# Adel City Council September 9, 2025 - Meeting Minutes

The Adel City Council met in regular session at Adel City Hall, 301 S. 10th Street, Adel, Iowa on Tuesday, September 9, 2025. At 6:00 p.m., Mayor Peters called the meeting to order. The following answered roll: Ockerman, Trout, McAdon, West, and Selby.

Staff Present: Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist, City Clerk Erickson, City Attorney Stone, Public Works Director Overton, Police Chief Book, Library Director Jayne, Parks & Recreation Director Schenck, and Community Development Director Nichols.

# **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC**

1.a. Review of the Completed Water, Sewer, and Stormwater USDA-RD Projects - Gary Brons, McClure Engineering

Gary Brons, McClure Engineering, was unable to be present at the meeting. This presentation will be moved to the following meeting on October 14, 2025.

1.b. Erin Milroy - Sweet Corn Festival Review and Adel Partners Chamber of Commerce Update
The Sweet Corn Festival faced weather challenges but was largely successful, according to Adel
Partners Chamber of Commerce President Erin Milroy. Nearly 500 people participated in the 5K,
and around 100 vendors attended. Parking improvements and extended vendor hours were wellreceived. The parade was canceled due to lightning concerns, with safety prioritized in coordination
with city staff and the National Weather Service. Communication efforts, praised by Council
Member McAdon, helped the public understand the cancellation. Chief Book's team effectively
managed parade exiting. Attendance was lower than usual at around 5,900, but visitors stayed
longer and all the corn was used. Vendors responded positively, appreciating the setup and extra
time, aided by a pre-event webinar. Milroy noted the need for a command center, better weather
planning, improved communication, and coordination with Kiwanis for future parade decisions.
Upcoming events include a candidate forum on September 30, Fall Festival Hay Day on October 3,
and Hometown Holidays on December 5–6, along with marketing updates and meetings with local
business leaders.

#### DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORT

3.a. Update on Audit Timeline

Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist shared that there is not much of an update as we have not heard when our field work will be happening. We will be using the same firm, RGE. We are starting to gather documents.

3.b. Update on Budget Timeline

Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist shared with Council that the timeline is included in the packet. Department Heads will receive their budget sheets this week to begin thinking about what they will request for their departments. Sandquist also shared that the City will find out in December what valuations will be. Council Member McAdon shared that the audit from the South Dallas County Landfill will be approved on Thursday. McAdon and Sandquist will also arrange a time to update PFM on their questions about rates.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- 4.a. Consider Approval of Mayor Board and Commission Appointment: Library Board One Opening Motion by Ockerman, seconded by Selby, to appoint Kate Marple to the Library Board. Roll: Ayes Unanimous. Motion Carried.
- 4.b. Consider Approval of the City of Adel Profile for the City Administrator Search Marketa Oliver, 316 Aaron Ave NW in Bondurant, discussed the upcoming City Administrator search and requested guidance on two items in the draft profile: the salary range and whether residency is still a requirement. Council Member West asked if the proposed salary aligns with the budget, and Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist said the position is currently budgeted at \$5,000 below the lower limit of the proposed range. The group agreed to proceed with the recommended salary range. Regarding residency, West and Council Member McAdon supported requiring it within six months of hire. Sandquist asked if that meant within city limits or just an Adel address. Chief Book clarified the current policy for the police department allows staff members to live up to 20 miles from city limits, with waivers possible. Oliver noted that residency requirements vary from other cities and may not impact visibility or dedication. City Attorney Stone cited city code requiring residency, while Council Member Ockerman expressed concern that it could deter candidates due to housing costs. Mayor Peters suggested using "residency preferred" in the job posting instead. The consensus was to include "residency preferred" in the profile. Oliver said she will finalize the profile and post it this week. Additional updates included West suggesting the addition of pickleball courts, and Trout suggesting updates to the ADM Tigers logo and car show photo.
- 4.c. Consider Approval of Sidewalk Regulations Waiver Request from O'Reilly Auto Parts

  Robby Laird, Own Engineering, requested a waiver for the City's sidewalk regulations.

Bobby Laird, Own Engineering, requested a waiver for the City's sidewalk regulations due to the slope of the road and the driveways on each side. The crosswalk across the driveway requirement would make the crosswalk too high and the underbelly of cars could hit it.

Motion by Ockerman, seconded by Selby, to approve the sidewalk waiver request for O'Reilly Auto Parts.

4.d. Consider Approval of Resolution No. 25-64, Determining the Necessity and Fixing a Date for a Public Hearing on the Matter of the Adoption of a Proposed Amended and Restated Adel Urban Revitalization Plan for Tuesday, October 14, 2025 at 6:00 p.m.

Council Member McAdon questioned why the application asks for the assessment category when the plan only concerns commercial. The issue will be resolved by the date of the publishing of the public hearing notice.

Motion by West, seconded by Trout, to approve Resolution No. 25-64.

4.e. Consider Approval of Resolution No. 25-65, Approving Preliminary Plat for Ortonville Industrial Park Plat 1

Mark Behr, 28901 R Ave, Adel, presented a plat just under 20 acres featuring seven lots and two retention ponds, continuing from 298th Place with future plans to connect to R Avenue. The development includes a pressurized sewer system; all necessary easements for road access and utilities are in place. Mayor Peters raised a question about the status of the existing east-west road, which doesn't appear as a city street on the assessor's website. Council Member Ockerman clarified that the road is considered a city road, noting that the auditor's records are more reliable than the assessor's for such designations. Discussion followed about screening requirements between Behr's property and adjacent land. Ockerman requested screening plans for both the north and south sides. Community Development Director Nichols explained that screening requirements, such as trees or plants, are found in the zoning code, not the subdivision code. City Attorney Stone asked about the zoning of the southern property, and Ockerman believed it was still agricultural. Motion by West, seconded by Selby, to approve Resolution No. 25-65.

Roll: Ayes - Unanimous. Motion Carried.

4.f. Discussion on Northwater Preliminary Plat 3 with John Sieck, Developer with Northwater, LLC

John Sieck, of Ironwood Homes at 101 Main Street in Booneville, IA, discussed the third plat to his already two developed plats of 8–10 lots. There is a concern about the correlation between lot size and sewer requirements. He explained that due to current septic system regulations, they are unable to develop 10 lots as planned. Sieck asked whether a plat with septic systems and dry sewers that meets all current code requirements would be acceptable. Council Member West inquired about the topography and drainage, and Sieck responded that the land is fairly flat and that modern septic systems are safe and environmentally friendly. He confirmed there have been no drainage issues in the other two plats, which also use septic systems without dry sewer connections. Council Member Ockerman noted that future development west of Meadowview School would require sewer infrastructure, and Behr Estates may eventually be forced to connect. Council Member Trout stated that if Sieck complies with all ordinance requirements, the project could move forward. Community Development Director Nichols added that approval from McClure is still needed before presenting to the council. Sieck plans to return at the next council meeting for final approval. Ockerman reminded him that a future sewer connection may still be required.

4.n. Consider Approval of Resolution No. 25-67, Setting a Public Hearing on Whether to Grant An Access Easement to Fairfax Properties, LLC, Across Property Located East of the City of Adel's Water Tower on Meadow Road

Deputy City Administrator/Finance Director Sandquist informed the council that a property near Meadow Road is up for auction and reminded them of a verbal agreement made when the city purchased 40 acres near the water tower, allowing property owners access via a city-owned gravel road. Now, with the property being up for auction, a formal easement is requested. Council Member Ockerman suggested considering a temporary rather than permanent easement. City Attorney Stone proposed including specific conditions in the easement language. Alex Schlader, McClure Engineering, noted the city could define where its right-of-way (ROW) should extend. Stone added that a plat would need council approval unless only one house is being built. Mayor Peters asked if the council had concerns about granting access easements in the area. Stone cautioned that the current easement prohibits obstruction or grading changes by the city, which could conflict with future road work on Meadow Road and would require an amendment. Council Member West supported moving forward with the necessary changes.

Motion by West, seconded by Trout, to approve Resolution No. 25-67.

Roll: Ayes - Unanimous. Motion Carried.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

1. City Clerk Erickson reminded the Council and Mayor that she sent a sign up earlier in the day for 30-minute interviews with McGrath Consulting September 23-25.

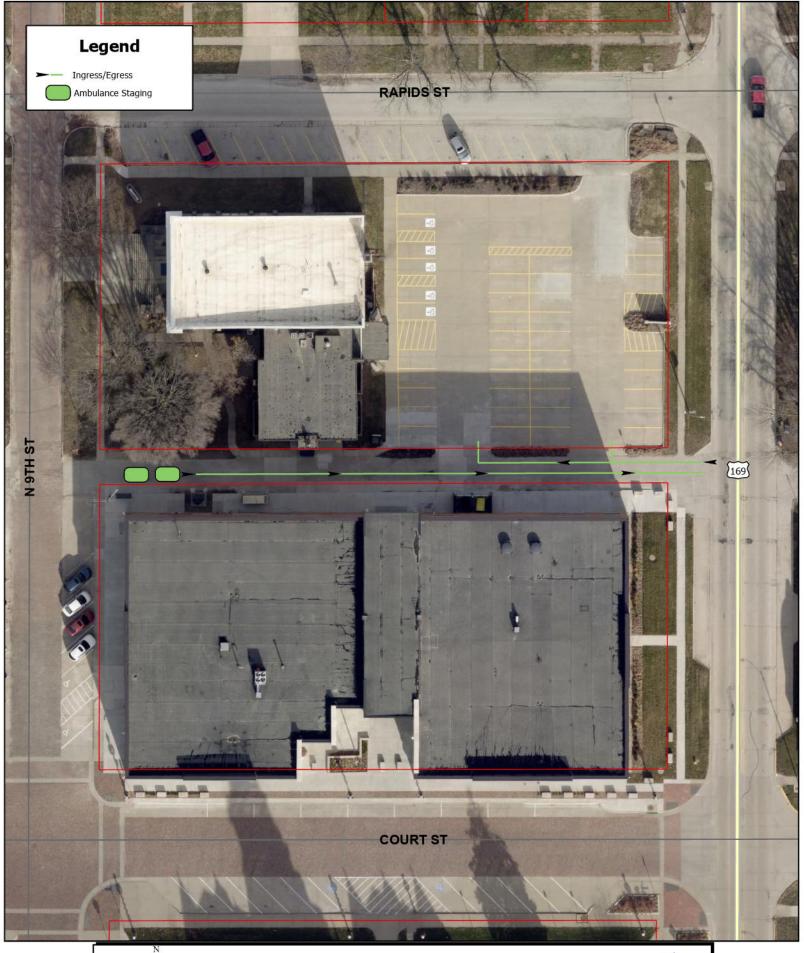

# Ordinance No. 432

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ADEL, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 165, ZONING CODE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING THE TIMELINE FOR PUBLISHED NOTICE RELATED TO ZONING MATTERS AND TO ADD A PRACTICAL DIFFICULTIES VARIANCE STANDARD

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Adel, Iowa, that:

**SECTION 1.** Section 165.17(1) of the zoning code is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

1. Administrative Review. To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is error in any order, requirement, decision, or determination made by the Zoning/Building Administrator in the enforcement of this chapter. Appeals to the Board may be taken by any person aggrieved, or by any officer, department, board or bureau of the City of Adel affected by any decision of the administrative officer. Such appeal shall be taken within 60 days by filing with the Zoning/Building Administrator, and with the Board a notice of appeal specifying the grounds thereof. The Zoning/Building Administrator shall forthwith transmit to the Board all papers constituting the record upon which the action appealed is taken. The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of the appeal, and give not less than four or more than 20 days' public notice in a paper of local circulation. At said hearing, any party may appear in person, by agent or by attorney. An appeal stays all proceedings in furtherance of the action appealed, unless the Zoning/Building Administrator from whom the appeal is taken certifies to the Board of Adjustment, after the Notice of Appeal is filed with the Administrator, that by reason of facts stated in the certificate, a stay would, in the Administrator's opinion, cause imminent peril to life and property. In such case proceedings shall not be stayed other than by a restraining order, which may be granted by the Board of Adjustment or by a court of record on application, on notice to the Zoning/Building Administrator from whom the appeal is taken and on due cause shown.

