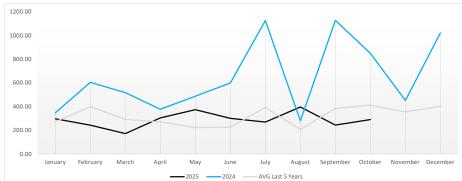

#### **CITY OF HUMBLE**

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 25-900**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 6.06 "VACATION ACCRUAL RATE" OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE PERSONNEL POLICIES.

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the Administration, the City Council of the City of Humble, Texas deems it a necessity to amend Section 6.06 "Vacation Accrual Rate" of the Personnel Policies of the City of Humble to read as follows:

"6.06 VACATION ACCRUAL RATE: All regular full-time employees shall be entitled to a vacation period based on the length of service with the City and with the vacation paid at the employee's regular rate of pay. Vacation time shall be earned at the following rate:

1 Year – 4 Years
5 Years – 11 Years
12 Years – 19 Years
20 Years – Separation
10 working days per year
15 working days per year
20 working days per year
25 working days per year

Vacation time shall be earned on an annual basis beginning on January 1, 2026 and shall be available for the eligible employee to use immediately subject to supervisor approval. When an employee's vacation accrual rate is increased according to the above stated schedule, they will receive the difference in days between their previous accrual rate and new accrual rate on their anniversary date, which will immediately be available for use, subject to supervisor approval.

Employees hired on or after January 1, 2026 shall begin accruing vacation time on a pro-rated basis from the start date of their employment through December 31st of the year in which they were hired; the amount of vacation earned during that time will then be made available to them on the following January 1st. They will then earn vacation time at the rate and schedule as specified above for each subsequent year. However, new employees will not be permitted to utilize any vacation time until completing at least six (6) months of employment. Following the employee's initial six (6) months of employment, the pro-rated amount of vacation they earned may be made available to them for use subject to supervisor approval. Any amount of vacation time utilized between the employee's date of hire and the following January 1st will be deducted from the employee's initial vacation time allotment.

Under special conditions and at the discretion of the department administrator, a new employee may be permitted to use up to five (5) days of vacation time during the initial six (6) months of employment. Special conditions that may warrant a new employee needing vacation time include but are not limited to: illness, death of a family member, or a preplanned event that is disclosed to the supervisor at the time of hire such as a family vacation, wedding, family reunion, a child's graduation or other

similar circumstance. If the new employee uses advanced vacation time that exceeds the amount they would have otherwise earned up to that point and his/her employment is terminated or otherwise separated from the city prior to their completing six (6) months of employment, the amount of vacation time that exceeds the amount of vacation time earned shall be deducted from the employee's final pay check. Any amount of vacation time utilized under this scenario will also be deducted from the amount of time that is allotted to the employee on the following January 1st."

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE TEXAS:

Section 1:	That the City Council of the City of Humble, Texas does hereby amend Section 6.06 of the Personnel Policies of the City of Humble as stated in the preamble of this Resolution.

The nomination period for period for the selection of two members of HCAD's board of directors has closed. The names of all candidates officially and timely nominated are listed on the enclosed "Certification of Ballot" form.

The governing bodies of taxing units that are qualified to vote under Texas Property Tax Code Section 6.03(d) will vote for directors from among the nominated candidates for two (2) directorships on the appraisal district's board of directors for terms beginning on January 1, 2026.

Resolutions and the Certification of Ballot must be delivered to arrive before 5:00 p.m. on December 15, 2025. Ballots and resolutions received after this date and time will not be counted.

## **VOTING PROCESS**

Nominees are listed alphabetically on the ballot by surname in the manner prescribed by the Texas Property Tax Code.

According to voting entitlement calculations made pursuant to Texas Property Tax Code Section 6.03(d), you <u>City of Humble</u> have <u>2</u> votes.

Your votes may be cast for one candidate or may be distributed among any of the candidates listed on the Certification of Ballot. See Property Tax Code Section 6.03(c).

# Please be certain to write down the number of votes you wish to cast for each candidate(s) for whom you are casting your votes.

Each governing body that casts its votes for one or more of the nominees must formally adopt a resolution naming the person(s) for whom it votes, and the number of votes cast for each candidate. A copy of the adopted resolution must be submitted to the Chief Appraiser before 5:00 p.m. on December 15, 2025. The vote must be by resolution.

The two candidates receiving the most votes will be appointed to the board of directors for 4-year terms respectively, beginning January 1, 2026. A tie vote will be resolved by a method of chance chosen by the Chief Appraiser.

To assist you in the election procedure, I have enclosed a Certification of Ballot and a suggested form of a resolution you can use for casting your vote for the candidate representing your taxing unit.

### SPECIAL DEADLINE - LARGE VOTING BLOCK TAXING UNITS

It is important to note that a very specific voting time limit applies to some governing bodies of taxing units because they are each entitled to cast at least 5% (95) of the total votes (1,888).

