**Background:** Every three years the City is required to submit the Pay Equity Report to the State of Minnesota, Department of Management and Budget. Included in the reporting is the job title, job points, job type, and salary range. Job points are determined using the City's previously adopted scale. The Statistical Analysis test shows an underpayment ratio of 125, anything 80 and above is passing. Additionally, the Salary Range test shows a score of 100, with results of 0 or 80 and above considered passing.

Therefore based on the results of the tests run on the report as submitted the City is compliant. The City Council will need to formally approve the report before the report can be submitted.

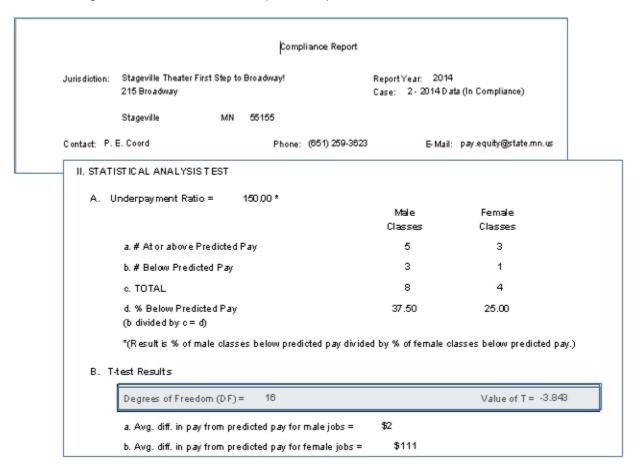
# **Interpreting Results of Compliance Tests**

Your jurisdiction is required to pass four tests to be in compliance with pay equity law. For more information about compliance tests, refer to the <u>Guide to Understanding Pay Equity Compliance</u>.

- Completeness and Accuracy Test Report is submitted on time, data is correct, and required information has been provided
- 2. Statistical or Alternative Test- Compares salary data to determine if female classes are paid consistently below male classes of comparable work value (job points). The Minnesota Pay Equity Management System will generate results applying the Statistical Analysis Test. Underpayment ratio results of 80 and above are passing. In some cases, the Alternative Analysis is required and consists of a manual review of the data. Refer to the following page to determine which test applies to your report.
- **3. Salary Range Test** Compares the average number of years required for female classes to move through a salary range consisting of a time-phased step progression to the average number of years required for male classes. Results of 0 or 80 and above are passing scores. (Test does not apply if years to achieve maximum salary are not defined or if salary ranges are not defined).
- **4. Exceptional Service Pay Test** Compares the percentage of female classes receiving longevity or performance pay to the percentage of male classes receiving longevity or performance pay. In noting exceptional service pay, recipients must exceed the maximum salary reported. Results of 0 or 80 and above are passing scores. (Test does not apply if exceptional service pay is not available in your jurisdiction).

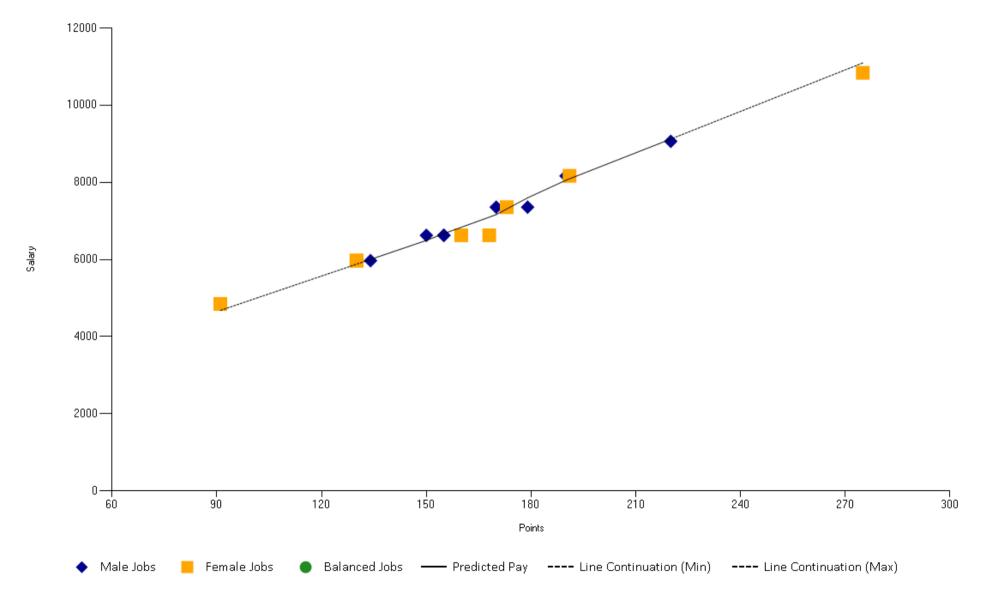

# AGRICULTURAL LEASE

This agreement entered into this 1st day of January 2025, by and between the City of Chatfield, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("City") and Schoenfelder Farms a partnership organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota ("Schoenfelder"),

It is agreed between the parties as follows:

- 1. Term. For the annual payment by Schoenfelder to City of the sum of \$225 per acre, or \$9,000.00 per year, City demises and leases to Schoenfelder the property for the term of January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. Payment is due April 1, 2025.
- 2. In order to properly maintain the newly created storm water structures, no tillage will take place closer than ten (10) feet from the front of the structures and a thirty (30) foot clear radius will be maintained around the drainpipes on both retention ponds. Reshape the waterways to the basins.
- 3. Construct a 10'wide path from County Road 10 field drive along the ditch and along the fence for access to equipment for mowing and maintenance to basin 2.
- 4. According to MN Rules Chapter 7041, work with the biosolids manager in the fall when biosolids application is to take place. The following information will be provided to the farmer: harvest restrictions, MANA rates and the amount of nitrogen supplied by biosolids, public access control periods, and immediate incorporation requirements.
- 5. Prior to planting, contact Brian Burkholder at 507-273-9597 to ensure access to the retention ponds for the purpose of mowing.
- 2. <u>Use</u>. During the period that this lease, or any extension thereof is in effect, Schoenfelder, or its agents or assigns, shall be permitted to use the property for agricultural purposes, or a use consistent with agricultural pursuits. Schoenfelder shall be required during the term of this lease to use and maintain the property in a manner that minimizes the uncontrolled drainage of surface water, erosion of soil and the growth of noxious weeds, and is consistent with good agricultural practices.
- 3. Termination Prior to December 31 of a Given Year. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 herein, City may terminate this lease at any time prior to the end of its term by giving Schoenfelder 30 days written prior notice of termination. Provided, that if City does so subsequent to October 1, of a given year and Schoenfelder has invested labor and other inputs in preparation for cultivating a crop on the property during the remainder of or a renewed term of the lease, City shall reimburse Schoenfelder the reasonable value of such labor and other inputs expended. Provided further, if such early termination of the lease occurs at a time when a crop is under cultivation (but not yet harvested) on the property by Schoenfelder, City, at its option may: (a) permit Schoenfelder to harvest said crop within a reasonable period of time, notwithstanding termination of the lease; or, (b) pay to Schoenfelder the reasonable value of the crop that would have been harvested but for the termination of the early termination of the lease.

# How You May Spend Gambling Funds

**Allowable expenses -** Gambling funds may be spent for allowable expenses, such as:

- gambling equipment (pull-tabs, bingo paper, bingo blower, paddlewheel tickets, tipboard games);
- · advertising;
- · printing raffle tickets; or
- any services or goods that are directly related to the conduct of your gambling.

**Charitable contributions -** Gambling funds may be spent for the following charitable contributions (lawful purpose):

- to or by 501(c)(3) organization and 501(c)(4) festival organizations;
- relieving the effects of poverty, homelessness, or disability;
- problem gambling programs approved by the Minnesota Department of Human Services;
- public or private nonprofit school;
- scholarships (if a contribution is made to a scholarship fund, it must be made to a nonprofit organization whose primary mission is to award scholarships);
- church;
- recognition of military service (open to public) or active military personnel in need;
- activities and facilities benefiting youth under age 21;
- citizen monitoring of surface water quality, with data submitted to Minnesota PCA;
- unit of government (NOTE: A direct contribution to a law enforcement or prosecutorial agency is not allowed);
- wildlife management projects or activities that benefit the public-at-large, with DNR approval;
- grooming and maintaining snowmobile or all-terrain trails that are grant-in-aid trails, or other trails open to public use, with DNR approval;
- supplies and materials for DNR training and educational programs;
- nutritional programs, food shelves, and congregate dining programs primarily for persons who are 62 or older or disabled;
- community arts organizations or programs;
- humanitarian service recognizing volunteerism or philanthropy; and
- acquisition and repair of real property and capital assets (contact the Gambling Control Board for requirements).

# How You May Not Spend Gambling Funds

- Controlled contribution An organization may not retain any control over any contribution made from gambling funds. The only exception is for expenditures by a 501(c)(3) organization or a 501(c)(4) festival organization to its general fund.
- 2. **Financial gain -** A contribution or expenditure may not be made if it results in any monetary, economic, financial, or material benefit to the organization making the contribution or expenditure.
- Government An expenditure may not be made for:
  - influencing the nomination or election of a candidate for public office;
  - promoting or defeating a ballot question; or
  - any activity intended to influence an election or a governmental decisionmaking process.
- Law enforcement A direct contribution may not be made to a law enforcement or prosecutorial agency.
- 5. **Pension** A contribution may not be made to a government pension or retirement fund, such as a fire relief association.
- Conflict of interest A contribution or expenditure may not be made if it is not allowed under the conflict of interest provisions of the Minnesota Nonprofit Corpo-ration Act, Minnesota Statutes, Section 317A.255.
- 7. **Alcohol -** An expenditure may not be made for the purchase of any intoxicating liquor, wine, or malt beverages.
- 8. **Fundraising** An expenditure may not be made for fundraising costs, except as allowed for a 501(c)(3) organization or 501(c)(4) festival organization from its general fund.
- 9. **Other organizations** With few exceptions, gambling funds may not be contributed to other organizations or clubs such as veterans, fraternal, Lions, etc. unless it is a 501(c)(3) organization.
- Other contributions A contribution may not be made to a 501(c)(3) organization or another entity with the intent or effect of not complying with lawful purpose restrictions or requirements.

# **BINGO AND RAFFLE - Checklist for Excluded/Exempt Permits**

The purpose of this form is to help your organization conduct excluded/exempt gambling in compliance with the requirements listed below. Exempt and Excluded activities cannot be conducted in the same calendar year. The five forms of lawful gambling are bingo, paddlewheels, pull-tabs, raffles and tipboards. 	9. Alcohol is only awarded as a prize to persons who demonstrate that they are 21 years of age or older. (340A.707)
	10. Only cash, personal checks, cashier's checks, money orders, travelers' checks, and debit cards may be accepted for the purchase of tickets (NO CREDIT CARDS – NO INTERNET SALES). (349.2127) (7861.0260)
	11. The method of winner selection cannot be manipulated or based on the outcome of an event not under the organization's control. (349.173)
	12. Persons are not required to be present at a raffle drawing to be eligible to win. (349.173) (7861.0310)