**SECTION 2.** Section 165.17(2)(B) of the zoning code is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

B. The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of the special exception, and give not less than four or more than 20 days' public notice in a paper of local circulation. At said hearing, any party may appear in person, by agent or by attorney.

**SECTION 3.** Section 165.17(3) of the zoning code is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

3. Variance, Conditions Governing Application; Procedures.

A. The Board of Adjustment may authorize upon appeal in specific cases not involving area, dimension, or other numerical limitations such variance from the terms of this chapter as will not be contrary to the public interest, where, owing to special

conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of this chapter would result in unnecessary hardship.

- B. The Board of Adjustment may authorize upon appeal in specific cases such variance from the terms of this chapter with respect to the area, dimension, or other numerical limitations as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of this chapter would result in practical difficulties to the property owner in making a beneficial use of the property allowed by the zoning ordinance.
- C. A variance from the terms of this chapter shall not be granted by the Board of Adjustment unless and until:
  - (1) For variances not involving area, dimension, or other numerical limitations, a written application for a variance is submitted demonstrating:
    - (a) That special conditions and circumstances exist which are peculiar to land, structure, or building involved and which are not applicable to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district;
    - (b) That literal interpretation of the provisions of this chapter would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the same district under the terms of this chapter;
    - (c) That the special conditions and circumstances do not result from the actions of the applicant;
    - (d) That granting the variance requested will not confer on the applicant any special privilege that is denied by this chapter to other lands, structures, or buildings in the same district.
  - (2) For variances involving area, dimension, or other numerical limitations, a written application for a variance is submitted demonstrating:
    - (a) That the practical difficulties faced are unique to the property at issue and not self-created by the applicant;
    - (b) That granting the variance requested will not significantly alter the essential character of the surrounding neighborhood.
- D. No nonconforming use of neighboring lands, structures, or buildings in the same district, and no permitted or nonconforming use of land, structures, or buildings in other districts may be considered grounds for the issuance of a variance.
- E. The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of the variance, and give not less than four or more than 20 days' public notice in a paper of local circulation. At said hearing, any party may appear in person, by agent or by attorney.
- F. The public hearing shall be held. Any party may appear in person, by agent or by attorney.
- G. The Board of Adjustment shall make findings that requirements of this section have been met by the applicant for a variance.
- H. The Board of Adjustment shall further make a finding that the reasons set forth in the application justify the granting of the variance, and that the variance is the minimum variance that will make possible the reasonable use of land, building, or structure.
- I. The Board of Adjustment shall further make a finding that the granting of the variance will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of this chapter, and will not be injurious to the neighborhood or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.

- J. In granting any variance, the Board of Adjustment may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards in conformity with this chapter. Violation of such conditions and safeguards, when made a part of the terms under which the variance is granted, shall be deemed a violation of this chapter and punishable under this chapter.
- K. Under no circumstances shall the Board of Adjustment grant a variance to allow a use not permissible under the terms of this chapter in the district involved or any use expressly or by implication prohibited by the terms of this chapter in said district.

**SECTION 4.** Section 165.19 of the zoning code is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

#### 165.19 AMENDMENTS TO ZONING CODE.

The regulations, restrictions, and boundaries may, from time to time, be amended, supplemented, changed, modified, or repealed, provided that at least four days' notice of the time and place of such hearing shall be published in a paper of general circulation in the City. In no case shall the notice be published more than 20 days prior to the hearing. Notwithstanding Section 414.2 of the *Code of Iowa*, as a part of an ordinance changing land from one zoning district to another zoning district or an ordinance approving a site development plan, a Council may impose conditions on a property owner which are in addition to existing regulations if the additional conditions have been agreed to in writing by the property owner before the public hearing required under this section or any adjournment of the hearing. The conditions must be reasonable and imposed to satisfy public needs which are directly caused by the requested change. In the case, however, of a written protest against a change or repeal which is filed with the City Clerk and signed by the owners of 20 percent or more of the area of the lots included in the proposed change or repeal, or by the owners of 20 percent or more of the property which is located within 200 feet of the exterior boundaries of the property for which the change or repeal is proposed, the change or repeal shall not become effective except by the favorable vote of at least three-fourths of all the members of the Council. The protest, if filed, must be filed before or at the public hearing. Proposed amendments not recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission shall become effective only upon a favorable vote of three-fourths of the members of the City Council. All zoning amendment application forms shall be approved by resolution of the City Council.

**SECTION 5.** Section 165.53(2) of the zoning code is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

2. Amendments. The regulations, restrictions, and boundaries may, from time to time, be amended, supplemented, changed, modified, or repealed, provided that at least four days' notice of the time and place of such hearing shall be published in a paper of general circulation in the City. In no case shall the notice be published more than 20 days prior to the hearing. Notwithstanding Section 414.2, as a part of an ordinance changing land from one zoning district to another zoning district or an ordinance approving a site development plan, the Council may impose conditions on a property owner which are in addition to existing regulations if the additional conditions have been agreed to in writing by the property owner before the public hearing required under this section or any adjournment of the hearing. The conditions must be reasonable and imposed to satisfy public needs which are directly caused by the requested change. In the

case, however, of a written protest against a change or repeal which is filed with the City Clerk and signed by the owners of twenty percent or more of the area of the lots included in the proposed change or repeal, or by the owners of twenty percent or more of the property that is located within two hundred feet of the exterior boundaries of the property for which the change or repeal is proposed, the change or repeal shall not become effective except by the favorable vote of at least three-fourths of all the members of the Council. The protest, if filed, must be filed before or at the public hearing. Proposed amendments not recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission shall become effective only upon a favorable vote of three-fourths of the members of the City Council. All zoning amendment application forms shall be approved by resolution of the Council.

**SECTION 6.** Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and publication as required by law.

**SECTION 7.** Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

**SECTION 8.** Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

## New Standards for Zoning Variances

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, Governor Reynolds signed into law Iowa House File 652. This law took effect on July 1, 2025, and amends Iowa Code sections 414.12 and 335.15 to change the criteria for granting certain zoning variances. House File 652 replaces the strict "unnecessary hardship" standard with a more flexible "practical difficulties" standard for some types of variance requests.

Gary Taylor, J.D. AICP, Professor and Extension Specialist with Iowa State University and Luke Seaberg, State Specialist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, wrote an article, <u>How HF 652</u> <u>Changes the Administration of Zoning Variances</u>, for the Iowa League of Cities' August edition of *CityScapes*. This article provides a good explanation of the variance process before and after the enactment of HF 652.

This new law impacts the powers of zoning boards of adjustment by creating a new, more lenient path for variance requests related to area, dimensional, or other numerical limitations imposed by local zoning regulations. Previously, a property owner had to demonstrate an "unnecessary hardship" to be granted any variance, which was a high bar to clear. The new law allows zoning boards of adjustment to grant relief to area, dimensional, or other numerical limitations upon a showing of "practical difficulties." Some examples of the zoning regulations covered by the new "practical difficulties" standard include:

- Minimum lot size
- Setbacks and yard widths
- Building height and bulk
- Sidewalk, fencing, and signage requirements
- Off-street parking rules

Under the new law, property owners requesting a variance for one of the covered zoning regulations mentioned above must still prove three things to a zoning board of adjustment:

- 1. The practical difficulties are unique to the property at issue and are not self-created. Meaning the problem must be inherent to the property itself, such as an irregular shape or unusual topography, and not a result of the owner's actions.
- 2. Granting the variance will not significantly alter the essential character of the surrounding neighborhood. Any change must keep the general aesthetics of the area.
- 3. The variance is not contrary to the public interest.

House File 652 does not remove the "unnecessary hardship" test for property owners to prove when seeking a variance from local floodplain regulations or any other zoning regulations. Property owners still have the burden of proving that complying with the floodplain or zoning regulations creates a hardship that is exceptional, unusual, and peculiar to their property and not to a structure, its inhabitants, or the property owners. It attempts to strike a balance between allowing property owners flexibility in how they want to develop their land and ensuring the spirit of the local zoning ordinance is maintained.

Communities with zoning regulations will need to update the variance provisions in their zoning ordinance to comply with the new law. For communities that have their floodplain regulations contained in a zoning ordinance, language should be included to clarify that variances from the floodplain regulations still must adhere to the unnecessary hardship test. This is a requirement for participating in the National Flood Insurance Program. Additionally, Iowa's state floodplain management rules require the applicant to prove undue hardship.

Communities with their floodplain regulations as a standalone ordinance are not required to make any changes to their floodplain ordinance. HF 652 only impacts zoning regulations.

Floodplain management regulations are based on public safety and damage reduction. When considering a variance request, such as one to waive or reduce the elevation requirement, it is essential to weigh the individual hardship against the community's need to protect its citizens from potential flood damage. Floodplain regulations are enacted to protect life and property from flood damage. A variance from full compliance with the floodplain regulations will further endanger the property owner and their structure to flood damage. Thus, granting a variance in this situation would be at odds with the spirit of the floodplain management ordinance.

It's worth remembering that all variance requests from local floodplain regulations require concurrence from the Iowa DNR's Floodplain Management Section before final approval.