The following provision applies to Harris County, Houston Independent School District, the City of Houston and Cypress-Fairbanks ISD:

Specifically, Section 6.03(k-1) states, "[T]he governing body of each taxing unit entitled to cast at least five percent of the total votes must determine its vote by resolution adopted at the first or second open meeting of the governing body that is held after the date the Chief Appraiser delivers the ballot to the presiding officer of the governing body. The governing body must submit its vote to the Chief Appraiser not later than the third day following the date the resolution is adopted.

### **COUNTING VOTES**

The Chief Appraiser will count the votes as required under the provisions contained in the Texas Property Tax Code. The Chief Appraiser will then declare the results and notify the winners, the nominees, and the presiding officers of each taxing unit before December 31, 2025.

In counting the votes, the Tax Code requires the Chief Appraiser to separate the ballots returned by the Conservation and Reclamation Districts. Pursuant to Section 6.03(k), the candidate who receives the most votes of the Conservation and Reclamation Districts is considered to have received all the votes <u>cast</u> by the Conservation and Reclamation Districts. The other candidates receiving votes from the Conservation and Reclamation Districts who did not receive the most votes cast are considered to have received no votes from the Conservation and Reclamation Districts.

Votes returned by taxing units other than Conservation and Reclamation Districts will be counted for the individual for whom the vote was cast as reflected on the ballot received by the Chief Appraiser.

Resolutions and the Certification of Ballot must be delivered to arrive before 5:00 p.m. on December 15, 2025. Ballots and resolutions received after this date and time will not be counted.

Acceptance: A proposal made upon these terms is subject to acceptance within fifteen days from date and the prices are subject to change without notice prior to acceptance by Customer. If your order is not such an acceptance, then this document is Hunton Services' offer, subject to credit approval, to provide the goods and/or Work solely in accordance with the following terms and conditions of sale

Exclusions from Work: Hunton Services' obligation is limited to the Work as defined and does not include any modifications to the Premises under the Americans with Disabilities Act or any other law or building code(s).

Construction Procedures: Hunton Services shall supervise and direct the Work using its best skill and attention and have exclusive control over construction means, methods, lechniques, sequences and procedures.

Payment Terms: Customer shall pay Hunton Services invoices within net thirty (30) days of invoice date. Hunton Services may invoice Customer for all equipment or material furnished, whether delivered to the installation site or to an off-site storage facility and for all work performed on-site or off-site. If payment is not received as required hereby. On October 16, 2025, eleven (11) bids were received for the above referenced project. This project involves the removal of existing asphalt pavement and replacement with approximately 12,800 SY of 6" thick reinforced concrete pavement with 6" curbs and gutters. The project also includes the installation of approximately 540 LF of 18" through 24" RCP storm sewers, 2,500 LF of 6" through 8" PVC water lines and associated appurtenances.

1. <u>Bid Tabulation Sheet</u> – Eleven (11) construction firms participated in the bidding process. The bids were checked for mathematical errors and/or bid irregularities. The bid tabulation is attached to this letter.

<u>Qualifications and References</u> – Upon receipt of the bids, ARKK's staff evaluated each of the bids for qualifications of bidders and a review of past performance.

Castillo-Aranda, LLC was the apparent low bidder for this project. However, based on the information provided, Castillo-Aranda, LLC does not meet the minimum experience requirements outlined in the bid documents. Specifically:

- a. The contractor is required to have completed a minimum of five (5) projects of similar nature and scope. The qualifications submitted do not demonstrate experience with projects comparable to this one.
- b. The qualifications and project examples listed by Castillo-Aranda, LLC appear to reference work performed by Aranda Brothers Construction, Inc., rather than Castillo-Aranda, LLC itself.

As a result, we recommend that the bid submitted by Castillo-Aranda, LLC not be considered for award.

The **second-lowest bidder**, **Ballast Point Construction**, **Inc.**, provided ARKK Engineers with a qualifications package, including a list of references, proposed subcontractors, and major suppliers. Ballast Point Construction, Inc. has successfully completed similar projects for nearby municipalities such as the City of Sugar Land, the City of Jersey Village, and the City of Oak Ridge North.

ARKK Engineers contacted multiple references provided by Ballast Point Construction, Inc., all of whom offered positive feedback regarding the firm's performance, communication, and quality of work. Based on this review, Ballast Point Construction, Inc. appears to be a responsible contractor capable of performing the specified work in a satisfactory and professional manner.

For these reasons, we recommend that the City of Humble award the McDugald Road, Sharon Drive and Carolyn Court Reconstruction Project to Ballast Point Construction, Inc. for a total amount of \$2,904,918.00.

