GENERAL NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

The City Council adopted new rules relating to the conduct of the public meetings, proceedings, and business in the City of South Gate on July 12, 2022, (Resolution 2022-38-CC) and go into effect on August 1, 2022. Resolution #2022-38-CC is available at the City Clerk's Office.

MEETING SCHEDULE

Regular meetings of the City Council are held on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month, closed session meetings will commence at 5:30 p.m. unless posted otherwise on its agenda. The regular City Council meetings will commence at 6:30 p.m. Agendas are available at the following locations: City Clerk Office, Public Notice Boards at City Hall, and on the City's web page at https://www.cityofsouthgate.org

The Public can sign up to receive automatic notices of postings of agendas for the City Council or any other Commission or Board of the City of South Gate. Visit the City webpage and click on the Agenda & Minutes icon. That will take you the page where an individual can enter their email in the "Email Updates" box to register.

PUBLIC COMMENT/PARTICIPATION

Any person may request to address a legislative body during a public meeting. The Presiding Officer will call upon those present in the Council Chambers first. After all speakers in the Chambers have spoken, the Presiding Officer will call upon those participating via zoom or teleconference.

Speakers are limited to three (3) minutes on any item listed on the agenda, including public hearings. Under Comments from the Audience portion, speakers are also limited to a single three (3) minutes time limit. Comments from the Audience is initially limited to 45 minutes at each meeting. Any speaker still wishing to speak, that did not speak, will have an addition Comments from the Audience opportunity after the last business item is finished. The Presiding Officer may extend the time limit as long as there is no objection from the City Council as a body.

To ensure that the public is able to participate, the City provides the opportunity to submit their

comments in person, virtually, email, phone call, mail and any other method which may become available. Methods of participation may be subject to change during other such times when a State of Emergency, Health Order or State Executive Order limits in-person participation.

CURFEW

In absence of a motion duly adopted by majority vote of the City Council, the Presiding Officer may adjourn the City Council meetings at 10:30 p.m. The Presiding Officer may ask the City Council if any agenda items listed should be continued or dealt with during the meeting. For those items to be continued, the City Council can direct the item be placed on the next City Council agenda or the current meeting may be adjourned to a time certain at which time the meeting shall be reconvened as an Adjourned Regular Meeting of the City Council and action upon the published agenda continued.

STAFF REPORTS

As a general rule, staff reports. or other written documentation are prepared/organized with respect to each item of business listed on the agenda. Meeting agendas and staff reports are available at least 72-hours prior to the scheduled regular City Council meeting and a minimum of 24-hours prior to a Special City Council meeting. SUBJECT: RESOLUTIONS ADOPTING FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 MUNICIPAL BUDGETS AND 5-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE CITY OF SOUTH GATE; SOUTH GATE HOUSING AUTHORITY AND THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH GATE

PURPOSE: To hear budget presentations from staff and review the Proposed Fiscal Year 2023-24 Municipal Budget for these various entities and consider the adoption of the proposed spending plan(s) as indicated in the Resolution attached for consideration.

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS: The City Council, South Gate Housing Authority and the Successor Agency to the Community Development Commission of the City of South Gate will consider:

- a. Hearing the various presentations on the Proposed Fiscal Year 2023-24 Municipal Budget and 5-Year Capital Improvement Program for the various entities;
- b. Approving a Resolution adopting the Municipal Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24 with the changes stipulated in Exhibit A and B for a total of \$156,497,819 for all funds along with any additions or deletions the Legislative Bodies may enact;
- c. Approving the budget modifications for Fiscal Year 2022-23 as described in Attachment C; and
- d. Approving a Resolution adopting the annual Gann Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2023-24.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24, to include all funds and entities, as amended is \$156,497,819. This amount includes transfers in and out of various funds. The General Fund accounts for \$70,480,452 including transfers out. The Proposed Budget for the Successor Agency is \$5,052,861 and the Housing Authority is \$5,211,434. The total revenue estimated for all entities and

funds is \$158,113,026. The differences are covered by the reserves and/or one or more funds that have accumulated for various proposed expenditures (primarily Capital Improvement Projects).

ANALYSIS: At tonight's meeting, which is the first of two scheduled meetings, staff will provide a general overview of the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24. In addition, several departments will begin providing presentations on their requested funding allocations for the new fiscal year. The meeting will be continued to June 21, 2023, where the Legislative Bodies will hear from the remaining departments on their requested funding allocations and will consider approving a Resolution adopting the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24 along with any adjustments discussed during these hearings. All these budget meetings are open to the public to observe and participate through the public comment section of the meeting.

The Proposed Budget was placed on the City's webpage for access and review by members of the public on May 30, 2022. Since then, several adjustments have been identified that need to be made to the Proposed Budget following reviews by staff and the City Council. These adjustments to the Budget are outlined in Exhibit A of the attached resolution. The General Fund proposed expenditure budget increased by \$246,790 while other special revenue and capital funds proposed expenditure budgets increased by \$1,334,909. The net change to the proposed budget pursuant to these adjustments total \$1,581,698. The total FY 2023-24 Proposed Budget, to include all funds and entities, with these adjustments is \$156,497,819. The Proposed Budget may be further adjusted with any additions or deletions the Legislative Bodies may enact during the budget meetings.