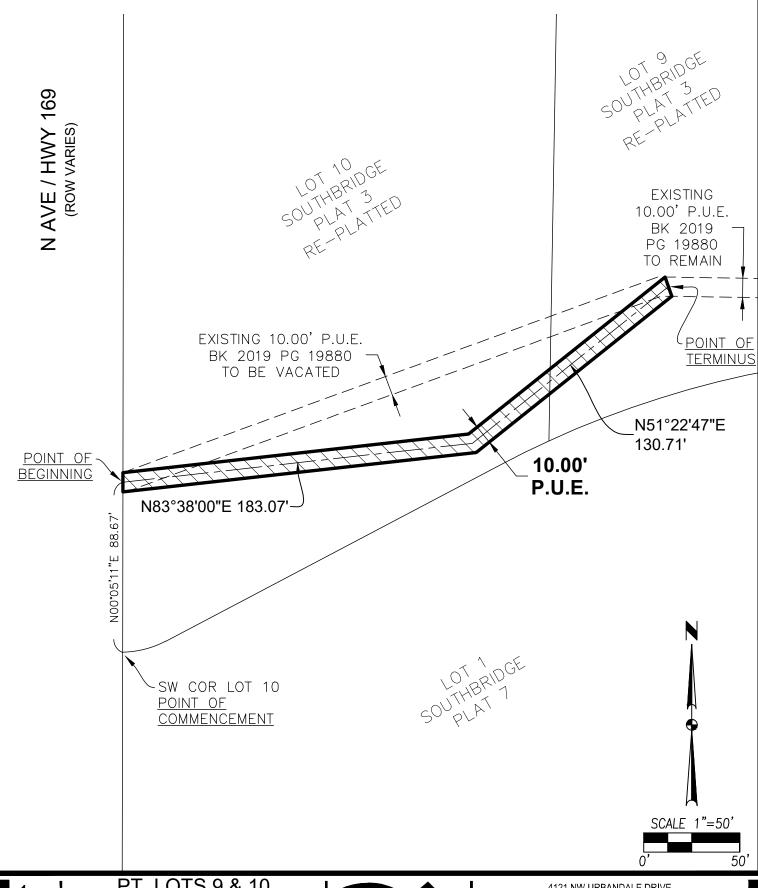

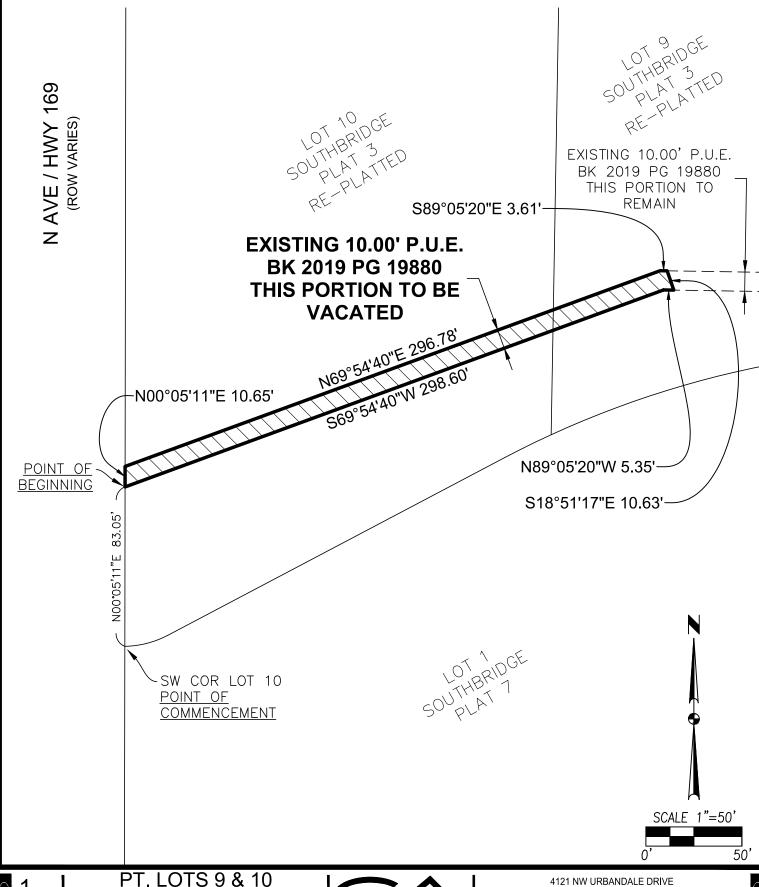

## RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AMENDED AND RESTATED ADEL URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 404, by action of the City Council on December 14, 2010, the City of Adel, Iowa (the "City") adopted the Urban Revitalization Plan (the "Original Plan") for the Adel Urban Revitalization Area (the "Urban Revitalization Area" or "Area"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council subsequently adopted seven amendments to the Original Plan; and

WHEREAS, by the foregoing action, the Council has determined that the Revitalization Area within the City can be revitalized as authorized by Iowa Code Chapter 404; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Amended and Restated Adel Urban Revitalization Plan ("Amended and Restated Plan" or "Plan") has been prepared as a further amendment to the Original Plan, the purpose of which is to consolidate the Original Plan and the previously adopted amendments into a single document; to amend the Plan's provisions to reflect recent legislative changes to Iowa Code Chapter 404 that took effect on July 1, 2024; and to extend the term of the revitalization program; and

WHEREAS, after published and mailed notice was given, as required by law, the City Council held a public hearing on October 14, 2025, on the Amended and Restated Plan and considered all objections, comments, and evidence presented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADEL, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That all objections received, if any, at the public hearing referred to in the preamble above are found to be without sufficient merit to warrant amending the proposed Amended and Restated Plan.

Section 2. That the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development, or a combination thereof, of the Revitalization Area, is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the City and that the Revitalization Area continues to substantially meets the criteria established in Iowa Code Section 404.1 (2-4) for a revitalization area.

Section 3. That the proposed Amended and Restated Plan is adopted in the form attached as Exhibit 1 to this Resolution; the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of the Amended and Restated Plan and this Resolution with the County Assessor.

Section 4. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

## AMENDED AND RESTATED ADEL URBAN REVITALIZATION PLAN FOR THE ADEL URBAN REVITALIZATION AREA

## I. INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

The Urban Revitalization Act, Chapter 404 of the *Code of Iowa*, is intended to encourage development, redevelopment, and revitalization within a designated area of a city by authorizing property tax development incentives to the private sector. Qualified real estate within a designated area may be eligible to receive a total or partial exemption from property taxes on improvements for a specified number of years. The primary intent of this act is to provide communities with a long-term increase or stabilization in their tax base by encouraging rehabilitation or new construction which might not otherwise have occurred.

The Urban Revitalization Plan ("Original Plan") for the City of Adel, Iowa (the "City") adopted by Resolution 10-55 on December 14, 2010 set forth an Exemption Schedule for Improvements on Qualified Real Estate completed during the 2011, 2012, and 2013 calendar years in the Adel Urban Revitalization Area (the "Revitalization Area" or "Area"). Amendment No. 1 to the Plan, adopted by Resolution No. 12-13 on March 13, 2012, modified the Exemption Schedule. Amendment No. 2, adopted by Resolution No. 12-59 on October 9, 2012, added annexed land not previously included in the Area. Amendment No. 3, adopted by Resolution No. 12-66 on December 11, 2012, modified the Exemption Schedule for 2013 and extended the program through calendar years 2014, 2015, and 2016. Amendment No. 4, adopted by Resolution No. 13-63 on November 12, 2013, added previously annexed land to the Area as well as automatically incorporating all land annexed into the City in the future into the Area as of the annexation date. Amendment No. 5, adopted by Resolution No. 14-36 on August 12, 2014, extended the Exemption Schedule for an additional nine years, thereby covering Improvements completed through December 31, 2025. Amendment No. 6, adopted by Resolution No. 17-02 on January 10, 2017, clarified the duration of the Original Plan/Area, incorporated a limitation to eligibility for property in an Urban Renewal Area, redefined Qualified Real Estate to include commercial property and multi-residential property, and added an Exemption Schedule for Improvements to Qualified Real Estate assessed as commercial or multi-residential property. Amendment No. 7, adopted by Resolution No. 17-49 on October 10, 2017, modified the exemption schedule for improvements to qualified real estate assessed as residential or multi-residential property and terminated the exemption schedule for improvements to qualified real estate assessed as residential or multiresidential property for improvements completed after January 1, 2021.

The City is now adopting this Amended and Restated Adel Urban Revitalization Plan (the "Amended and Restated Plan" or "Plan") for the Area in order to: (i) consolidate the Original Plan and Amendment Nos. 1-7 into a single revitalization plan document; (ii) update the Plan to accommodate legislative changes; and (iii) extend the term of the Plan. The City Council may adopt future amendments to this Plan that limit or adjust the eligibility provisions of the Plan.

Upon adoption of this Amended and Restated Plan, this Amended and Restated Plan shall replace the Original Plan, as previously amended. In case of any conflict or uncertainty, the terms of this Amended and Restated Plan shall control. Any parts of the Original Plan, as previously amended, in conflict with this Amended and Restated are hereby repealed.

## II. DESCRIPTION OF REVITALIZATION AREA

The property to be included in the Adel Urban Revitalization Area is legally described as follows:

All real property contained within the incorporated limits of the City of Adel, Dallas County, State of Iowa as those boundaries existed on January 1, 2013, and all areas thereafter annexed in the City of Adel effective immediately upon their annexation.

The City may amend the land included in the Revitalization Area, or adjust the boundaries of the Area, by adoption of future amendments to this Plan and by the adoption of additional designating ordinances or the repeal of existing designating ordinances.

## III. DESIGNATION OF REVITALIZATION AREA

Iowa Code Chapter 404 provides that the City Council may designate an area of the City as a revitalization area, if that area meets any of the criteria set forth in Iowa Code Section 404.1 The City Council has previously designated the Adel Urban Revitalization Area as an urban revitalization area under the criteria of Sections 404.1(2-4), which respectively provide the following criteria:

- 2. An area which by reason of the presence of a substantial number of deteriorated or deteriorating structures, predominance of defective or inadequate street layout, incompatible land use relationships, faulty lot layout in relation to size, adequacy, accessibility or usefulness, unsanitary or unsafe conditions, deterioration of site or other improvements, diversity of ownership, tax or special assessment delinquency exceeding the actual value of the land, defective or unusual conditions of title, or the existence of conditions which endanger life or property by fire and other causes, or a combination of such factors, substantially impairs or arrests the sound growth of a municipality, retards the provision of housing accommodations or constitutes an economic or social liability and is a menace to the public health, safety, or welfare in its present condition and use.
- 3. An area in which there is a predominance of buildings or improvements which by reason of age, history, architecture or significance should be preserved or restored to productive use.
- 4. An area which is appropriate as an economic development area as defined in section 403.17.

With the adoption of this Amended and Restated Plan, the City Council affirms that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development, or a combination thereof, of the Revitalization Area, is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the

residents of the City and that the Revitalization Area continues to substantially meets the criteria established in Iowa Code Section 404.1 (2-4) for a revitalization area.

### IX. EXISTING ZONING; EXISTING AND PROPOSED LAND USE

The City's zoning ordinance(s) and a detailed zoning map are available for public inspection at City Hall.

Existing land use categories are listed in the City's Comprehensive Plan which is available for public inspection at City Hall.

New and expanded commercial development, including improvements to and revitalization of existing commercial structures, is proposed for the Revitalization Area, in accordance with the City's zoning ordinance(s) and the City's Comprehensive Plan.

## V. PROPOSALS FOR EXPANDING CITY SERVICES

No extensions or upgrades to existing municipal services or infrastructure are currently planned as part of this Plan. As development and redevelopment within the Revitalization Area warrants, municipal services within the Revitalization Area will be expanded and improved, as needed and as financially feasible, to serve new and expanded development.

## VI. ELIGIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

Qualified Real Estate, as used in this Plan, means all real property that is (i) assessed as commercial, (ii) located within the Revitalization Area, and (iii) to which Eligible Improvements have been added during the time the property was included in the designated revitalization area.

<u>Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means improvements to Qualified Real Estate, including rehabilitation of and additions to any existing structures and new construction, that increase the actual value of the Qualified Real Estate by at least 15%. In order to be considered Eligible Improvements, the improvements must be completed in conformance with all applicable ordinances and regulations for the City and must be completed during the time the Area has been designated as a revitalization area.

<u>Actual Value Added by Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means the actual value added to the property's assessed valuation due to the Eligible Improvements as of the first year for which the exemption was received.

## VII. TIME FRAME

Revitalization activities in the Revitalization Area shall be eligible under this Plan until the City repeals or amends the ordinance(s) establishing the Revitalization Area, or repeals or amends the exemption benefits contained in this Plan.

If at any time, in the opinion of the City Council, the desired level of revitalization has been attained or economic conditions are such that the continuation of the exemptions granted in the Plan would cease to be of benefit to the City, then, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.7, the City Council may repeal the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, or any portion of the Revitalization Area. Following the repeal of the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, all previously approved exemptions shall continue until their expiration. The City reserves the right to extend, amend, terminate, or repeal the Plan and/or the designating ordinances to the extent allowed by law.

## VIII. EXEMPTIONS

The following exemption schedule is available under this Plan for Qualified Real Estate located within the Revitalization Area to which Eligible Improvements are made:

## **Commercial Property**

All Qualified Real Estate assessed as commercial property is eligible to receive exemption from taxation on Actual Value Added by the Eligible Improvements according to the following schedule:

1st Year	Seventy-Five percent (75%) of actual value added
2nd Year	Sixty percent (60%) of actual value added
3rd Year	Forty-Five percent (45%) of actual value added
4th Year	Thirty percent (30%) of actual value added
5th year	Fifteen percent (15%) of actual value added

#### IX. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

## <u>Application for Completed Improvements – "First Year Application"</u>

Property owners must file an application, on the form provided by the City, for each new exemption claimed. The application shall be filed by the property owner with the City Council by February 1 of the assessment year for which the exemption is first claimed, but not later than the year in which all improvements included in the project are first assessed for taxation, or the following two assessment years. The application shall contain, but is not limited to the following information:

- The nature of the improvement(s);
- The cost of the improvement(s);
- Estimated or actual completion date of the improvement(s);
- The tenants that occupied the property on the date the City adopted the resolution adopting the Original Plan, if known; and
- Identification of which exemption option the property owner is applying for under this Plan.

## Additional Requirement for Properties Assessed as Commercial

Property owners submitting applications on or after July 1, 2024 for improvements to property assessed as commercial must also enter into a written assessment agreement with the City, in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, specifying a minimum actual value for the completed improvements, consistent with and to the extent required by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 404 in effect at the time the application is submitted to the City.

