City Manager Keith Dickerson said that the City of Clarkesville applied and received a \$422,480.00 Grant from ARPA. The Grant will allow the city to put in a 10,600-foot 6-inch water line up Alex Mountain Road to loop our current water system back to North Georgia Technical College.

Sub-Item #6c.: *The City Manager, Keith Dickerson to discuss the Lottery for Distilled Spirits.*
City Manager Keith Dickerson said that 11 applied to be in the lottery, and nine had qualified that the lottery would be at noon on Friday, March 11, 2022.

Linda Turpin 101 Holcomb Street

Ms. Turpin requested that the speed bumps to be reinstalled on Lewallen Street and Holcomb Street.

The ESG Manager told Ms. Turpin that they would be installing the kind of speed bumps that are resurfaced with the street like the ones on Bartley Wilbanks when those streets are resurfaced this spring.

Lisa Nicholson 111 Habersham Place

Ms. Nicholson had questions about the speed study. She asked what streets were involved, and said that she had concerns with the speed problem. She said that she and many others walk every day, and a speed study was needed.

She was told that the speed study was primarily for the main and back streets in the city, and the study investigation would continue.

MaLisa McOmbler Asbury Street

Ms. McOmbler had concerns about trucks using E Water and Asbury Streets as a cut-through to avoid downtown. At the curve in front of their Inn, they go off the road and into her lawn and make ruts and holes. She said that those streets were not wide enough for two-way traffic.

Agenda Item #1: *Call to Order*

Mayor Barrie Aycock called the meeting to order.

Agenda Item #2: *Unfinished Business*

Sub-Item #2A: Council to discuss Personal Transportation Vehicles/Golf Carts

City Manager Keith Dickerson said the Council had been discussing Golf Carts for the last year. The Council compiled a speed study, consulted the state guidelines, and obtained the Police Chiefs & City Attorneys guidance to prepare an ordinance that would work for the City of Clarkesville. Items that need to be completed, signage installed on the route that golf carts are allowed, speed signs changed to 25 or less, plans for inspection of golf carts by police. The Georgia law states that golf carts cannot be on state roads. They can cross them but not drive on them. Golf carts would be required to have lights, seat-belts, insurance & you would be required to have a drivers license. Three citizens gave there view of the ordinance at the meeting; two were for and one against. The Mayor and Council will review all the information at the April Council Meeting.

Mr. Brown said he enjoyed taking his grandchildren out in the evening for a ride. It would make parking convenient for the elderly at events and out to eat. He said the route and ordinance would limit a lot of travel. He did not see 20 carts being in the city.

Planning Activities: The Planning Commission met with Adam Hazell from Georgia Mountains Regional Commission to work on zoning ordinance amendments. I'm working on finalizing them so they can go to our attorney and city manager for review before public notice is published.

We had a walk-thru at Sutton Terrace with our third-party inspection company since the project is nearing completion.

Dunkin Donuts has begun the remodel of the building with an estimated completion date of June.

Dollar General has begun work on the site for their new building on Hwy 115 adjacent to Sutton Terrace.

IT activities: include security and maintenance updates on the city servers and firewalls. I have received the new desktops for city hall and work on setting them up and installed has started.

The new VoIP phone system is scheduled to be completed in early April. All of the phone numbers that are currently in use will remain the same.

Finally, the security camera system for Pitts Park has been ordered and once they come in, will be installed.

Personal Transportation Vehicle (PTV) / Motorized Cart Ordinance

ORDINANCE CHAPTER MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

A PERSONAL TRANSPORTATION VEHICLE ORDINANCE IN COMPLIANCE WITH O.C.G.A. § 40-6-331 FOR INCLUSION TO THE CITY OF CLARKESVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Clarkesville, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by authority of same, as follows:

Adding the following Sections hereby amends Chapter 9 Motor Vehicles and Traffic.

Section. Purpose and Intent.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to protect, maintain, and enhance health, safety and general welfare of present and future citizens of the City.

It has come to the attention of Mayor and Council that the use of Personal Transportation Vehicles ("PTV") (also commonly known as "golf carts" or motorized carts) on City streets creates a potential traffic hazard for other vehicular traffic as well as a danger to the occupants of PTVs.

Therefore, the intent of this Ordinance is to regulate the use of motorized carts within the corporate limits of the City of Clarkesville as authorized by O.C.G.A. 40-6-331.

Section. Definitions.

Personal Transportation Vehicle ("PTV") –

(A) Any motor vehicle having no fewer than three wheels and an unladen weight of 1,300 pounds or less and which cannot operate at more than 20 miles per hour if such vehicle was authorized to operate on local roads by a local authority prior to January 1, 2012; and

(B) Any motor vehicle:

- (i) With a minimum of four wheels;
- (ii) Capable of a maximum level ground speed of less than 20 miles per hour;
- (iii) With a maximum gross vehicle unladen or empty weight of 1,375 pounds; and
- (iv) Capable of transporting not more than eight persons.

