




#### Percent Change in Population from 2010 to 2020

Population Change in Resident Over 18 from 2010-2020






#### Distribution of Residents Over 18 Years of Age from 2010-2020






#### 2010-2020 Population Change




# Coral Springs Population Changes

#### **INCREASED DIVERSITY 2000-2020**















Non-Hispanic Population, 2020