## <u>Application for Prior Approval – Before Improvement Construction</u>

Property owners may submit a proposal for an improvement project to the City Council to receive prior approval for eligibility for a tax exemption on the project prior to construction of the project. The City Council shall give its prior approval if the project is in conformance with this Plan for revitalization. However, if the proposal is not approved, the owner(s) may submit an amended proposal for the City Council to approve or reject. Such prior approval shall not entitle the owner(s) to exemption from taxation until the improvements have been completed and found to be qualified for the exemption. Additionally, after receiving approval of the application for prior approval, the property owner must submit a first-year application to the City between January 1 and February 1 of the year in which all improvements in the project as first assessed. Failure to timely submit the second application may result in ineligibility of the improvements for a tax exemption under this Plan.

### X. APPLICATION REVIEW

The City Council shall, subject to review by the County Assessor, approve all applications submitted for approval if:

- 1. The project, as determined by the City Council, is in conformance with this Plan and all other requirements of City Code, including, but not limited to, zoning and building code requirements and receipt of a building permit (if required by City Code); and
- 2. The project is located within the Revitalization Area; and
- 3. The improvements were made during the time the Revitalization Area was so designated.

The City Council will determine which exemption is applicable to the project (if any), subject to review by the County Assessor, based upon the terms of the Plan in effect when the application is reviewed and approved by the Council.

All approved first-year applications shall be forwarded to the County Assessor by March 1 for review, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.5. The County Assessor shall make a physical review of all properties with approved applications. The County Assessor shall determine the increase in actual value for tax purposes due to the improvements and notify the applicant of the determination, which may be appealed to the local board of review pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa Code. After the initial tax exemption is granted, the County Assessor shall continue to grant the tax exemption for the time period specified on the approved application. The tax

exemptions for the succeeding years shall be granted without the owner(s) having to file an application for succeeding years.

## XI. OTHER SOURCES OF REVITALIZATION FUNDS

The City is not aware of a federal, state, or private grant or loan program that is permanently a source of funding for residential improvements in the Revitalization Area. However, it is not the intention of the City to prohibit the use of any other appropriate federal or state revitalization or incentive programs within the Revitalization Area. The City Council encourages all property owners to investigate other public and private funding sources for improvements to real property, and to apply to those sources which are applicable to the types of improvements being proposed.

## XII. RELOCATION PROVISIONS

The City does not anticipate the displacement or relocation of any persons, families, or businesses as a result of the improvements to be made in the Revitalization Area. However, if the relocation or displacement of a qualified tenant results from a property owner's action to qualify for a tax exemption under this Plan, upon the City's verification of such relocation or displacement, the City may require the property owner to compensate the qualified tenant for at least one month's rent and actual relocation expenses. A "qualified tenant" means the legal occupant of a residential dwelling unit which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same dwelling unit continuously since one year prior to the adoption of the Original Plan.

## XIII. ASSESSED VALUATIONS AND OWNERS OF RECORD

Listings of the names and addresses of the owners of record for all real estate in the Revitalization Area, along with the assessed valuations stated separately for land and buildings for the real estate, as of the adoption date of the Original Plan, is maintained in the office of the City Clerk.

#### XIV. LIMITATION TO ELIGIBILITY FOR PROPERTY IN URBAN RENEWAL AREA

The City has one or more urban renewal areas that may overlap with the Revitalization Area and, in the future, may establish additional urban renewal areas that overlap with the Revitalization Area. The City has a tax increment financing program within these urban renewal areas that is designed to provide incentives for development. Accordingly, a property that, in the determination of the City Council, is within an urban renewal area and is receiving either direct or indirect benefits that were financed through a tax increment financing program, shall not be eligible for tax abatement under the Plan absent specific approval from the City Council.

## XV. SEVERABILITY

If any part of the Amended and Restated Plan is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans as a whole or any part of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans, prior amendments to revitalization plans, or the Amended and Restated Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.

## XVI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Amended and Restated Plan shall be effective upon the approval of a resolution by the City Council adopting the Amended and Restated Plan ("Effective Date").

Applications submitted under this Plan following the Effective Date shall be eligible to apply only for those exemptions contained in this Amended and Restated Plan, subject to the terms of the Plan. All exemptions awarded prior to the Effective Date shall continue until their expiration.

## EXHIBIT A MINIMUM ASSESSMENT AGREEMENT

## I. INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

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- 3. An area in which there is a predominance of buildings or improvements which by reason of age, history, architecture or significance should be preserved or restored to productive use.
- 4. An area which is appropriate as an economic development area as defined in section 403.17.

With the adoption of this Amended and Restated Plan, the City Council affirms that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, economic development, or a combination thereof, of the Revitalization Area, is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the

residents of the City and that the Revitalization Area continues to substantially meets the criteria established in Iowa Code Section 404.1 (2-4) for a revitalization area.

#### IX. EXISTING ZONING; EXISTING AND PROPOSED LAND USE

The City's zoning ordinance(s) and a detailed zoning map are available for public inspection at City Hall.

Existing land use categories are listed in the City's Comprehensive Plan which is available for public inspection at City Hall.

New and expanded commercial development, including improvements to and revitalization of existing commercial structures, is proposed for the Revitalization Area, in accordance with the City's zoning ordinance(s) and the City's Comprehensive Plan.

## V. PROPOSALS FOR EXPANDING CITY SERVICES

No extensions or upgrades to existing municipal services or infrastructure are currently planned as part of this Plan. As development and redevelopment within the Revitalization Area warrants, municipal services within the Revitalization Area will be expanded and improved, as needed and as financially feasible, to serve new and expanded development.

## VI. ELIGIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

Qualified Real Estate, as used in this Plan, means all real property that is (i) assessed as commercial, (ii) located within the Revitalization Area, and (iii) to which Eligible Improvements have been added during the time the property was included in the designated revitalization area.

<u>Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means improvements to Qualified Real Estate, including rehabilitation of and additions to any existing structures and new construction, that increase the actual value of the Qualified Real Estate by at least 15%. In order to be considered Eligible Improvements, the improvements must be completed in conformance with all applicable ordinances and regulations for the City and must be completed during the time the Area has been designated as a revitalization area.

<u>Actual Value Added by Eligible Improvements</u>, as used in this Plan, means the actual value added to the property's assessed valuation due to the Eligible Improvements as of the first year for which the exemption was received.

## VII. TIME FRAME

Revitalization activities in the Revitalization Area shall be eligible under this Plan until the City repeals or amends the ordinance(s) establishing the Revitalization Area, or repeals or amends the exemption benefits contained in this Plan.

If at any time, in the opinion of the City Council, the desired level of revitalization has been attained or economic conditions are such that the continuation of the exemptions granted in the Plan would cease to be of benefit to the City, then, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.7, the City Council may repeal the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, or any portion of the Revitalization Area. Following the repeal of the ordinance(s) designating the Revitalization Area, all previously approved exemptions shall continue until their expiration. The City reserves the right to extend, amend, terminate, or repeal the Plan and/or the designating ordinances to the extent allowed by law.

## VIII. EXEMPTIONS

The following exemption schedule is available under this Plan for Qualified Real Estate located within the Revitalization Area to which Eligible Improvements are made:

## **Commercial Property**

All Qualified Real Estate assessed as commercial property is eligible to receive exemption from taxation on Actual Value Added by the Eligible Improvements according to the following schedule:

1st Year	Seventy-Five percent (75%) of actual value added
2nd Year	Sixty percent (60%) of actual value added
3rd Year	Forty-Five percent (45%) of actual value added
4th Year	Thirty percent (30%) of actual value added
5th year	Fifteen percent (15%) of actual value added

#### IX. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

## <u>Application for Completed Improvements – "First Year Application"</u>

Property owners must file an application, on the form provided by the City, for each new exemption claimed. The application shall be filed by the property owner with the City Council by February 1 of the assessment year for which the exemption is first claimed, but not later than the year in which all improvements included in the project are first assessed for taxation, or the following two assessment years. The application shall contain, but is not limited to the following information:

- The nature of the improvement(s);
- The cost of the improvement(s);
- Estimated or actual completion date of the improvement(s);
- The tenants that occupied the property on the date the City adopted the resolution adopting the Original Plan, if known; and
- Identification of which exemption option the property owner is applying for under this Plan.

### Additional Requirement for Properties Assessed as Commercial

Property owners submitting applications on or after July 1, 2024 for improvements to property assessed as commercial must also enter into a written assessment agreement with the City, in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A, specifying a minimum actual value for the completed improvements, consistent with and to the extent required by the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 404 in effect at the time the application is submitted to the City.

## <u>Application for Prior Approval – Before Improvement Construction</u>

Property owners may submit a proposal for an improvement project to the City Council to receive prior approval for eligibility for a tax exemption on the project prior to construction of the project. The City Council shall give its prior approval if the project is in conformance with this Plan for revitalization. However, if the proposal is not approved, the owner(s) may submit an amended proposal for the City Council to approve or reject. Such prior approval shall not entitle the owner(s) to exemption from taxation until the improvements have been completed and found to be qualified for the exemption. Additionally, after receiving approval of the application for prior approval, the property owner must submit a first-year application to the City between January 1 and February 1 of the year in which all improvements in the project as first assessed. Failure to timely submit the second application may result in ineligibility of the improvements for a tax exemption under this Plan.

### X. APPLICATION REVIEW

The City Council shall, subject to review by the County Assessor, approve all applications submitted for approval if:

- 1. The project, as determined by the City Council, is in conformance with this Plan and all other requirements of City Code, including, but not limited to, zoning and building code requirements and receipt of a building permit (if required by City Code); and
- 2. The project is located within the Revitalization Area; and
- 3. The improvements were made during the time the Revitalization Area was so designated.

The City Council will determine which exemption is applicable to the project (if any), subject to review by the County Assessor, based upon the terms of the Plan in effect when the application is reviewed and approved by the Council.

All approved first-year applications shall be forwarded to the County Assessor by March 1 for review, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 404.5. The County Assessor shall make a physical review of all properties with approved applications. The County Assessor shall determine the increase in actual value for tax purposes due to the improvements and notify the applicant of the determination, which may be appealed to the local board of review pursuant to the provisions of the Iowa Code. After the initial tax exemption is granted, the County Assessor shall continue to grant the tax exemption for the time period specified on the approved application. The tax

exemptions for the succeeding years shall be granted without the owner(s) having to file an application for succeeding years.

### XI. OTHER SOURCES OF REVITALIZATION FUNDS

The City is not aware of a federal, state, or private grant or loan program that is permanently a source of funding for residential improvements in the Revitalization Area. However, it is not the intention of the City to prohibit the use of any other appropriate federal or state revitalization or incentive programs within the Revitalization Area. The City Council encourages all property owners to investigate other public and private funding sources for improvements to real property, and to apply to those sources which are applicable to the types of improvements being proposed.

## XII. RELOCATION PROVISIONS

The City does not anticipate the displacement or relocation of any persons, families, or businesses as a result of the improvements to be made in the Revitalization Area. However, if the relocation or displacement of a qualified tenant results from a property owner's action to qualify for a tax exemption under this Plan, upon the City's verification of such relocation or displacement, the City may require the property owner to compensate the qualified tenant for at least one month's rent and actual relocation expenses. A "qualified tenant" means the legal occupant of a residential dwelling unit which is located within the designated Revitalization Area and who has occupied the same dwelling unit continuously since one year prior to the adoption of the Original Plan.

### XIII. ASSESSED VALUATIONS AND OWNERS OF RECORD

Listings of the names and addresses of the owners of record for all real estate in the Revitalization Area, along with the assessed valuations stated separately for land and buildings for the real estate, as of the adoption date of the Original Plan, is maintained in the office of the City Clerk.

#### XIV. LIMITATION TO ELIGIBILITY FOR PROPERTY IN URBAN RENEWAL AREA

The City has one or more urban renewal areas that may overlap with the Revitalization Area and, in the future, may establish additional urban renewal areas that overlap with the Revitalization Area. The City has a tax increment financing program within these urban renewal areas that is designed to provide incentives for development. Accordingly, a property that, in the determination of the City Council, is within an urban renewal area and is receiving either direct or indirect benefits that were financed through a tax increment financing program, shall not be eligible for tax abatement under the Plan absent specific approval from the City Council.

