of the sound equipment, including the license number of any motor vehicle upon which it is to be operated.
- F. Any other information as may be required by the City Clerk.
 - Permit Fee. The fees for a noise permit are as follows:
- A. Permits for 1 day or less = \$50.00
- B. Permits for 2 through 7 days = \$100.00

No fee is required for a noise permit issued to City, State or Federal government or any governmental subdivision or agency thereof.

• Issuance of Permit. Permits may be issued by the City Clerk. Except as hereinafter provided, if the application contains the required information and is accompanied by the required fee, the noise permit for sound equipment shall be issued with reasonable dispatch. If

the event requiring a noise permit has an ending time of 10:00 p.m. or later, the application must be approved by the Council prior to the permit being issued.

Permit applications received less than two (2) weeks before the event may not be processed by the City in time for the event.

Our Community

Adel is located in Dallas County, Iowa, approximately 13 miles west of the intersection of Interstates 80 and 35. The growing community is the county seat and oldest town within Dallas County, the fastest growing county in Iowa and one of the fastest growing counties in the nation. Adel is located on the west bank of the North Raccoon River. Its historic roots include being home to one of the most important stage routes in Iowa. Native American artifacts found in the area provide evidence of earlier residents including the Sac and Fox Indians in whose language Penoach means "far away". Originally called Penoach, the town was founded as the county seat and was located on the first road in



the county. Adel has been a community since 1847, growing with pride, to be the up-and-coming community it is today.

Adding to the community's scenic beauty is the charming brick streets, a point of pride for the community. 
City Organization

Adel is a Council/Mayor form of government with a City Administrator. The City is governed by a Mayor elected to two-year terms and a five-member City Council elected to four-year terms. The Adel City Council meets regularly on the second Tuesday of every month at 6:00 p.m., reserving the fourth Monday for a second meeting if necessary. The Mayor and Council are assisted by citizen boards and commissions including Parks and Recreation, Planning and Zoning Commission, Board of Adjustment, Historic Preservation Commission, and the Library Board. The City employs a full-time staff of 24. The total budget is \$16.1 million, with a levy rate of \$13.25836. The City police force consists of 12 full-time and 3 part-time sworn staff, plus one administrative position. The county sheriff's department is based in Adel. Fire protection services are provided by a 28 member volunteer department. The City operates a water utility and a wastewater treatment plant. The water supply is from wells with an elevated storage capacity.

Parks and Recreation

Adel is heavily invested in its parks system and recreational activities, dedicating a significant portion of the voter-approved Local Option Sales and Services Taxes to these activities. The City maintains several parks, a campground, and an aquatic center including the Kinnick-Feller that accommodates softball fields, flag football fields, and tennis courts. Island Park features a soccer field and camp grounds. Two golf courses serve Adel: a private 9-hole course, and a public 18-hole course.


The scenic 54-mile Raccoon River Valley Trail biking and hiking trail passes through Adel and connects with Des Moines, with 75,000+ cyclists trail annually. The City maintains 150+ acres of park land, a fifty site campground, two boat ramps, three cemeteries, three basketball courts, three sand volleyball courts, two tennis courts, seven baseball/softball fields, a nine hole disc golf course, three plus miles of multi-use asphalt trails, a football field, soccer complex and offers over 60 recreational programs throughout the year.






Education

The Adel-DeSoto-Minburn Community School District is renowned for its commitment to academic excellence, and ADM High School consistently ranks among Iowa's top 10 high schools according to U.S. News & World Report. With an estimated student enrollment of more than 2,100, the District operates elementary schools in Adel and Desoto as well as a middle school and high school in Adel. A new \$56 million, 1,000 student high school in Adel broke ground in June 2025.





Transportation

Adel is adjacent to Interstate 80, which runs from Boston, MA to San Francisco, CA and approximately 13 miles from Interstate 35, which runs from Laredo, TX to Duluth, MN. State Highway 169 runs through Adel and connects to Winterset to the south and Des Moines to the north/east. For train travel, Adel is 45 minutes away from Osceola, IA, a major Amtrak connection. The Des Moines International Airport is approximately 20 miles away, offering both domestic and international flights and is currently undergoing a major expansion. There are also smaller general aviation airports near Adel, such as the Perry Municipal Airport and the Winterset Municipal Airport, available for private flights and smaller aircraft.