The term does not include mobility aids, including electric personal assistive mobility devices, power wheelchairs, and scooters, that can be used indoors and outdoors for the express purpose of enabling mobility for a person with a disability. The term also does not include any all-terrain vehicle or multipurpose off-highway vehicle.

The term PTV as used herein is synonymous with "motorized cart".

Section. Operations & Limitations.

Motorized Carts may be operated within the corporate limits of Clarkesville by:

- A. Those persons who are 18 years of age and older and have a valid motor vehicle driver's license, or;
- B. Those persons who are 16 years of age, but not yet 18 years of age, if accompanied in the front seat by a person at least 18 years of age who holds a valid motor vehicle driver's license.
- C. No person under the age of 16 years of age shall be permitted to operate a motorized cart on any public street within the corporate limits of the City of Clarkesville.
- D. All operators of Motorized Carts shall abide by all traffic regulations applicable to vehicular traffic.
- E. Motorized Carts shall not be operated on sidewalks or in City parks other than in parking areas.
- F. Motorized Carts shall be operated during daylight hours only except if such carts are equipped with functional headlights and taillights.
- G. Motorized Carts may not traverse streets and highways under the jurisdiction of the Georgia Department of Transportation ("GDOT") except at those specific intersections clearly designated for that purpose and which have a warning sign W11-11. Motorized Carts may cross these streets to access other City streets at those intersections only. The specific GDOT streets and highways referenced include North Church Street, South Church Street, East Main Street and West Main Street throughout the corporate limits of the City.
- H. Motorized Carts shall only operate within and upon those City streets that have a posted speed limit of 25 miles per hour or less and are designated by the City Mayor/Council as an authorized street. The ordinance only applies to streets within the Clarkesville city limits. All street crossings of GDOT highways must be in compliance with § G as set forth above.

Section. Registration.

Before any Motorized Cart may be operated within the corporate limits of Clarkesville, it must be registered and receive a decal from the City Clerk signifying its registration. A person desiring to register a Motorized Cart shall bring documentation setting forth a description of said cart to the City Clerk's office and complete an application for registration. Upon registration, the Clerk shall issue a decal to be applied to the rear of such cart so as to be plainly visible. There shall be a fee of fifteen (\$15) dollars for such registration. The decal, once issued, shall be non-transferable

from the cart for which it is issued. The registration shall be effective until such time as the Cart is sold or for a period of 5 years, whichever is shorter. New owners must register a cart within ten (10) business days of a change of ownership at a cost of fifteen (\$15) dollars.

Before any Motorized Cart may be operated within the corporate limits of Clarkesville, the cart must have affixed thereto an emblem as required by O.C.G.A. 40-8-4. The emblem shall conform with those standards and specifications adopted for slow-moving vehicles by the American Society of Agricultural Engineers in December 1966, and contained within such Society's standard ASAE S276.1, or shall be an emblem of the same shape and size painted on such vehicle in a bright and conspicuous retro-reflective red-orange paint. Such emblem shall be mounted on the rear of such vehicles, in the approximate horizontal geometric center of the vehicle, at a height of three (3) to five (5) feet above the roadway, and shall be maintained at all times in a clean and reflective condition.

All PTVs and Motorized Carts shall have minimum required equipment;

a. All Motorized Carts shall be equipped with:

1. A braking system sufficient for the weight and passenger capacity of the vehicle including a parking brake;
2. A reverse warning device functional at all times when the directional control is in the reverse position;
3. A main power switch. When the switch is in the "off" position, or the key or other device that activates the switch is removed, the motive power circuit shall be inoperative. If the switch uses a key, it shall be removable only in the "off" position;
4. Head lamps;
5. Reflex reflectors;
6. Tail lamps;
7. A horn;
8. A rearview mirror;
9. Safety warning labels; and
10. Hip restraints and hand holds or a combination thereof.

Section. Liability Insurance Coverage.

Each person operating a Motorized Cart is liable for his or her own actions. Liability insurance coverage varies and each person operating a Motorized Cart should verify his or her coverage.

Section. Exception.

1. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to any self-propelled, two-wheeled vehicle.
2. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to motorized carts operated by the City of Clarkesville.

3. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to motorized carts operated by commercial delivery companies that employ at least 10,000 persons pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 40-6-331(e).

Section. Enforcement.

The Clarkesville Police Department shall be charged with enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section. Penalty.

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine for the first offense of not less than twenty (\$25.00) five dollars. For the second offense, fifty (\$50.00) dollars. If a third offense is committed within one (1) year of conviction of a second offense, the minimum fine shall be one (\$100.00) hundred dollars and the owner's registration shall be revoked. If a registration is revoked, the owner shall pay a re-registration fee of two (\$200.00) hundred dollars. The registered owner or family member cannot thereafter register a Motorized Cart for use in the City for a period of two (2) years following a third conviction.

Section. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the City of Clarkesville receiving supplies for registration of Carts, but no later than thirty (90) days from passage.