## XV. SEVERABILITY

If any part of the Amended and Restated Plan is determined to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans as a whole or any part of the previously adopted urban revitalization plans, prior amendments to revitalization plans, or the Amended and Restated Plan not determined to be invalid or unconstitutional.

## XVI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Amended and Restated Plan shall be effective upon the approval of a resolution by the City Council adopting the Amended and Restated Plan ("Effective Date").

Applications submitted under this Plan following the Effective Date shall be eligible to apply only for those exemptions contained in this Amended and Restated Plan, subject to the terms of the Plan. All exemptions awarded prior to the Effective Date shall continue until their expiration.

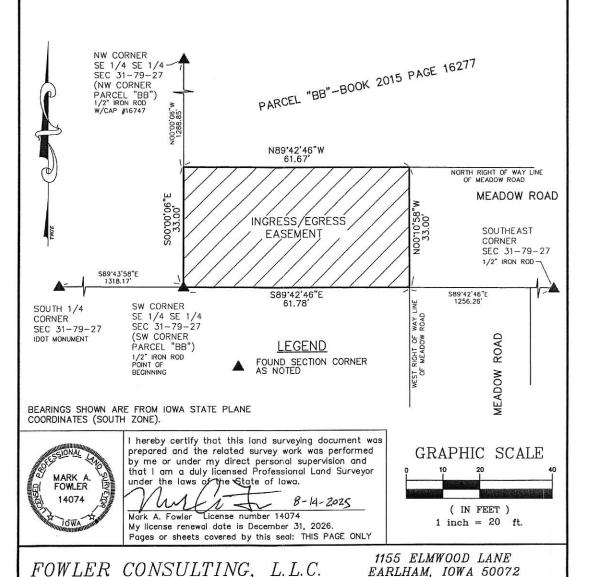

#### Task Order Scope of Work

#### I. PROJECT INFORMATION

- A. The PROJECT includes the functional design study of Meadow Road from S 15<sup>th</sup> Street and US Highway 169 in the City of Adel, Iowa. Refer to Exhibit F in this Task Order for study limits.
- **B.** The PROJECT will provide a planning document that identifies a full-build of Meadow Road. The proposed roadway is anticipated to include a 44-foot urban section including two through lanes with a center two-way-left-turn (TWTL). A 10-foot trail and 5-foot sidewalk will also be included throughout the corridor.
- C. The PROJECT will include utility planning of sanitary sewer needs, water main adjustments, and storm water sewer collection and conveyance.
- D. The PROJECT also includes topographical survey, right-of-way analysis, and cost estimation.

#### II. SCOPE OF SERVICES

## A. Phase 100 – Preliminary Planning and Reports

- 1. Task 101 Functional Design
  - a. Traffic Analysis

#### RESOLUTION NO. 25-19

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING STAFF TO PROCEED WITH TRANSITION OF LANDFILL PROPERTY AND OPERATIONS TO THE CITY OF ADEL

WHEREAS, on April 20, 1970, the City of Adel entered into a 28E Agreement creating the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency; and

WHEREAS, the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency was created for the purpose of collecting and disposing of solid waste within its member communities; and

WHEREAS, since 1992, the City of Adel has been the sole member of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency; and

WHEREAS, currently all real and personal property, employees, permits, agreements and insurance related to the landfill's operations are held in the name of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Adel City Council believes it is prudent and necessary to begin the process of dissolving the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency and formally transferring its assets, liabilities and operations to the City to be operated as a City enterprise.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADEL, IOWA:

- Section 1. That City staff is hereby authorized and directed to begin the process of formally transferring the assets, liabilities and operations of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency to the City of Adel to be operated as a City enterprise, to be effective on July 1, 2026.
- Section 2. Upon completion of the transfer of the assets, liabilities and operations of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill to the City, it shall be appropriate and necessary to dissolve the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency.
- Section 3. That City staff, in consultation with legal counsel, is authorized and directed to prepare all documents which may be necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.
- Section 4. That upon its approval, the City Clerk shall deliver a copy of this Resolution to the South Dallas County Landfill Agency.

The City of Adel has requested assistance from legal counsel to advise on the process for transferring its local landfill from a previously formed 28E arrangement to the City for full and complete control, and subsequently terminating the longstanding 28E agreement that formed the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency, which has long overseen and operated said landfill.

# **Factual Background**

On April 20, 1970, five municipalities—Earlham, Van Meter, DeSoto, Redfield, and Adel—executed a 28E agreement for the joint exercise of their powers to form a local sanitary landfill. See 28E Agreement. The agreement resulted in the creation of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency ("Landfill"). Id. To provide for the joint exercise of powers over the landfill, the agreement created an "Agency Board," made up of one elected representative of the governing bodies of each participating member community. Id. § III(a). The agreement's expressed intent was to create a lasting joint operation to maintain, operate, and oversee the landfill permanently. 28E Agreement § IV(1).

The next year, in 1971, Dallas County joined the Landfill, followed by the City of Waukee in 1972, and the City of Dallas Center and the City of Dexter in 1973. Settlement Agreement § 2. Over time, however, member municipalities withdrew from the joint agreement. Dallas County was the last joint member to leave the Landfill in 1992, leaving the City of Adel as its sole remaining member. *Id.* 

A dispute developed between the Landfill and its former members, resulting is a lawsuit brought by the Landfill against the former members in the Iowa District Court for Dallas County. The dispute centered on continued monetary obligations by the former members for the closure and post-closure maintenance of the Northeast Area (used September 01, 1970-March 01, 1986) and the Southwest Area (used March 01, 1986-February 01, 1993), which activities are required by state and federal law. Settlement Agreement Preamble, § 1. The lawsuit resulted in a settlement amongst the Landfill and former members, except Dallas County and the City of Waukee, providing for the apportionment of the various members' monetary obligations for area closure and post-closure maintenance, as well as a payment schedule therefore. Based on the settlement agreement, the Landfill is expected to receive its final settlement contributions from Redfield,

Dexter, and Dallas Center in 2025 (totaling \$6,716). Landfill Audit p. 19; Settlement Agreement § 9. The settlement agreement also restricted the continued operations and functions of the original Landfill to the vertical expansion of the Northeast Area and the closure and post-closure care of the Northeast Area and Southwest Area. Settlement Agreement § 11(b). Any additional undertakings were to be undertaken by a new entity, separate and apart from the history and relations of the original 28E agreement. *Id*.

In 2008, the Landfill requested a legal opinion from its counsel to advise on the City's potential liability for actions of the Landfill. The Landfill's counsel concluded that no separate legal entity was ever created by the original 28E agreement and that a 28E agreement with just one remaining active member to the agreement does not legally survive because 28E agreements and operations are intended for joint undertakings between or among members. Counsel Letter, Feb. 25, 2008; Counsel Letter, April 21, 2008. The Landfill's counsel advised the Landfill and the City to seek another legal vehicle for operating the landfill, namely for the City to take unambiguous title and control of the landfill and maintain it as a function of the City. Counsel Letter, Feb. 25, 2008; Counsel Letter, April 21, 2008.

Since around 1992, when the City of Adel became the sole remaining member of the Landfill, the Landfill and the City of Adel have continued to operate the landfill as an independent, if not wholly separate, agency. The Landfill continues to function as a board-governed entity, with the City of Adel's representative as the Landfill's single remaining member. The Landfill's Director, Mike Fountas, serves as the Board Secretary. We understand the City of Adel to no longer be making annual contributions to the Landfill, per the original 28E agreement. The Landfill has continued its operations as an independent agency based on the possibility that former or separate communities would (re)join the 28E agreement; as time has passed, such a possibility is no longer realistic.

The Landfill holds title to its real and personal property acquired and used for landfill operations, including the open and closed deposit areas, a compactor, bulldozer, loader, grader, and other equipment with a total value of approximately \$2 million. Add'l Prop. Stmt. Values, ICAP. The Landfill maintains restricted cash balances to fund the post-closure care of the Landfill's closed areas as well as the closure and post-closure care costs of the areas that remain open, as required by state law. See Iowa Code § 455B.306. The Landfill's restricted (closure and post-closure care funds) and unrestricted cash balances total approximately \$12 million. Landfill's Audit p. 6.

The Landfill employs its director and three (3) operators. Payroll is handled by a CPA firm engaged by the Landfill. The Landfill's employees are provided pensions through the Iowa Public Employees' Retirement System (IPERS), and IPERS membership is mandatory for the Landfill's employees. Landfill Audit pp. 10-13.

The Landfill maintains casualty and property insurance through the Iowa Communities Assurance Pool (ICAP). Landfill Audit p. 16-17. The Landfill also maintains additional commercial coverage for worker's compensation through other insurers. Landfill Audit p. 17.

The Landfill contracts with Metro Waste Authority—a Solid Waste contract and a Household Solid Waste Contract. The Landfill generates revenue primarily through tonnage fees paid by the solid waste collectors and investment returns. Ankeny Sanitation contracts with the City of Adel for residential solid waste collection and delivers the collected solid waste to the Landfill. The Landfill does not contract directly with Ankeny Sanitation. Waste Management provides commercial solid waste collection within the City of Adel and delivers those collections to the Landfill but, again, does not contract directly with the Landfill.

According to the Landfill's 2024 Financial Audit, the Landfill's estimated remaining life is seven (7) years, with approximately 69.1% of its capacity used as of June 30, 2024. Landfill Audit p. 14.

### **Discussion**

# Summary of Landfill Legal Counsel Assessments and Advice

In his 2008 analysis, the Landfill's legal counsel analyzed the Landfill's legal status following the departure of all its members save the City of Adel. The Landfill's attorney first determined that the language of the original 28E agreement did not provide for the creation of a separate entity to conduct the joint landfill operations. Counsel Letter, Feb. 25, 2008, pp. 1-2. He also concluded the parties did not intend to create a separate entity and, instead, likely intended to create a joint board for the Landfill's operations. *Id.* p. 2; *see* Iowa Code § 28E.6. Finally, counsel determined that in the absence of all other members, aside from the City of Adel, the Landfill does not legally survive as an entity originally formulated and constituted under Iowa Code chapter 28E—a law enabling joint operations by two or more entities, one of which must be public. *Id.* p. 3. As a result, the Landfill's attorney found the Landfill's identity essentially equated to that of the City of Adel, and the Landfill's liability would flow to the City; he advised the Landfill and the City to create an alternative legal entity or vehicle to continue carrying on operations.

Legal counsel followed up his initial opinion with a subsequent review that included further assessing the 1996 Settlement Agreement under the same context. Counsel Letter, April 21, 2008. In this second opinion, the Landfill's attorneys determined that the Settlement Agreement further supported the need for the Landfill to create a new entity or vehicle to carry on expanded operations beyond the Northeast Area and the Southwest Areas that were subject of the lawsuit. *Id.* p. 1-3. Legal counsel further advised that the City of Adel likely could not create an administrative agency under Iowa Code chapter 392, because the City could not delegate functions of a "city enterprise" under Iowa Code chapter 384 (a landfill is considered a type of "city enterprise"), to an administrative agency. *Id.* p. 3. Therefore, the attorneys advised that the City of Adel would need to assume landfill operations as a city function. *Id.* 

### City Attorney Opinion on Transferring Landfill Ownership and Operations

We have reviewed and considered the assessments and recommendations of the Landfill's legal counsel. We do not disagree with their determinations summarized above, aside from one point.

In his April 21, 2008 letter, legal counsel advised that he did not believe the City could establish an administrative agency to oversee and run the landfill. Our reading of Iowa Code section 392.1, providing for administrative agencies, does not prevent the City of Adel from establishing the new landfill as an administrative agency simply because a landfill qualifies as a "city enterprise" under Iowa Code chapter 384. However, if the City chose to create an administrative agency to operate the landfill, the City Council could not delegate its revenue financing authorities provided for under Iowa Code chapter 384, subchapter V, to the agency; instead, the Council must retain those powers. But if the City established the landfill as an administrative agency, it could delegate authority to establish and collect charges and disburse moneys, strictly subject to the limitations imposed by any outstanding revenue financing for the landfill. Iowa Code § 392.1. If the City desired to establish the landfill as an administrative agency, it must do so by ordinance providing for the powers, duties, method of appointment or election, qualification, compensation, and term of its members. *Id*.