Cultural Opportunities

Adel is home to multiple churches, with the major denominations of Methodist, Catholic, Lutheran, and Baptist represented in the area.







The Position






Sidewalk Waiver Request – O'Reilly Auto Parts Site

Dear Council Members.

On behalf of O'Reilly Auto Parts, we are submitting this letter to formally request a partial waiver of the sidewalk installation requirement.

As shown on the attached site plan, sidewalks are proposed along the site frontage (highlighted in green) and will include ADA-compliant curb ramps with detectable warning domes where required. However, we are requesting a waiver for the portions shown in red—along the east side of the proposed building and at the south access to the property.

This request is based on existing conditions that make compliance with the sidewalk slope standard impractical. Specifically, the southern access has a substantial grade difference, making the required 2% cross slope infeasible.

In accordance with Section 136.02(4), we respectfully ask that the Council consider these site-specific conditions as justification for granting a partial waiver. We also understand and accept that if these conditions are modified or removed in the future, the City may require installation of the sidewalk within 120 days of notification.



STAFF/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The City's current commercial tax abatement program is set to expire on December 31, 2025. Due to recent changes in Iowa law, municipalities seeking to continue offering commercial tax abatements must update their urban revitalization plans to incorporate a *minimum assessment agreement*, which is now a statutory requirement for such programs.

To remain in compliance with state law and preserve this economic development incentive, City staff recommends engaging with Ahlers & Cooney, P.C. to amend and restate the City's Urban Revitalization Plan. This process would allow the City to extend the commercial tax abatement program while aligning it with the new legal requirements.

This item is to set a public hearing for Tuesday, October 14, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. The supporting documents show the draft Urban Revitalization Plan, the application for tax abatement, and the adoption schedule. These items and the acceptance of the Urban Revitalization Plan will be on the agenda for the October 14, 2025 City Council meeting.

City staff is recommending approval.

RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE NECESSITY AND FIXING A DATE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE MATTER OF THE ADOPTION OF A PROPOSED AMENDED AND RESTATED ADEL URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 404, by action of the City Council on December 14, 2010, the City of Adel, Iowa (the "City") adopted the Urban Revitalization Plan (the "Original Plan") for the Adel Urban Revitalization Area (the "Urban Revitalization Area" or "Area"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council subsequently adopted seven amendments to the Original Plan; and

WHEREAS, by the foregoing action, the Council has determined that the Revitalization Area within the City can be revitalized as authorized by Iowa Code Chapter 404; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Amended and Restated Adel Urban Revitalization Plan ("Amended and Restated Plan" or "Plan") has been prepared as a further amendment to the Original Plan, the purpose of which is to consolidate the Original Plan and the previously adopted amendments into a single document; to amend the Plan's provisions to reflect recent legislative changes to Iowa Code Chapter 404 that took effect on July 1, 2024; and to extend the term of the revitalization program; and

WHEREAS, before such Amended and Restated Plan can be adopted, it is necessary that a public hearing be held thereon and that due notice be given in accordance with the requirements of Iowa Code Chapter 404.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADEL, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. It is determined that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development or a combination thereof of the Area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, or welfare of the residents of the City, and the Area substantially meets the criteria of Iowa Code Section 404.1 and the proposed Amended and Restated Plan, attached to this Resolution as Exhibit 1, is declared to substantially meet the criteria of Iowa Code Section 404.2.

I. INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

The Urban Revitalization Act, Chapter 404 of the *Code of Iowa*, is intended to encourage development, redevelopment, and revitalization within a designated area of a city by authorizing property tax development incentives to the private sector. Qualified real estate within a designated area may be eligible to receive a total or partial exemption from property taxes on improvements for a specified number of years. The primary intent of this act is to provide communities with a long-term increase or stabilization in their tax base by encouraging rehabilitation or new construction which might not otherwise have occurred.