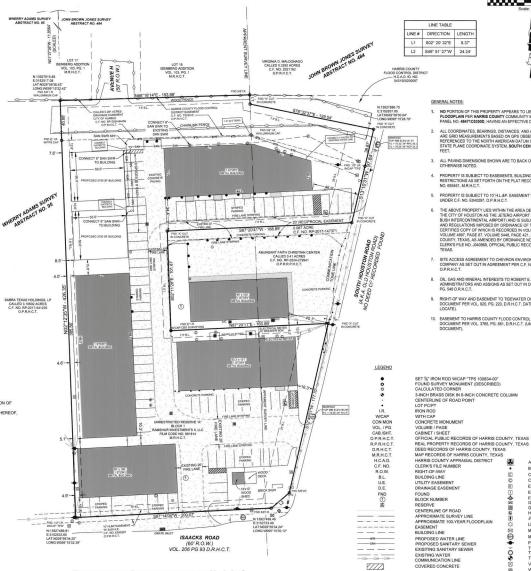

#### CITY OF HUMBLE

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 25-1002**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE, TEXAS, AMENDING ARTICLE 4.09 MOBILE HOMES AND MOBILE HOME PARKS BY ADDING PROVISIONS RELATED TO MANUFACTURED HOMES; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE AFTER PUBLICATION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Humble, Texas, finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Humble to adopt an Ordinance amending and updating the City's regulation for mobile and manufactured homes and parks for the purposes of promoting and protecting the public health, safety, and general welfare of the community;

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE, TEXAS, THAT:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are found to be true and correct.
- Section 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Humble be amended by amending Article 4.09 Mobile Homes and Mobile Home Parks, by adding the language underlined and removing the language struck through as herein in **Exhibit A** to this Ordinance.
- All provisions of any ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent they are in conflict, but such repeal shall not abate any pending prosecution for violation of the repealed ordinance, nor shall the repeal prevent a prosecution from being commenced for any violation if occurring prior to the repeal of the ordinance. Any remaining portions of said ordinances shall remain in full force and effect.
- Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional and/or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Humble hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, regardless of whether any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases is declared unconstitutional and/or invalid.
- Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective within ten (10) days of its adoption and after publication in an official newspaper of the City of Humble pursuant to Section 12 of the Charter of the City of Humble.

### Exhibit A

Article 4.09 Mobile and Manufacture Homes and Mobile and Manufactures Home Parks

### Division I Generally

#### **§ 4.09.001. Definitions.**

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Dependent mobile home. means a mobile home which does not have a flush toilet and a bath or shower.

Home. means either a mobile home or manufactured home.

Independent mobile home. means a mobile home which has a flush toilet and a bath or shower.

Manufactured Home. means a HUD-code manufactured home.

Mobile home, means a structure:

- (1) Constructed before June 15, 1976;
- (2) Built on a permanent chassis;
- (3) Designed for use as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when the structure is connected to the required utilities;
- (4) Transportable in one or more sections;
- (5) In the traveling mode, at least eight body feet in width or at least 40 body feet in length or, when erected on-site, at least 320 square feet; and
- (6) Which includes the plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and electrical systems of the home.

Mobile <u>and Manufactured</u> home park. means any plot of ground upon which two or more mobile <u>or manufactured</u> homes occupied for dwelling or sleeping purposes are located, regardless of whether or not a charge is made for such accommodation.

Mobile <u>or Manufactured</u> home space. means a plot of ground within a mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park designed for the accommodation of one mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home.

Natural or artificial barrier. means any river, pond, canal, railroad, levee, embankment, fence or hedge.

Park. means a mobile and manufactured home park.

#### § 4.09.002. Placement outside mobile home park or subdivision prohibited.

- (a) The placement of mobile <u>or manufactured</u> homes within the city shall be prohibited except in platted or approved <del>mobile home</del> parks or subdivisions.
- (b) Existing mobile homes placed within the city prior to April 28, 1993, shall be allowed to remain.

#### § 4.09.003. Requirements for mobile and manufactured homes.

- (a) Sewage disposal. Each mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home shall be required to comply with all city regulations regarding sanitary sewage connections and capacity fees.
- (b) Setbacks. Mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall comply with the subdivision ordinance setback requirements.
- (c) Skirting. Mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall be skirted in accordance with the Manufactured Housing Standards Act; Manufactured Housing Standards Code, V.T.C.A., Occupations Code chapter 1201.
- (d) Blocking. Mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall comply with blocking standards per the provisions of the Manufactured Housing Standards Act; Manufactured Housing Standards Code, V.T.C.A., Occupations Code chapter 1201.
- (e) Mobile offices and construction trailers. Mobile offices and mobile construction trailers shall conform to the aforementioned regulations. All mobile offices and trailers shall be promptly removed from the construction site at the completion of the construction project.
- (f) Posting of street address. All mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall be marked with the street address in four-inch or larger numbers, clearly visible from the street.

#### § 4.09.004. Powers and duties of building official.

The building official shall enforce all the provisions of this article and shall act on any question relative to the mode or manner of construction and the materials to be used in the erection, addition to, alteration, repair, removal, location, occupancy and maintenance of mobile and manufactured homes, except as may otherwise be specifically provided for by statutory requirements, or as herein provided.

#### § 4.09.005. Notices and orders.

The building official shall issue all necessary notices or orders to remove illegal or unsafe conditions, and to ensure compliance with all the requirements of this article for safety, health and general welfare of the public.

#### § 4.09.006. Tie-downs.

All mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall be tied down in accordance with all local ordinances, state laws and federal guidelines. The mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home shall be anchored to resist overturning or sliding due to wind. Anchors, or tie-downs, such as cast-in-place concrete, deadmen, eyelets imbedded in concrete, screw augers or arrowhead anchors, shall be placed at least at each corner of the mobile home. Each device shall be able to sustain a minimum load of 4,800 pounds.

