Public comment is a time to give comment. It is not a question and answer period and the City Council does not respond to public comments. Speakers who engage in threatening or disorderly behavior will have their time ceased.

CONSENT AGENDA

All items under the Consent Agenda are considered to be routine in nature and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Council Member, City Manager or Corporation Counsel so requests; in which event, the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered in the Regular Agenda, which typically begins with Item No. 8.

The City's Boards and Commissions hold Public Hearings prior to some Council agenda items appearing on the Council's Meeting Agenda. Persons who wish to address the Council should provide new information that is pertinent to the issue before them.

PUBLIC HEARING

Items that require receiving public testimony will be placed on the agenda and noticed as a Public Hearing. Individuals have an opportunity to provide public testimony on those items that impact the community and/or residence.

Objective 2a. Better quality roads and sidewalks

BACKGROUND: As discussed in previous Council Meetings, the City is beginning its Continuous Improvement journey to determine what efficiencies can be gained. On August 12, 2024, Council approved an agreement with Iverson Consulting Group (ICG) to begin services to help scope out what a formalized, continuous improvement effort could look like. An update on work related to that effort will be provided by the end of 2024.

Infrastructure continues to be a high priority for both Council and Staff. In the spirit of continuous improvement, the Public Works Department has recently conducted several experiments to help determine what future Sidewalk Remediation and Street Resurfacing efforts could look like, to further enhance the work being done. The presentation will provide findings on those efforts.

As a federally funded public housing agency, the BHA offers quality rental housing options for families, seniors, and individuals with disabilities, managing approximately 600 units across nine housing developments. These properties are owned and operated by the BHA, which is committed to maintaining and improving the housing options available in our community.

The BHA recently welcomed Tasha Aje'Scott as its new Executive Director. At Monday's meeting, Ms. Aje'Scott will present to the City Council, offering insights into the BHA's ongoing work and highlighting the important role the organization plays in addressing housing needs throughout Bloomington.