Additionally, staff has identified modifications to the existing FY 2022-23 Budget due to occurrences after the Mid-Year report that need to be updated prior to the start of the annual audit. These modifications do not change the estimated ending fund balance in the Fund Balance Summary. All the budget modifications are listed in Attachment C.

It is important to note that a budget is a plan that is fluid. Typically, reports on the budget are made periodically during the fiscal year. At a minimum, a mid-year budget will be conducted where staff will report on the budget for the current fiscal year and request consideration of any adjustments that may be needed. At the same time, it allows staff to begin to solicit budget themes for the upcoming fiscal year that the City Council may wish to explore when the proposed budget is presented.

BACKGROUND: A municipal budget addresses city policies, city operations and communicates the anticipated financial activities to both the public and Legislative Bodies of the impacted entities. This is the first of two scheduled meetings to review the various proposed spending requests. The second meeting will be on June 21, 2023, where the City Council will consider approving a Resolution to adopt the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24.

Government Code Section 53901 requires each local agency to file its budget with the county auditor within 60 days after the beginning of its fiscal year. If an agency does not have a "formal budget", it must file a listing of its anticipated revenues together with its expenditures for the fiscal year in progress. Staff anticipates that the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-24 will be adopted on June 21, 2023, which is within the time frame of submitting the budget to the county auditor.

Additionally, each year the City must adopt an appropriation limit called the Gann limit. The Gann limit is designed to limit the amount of revenue that can be appropriated in a fiscal year. The appropriations subject to the limit are those that expend proceeds of taxes (e.g., Property Tax, Sales Tax, and Transient Occupancy Tax) less any exclusion for qualified capital outlay, debt service, and

federal mandates. The finance staff has calculated the Gann Limit for FY 2023-24 to be \$97,283,328, leaving the City with an appropriations balance under the limit of \$51,321,558.

WHEREAS, the City Manager has submitted to the City Council, Housing Authority and Successor Agency a Proposed Operating Budget for FY 2023-24 with total expenditures for all funds totaling \$156,497,819 and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held budget study sessions, heard presentations, reviewed, discussed, and considered said budget during the regularly scheduled City Council meetings conducted on June 20, 2023, and June 21, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH GATE, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby adopts the Municipal Budget for FY 2023-24, with the changes stipulated in Exhibit A and Exhibit B of this Resolution, for a total of \$156,138,319 for all funds and entities along with any additions or deletions the Legislative Bodies may enact.

SECTION 2. The City Council will reserve the right to make further adjustments to the Municipal Budget throughout the year at any publicly agendized meeting of the City Council/Housing Authority/Successor Agency.

SECTION 3. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to make administrative budget adjustments to transfer appropriations from one line item to another within a fund at the overall departmental budget level as prescribed in the South Gate Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, the voters of the State of California on November 6, 1979, added Article XIII B to the Constitution of the State of California placing various limitations on the appropriations of the state and local governments;

WHEREAS, Article XIII B provides that the appropriations limit for Fiscal Year 2023/24 shall be calculated by adjusting the appropriations limit for the prior fiscal year for changes in inflation and population, except as otherwise provided for in Article XIII B and implementing state statutes;

WHEREAS, the information necessary for making such adjustments is attached as Exhibit A, which is incorporated herein and by reference made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the City of South Gate has complied with the provisions of Article XIII B in determining the appropriations limit for Fiscal Year 2023/24.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH GATE, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City selects the percent increase in Non-Residential Assessed Valuation due to New Construction (NRAV-NC) as the inflation factor and the percent increase in the City of South Gate population growth as the population factor.

SECTION 2. An appropriations limit in the total amount of \$97,283,328 is hereby adopted for Fiscal Year 2023/24, with an amount subject to the limit of \$51,321,558.

MODIFICATIONS TO THE FY 2022-23 BUDGET

Gas Tax Fund

- 1. Appropriate \$442,480 as one-time funds for the priority tree maintenance program.
- 2. Reprogram \$625,000 in Grant Funds to Gas Tax Funds for the Tweedy Blvd Complete Streets.

<u>Information System Fund</u>

- 1. Appropriate \$77,905 as one-time funds for ERP consulting services to assist with the solicitation selection, and implementation of a new ERP system. The contract was approved by City Council at the April 27, 2021, meeting but the budget was not carried over from last fiscal year.
- 2. Appropriate \$28,320 for broadband cable and telephone services. The budget for these services was inadvertently excluded in the FY 2022-23 Budget.
- 3. Appropriate \$30,000 to upgrade the City's email protection services with Barracuda to protect against evolving threats in spam and ransomware.

Asset Forfeiture Fund

1. Appropriate \$75,000 as one-time funds for Police Overtime Salaries to cover increased overtime due to vacancies.

Homeland Security Grant

1. Appropriate \$3,000 for a grant amendment that was approved by CalOES for the 2020 SHSP Homeland Security Grant.

Emergency Housing Voucher

 Appropriate \$150,000 for Housing Assistance Payments under the Emergency Housing Voucher program. The budget for these payments was inadvertently excluded in the FY 2022-23 Budget but the HUD funding is available and housing assistance payments are currently being distributed.