#### § 4.09.007. Maintenance.

All mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes, both existing and new, and all parts thereof shall be maintained in a safe and sanitary condition. All devices or safeguards which are required by this article or by standards adopted by this code in a mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home shall be maintained in good working order.

#### § 4.09.008. Sales, storage and repair lots.

- (a) All storage and repair lots must be surrounded by an eight-foot board fence with locked gates to restrict public access.
- (b) All sales lots must be surrounded by a minimum of a six-foot chain-link fence with gates and other security devices whereby the lot can be closed for off-business hours.
- (c) All mobile homes must be at least 20 feet from the inside lot line, 20 feet from all corners and no closer than 20 feet from any other habitable structures. Mobile homes can be no closer than ten feet apart.
- (d) Storage, sales and repair lots shall be well lighted, and all vegetation and trash must be taken care of in a prudent manner. Fire protection must be provided and conform to present city, state and federal fire prevention codes.
- (e) To store or repair a mobile home, a permit must be obtained for either storage or repair. Such permit shall be good for 60 days' duration and can be renewed. The fee for a storage or repair permit shall be as currently established or as hereafter adopted by resolution of the city council from time to time prior to moving the mobile home into the city limits.
- (f) Employees shall not reside in a mobile home under repair or for sale.

### DIVISION 2 Permit

#### § 4.09.031. Required.

Any person occupying and maintaining a mobile home outside of a duly licensed mobile home park within this city on June 1, 1973, and any person occupying and maintaining a mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home within a duly licensed mobile home park or desiring to do so, shall first obtain a permit therefor from the city. Failure to obtain a permit and continued occupancy and maintenance of a mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home without renewal of such permit shall be a misdemeanor.

#### § 4.09.032. Application.

Applications for permits required by the provisions of this division shall be made to the building official, giving the name and address of the applicant and a description of the property upon which the mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home is to be located.

#### § 4.09.033. Affidavit.

No permit shall be issued under the provisions of this division until an affidavit has been submitted to the city stating that the purpose for which the permit is being sought will not violate any deed restrictions or covenants running with the land to which the property may be subject.

#### § 4.09.034. Fee.

The fee for a permit required by the provisions of this division shall be as currently established or as hereafter adopted by resolution of the city council from time to time, and shall be paid before such permit is issued.

# DIVISION 3 Mobile and Manufactured Home Parks Part I In General

#### § 4.09.061. Maintenance.

Every person owning or operating a mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park shall maintain such park, and any facilities, fixtures and permanent equipment in connection therewith, in a clean and sanitary condition and shall maintain such equipment in a state of good repair.

#### § 4.09.062. Office building.

Each mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park shall be provided with a building to be known as the office in which shall be kept copies of all records pertaining to the management and supervision of the park, as well as rules and regulations of the park, and such records, rules and regulations shall be available for inspection by law enforcement officers, public health officials and other officials whose duties necessitate acquisition of the information contained therein.

#### § 4.09.063. Rules and regulations.

It shall be the duty of the owner, his agent, representative or manager to prescribe rules and regulations for management of the mobile home park; to make adequate provisions for the enforcement of such rules; and to subscribe to any and all subsequent rules and regulations which may be adopted for the management of such park. Copies of all such rules and regulations shall be furnished to the city council. In addition thereto, it shall be the duty of the owner, his agent, representative or manager to comply strictly with the following:

- (1) Provide for regular inspection of the water and sanitary conveniences.
- (2) Provide for the collection and removal of garbage and other waste material.
- (3) Prohibit the placing or storage of unsightly material or vehicles of any kind.
- (4) Provide for the regular cleaning, painting, repairing and disinfecting of all buildings.
- (5) Take such other measures as may be deemed to be necessary by the city to preserve the health, comfort and safety of all persons residing in the park and the general public.
- (6) Report to the city, within 24 hours, all cases of communicable diseases or suspected cases of communicable diseases affecting any guest or employee of the park.
- (7) Report immediately to the police department all acts of disorderly character committed by any person inside the park.
- (8) See that copies of all rules and regulations are prepared and posted in conspicuous locations throughout the park.

#### § 4.09.064. Management.

Each mobile home park shall be under the direct management of the owner or his agent or representative, for whose acts he shall be fully responsible. The name of the person entrusted with the direct management of a park shall be filed for reference with the city council. Such person must be of good reputation and character and shall satisfy the city council of his experience and capacity to supervise, manage, regulate and control the park and maintain good sanitary conditions in and about the park.

#### § 4.09.065. Supervision.

A responsible attendant, caretaker, owner or operator shall be in charge at all times to keep the mobile home park, its facilities and equipment in a clean, orderly and sanitary condition and he shall be answerable, with the licensee, for any violation of the provisions of this division.