The Urban Revitalization Plan ("Original Plan") for the City of Adel, Iowa (the "City") adopted by Resolution 10-55 on December 14, 2010 set forth an Exemption Schedule for Improvements on Qualified Real Estate completed during the 2011, 2012, and 2013 calendar years in the Adel Urban Revitalization Area (the "Revitalization Area" or "Area"). Amendment No. 1 to the Plan, adopted by Resolution No. 12-13 on March 13, 2012, modified the Exemption Schedule. Amendment No. 2, adopted by Resolution No. 12-59 on October 9, 2012, added annexed land not previously included in the Area. Amendment No. 3, adopted by Resolution No. 12-66 on December 11, 2012, modified the Exemption Schedule for 2013 and extended the program through calendar years 2014, 2015, and 2016. Amendment No. 4, adopted by Resolution No. 13-63 on November 12, 2013, added previously annexed land to the Area as well as automatically incorporating all land annexed into the City in the future into the Area as of the annexation date. Amendment No. 5, adopted by Resolution No. 14-36 on August 12, 2014, extended the Exemption Schedule for an additional nine years, thereby covering Improvements completed through December 31, 2025. Amendment No. 6, adopted by Resolution No. 17-02 on January 10, 2017, clarified the duration of the Original Plan/Area, incorporated a limitation to eligibility for property in an Urban Renewal Area, redefined Qualified Real Estate to include commercial property and multi-residential property, and added an Exemption Schedule for Improvements to Qualified Real Estate assessed as commercial or multi-residential property. Amendment No. 7, adopted by Resolution No. 17-49 on October 10, 2017, modified the exemption schedule for improvements to qualified real estate assessed as residential or multi-residential property and terminated the exemption schedule for improvements to qualified real estate assessed as residential or multiresidential property for improvements completed after January 1, 2021.

The City is now adopting this Amended and Restated Adel Urban Revitalization Plan (the "Amended and Restated Plan" or "Plan") for the Area in order to: (i) consolidate the Original Plan and Amendment Nos. 1-7 into a single revitalization plan document; (ii) update the Plan to accommodate legislative changes; and (iii) extend the term of the Plan. The City Council may adopt future amendments to this Plan that limit or adjust the eligibility provisions of the Plan.

Upon adoption of this Amended and Restated Plan, this Amended and Restated Plan shall replace the Original Plan, as previously amended. In case of any conflict or uncertainty, the terms of this Amended and Restated Plan shall control. Any parts of the Original Plan, as previously amended, in conflict with this Amended and Restated are hereby repealed.

II. DESCRIPTION OF REVITALIZATION AREA

The property to be included in the Adel Urban Revitalization Area is legally described as follows:

All real property contained within the incorporated limits of the City of Adel, Dallas County, State of Iowa as those boundaries existed on January 1, 2013, and all areas thereafter annexed in the City of Adel effective immediately upon their annexation.

The City may amend the land included in the Revitalization Area, or adjust the boundaries of the Area, by adoption of future amendments to this Plan and by the adoption of additional designating ordinances or the repeal of existing designating ordinances.

III. DESIGNATION OF REVITALIZATION AREA

Iowa Code Chapter 404 provides that the City Council may designate an area of the City as a revitalization area, if that area meets any of the criteria set forth in Iowa Code Section 404.1 The City Council has previously designated the Adel Urban Revitalization Area as an urban revitalization area under the criteria of Sections 404.1(2-4), which respectively provide the following criteria:

- 2. An area which by reason of the presence of a substantial number of deteriorated or deteriorating structures, predominance of defective or inadequate street layout, incompatible land use relationships, faulty lot layout in relation to size, adequacy, accessibility or usefulness, unsanitary or unsafe conditions, deterioration of site or other improvements, diversity of ownership, tax or special assessment delinquency exceeding the actual value of the land, defective or unusual conditions of title, or the existence of conditions which endanger life or property by fire and other causes, or a combination of such factors, substantially impairs or arrests the sound growth of a municipality, retards the provision of housing accommodations or constitutes an economic or social liability and is a menace to the public health, safety, or welfare in its present condition and use.
- 3. An area in which there is a predominance of buildings or improvements which by reason of age, history, architecture or significance should be preserved or restored to productive use.
- 4. An area which is appropriate as an economic development area as defined in section 403.17.