Separately, because the Landfill has essentially been operated and functioned as an independent entity since 1992, when the City of Adel became the sole remaining member, despite the potential legal illegitimacy of the entity, we believe the most practical approach to transferring operations to the City of Adel and winding down the Landfill would be to continue treating the Landfill as an independent entity. Given the relative sophistication of the Landfill's operations and the substantial assets involved, undertaking a formal planning, preparation, and transfer will reduce risks of errors, oversights, or future liability, and best position the City of Adel to assume operations for the remaining years of the landfill's useful life.

# Planning for the Transfer of Landfill Ownership and Operations to the City of Adel

The process for transferring the Landfill's real and personal property to the City of Adel and the City of Adel's formal assumption of the Landfill's operations and assets will require careful sequencing of several steps to complete.

An initial step to this process will be planning for the City of Adel to receive the transfer of the Landfill's existing Solid Waste Disposal Permit from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. The City should review either the Landfill's or its own documentation providing for the implementation of solid waste disposal methods other than final disposal in a sanitary landfill. Such documentation is a prerequisite to issuance of a permit. See Iowa Code § 455B.305(2). Further, the City should review and confirm the adequacy of the Landfill's leachate control system. Id. § 455B.305(3). Additionally, the City should review the Landfill's most recent inspection reports from either the Iowa Department of Natural Resources or the local board of health. Id. § 455B.305(1)(b). The City should also review the Landfill's comprehensive plans for the disposal of solid waste and the solid waste reduction program, if either of these are not already maintained by the City. Id. §§ 455B.306(1), .306(1)(a). The City should also review the Landfill's compliance with Iowa Code chapter 455B, overall, and the adequacy of the Landfill's equipment and personnel to continue operating the landfill. Iowa Admin. Code r. 567—102.8(1). Completing this review, and making any necessary updates or taking any necessary actions, will facilitate the transfer of the Landfill's Solid Waste Disposal Permit to the City's name when the time comes. Id. It is

advisable to coordinate with the Department of Natural Resources in advance to best facilitate a smooth permit transfer.

Absent any identified issues with the transfer of the Solid Waste Disposal Permit, it may be useful, for the purposes of documenting the effort, for the Landfill and the City to approve respective resolutions of support of the decision to transfer operations from the Landfill to the City and expressing intended cooperation between the parties for the accomplishment thereof.

Next, the City should plan for the assumption of landfill operations within its overall operations. This could be the formation of an administrative agency to oversee and run the landfill, or as, as the Landfill's legal counsel indicated, through the creation of a new department or division within city operations. If the former, the City would likely need to establish the administrative agency by ordinance, staff it, and empower it to carry out the transfer and assumption of the Landfill, subject to Council approval as necessary.

If the City decided to simply bring the landfill operations "in house," City staff will need make recommendations to structure the new landfill department or division within existing city operations. This may also require an ordinance to establish a new city department or division. Such planning may also include creating new positions with the applicable hierarchy and updating employee and compensation handbooks, which will require Council approval. Further, the efforts may require a budget amendment or incorporation of the future employees and operating costs into the next fiscal year's budget, also subject to Council approval.

A note, any legislation should also amend City Code sections 105.11 and 106.08's references to the "South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency," which will soon be no more.

Following permit and personnel preparation, the Landfill and the City may focus on the transfer of assets. The Landfill's known assets include the real estate on which the landfill is located, the Landfill's equipment (valued at approximately \$2 million), and the Landfill's cash accounts (valued at approximately \$12 million). The parties may wish to complete the transfer via either an asset purchase agreement or a gift agreement between two government entities. However, given the involvement of prior members in the Landfill's acquisition of some assets and the questionability of the Landfill's legal entity status, it may be best to pursue an asset purchase agreement. Once a mutual agreement is drawn up to transfer the assets, the City may approve the acquisition of the assets and authorize the agreement's execution by resolution. Subsequently, the Landfill should set a public hearing by resolution for the proposal to convey the real property to the City of Adel, publish notice, hold the public hearing, and approve the conveyance of the Landfill's assets to the City of Adel. See Iowa Code § 364.7. Once the parties have executed the asset purchase agreement, the transaction may be completed pursuant to the terms and title transferred via deed and bill of sale, and recorded.

Within 30 days of the transfer, the City must apply in writing to the Department of Natural Resources for the transfer of the Solid Waste Disposal Permit from the Landfill to the City. Iowa Admin. Code r. 567—102(8). The Landfill's existing Solid Waste Disposal Permit will become invalid 60 days following the transfer of title. *Id.* r. 567—102.8(2).

Upon completion of the transfer of the Landfill's assets, the Landfill and the City should handle the insurance of the assets. The Landfill should seek to either assign its ICAP casualty and property insurance to the City of Adel or cancel the policy upon the City's confirmation of its insuring the assets and operations.

Near in time to the closing of the transaction transferring the Landfill's assets to the City, the Landfill should terminate its employees, and the City should hire the employees. This should be conducted in accordance with each entity's policies and procedures. As part of the transfer of employment, the Landfill and the City should review the employees' benefits for comparability and transferability, including IPERS benefits and compensated absences. Once the Landfill's employees are transferred to the City, the Landfill may cancel any commercial insurance policies it maintains for worker's compensation, pursuant to the terms of such plans.

The Landfill may require a short-term agreement to retain its Director to complete the final dissolution, wind up and termination, or, alternatively, a later termination and re-hiring by the City than the other Landfill employees.

The Landfill will need to assign its existing contracts with Metro Waste Authority to the City, pursuant to the terms of those agreements. The City may accept such assignment through an assumption agreement provided for under the asset purchase agreement, or via separate resolution.

Having transferred essentially all of the assets and obligations of the Landfill, the City may at this point withdraw from the original 28E agreement. The City should adopt and approve a resolution to withdraw from the Landfill and direct notice of withdrawal to be provided to the Landfill. Upon receipt of notice, the Landfill should adopt a resolution receiving the City of Adel's notice of withdrawal, acknowledging the departure of its final member, and directing dissolution, wind up, and termination, which must pass by 3/4 majority vote. 28E Agreement, Section IX(2). Pursuant to the 28E agreement's Section IX(1), when a member withdraws, they "shall/shall not" be entitled to a prorated share of the Landfill's assets. Withdrawing members may waive any rights to a prorated share. 28E Agreement, Section IX(1). Given that the last member, aside from Adel, withdrew in 1992, it may be assumed that any waivers or prorated distributions were settled at the time of each previous member's respective withdraw. However, the Landfill may review its records and weigh in to the contrary or correction of this assumption. But it is unlikely the Landfill will need to make any distribution to the prior members to compensate for their early contributions in the acquisition of assets. Additionally, Section IX(3) provides that in the event of complete dissolution of the Landfill, any real or personal property shall be sold and the proceeds distributed to the municipalities at the time of dissolution. Given that the Landfill will have already transferred its assets to the City of Adel, there should not be anything left to dispose of. However, if the Landfill has any proceeds to assets remaining following its transaction with the City of Adel and upon its final dissolution, those should be distributed to the City of Adel—as the sole remaining member at the time of complete dissolution.

Once the Landfill has completed any and all remaining business, the Landfill should cause a notice of the original 28E's termination to be filed with the Secretary of State. See Iowa Code

28E.8(1)(b). The filing of this notice should be the final step and achieve the dissolution and termination of the South Dallas County Sanitary Landfill Agency, originally constituted under Iowa Code chapter 28E.

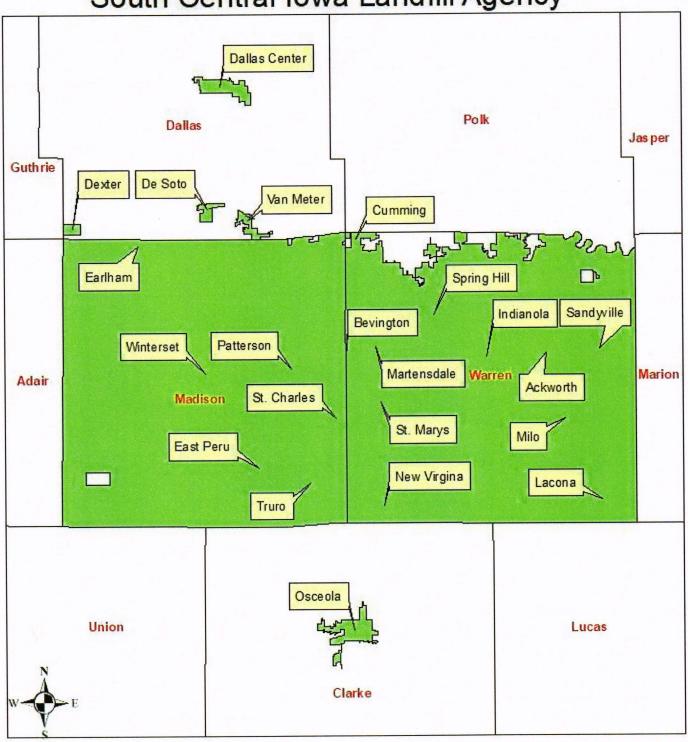

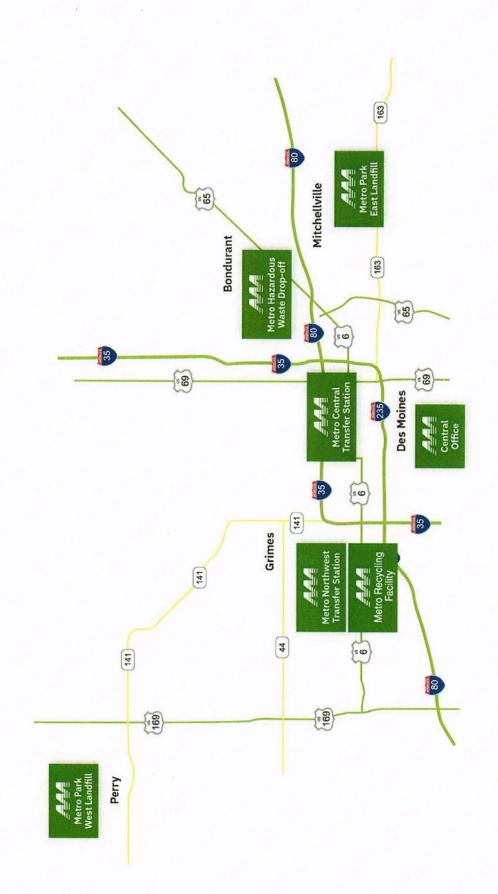

# **CPI Method**

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) Method to determine unit costs has historically been used for PCC reconstruction projects in the City of Adel. This method uses the Flint Formula to calculate the number of units assigned to each parcel. The unit cost is determined by the increase in average CPI from previous projects based on the year constructed. The following indicates the increase in unit cost from the previous 2017 Brick Streets project.

Based on a unit price of \$69.67/unit the attached parcel assessments and schedule are assigned to each parcel along the Rapids Street corridor. Excluding the ADM School property, the average assessment applied to each resident is \$7,738.06, and the total amount assessed totals \$317,077.09. This is 6.18% of the total project costs of \$5,127,534.26 (60% Design Cost Opinion).