#### § 4.09.066. Register of occupants.

- (a) It shall be the duty of the licensee to keep a register containing a record of all mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home owners and occupants located within the park. The register shall contain the following information:
- (1) The name and address of each occupant.
- (2) The make, model and year of all automobiles and mobile homes.
- (3) The license number and owner of each mobile home and the automobile by which it is towed.
- (4) The state issuing such license.
- (5) The date of arrival and of departure of each mobile home.
- (6) Whether or not each mobile home is an independent or dependent mobile home.
- (b) The park shall keep the register available for inspection, at all times, by law enforcement officers, public health officials and other officials whose duties necessitate acquisition of the information contained in the register. The register records shall not be destroyed for a period of three years following the date of registration.

#### Part II License

#### § 4.09.091. Required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to maintain or operate, within the limits of the city, any mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park unless such person shall first obtain a license therefor.

#### § 4.09.092. Application.

Applications for a mobile home park license shall be filed in triplicate with the city council.

Applications shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and shall contain the following:

- (1) The name and address of the applicant.
- (2) The location and legal description of the mobile home park.
- (3) A complete plan of the park showing compliance with the provisions of this part.
- (4) Plans and specifications of all buildings and other improvements constructed or to be constructed within the park.
- (5) Such further information as may be requested by the city council, to enable it to determine if the mobile home park will comply with the legal requirements.

#### **§ 4.09.093. Investigation.**

The city manager or designee, city health officer and city council shall investigate the applicant for a license required by the provisions of this part and inspect the proposed plans and specifications. Each of them shall then make a report to the city council concerning such applicant and include therein their recommendations relative to the issuance of a license. If the mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park will be in compliance with all provisions of this part and all other applicable ordinances or statutes, the city council may approve the application and, in the case of proposed parks, make such approval contingent upon the completion of the park according to the plans and specifications submitted with the application.

#### § 4.09.094. Fee.

The annual license fee for each mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park shall be as currently established or as hereafter adopted by resolution of the city council from time to time. No fee shall be charged for the transfer of such license as provided for in this part.

#### § 4.09.095. Issuance.

Upon approval by the city council, the city manager or designee shall issue a license applied for under the provisions of this part.

#### § 4.09.096. Transfer.

Upon application for a transfer of a mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park license, the city council may issue a transfer if the city council finds that the transferee is in compliance with this part. Such original license and transfer thereof may be granted at any time during the year.

#### § 4.09.097. Expiration.

Every license issued under the provisions of this part shall expire at the end of the fiscal year of the city during which the same was issued, unless previously revoked or terminated.

#### § 4.09.098. Posting.

The license certificate issued under the provisions of this part shall be conspicuously posted in the office of or on the premises of the mobile and manufactured home park at all times.

#### § 4.09.099. Revocation.

The city council may revoke any license issued under the provisions of this part when the licensee has been found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of violating any provision of this division. After such conviction, the license may be reissued if the circumstances leading to conviction have been remedied and the park is being maintained and operated in full compliance with law and this division.

#### Part III

#### **Site Requirements**

#### § 4.09.121. Compliance.

Every mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park established and operated within this city shall conform to the provisions of this part.

#### § 4.09.122. Location.

Each boundary of a mobile home park shall be at least 200 feet from any permanent residential building located outside the park, unless separated therefrom by a natural or artificial barrier, or unless a majority of the property owners according to area within such 200 feet consent in writing to the establishment of the park. The provisions of this section shall not apply to mobile and manufactured home parks already in existence and in operation on January 8, 1970, and such existing and operating parks shall be treated as a nonconforming use insofar as the requirements of this section are concerned.

#### § 4.09.123. Drainage.

The mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park shall be located on a well-drained site, properly graded to ensure rapid drainage and freedom from stagnant pools of water.

#### § 4.09.124. Minimum size of spaces.

Mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home spaces shall be provided in every mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park consisting of a minimum of 1,000 square feet for each space, which shall be at least 25 feet wide and clearly defined.

#### § 4.09.125. Placement of homes.

Mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes shall be so harbored on each space that there shall be at least 15 feet of clearance between mobile <u>and manufactured</u> homes; provided, however, that with respect to mobile homes parked end-to-end, the end-to-end clearance between mobile homes may be less than 15 feet but shall not be less than ten feet. No mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home shall be located closer than ten feet from any building within the park or from any property line bounding the park.

#### § 4.09.126. Setbacks.

No mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home shall be situated closer to the street upon which the mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park fronts than 30 feet from the front property line, and in the case of mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home parks situated [on a side street] nearer than 25 feet to the property line adjacent to the side street.

#### § 4.09.127. Recreation area.

Each mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park shall have a park or playground area, centrally located within such park, having a minimum area in size equal to ten square feet per mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home space.

#### § 4.09.128. Electrical outlets.

An electrical outlet supplying at least 110 volts shall be provided for each mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home space within each <del>mobile home</del> park.

#### § 4.09.129. Service buildings.

Each park shall provide service buildings to house toilet facilities, bathing facilities and laundry facilities as hereinafter more particularly prescribed.