With the adoption of this Amended and Restated Plan, the City Council affirms that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development, or a combination thereof, of the Revitalization Area, is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the

residents of the City and that the Revitalization Area continues to substantially meets the criteria established in Iowa Code Section 404.1 (2-4) for a revitalization area.

IX. EXISTING ZONING; EXISTING AND PROPOSED LAND USE

The City's zoning ordinance(s) and a detailed zoning map are available for public inspection at City Hall.

Existing land use categories are the same as the zoning classifications described above.

New and expanded commercial development, including improvements to and revitalization of existing commercial structures, is proposed for the Revitalization Area, in accordance with the City's zoning ordinance(s) and the City's Comprehensive Plan.

V. PROPOSALS FOR EXPANDING CITY SERVICES

No extensions or upgrades to existing municipal services or infrastructure are currently planned as part of this Plan. As development and redevelopment within the Revitalization Area warrants, municipal services within the Revitalization Area will be expanded and improved, as needed and as financially feasible, to serve new and expanded development.

VI. ELIGIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

Qualified Real Estate, as used in this Plan, means all real property that is (i) assessed as commercial, (ii) located within the Revitalization Area, and (iii) to which Eligible Improvements have been added during the time the property was included in the designated revitalization area.

<u>Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means improvements to Qualified Real Estate, including rehabilitation of and additions to any existing structures and new construction, that increase the actual value of the Qualified Real Estate by at least 15%. In order to be considered Eligible Improvements, the improvements must be completed in conformance with all applicable ordinances and regulations for the City and must be completed during the time the Area has been designated as a revitalization area.

<u>Actual Value Added by Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means the actual value added to the property's assessed valuation due to the Eligible Improvements as of the first year for which the exemption was received.

VII. TIME FRAME

Revitalization activities in the Revitalization Area shall be eligible under this Plan until the City repeals or amends the ordinance(s) establishing the Revitalization Area, or repeals or amends the exemption benefits contained in this Plan.

If at any time, in the opinion of the City Council, the desired level of revitalization has been attained or economic conditions are such that the continuation of the exemptions granted in the

Plan would cease to be of benefit to the City, then, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.7, the City Council may repeal the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, or any portion of the Revitalization Area. Following the repeal of the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, all previously approved exemptions shall continue until their expiration. The City reserves the right to extend, amend, terminate, or repeal the Plan and/or the designating ordinances to the extent allowed by law.

VIII. EXEMPTIONS

The following exemption schedule is available under this Plan for Qualified Real Estate located within the Revitalization Area to which Eligible Improvements are made:

Commercial Property

All Qualified Real Estate assessed as commercial property is eligible to receive exemption from taxation on Actual Value Added by the Eligible Improvements according to the following schedule:

1st Year	Seventy-Five percent (75%) of actual value added
2nd Year	Sixty percent (60%) of actual value added
3rd Year	Forty-Five percent (45%) of actual value added
4th Year	Thirty percent (30%) of actual value added
5th year	Fifteen percent (15%) of actual value added

IX. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Application for Completed Improvements – "First Year Application"

Property owners must file an application, on the form provided by the City, for each new exemption claimed. The application shall be filed by the property owner with the City Council by February 1 of the assessment year for which the exemption is first claimed, but not later than the year in which all improvements included in the project are first assessed for taxation, or the following two assessment years. The application shall contain, but is not limited to the following information:

- The nature of the improvement(s);
- The cost of the improvement(s);
- Estimated or actual completion date of the improvement(s);
- The tenants that occupied the property on the date the City adopted the resolution adopting the Original Plan, if known; and
- Identification of which exemption option the property owner is applying for under this Plan.

Additional Requirement for Properties Assessed as Commercial

Property owners submitting applications on or after July 1, 2024 for improvements to property assessed as commercial must also enter into a written assessment agreement with the City, in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, specifying a minimum actual value for the completed improvements, consistent with and to the extent required by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 404 in effect at the time the application is submitted to the City.

