Artist Stephanie Chisholm (They/Them) says "It means a lot to have completed my first mural in Ferndale- a place that has welcomed and supported me in various ways over the years. Intuitive abstract work requires an open and curious mind and so does living in a world which embraces belonging. As a dog walker here, I spend a lot of time exploring every street in the neighborhood. There is a felt experience of energy and acceptance that takes place. I did my best to transfer that sense of upliftment and all I've soaked in over the years into the artwork to hopefully produce something others can enjoy and reflect upon too."

The mural locations were carefully chosen to enhance the pedestrian experience and activate underutilized spaces. From the rear entrance of Natural Patch to the Emory, to Howe's Bayou, the murals now brighten several prominent locations across the city. "Art has the extraordinary ability to transcend barriers, fostering connections between individuals from all walks of life", remarked Mayor Melanie Piana. "The mural art theme "You Belong Here" reflects our community's commitment to elevate diversity, love and belonging. I'm excited to expand on our small collection of mural art. Blank downtown building walls are a perfect canvas for expressing Ferndale's uniqueness."

The selection process was overseen by an advisory committee comprising representatives from the DDA, Ferndale Arts and Cultural Committee, and City of Ferndale. The committee evaluated each artist's proposal based on artistic quality, feasibility, location appropriateness, and diversity of styles and artists. Properties submitted for consideration were evaluated to prioritize highly visible public sites, underutilized pedestrian spaces, or those with safety and security issues. The goal was to create a collection of murals throughout downtown that would celebrate the unique voices of the artists while reflecting the vibrant tapestry of Ferndale's community.

"Our inaugural mural program has been an absolute success! We had a great turnout from a wide variety of artists, both in style and constitution. The process was fun and efficient (rare bedfellows). It's hard to believe how quickly it all came together. Ferndale is a little more colorful now and I couldn't be prouder." said Pj Jacokes, DDA Board Chair