#### § 4.09.130. Driveways.

All mobile or manufactured home spaces shall abut upon a driveway of not less than 25 feet in width which shall have unobstructed access to a public street, alley or highway. All driveways shall be hard-surfaced, well marked in the daytime and lighted at night. The minimum quality of such driveway surfacing shall be two-course gravel surface to be approved by the city engineer.

#### § 4.09.131. Walkways.

Walkways not less than two feet wide shall be provided from the mobile home spaces to the service buildings. The walkway shall be hard-surfaced, well marked in the daytime and lighted at night.

#### § 4.09.132. Additional construction attached to mobile or manufactured home.

It shall be unlawful for any person operating a mobile <u>and manufactured</u> home park or occupying a mobile <u>or manufactured</u> home to construct or permit to be constructed in such park or in connection with such <u>mobile</u> home any additional structure, building or shelter in connection with or attached to a <u>mobile</u> home, except, however, awnings of canvas or metal, suitably constructed, may be attached to such <u>mobile</u> homes.

#### § 4.09.133. Water supply.

An adequate supply of pure water for drinking and domestic purposes shall be supplied to meet the requirements of the park. The water supply shall be obtained from faucets only. No common drinking cups shall be permitted. Each mobile home space shall be provided with a cold water tap at least four inches above the ground. An adequate supply of hot water shall be provided at all times in the service buildings for all bathing, washing, cleaning and laundry facilities.

#### **§ 4.09.134. Sewage disposal.**

Waste from showers, bathtubs, flush toilets, urinals, lavatories, slop sinks and laundries in service buildings and other buildings within the park shall be discharged into the public sewerage system in compliance with applicable provisions of this code and city ordinances. Each mobile home space shall be provided with a trapped sewer at least four inches in diameter which shall be connected to receive the waste from the shower, bathtub, flush toilet, lavatory and kitchen sink of the mobile home harbored in such space and having any or all of such facilities. The trapped sewer in each mobile home space shall be connected to discharge the mobile home waste into the public sewer system in compliance with applicable provisions of this code and city ordinances.

#### § 4.09.135. Garbage receptacles.

Tightly covered garbage cans or city-approved plastic bags shall be provided in quantities adequate to permit disposal of all garbage and rubbish. Garbage cans shall be located not further than 200 feet from any mobile home space. The cans shall be kept in sanitary condition at all times. Garbage and rubbish shall be collected and disposed of as frequently as may be necessary to ensure that the garbage cans shall not overflow.

#### § 4.09.136. Fire protection.

Every park shall be equipped at all times with one fire extinguisher in good working order and currently charged for every ten mobile home spaces, located not further than 200 feet from each mobile home space.

#### § 4.09.137. Fuel.

Bottled gas for cooking purposes shall not be used at individual mobile home spaces unless the containers are properly connected by copper or other suitable metallic tubing. Bottled gas cylinders

shall be securely fastened in place. No cylinder containing bottled gas shall be located in a mobile home space or within five feet of a door thereof. State and local regulations applicable to the handling of bottled gas and fuel must be followed.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 25-902**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE, TEXAS AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE CONNECT INVESTMENT TRUST.

- WHEREAS, the City of Humble (the "Participant") is a local government or state agency of the State of Texas and is empowered to delegate to a public funds investment pool the authority to invest funds and to act as custodian of investments purchased with investment funds;
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Participant to invest funds in investments that provide for the preservation and safety of principal, liquidity, and yield consistent with the Public Funds Investment Act (the "Act");
- WHEREAS, the Connect Investment Trust d/b/a Texas Connect (the "Trust") is an investment pool named Texas Connect, whose purpose is to assist local governments and state agencies with the investment of public funds under the objectives of preserving principal, ensuring liquidity, and yielding reasonable returns consistent with such objectives;
- WHEREAS, the Trust was formed under the Act and the laws of the State of Texas and is governed by its First Amended and Restated Trust Agreement (the "Agreement");
- WHEREAS, the Participant has received and reviewed the Agreement, the Texas Connect Information Statement, and the Texas Connect Investment Policy (collectively, the "Participation Documents"), each of which is made available at Texas-Connect.com;
- WHEREAS, the Participant has had the opportunity to discuss the Participation Documents with the Trust and its representatives and otherwise received such advice as it deems necessary (legal or otherwise) to make an informed decision about an investment in the Trust;
- WHEREAS, the Participant has determined that the investments proposed to be acquired by Texas Connect are of a type that are permitted by the Act and are consistent with its investment policy;
- WHEREAS, the Participant has determined that an investment in the Texas Connect will assist the Participant in achieving the goals set forth in its investment policy;
- WHEREAS, the Participant has delegated its authority to certain authorized representatives to enter into the Agreement with the Trust and other local governments and state agencies for the investment of their respective public funds; and

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUMBLE, TEXAS,

- SECTION 1: The Participant approves the Agreement, agrees to its terms, including the participation terms in Article II, and authorizes its representatives to establish an account in its name in the Trust or one of its pools for transmitting public funds for investment.
- SECTION 2: The Participant has taken any and all actions required by the Act for its participation in the
- SECTION 3: The Participant finds that the facts and recitations contained in the preamble of this Resolution are true and correct.