Application for Prior Approval – Before Improvement Construction

Property owners may submit a proposal for an improvement project to the City Council to receive prior approval for eligibility for a tax exemption on the project prior to construction of the project. The City Council shall give its prior approval if the project is in conformance with this Plan for revitalization. However, if the proposal is not approved, the owner(s) may submit an amended proposal for the City Council to approve or reject. Such prior approval shall not entitle the owner(s) to exemption from taxation until the improvements have been completed and found to be qualified for the exemption. Additionally, after receiving approval of the application for prior approval, the property owner must submit a first-year application to the City between January 1 and February 1 of the year in which all improvements in the project as first assessed. Failure to timely submit the second application may result in ineligibility of the improvements for a tax exemption under this Plan.

X. APPLICATION REVIEW

The City Council shall, subject to review by the County Assessor, approve all applications submitted for approval if:

- 1. The project, as determined by the City Council, is in conformance with this Plan and all other requirements of City Code, including, but not limited to, zoning and building code requirements and receipt of a building permit (if required by City Code); and
- 2. The project is located within the Revitalization Area; and
- 3. The improvements were made during the time the Revitalization Area was so designated.

The City Council will determine which exemption is applicable to the project (if any), subject to review by the County Assessor, based upon the terms of the Plan in effect when the application is reviewed and approved by the Council.

All approved first-year applications shall be forwarded to the County Assessor by March 1 for review, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.5. The County Assessor shall make a physical review of all properties with approved applications. The County Assessor shall determine the increase in actual value for tax purposes due to the improvements and notify the applicant of the determination, which may be appealed to the local board of review pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa Code. After the initial tax exemption is granted, the County Assessor shall continue to grant the tax exemption for the time period specified on the approved application. The tax exemptions for the succeeding years shall be granted without the owner(s) having to file an application for succeeding years.

XI. OTHER SOURCES OF REVITALIZATION FUNDS

The City is not aware of a federal, state, or private grant or loan program that is permanently a source of funding for residential improvements in the Revitalization Area. However, it is not the intention of the City to prohibit the use of any other appropriate federal or state revitalization or incentive programs within the Revitalization Area. The City Council encourages all property owners to investigate other public and private funding sources for improvements to real property, and to apply to those sources which are applicable to the types of improvements being proposed.

XII. RELOCATION PROVISIONS

The City does not anticipate the displacement or relocation of any persons, families, or businesses as a result of the improvements to be made in the Revitalization Area. However, if the relocation or displacement of a qualified tenant results from a property owner's action to qualify for a tax exemption under this Plan, upon the City's verification of such relocation or displacement, the City may require the property owner to compensate the qualified tenant for at least one month's rent and actual relocation expenses. A "qualified tenant" means the legal occupant of a residential dwelling unit which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same dwelling unit continuously since one year prior to the adoption of the Original Plan.

XIII. ASSESSED VALUATIONS AND OWNERS OF RECORD

Listings of the names and addresses of the owners of record for all real estate in the Revitalization Area, along with the assessed valuations stated separately for land and buildings for the real estate, as of the adoption date of the Original Plan, is maintained in the office of the City Clerk.

XIV. LIMITATION TO ELIGIBILITY FOR PROPERTY IN URBAN RENEWAL AREA

The City has one or more urban renewal areas that may overlap with the Revitalization Area and, in the future, may establish additional urban renewal areas that overlap with the Revitalization Area. The City has a tax increment financing program within these urban renewal areas that is designed to provide incentives for development. Accordingly, a property that, in the determination of the City Council, is within an urban renewal area and is receiving either direct or indirect benefits that were financed through a tax increment financing program, shall not be eligible for tax abatement under the Plan absent specific approval from the City Council.

XV. SEVERABILITY

If any part of the Amended and Restated Plan is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans as a whole or any part of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans, prior amendments to revitalization plans, or the Amended and Restated Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.

XVI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Amended and Restated Plan shall be effective upon the approval of a resolution by the City Council adopting the Amended and Restated Plan ("Effective Date").