# Straight Flint Method

Similar to the CPI Method, the Straight Flint Method uses the Flint Formula to determine the number of units to be assessed on the project. The difference is the unit cost calculation based on what items are selected to be assessed. For the purposes of this report McClure looked at five scenarios to calculate the unit costs for the Straight Flint Method. The scenario descriptions are as follows:

- 1. **Scenario 1** This scenario includes the entire project costs consisting of all anticipated construction costs, contingency, engineering services, and legal/admin costs.
- 2. **Scenario 2** This scenario includes all roadway pavement (minus intersections), storm sewer, water/sanitary service lines, sidewalks, driveways, partial engineering, and partial legal/admin costs. Items removed are removal items, lump sum items (needed to construct the project), and associated portions of engineering and legal/admin costs.
- 3. **Scenario 3** This scenario is similar to Scenario 2 but the costs for sidewalks, driveways, and storm sewer costs were also removed from the assessed items.
- 4. **Scenario 4** This scenario includes all roadway pavement (minus intersections and modified subbase), water/sanitary service lines, temporary water main, partial engineering, and partial legal/admin costs.
- 5. **Scenario 5** This scenario includes water/sanitary/storm service lines, sidewalks, driveways, surface preparation (topsoil and seeding), partial engineering, and partial legal/admin costs.

Based on the five scenarios, an associated unit cost was applied to each parcel assessment. The breakdown of average assessed cost (without the ADM School property), total assessed costs, percentage of property owner contribution, and percentage of City contribution for each scenario are as follows:

# Area Method

The area method is a different assessment method to determine the number of units assigned to each parcel adjacent to the project. This method assigns a unit factor based on parcel area with in a 50-foot interval outside the right-of-way up to 300-feet. A table of factors applied to this project is listed in the table below.

# IOWA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION Federal-Aid Agreement for a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Project

This agreement, made as of the date of the last party's signature below, is between City of Adel (hereinafter referred to as Subrecipient) and the Iowa Department of Transportation, the federal pass-through entity (hereinafter referred to as the Department). Iowa Code Sections 306A.7 and 307.44 provide for the Subrecipient and the Department to enter into agreements with each other for the purpose of financing transportation improvement projects in Iowa with federal funds. Federal regulations require federal funds to be administered by the Department. The federal-aid highway funds included in this agreement are jointly implemented by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Department.

The Subrecipient has received federal funding through the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), which is funded by the Transportation Alternatives Set-aside of the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (TA Set-aside), as codified in Section 133(h) of Title 23, United States Code (U.S.C.), which are hereinafter referred to as TA Set-aside funds. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number and title for this funding is 20.205 Highway Planning and Construction.

Pursuant to the terms of this agreement, applicable statutes, and administrative rules, the Department agrees to provide the funding named above to the Subrecipient for the authorized and approved costs for eligible items associated with the project.

Under this agreement, the parties further agree as follows:

- 1. The Subrecipient shall be responsible for carrying out the provisions of this agreement.
- 2. All notices required under this agreement shall be made in writing to the appropriate contact person. The Department's contact person shall be Emily Whaley, Local Systems Bureau, 800 Lincoln Way, Ames, Iowa 50010, 515-239-1629. The Subrecipient's contact person shall be Carrie Erickson, City Clerk; 515-993-4525; City of Adel, 301 S. 10<sup>th</sup> St., PO Box 248, Adel, Iowa 50003.
- 3. The Subrecipient shall be responsible for the development and completion of the following described project:

Adel Recreation Trail- Evans Park to Raccoon River Valley Trail: In the city of Adel, along S 14th St trail connecting Evans Park trail north to Raccoon River Valley Trail

- 4. The Subrecipient shall receive reimbursement for costs of authorized and approved eligible project activities under the TAP program from TA Set-aside funds. The portion of the project costs reimbursed with TA Set-aside funds shall be limited to a maximum of either 80 percent of eligible costs (other than those reimbursed with other federal funds) or the amount listed (\$250,000) in the Central Iowa Regional Transportation Planning Alliance (CIRTPA) current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and approved in the current Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), whichever is less. Eligible project activities will be as described in Section 133(h) of Title 23, United States Code (U.S.C.), and determined by the Department to be eligible.
- 5. Eligible project costs in excess of the amount reimbursed by the Department above will be considered the local contribution and may include cash, non-cash or approved state fund contributions, subject to Department approval. The local contribution must equal a minimum of 20 percent of eligible project costs. The subrecipient shall certify to the Department the value of any non-cash contribution to the project prior to it being incurred and in accordance with the procedures outlined in the applicable Instructional Memorandum to Local Public Agencies (I.M.s). The Department retains the sole authority to determine the eligibility and value of the Subrecipient's non-cash contribution for the purposes of this agreement. If the Subrecipient's total cash and non-cash contribution is determined by the Department to be less than that required by this agreement, the Subrecipient shall increase its cash contribution or the grant amount associated with this project shall be reduced accordingly.
- 6. The Subrecipient must have let the contract or have construction started within two years of October 1, 2024. If the Subrecipient does not do this, they will be in default for which the Department can revoke funding commitments. The Department may approve extensions of this agreement for periods up to six months upon receipt of a written request from the Subrecipient at least sixty (60) days prior to the deadline.
- 7. If the Subrecipient fails to perform any obligation under this agreement, the Department shall have the right, after first giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Subrecipient by certified mail return receipt requested, to declare any part or all of this agreement in default. The Subrecipient shall have thirty (30) days from date of mailing of the notice to cure the default. If the Recipient cures the default, the Subrecipient shall notify Department no later than five (5) days after cure or before the end of said thirty (30) day period given to cure the default. The Department may thereafter determine whether the default has, in fact, been cured, or whether the Subrecipient remains in default.
- 8. This agreement may be declared to be in default by the Department if the Department determines that the Subrecipient's application for funding contained inaccuracies, omissions, errors or misrepresentations; or if the Department determines that the project is not developed as described in the application and according to the requirements of this agreement.
- 9. In the event a default is not cured the Department may do any of the following: a) revoke funding commitments of funds loaned or granted by this agreement; b) seek repayment of funds loaned or granted by this agreement; or c) revoke funding commitments of funds loaned or granted by this agreement and also seek repayment of funds loaned or granted by this agreement. By signing this agreement the Subrecipient agrees to repay said funding if they are found to be in default.

- Repayment methods may include cash repayment, installment repayments with negotiable interest rates, or other methods as approved by the Department.
- 10. The Subrecipient shall comply with Exhibit 1, General Agreement Provisions for use of Federal Highway Funds on Non-primary Highways, which is attached hereto and by this reference is incorporated into this agreement.
- 11. The Subrecipient shall maintain, or cause to be maintained for the intended public use, the improvement for twenty (20) years from the completion date in a manner acceptable to the Department.
- 12. This agreement is not assignable without the prior written consent of the Department.
- 13. If any part of this agreement is found to be void and unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in effect.
- 14. It is the intent of both parties that no third-party beneficiaries be created by this agreement.
- 15. This agreement and the attached exhibit constitute the entire agreement between the Department and the Subrecipient concerning this project. Representations made before the signing of this agreement are not binding, and neither party has relied upon conflicting representations in entering into this agreement. Any change or alteration to the terms of this agreement shall be made in the form of an addendum to this agreement. The addendum shall become effective only upon written approval of the Department and the Subrecipient.

## **EXHIBIT 1**

# General Agreement Provisions for use of Federal Highway Funds on Non-primary Projects

Unless otherwise specified in this agreement, the Subrecipient shall be responsible for the following:

# 1. General Requirements.

- a. The Subrecipient shall take the necessary actions to comply with applicable state and federal laws and regulations. To assist the Subrecipient, the Department has provided guidance in the Federal-aid Project Development Guide (Guide) and the Instructional Memorandums to Local Public Agencies (I.M.s) that are referenced by the Guide. Both are available on-line at: https://iowadot.gov/local\_systems/im/lpa-ims. The Subrecipient shall follow the applicable procedures and guidelines contained in the Guide and I.M.s in effect at the time project activities are conducted.
- b. In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and associated subsequent nondiscrimination laws, regulations, and executive orders, the Subrecipient shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. In accordance with Iowa Code Chapter 216, the Subrecipient shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, creed, age, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, religion, pregnancy, or disability. The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the requirements outlined in I.M. 1.070, Title VI and Nondiscrimination Requirements which includes the requirement to provide a copy of the Subrecipient's Title VI Plan or Agreement and Standard DOT Title VI Assurances to the Department.
- c. The Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), the associated Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) that implement these laws, and the guidance provided in <a href="L.M.">L.M.</a>
  <a href="L.080">L.080</a>, ADA Requirements. When bicycle and/or pedestrian facilities are constructed, reconstructed, or altered, the Subrecipient shall make such facilities compliant with the ADA and Section 504, which includes following the requirements set forth in Chapter 12A for sidewalks and Chapter 12B for Bicycle Facilities of the Iowa DOT Design Manual.
- d. To the extent allowable by law, the Subrecipient agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the Department harmless from any claim, action or liability arising out of the design, construction, maintenance, placement of traffic control devices, inspection, or use of this project. This agreement to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless applies to all aspects of the Department's application review and approval process, plan and construction reviews, and funding participation.
- e. As required by 2 CFR 200.501 "Audit Requirements," a non-federal entity expending \$750,000 or more in federal awards in a year shall have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provision of that part. Auditee responsibilities are addressed in Subpart F of 2 CFR 200. The federal funds provided by this agreement shall be reported on the appropriate Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA) using the Catalog of Federal

Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number and title as shown in this agreement. If the Subrecipient will pay initial project costs and request reimbursement from the Department, the Subrecipient shall report this project on its SEFA. If the Department will pay initial project costs and then credit those accounts from which initial costs were paid, the Department will report this project on its SEFA. In this case, the Subrecipient shall not report this project on its SEFA.

- f. The Subrecipient shall supply the Department with all information required by the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 and 2 CFR Part 170.
- g. The Subrecipient shall comply with the following Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) requirements:
  - i. The Subrecipient shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of any Department-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR Part 26. The Subrecipient shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR Part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of Department-assisted contracts.
  - ii. The Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements of I.M. 5.010, DBE Guidelines.
  - iii. The Department's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR Part 26 and as approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Implementation of this program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as a violation of this agreement. Upon notification to the Subrecipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the Department may impose sanctions as provided for under Part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C. 3801 et seq.).
- h. Termination of funds. Notwithstanding anything in this agreement to the contrary, and subject to the limitations set forth below, the Department shall have the right to terminate this agreement without penalty and without any advance notice as a result of any of the following: 1) The federal government, legislature or governor fail in the sole opinion of the Department to appropriate funds sufficient to allow the Department to either meet its obligations under this agreement or to operate as required and to fulfill its obligations under this agreement; or 2) If funds are deappropriated, reduced, not allocated, or receipt of funds is delayed, or if any funds or revenues needed by the Department to make any payment hereunder are insufficient or unavailable for any other reason as determined by the Department in its sole discretion; or 3) If the Department's authorization to conduct its business or engage in activities or operations related to the subject matter of this agreement is withdrawn or materially altered or modified. The Department shall provide the Subrecipient with written notice of termination pursuant to this section.

# 2. Programming and Federal Authorization.

- a. The Subrecipient shall be responsible for including the project in the appropriate Regional Planning Affiliation (RPA) or Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The Subrecipient shall also ensure that the appropriate RPA or MPO, through their TIP submittal to the Department, includes the project in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). If the project is not included in the appropriate fiscal year of the STIP, federal funds cannot be authorized.
- b. Before beginning any work for which federal funding reimbursement will be requested, the Subrecipient shall contact the Department to obtain the procedures necessary to secure FHWA authorization. The Subrecipient shall submit a written request for FHWA authorization to the Department. After reviewing the Subrecipient's request, the Department will forward the request to the FHWA for authorization and obligation of federal funds. The Department will notify the Subrecipient when FHWA authorization is obtained. The cost of work performed prior to FHWA authorization will not be reimbursed with federal funds.
- c. Upon receiving FHWA authorization, the Subrecipient must show federal aid funding activity to receive the programmed amount authorized for the project. If there is no funding activity for nine or more months after the previous activity, the remaining unused programmed amount will be de-obligated from the project and there will be no further federal aid reimbursement issued for the project. If the Subrecipient knows in advance that funding activity will not occur for the nine months, the Contract Administrator needs to be notified to determine if programming of funds can be adjusted or other options can be explored.
- d. Upon receipt of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) authorization a Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN) will be assigned to this project by the FHWA based on a methodology that incorporates identifying information about the federal award such as the federal funding program code and the federal project number. This FAIN will be used to identify this project and award on the federal government's listing of financial assistance awards consistent with the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (FFATA) at usaspending.gov.
- e. A period of performance for this federal funding award will be established at the time of FHWA authorization. The start date of the period of performance will be the FHWA authorization date. The project end date (PED) will be determined according to the methodology in <a href="L.M. 1.200">L.M. 1.200</a>, Federal Funds Management. Costs incurred before the start date or after the PED of the period of performance will not be eligible for reimbursement.