- SECTION 4: The individuals, Participant's duly authorized representative(s) are each hereby empowered and directed to perform all acts and execute, acknowledge, and deliver in the name and on behalf of the Participant all certificates, instruments, and other papers, whether or not herein mentioned, as they may determine to be necessary or desirable to carry out the terms and provisions of this Resolution.
- SECTION 5: This resolution and its authorization shall continue in full force and effect until amended or revoked by the Participant and the Trust receives a copy of any such amendment or revocation.

### **Investment Management Agreement**

Meeder Public Funds

This Investment Management Agreement ("Agreement") is effective as of the date executed by and between Meeder Public Funds, Inc. ("Meeder"), its applicable affiliates, and the undersigned account owner ("Client").

- 1. **Investment Management Services**. Under this Agreement, Meeder provides discretionary investment management services for public entity clients in accordance with the terms of the applicable state investment code and investment policy.
- 2. **Appointment**. Client appoints Meeder as discretionary investment manager to manage the assets deposited in any account subject to the terms of this Agreement ("Account"). Meeder accepts the appointment as investment manager and shall invest, reinvest and manage the securities, cash and other assets of the Account as directed by Client and in accordance with the written investment objectives and any specific investment restrictions or limitations of the Client. Meeder shall provide advice only with respect to assets in the Account and shall have no responsibility for the actions or non-actions of predecessor investment advisors or for the management of assets other than the assets allocated to the Account.
- 3. **Trading Authorization**. Client grants Meeder discretionary trading authority and appoints Meeder as agent and attorney-in-fact with respect to investments in the Account. Meeder may direct the purchase, sale, exchange, conversion, delivery or other acquisition or disposition of securities and other investments in the Account and act on behalf of Client in all other matters incidental to the handling of Account investments, all without prior consultation with Client.
- 4. **Custody**. Meeder will not assume physical custody of the Account or any portion of it. Client shall establish a custodial account with a qualified custodian ("Custodian"). Client will receive from the Custodian account statements and confirmations identifying assets and transactions in the Account. All transactions will be consummated by payment to, or delivery by, the Custodian of all cash, securities and other assets due to or from the Account. The Custodian shall be responsible for investing any daily cash balances in the Account and Meeder will not exercise discretion to select sweep vehicles for the Account.
- 5. **Investment Objectives and Restrictions**. Client may provide Meeder with an Investment Policy Statement or other written directions setting forth the investment objectives and any specific investment restrictions or limitations which govern the Account. Meeder shall be entitled to rely on such guidelines, objectives and restrictions relating to the Account as it may receive from Client. It is Client's responsibility to inform Meeder in writing of any modifications to these directions, which shall be given ten days in advance of any such change.
- 6. **Brokerage**. Unless otherwise directed, Meeder will place trades for the Account through such brokers or dealers as it may select. When selecting brokers, Meeder's primary consideration will be the broker's ability to provide best execution of trades and Meeder may consider the quality and reliability of the brokerage services, trade price and commission, as well as research and other services provided by the broker-dealers.
- 7. **Trade Aggregation**. Meeder may aggregate trades for multiple clients when, in the adviser's judgment, aggregation is in the best interests of the clients involved. Orders are aggregated to facilitate best execution and each client participating in the aggregated transaction receives the same price and participation in such trade on a pro-rata basis. Where it is not possible to obtain the same execution price for all securities purchased or sold on an aggregated basis, Meeder will follow its trade allocation policy, which is designed to ensure that securities allocations are made in a fair and equitable manner.
- 8. **Fees.** For the services provided in accordance with this Agreement, Client will pay an investment advisory fee as indicated on Schedule A to this Agreement. Investment advisory fees do not include custody fees charged

by Client's selected Custodian. Where Client has elected to have fees deducted, Client authorizes the Custodian to deduct fees from the Account and pay them to Meeder.