Applications submitted under this Plan following the Effective Date shall be eligible to apply only for those exemptions contained in this Amended and Restated Plan, subject to the terms of the Plan. All exemptions awarded prior to the Effective Date shall continue until their expiration.

- 2. This Minimum Assessment Agreement shall be promptly recorded by the City with the Recorder of Dallas County, Iowa. Such filing shall constitute notice to any subsequent encumbrancer of the Property (or part thereof), whether voluntary or involuntary, and this Minimum Assessment Agreement shall be binding and enforceable in its entirety against any such subsequent encumbrancer, including the holder of any mortgage. The City shall pay all costs of recording.
- 3. This Minimum Assessment Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of and be enforceable by the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.
- 4. Nothing herein shall be deemed to waive the rights of Owner from seeking administrative or legal remedies to reduce the actual value assignment made by the Assessor in excess of the Minimum Actual Value established herein. 
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The City of Adel's Planning and Zoning Commission met at Adel City Hall, 301 S. 10th Street, on Wednesday, September 3, 2025, at 6:00 p.m.

The Commissioners present were Stephanie Poole, Lane Pralle, Tim Crannell, Jerry Adams, and Code Compliance Officer Steve Nichols. The Commissioner absent was Danielle Roberts, Jonathan Fokken and Patrick Halsey. Also present were representative Associated Engineering Company of Iowa Vic Piagentini, Mark Behr for the Ortonville Project and John Sieck, Brian Caltrider and Julianna Cullin for the Northwater Plat.

- I. Discussion / Possible Action on Preliminary Ortonville Industrial Plat 1 presented by Mark Behr. Piagentini introduced the plat to the board. It has 7 industrial lots from 1 acre to 3.33 acres. This land is flat, so two retention ponds are being used. Outlot Z, which is the road in the development, will remain private and the road running south to north will be the future R-16. Nichols stated that this has gone through review with Overton and McClures Engineering and corrections were made prior to the Planning and Zoning meeting. Motion by Adams and second by Pralle, to approve Preliminary Ortonville Industrial Plat 1. Motion passed unanimously.
- II. Discussion / Possible Action Approving Preliminary Northwater Plat 3 Make Recommendation to Council. John Sieck presented the Northwater Plat to the Board. This plat is mirrored to the two existing Northwater plats. The difference is having only 8 lots to accommodate the square footage to the code for septic system use of 40,000 square feet. Nichols also stated that there will need to have a dry sewer system that will go east and will need an easement between lots 4 and 5 and end at the property line. This will continue having all roads being private and it will be part of the original Northwater HOA. Nichols stated that this is still in the review stage of McClure Engineering. This was originally looked at with Overton and Nichols with comments to Mr. Sieck Adams made a motion to approve Northwater Plat 3 pending that all McCure's review of our Subdivision Ordinance comments are completed and stated on an updated Preliminary Plat before it goes to Council. Second by Crannell. Motion passed unanimously.

Purpose of Project:

The City of Adel has requested a proposal to prepare a functional design for the Meadow Road corridor between S. 15th Street and US Highway 169. With significant private development occurring in the vicinity of this corridor, it is important to establish a clear planning document that identifies the anticipated full build-out of this designated collector roadway, provides utility planning, and establishes a framework for cost participation between developers and the City. The following is a breakdown of our proposed scope of services, associated fees, and an anticipated schedule for this functional design study.

Scope of Services:

The proposed scope of services will include the following tasks:

1. Topographic Survey

- Utilize survey information collected in 2018.
- Obtain areas updated since original survey including roadway profile survey to establish accurate existing elevations and the areas near US Highway 169.
- o Supplement survey with LiDAR and City GIS data for adjacent grades and right-of-way information.

2. Functional Design

Traffic Engineering

o Review the anticipated trip generation based on surrounding developments and current traffic counts to verify the proposed 3-lane urban section meets the need for additional traffic volumes.

Roadway Modeling

- Develop roadway model for a 3-lane urban section (two through lanes with a center two-way left-turn lane).
- Define anticipated grading limits to accommodate future sidewalks, trails, and utility corridors.