# 3. Federal Participation in Work Performed by Subrecipient Employees.

a. If federal reimbursement will be requested for engineering, construction inspection, right-of-way acquisition or other services provided by employees of the Subrecipient, the Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 3.330, Federal-aid Participation in In-House Services.

- b. If federal reimbursement will be requested for construction performed by employees of the Subrecipient, the Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in <u>I.M. 6.010</u>, Federal-aid Construction by Local Agency Forces.
- c. If the Subrecipient desires to claim indirect costs associated with work performed by its employees, the Subrecipient shall prepare and submit to the Department an indirect cost rate proposal and related documentation in accordance with the requirements of 2 CFR 200. Before incurring any indirect costs, such indirect cost rate proposal shall be certified by the FHWA or the federal agency providing the largest amount of federal funds to the Subrecipient. If approved, the approved indirect cost rate shall be incorporated by means of an addendum to this agreement.

# 4. Design and Consultant Services

- a. The Subrecipient shall be responsible for the design of the project, including all necessary plans, specifications, and estimates (PS&E). The project shall be designed in accordance with the design guidelines provided or referenced by the Department in the Guide and applicable I.M.s.
- b. If the Subrecipient requests federal funds for consultant services, the Subrecipient and the Consultant shall prepare a contract for consultant services in accordance with 23 CFR Part 172. These regulations require a qualifications-based selection process. The Subrecipient shall follow the procedures for selecting and using consultants outlined in <a href="L.M. 3.310">L.M. 3.310</a>, Federal-aid Participation in Consultant Costs.

# 5. Environmental Requirements and other Agreements or Permits.

- a. The Subrecipient shall take the appropriate actions and prepare the necessary documents to fulfill the FHWA requirements for project environmental studies including historical/cultural reviews and location approval. The Subrecipient shall complete any mitigation agreed upon in the FHWA approval document. These procedures are set forth in <u>I.M. 3.020</u>, Concept Statement Instructions; <u>4.020</u>, NEPA Process; <u>4.110</u>, Threatened and Endangered Species; and <u>4.120</u>, Cultural Resource Regulations.
- b. If farmland is to be acquired, whether for use as project right-of-way or permanent easement, the Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 4.170, Farmland Protection Policy Act.
- c. The Subrecipient shall obtain project permits and approvals, when necessary, from the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs (State Historical Society of Iowa; State Historic Preservation Officer), Iowa Department of Natural Resources, U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Department, or other agencies as required. The Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 4.130, 404 Permit Process; 4.140, Storm Water Permits; 4.150, Iowa DNR Floodplain Permits and Regulations; 4.160, Asbestos Inspection, Removal and Notification Requirements; and 4.190, Highway Improvements in the Vicinity of Airports or Heliports.
- d. In all contracts entered into by the Subrecipient, and all subcontracts, in connection with this project that exceed \$100,000, the Subrecipient shall comply with the requirements of Section

114 of the Clean Air Act and Section 308 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and all their regulations and guidelines. In such contracts, the Subrecipient shall stipulate that any facility to be utilized in performance of or to benefit from this agreement is not listed on the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) List of Violating Facilities or is under consideration to be listed.

# 6. Right-of-Way, Railroads and Utilities.

- a. The Subrecipient shall acquire the project right-of-way, whether by lease, easement, or fee title, and shall provide relocation assistance benefits and payments in accordance with the procedures set forth in <a href="L.M. 3.600">L.M. 3.600</a>, Right-of-Way Acquisition, and the Department's Right of Way Bureau Local Public Agency Manual. The Subrecipient shall contact the Department for assistance, as necessary, to ensure compliance with the required procedures, even if no federal funds are used for right-of-way activities. The Subrecipient shall obtain environmental concurrence before acquiring any needed right-of-way. With prior approval, hardship and protective buying is possible. If the Subrecipient requests federal funding for right-of-way acquisition, the Subrecipient shall also obtain FHWA authorization before purchasing any needed right-of-way.
- b. If the project right-of-way is federally funded and if the actual construction is not undertaken by the close of the twentieth fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the federal funds were authorized, the Subrecipient shall repay the amount of federal funds reimbursed for right-of-way costs to the Department.
- c. If a railroad crossing or railroad tracks are within or adjacent to the project limits, the Subrecipient shall obtain agreements, easements, or permits as needed from the railroad. The Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in <u>I.M. 3.670</u>, Work on Railroad Right-of-Way, and <u>I.M. 3.680</u>, Federal-aid Projects Involving Railroads.
- d. The Subrecipient shall comply with the Policy for Accommodating Utilities on City and County Federal-aid Highway Right of Way for projects on non-primary federal-aid highways. For projects connecting to or involving some work inside the right-of-way for a primary highway, the Subrecipient shall follow the Department's Policy for Accommodating Utilities on Primary Road System. Certain utility relocation, alteration, adjustment, or removal costs to the Subrecipient for the project may be eligible for federal funding reimbursement. The Subrecipient should also use the procedures outlined in <a href="L.M. 3.640">L.M. 3.640</a>, Utility Accommodation and Coordination, as a guide to coordinating with utilities.
- e. If the Subrecipient desires federal reimbursement for utility costs, it shall submit a request for FHWA authorization prior to beginning any utility relocation work, in accordance with the procedures outlined in I.M. 3.650, Federal-aid Participation in Utility Relocations.

# 7. Construction Contract Procurement.

The following provisions apply only to projects involving physical construction or improvements to transportation facilities:

- a. The project plans, specifications, and cost estimate (PS&E) shall be prepared and certified by a professional engineer, architect, or landscape architect, as applicable, licensed in the State of lowa.
- b. For projects let through the Department, the Subrecipient shall be responsible for the following:
  - i. Prepare and submit the PS&E and other contract documents to the Department for review and approval in accordance with <u>I.M. 3.700</u>, Check and Final Plans and <u>I.M. 3.500</u>, Bridge or Culvert Plans, as applicable.
  - ii. The contract documents shall use the Department's Standard Specifications for Highway and Bridge Construction. Prior to their use in the PS&E, specifications developed by the Subrecipient for individual construction items shall be approved by the Department.
  - iii. Follow the procedures in <u>I.M. 5.030</u>, Iowa DOT Letting Process, to analyze the bids received, make a decision to either award a contract to the lowest responsive bidder or reject all bids, and if a contract is awarded, execute the contract documents in Doc Express.
- c. For projects that are let locally by the Subrecipient, the Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in I.M. 5.120, Local Letting Process, Federal-aid.
- d. The Subrecipient shall forward a completed Project Development Certification (Form 730002) to the Department in accordance with <u>I.M. 5.050</u>, Project Development Certification Instructions. The project shall not receive FHWA authorization for construction or be advertised for bids until after the Department has reviewed and approved the Project Development Certification.
- e. If the Subrecipient is a city, the Subrecipient shall comply with the public hearing requirements of the Iowa Code section 26.12.
- f. The Subrecipient shall not provide the contractor with notice to proceed until after receiving notice in Doc Express that the Department has concurred in the contract award.

## 8. Construction.

- a. A full-time employee of the Subrecipient shall serve as the person in responsible charge of the construction project. For cities that do not have any full-time employees, the mayor or city clerk will serve as the person in responsible charge, with assistance from the Department.
- b. Traffic control devices, signing, or pavement markings installed within the limits of this project shall conform to the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" per 761 IAC Chapter 130. The safety of the general public shall be assured through the use of proper protective measures and devices such as fences, barricades, signs, flood lighting, and warning lights as necessary.
- c. For projects let through the Department, the project shall be constructed under the Department's Standard Specifications for Highway and Bridge Construction and the Subrecipient shall comply with the procedures and responsibilities for materials testing according to the

Department's Materials I.M.s applicable to the letting. Available on-line at: https://www.iowadot.gov/erl/index.html.

- d. For projects let locally, the Subrecipient shall provide materials testing and certifications as required by the approved specifications.
- e. If the Department provides any materials testing services to the Subrecipient, the Department will bill the Subrecipient for such testing services according to its normal policy as per Materials I.M. 103, Inspection Services Provided to Counties, Cities, and Other State Agencies.
- f. The Subrecipient shall follow the procedures in <u>I.M. 6.000</u>, Construction Inspection, and the Department's Construction Manual, as applicable, for conducting construction inspection activities.

### 9. Reimbursements.

- a. After costs have been incurred, the Subrecipient shall submit to the Department periodic itemized claims for reimbursement for eligible project costs. Requests for reimbursement shall be made at least once every six months but not more than bi-weekly.
- b. To ensure proper accounting of costs, reimbursement requests for costs incurred prior to June 30 shall be submitted to the Department by August 1.
- c. Reimbursement claims shall include a certification that all eligible project costs, for which reimbursement is requested, have been reviewed by an official or governing board of the Subrecipient, are reasonable and proper, have been paid in full, and were completed in substantial compliance with the terms of this agreement.
- d. Reimbursement claims shall be submitted on forms identified by the Department along with all required supporting documentation. The Department will reimburse the Subrecipient for properly documented and certified claims for eligible project costs. The Department may withhold up to 5% of the federal share of construction costs or 5% of the total federal funds available for the project, whichever is less. Reimbursement will be made either by state warrant or by crediting other accounts from which payment was initially made. If, upon final audit or review, the Department determines the Subrecipient has been overpaid, the Subrecipient shall reimburse the overpaid amount to the Department. After the final audit or review is complete and after the Subrecipient has provided all required paperwork, the Department will release the federal funds withheld.
- e. The total funds collected by the Subrecipient for this project shall not exceed the total project costs. The total funds collected shall include any federal or state funds received, any special assessments made by the Subrecipient (exclusive of any associated interest or penalties) pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 384 (cities) or Chapter 311 (counties), proceeds from the sale of excess right-of-way, and any other revenues generated by the project. The total project costs shall include all costs that can be directly attributed to the project. In the event that the total

funds collected by the Subrecipient do exceed the total project costs, the Subrecipient shall either:

- in the case of special assessments, refund to the assessed property owners the excess special assessments collected (including interest and penalties associated with the amount of the excess), or
- ii. Refund to the Department all funds collected in excess of the total project costs (including interest and penalties associated with the amount of the excess) within 60 days of the receipt of any excess funds. In return, the Department will either credit reimbursement billings to the FHWA or credit the appropriate state fund account in the amount of refunds received from the Subrecipient.

# 10. Project Close-out.

- a. Within 30 days of completion of construction or other activities authorized by this agreement, the Subrecipient shall provide written notification to the Department and request a final audit, in accordance with the procedures in <u>I.M. 6.110</u>, Final Review, Audit, and Close-out Procedures for Federal-aid, Federal-aid Swap, and Farm-to-Market Projects. Failure to comply with the procedures will result in loss of federal funds remaining to be reimbursed and the repayment of funds already reimbursed. The Subrecipient may be suspended from receiving federal funds on future projects.
- For construction projects, the Subrecipient shall provide a certification by a professional engineer, architect, or landscape architect as applicable, licensed in the State of Iowa, indicating the construction was completed in substantial compliance with the project plans and specifications.
- c. Final reimbursement of federal funds shall be made only after the Department accepts the project as complete.
- d. The Subrecipient shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, reports, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred for the project. The Subrecipient shall also make these materials available at all reasonable times for inspection by the Department, FHWA, or any authorized representatives of the federal government. Copies of these materials shall be furnished by the Subrecipient if requested. Such documents shall be retained for at least 3 years from the date of FHWA approval of the final closure document. Upon receipt of FHWA approval of the final closure document, the Department will notify the Subrecipient of the record retention date.
- e. The Subrecipient shall maintain, or cause to be maintained, the completed improvement in a manner acceptable to the Department and the FHWA.