- 9. **Promoter Arrangements**. Meeder accepts Clients referred through unaffiliated third parties ("Promoters") and may pay cash compensation for the endorsement of Meeder's services, which provides the Promoter with an incentive to refer clients. Clients will not incur additional fees for being referred to Meeder by a Promoter. Clients that engage Meeder as their investment adviser following a referral by a Promoter will receive a written disclosure statement describing the nature and terms of the arrangement, including the amount payable to the Promoter.
- 10. **Local Government Investment Pools**. Where appropriate, Meeder may recommend the use of a Local Government Investment Pool ("LGIP") in which Meeder or one of its affiliates earn advisory and/or administration fees. Assets placed in an LGIP are not included among eligible assets when calculating the investment advisory fee. Because Meeder or its affiliates receive fees in connection with programs we sponsor or recommend, use of these programs presents a conflict of interest. By investing in an LGIP, Client specifically consents to the conflicts presented by such investment and payment of fees.
- 11. **Custodial Sweep Vehicles**. Where available, Meeder may recommend the use of the Meeder Government Money Market Fund as a vehicle to sweep cash held in the custodial account for investment. Because Meeder's affiliates earn advisory, transfer agency and administration fees for management of the Meeder Government Money Market Fund, recommendation of the fund as a sweep vehicle presents a conflict of interest. Meeder charges investment advisory fees on the total market value of assets held in the custodial account, including sweep vehicles. By selecting the Meeder Government Money Market Fund, Client specifically consents to the conflicts presented by such investment and payment of fees.
- 12. **Third-Party Payments.** Meeder or its affiliates receive compensation from unaffiliated third parties for endorsing or recommending certain financial products to its clients. This arrangement presents a conflict of interest because it provides Meeder with an incentive to solicit and secure participation in the program. Asset-based advisory fees are not charged for assets invested in products that pay indirect compensation to Meeder.
- 13. **Proxy Voting.** Meeder does not accept or assume authority to vote proxies for its public fund clients. Clients will receive their proxies or other solicitations directly from their Custodian. Client agrees that Meeder will not advise or act for Client in any legal proceedings, including bankruptcies or class actions, involving securities held or previously held by the Account or the issuers of such securities.
- 14. **Electronic Delivery**. Client consents to electronic delivery of all documents from Meeder, including but not limited to a copy of the executed Agreement, statements, confirmations, Meeder's Form ADV Part 2 and amendments thereto, and other general communications delivered to Client's electronic mail address of record. Delivery of communications to Clients in this fashion will be deemed effective unless Meeder is notified otherwise. Client is responsible for maintaining an accurate and up to date email address and to ensure that Client at all times has the ability to receive communications directed in this manner.
- 15. **Confidentiality**. All information and advice furnished by either party to the other, including their respective agents and employees, shall be treated as confidential and shall not be disclosed to third parties except as otherwise required by law or as agreed to in writing by Client. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Client consents to the use of Client's name in sales and marketing material used by Meeder or its affiliates solely for the purpose of identifying the Client as an investment advisory client.
- 16. **Services to Other Clients**. Client understands that Meeder serves as investment adviser for other clients and will continue to do so. Client also understands that Meeder, its personnel and affiliates ("Affiliated Persons") may give advice or take action in performing their duties to other clients, or for their own accounts, that differ from advice given to or action taken for Client. Meeder is not obligated to buy, sell or recommend for Client any security or other investment that Meeder or its Affiliated Persons may recommend for any other client or their own accounts.
- 17. **Meeder's Representations**. Meeder represents that it is a registered investment adviser under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940.

- 18. Client's Representations. Client represents and acknowledges that: (i) Client is the sole owner of the Account assets and has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to commit the assets to Meeder's management and supervision; (ii) that the person signing this Agreement on behalf of Client is authorized and empowered to establish accounts and commit the assets to Meeder's management and supervision on the entity's behalf; (iii) Client has received Meeder's current Form ADV, Part 2A and B; and (iv) Client has received a copy of Meeder's Privacy Policy.
- 19. **Term**. This Agreement may be terminated by either party for any or no reason upon delivery by first class U.S. mail, postage prepaid, or delivery by hand, of a written "Notice of Termination" to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the intended early termination of this Agreement. Termination of this Agreement will not affect the status, obligations or liabilities of the parties to this Agreement that arose prior to such termination.
- 20. **Limitation of Liability**. Except for negligence, malfeasance or violation of applicable law, neither Meeder nor its officers, directors or employees shall be liable to Client for any action performed, or omitted to be performed, or for any errors of judgment in managing the Account. Nor shall Meeder be liable to Client for any act or failure to act by any other third party. The federal securities laws impose liabilities under certain circumstances on persons even when they act in good faith and nothing in this Agreement shall in any way constitute a waiver or limitation of any rights that Client may have under any federal or state securities laws.
- 21. **Assignment**. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the consent of the other party. Meeder will provide Client at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of any proposed assignment, and Client's consent will be presumed unless Client notifies Meeder otherwise in writing prior to the date of the assignment indicated on the notice.
- 22. **Amendment**. This Agreement may be amended by Meeder with thirty (30) days prior written notice to Client and may be amended immediately upon notice to the extent reasonably required to satisfy federal or state regulatory requirements.
- 23. **Governing Law**. This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas without giving effect to any conflict or choice of law provisions of that State.
- 24. **Severability**. If any provision of this Agreement is or should become inconsistent with any law or rule of any governmental or regulatory body having jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Agreement, the provision will be deemed to be rescinded or modified in accordance with any such law or rule. In all other respects, this Agreement will continue and remain in full force and effect.
- 25. **Affiliates**. To the extent necessary to carry out the terms of this Agreement, any named affiliate of Meeder shall be deemed to be a party to the Agreement for that purpose.

Investment advisory fees are subject to a minimum fee of \$15,000 per year, inclusive of any discounts and credits, prorated based on the billing cycle, and payable for each billing period in which assets do not meet the stated minimum. Fees are calculated and billed monthly in arrears based on the value of the securities, cash and other assets in the account at the end of the billing period. Unless otherwise agreed, fees are deducted directly from the Account. For clients that utilize Meeder's Preferred Custodian, fees may be credited an amount equal to the custodial fee up to a maximum annual credit of 0.01% and subject to the applicable minimum fee.