Utility Planning

Evaluate sanitary sewer needs, including force main and gravity sewer alignments.

- o Identify water main adjustments and connections.
- o Plan for storm sewer collection and conveyance.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ADEL, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO LIQUOR LICENSES AND WINE AND BEER PERMITS

Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of Adel, Iowa:

SECTION 1. SUBSECTION MODIFIED. Subsection 8 of Section 120.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Adel, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

8. Keep on premises covered by a retail alcohol license any alcoholic liquor in any container except the original package purchased from the Iowa Department of Revenue and except mixed drinks or cocktails mixed on the premises for immediate consumption. However, mixed drinks or cocktails that are mixed on the premises and are not for immediate consumption may be consumed on the licensed premises, subject to Section 123.49, Subsection 2, Paragraph D, Subparagraphs (2), (3), and (4) of the *Code of Iowa*.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 123.49(2)(d)(2), (3), and (4))

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 431

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ADEL, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO CIGARETTE AND TOBACCO PERMITS

Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of Adel, Iowa:

SECTION 1. CHAPTER MODIFIED. Chapter 121 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Adel, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

CHAPTER 121

CIGARETTE AND TOBACCO PERMITS

121.01 Definitions121.07 Expiration121.02 Permit Required121.08 Refunds121.03 Application121.09 Persons Under Legal Age121.04 City Approval121.10 Self-Service Sales Prohibited121.05 Fees121.11 Permit Revocation121.06 Issuance

121.01 DEFINITIONS. For use in this chapter the following terms are defined: (Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.1)

- 1. "Alternative nicotine product" means a product, not consisting of or containing tobacco, that provides for the ingestion into the body of nicotine, whether by chewing, absorbing, dissolving, inhaling, snorting, or sniffing, or by any other means. "Alternative nicotine product" does not include cigarettes, tobacco products, or vapor products, or a product that is regulated as a drug or device by the United States Food and Drug Administration under Chapter V of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.
- 2. "Cigarette" means any roll for smoking made wholly or in part of tobacco, or any substitute for tobacco, irrespective of size or shape and irrespective of tobacco or any substitute for tobacco being flavored, adulterated, or mixed with any other ingredient, where such roll has a wrapper or cover made of paper or any other material. However, cigarettes shall not be construed to include cigars.
- 3. "Department" means the State Department of Revenue.
- 4. "Place of business" means any place where cigarettes, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products are sold, stored, or kept for the purpose of sale or consumption by a retailer.
- 5. "Retailer" means every person who sells, distributes, or offers for sale for consumption, or possesses for the purpose of sale for consumption, cigarettes, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, irrespective of the quantity or amount or the number of sales, or who engages in the business of selling tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products to ultimate consumers.
- 6. "Self-service display" means any manner of product display, placement, or storage from which a person purchasing the product may take possession of the product, prior to purchase, without assistance from the retailer or employee of the retailer, in removing the product from a restricted access location.

- 7. "Tobacco products" means the following: cigars; little cigars; cheroots; stogies; periques; granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready rubbed, and other smoking tobacco; snuff; cavendish; plug and twist tobacco; fine-cut and other chewing tobaccos; shorts or refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings, and sweepings of tobacco; and other kinds and forms of tobacco prepared in such manner as to be suitable for chewing or smoking in a pipe or otherwise, or for both chewing and smoking, but does not mean cigarettes.
- 8. "Vapor product" means any noncombustible product, which may or may not contain nicotine, that employs a heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size, that can be used to produce vapor from a solution or other substance. "Vapor product" includes an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device, and any cartridge or other container of a solution or other substance, which may or may not contain nicotine, that is intended to be used with or in an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device. "Vapor product" does not include a product regulated as a drug or device by the United States Food and Drug Administration under Chapter V of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

121.02 PERMIT REQUIRED.

1. Retail Cigarette Permits. It is unlawful for any person, other than a holder of a retail permit, to sell cigarettes, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products at retail and no retailer shall distribute, sell, or solicit the sale of any cigarettes, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products within the City without a valid permit for each place of business. The permit shall, at all times, be publicly displayed at the place of business so as to be easily seen by the public and the persons authorized to inspect the place of business.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.13(1))

2. Retail Tobacco Permits. It is unlawful for any person to engage in the business of a retailer of tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products at any place of business without first having received a permit as a retailer for each place of business owned or operated by the retailer.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.47A(1))

A retailer who holds a retail cigarette permit is not required to also obtain a retail tobacco permit. However, if a retailer only holds a retail cigarette permit and that permit is suspended, revoked, or expired, the retailer shall not sell any tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, or vapor products, during such time.

121.03 APPLICATION. A retailer shall submit to the department an application on forms furnished by the department, accompanied by the required fees and adequate bond as provided in Section 453A.14, of the *Code of Iowa*. Applications, any supporting documentation, and the associated fees shall be submitted electronically to the department.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.13(5))

121.04 CITY APPROVAL. The City may approve retail permit applications for applicants with a place of business within the City limits. The City shall use the electronic portal of the department to process retail permit applications. Upon approval of a retail permit application by the City the department shall issue the permit to the applicant on behalf of the City.

121.05 FEES. The fee for a retail cigarette or tobacco permit shall be as follows: (Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.13(3)(b) and 453A.47A(7))

121.06 ISSUANCE. Each permit issued shall describe clearly the place of business for which it is issued and shall be nonassignable.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.13(9))

121.07 EXPIRATION. All permits shall expire on June 30 of each year. A permit shall not be granted or issued until the applicant has paid the fees to the department for the next period ending on June 30.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.13(3)(a))

121.08 REFUNDS. A retailer may surrender an unrevoked permit and receive a refund from the City, except during April, May, or June, in accordance with the schedule of refunds as provided in Section 453A.13 or 453A.47A of the *Code of Iowa*.

(Code of Iowa, 453A.13(4) and 453A.47A(8))

- **121.09 PERSONS UNDER LEGAL AGE.** A person shall not sell, give, or otherwise supply any tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, or cigarettes to any person under 21 years of age. The provision of this section includes prohibiting a person under 21 years of age from purchasing tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, and cigarettes from a vending machine. If a retailer or employee of a retailer violates the provisions of this section, the Council shall, after written notice and hearing, and in addition to the other penalties fixed for such violation, assess the following:
 - 1. For a first violation, the retailer shall be assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$300.00. Failure to pay the civil penalty as ordered under this subsection shall result in automatic suspension of the permit for a period of 14 days.
 - 2. For a second violation within a period of two years, the retailer shall be assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,500.00 or the retailer's permit shall be suspended for a period of 30 days. The retailer may select its preference in the penalty to be applied under this subsection.
 - 3. For a third violation within a period of three years, the retailer shall be assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,500.00 and the retailer's permit shall be suspended for a period of 30 days.
 - 4. For a fourth violation within a period of three years, the retailer shall be assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,500.00 and the retailer's permit shall be suspended for a period of 60 days.
 - 5. For a fifth violation within a period of four years, the retailer's permit shall be revoked.

The Clerk shall give 10 days' written notice to the retailer by mailing a copy of the notice to the place of business as it appears on the application for a permit. The notice shall state the reason for the contemplated action and the time and place at which the retailer may appear and be heard.

121.10 SELF-SERVICE SALES PROHIBITED. Except for the sale of cigarettes through a cigarette vending machine as provided in Section 453A.36(6) of the Code of Iowa, a retailer shall not sell or offer for sale tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products, vapor products, or cigarettes through the use of a self-service display.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 453A.36A)

PERMIT REVOCATION. Following a written notice and an opportunity for a 121.11 hearing, as provided by the Code of Iowa, the Council may also revoke a permit issued pursuant to this chapter for a violation of Division I of Chapter 453A of the Code of Iowa or any rule adopted thereunder. If a permit is revoked, a new permit shall not be issued to the permit holder for any place of business, or to any other person for the place of business at which the violation occurred, until one year has expired from the date of revocation, unless good cause to the contrary is shown to the Council. The Clerk shall report the revocation or suspension of a retail permit to the department within 30 days of the revocation or suspension.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
