9. PRESIDENT AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

Carlos A. Migoya, Chief Executive Officer, Jackson Health Systems (JHS) spoke about the actions that are ongoing to re-align and refine Jackson Health System budget and preserve JHS transformation. Post-pandemic inflation across industries has affected all of us in our personal lives, and it certainly has impacted Jackson bottom line. JHS is also experiencing lower-than-anticipated volumes in a few high revenue-generating service lines. JHS recently implemented an efficiency and cost savings plan to help course correct. Now, halfway through this fiscal year, senior leadership team is confident that JHS made the needed changes to ensure continue delivery of best patient care while able to meet institutional goals. On March 13, 2024 JHS hosted a virtual Town Hall meeting on Zoom where Mr. Migoya and executive leadership team spoke candidly about the issues JHS is facing. These challenges are stressful however, JHS is not in a crisis mode, and the Jackson of today is stable, strong and resilient. JHS caregivers and patients can rest assured that this is just a blip that JHS will get through.

Mr. Migoya shared positive news about JHS teams. Rosa Costanzo, Senior Vice President Strategic Sourcing, Supply Chain Management Division and Chief Procurement Officer and Team were recently awarded the GHX Supply Chain of Distinction Award for 2023. This award recognizes GHX Exchange-connected provider organizations that are driving best-in-class efficiencies by executing perfect order metrics during a calendar year. Winner represents the top 25 performers in three organizational segments, Jackson Team was awarded "Large Organization". Ms. Costanzo and her team are role models in their field, Jackson Congratulates them for this well- deserved recognition. In conclusion Mr. Migoya reminded everyone of Thursday, April 4th One Day for Jackson Event. This is a countywide initiative by Jackson Health Foundation exclusively to raise funds and awareness for Jackson Health System. The Committee met on March 27, 2024. Ms. Weiss Nuell provided an overview of the Committee Meeting. Received an outstanding quality report from Andres Gonzalez, Chief Nursing Officer at Jackson South Medical Center. All trends going on the right direction. Resolution for credentialing report presented for approval.

10.b <u>Fiscal Committee, Amadeo Lopez-Castro, III, Vice Chairman</u>

The Committee met on March 27, 2024. Committee received report from Mark Knight. Jackson System has seen improvement in values, however, continue to work with salaries and supply expense reduction. Productivity is strong, there is a reduction in premium pay less than \$8 million; goal is to go to pre-COVID date of \$5 million. Challenges with cash collection, March should be a better month. The outlook for the rest of the year seems to be better, there is a \$1 million profit for the month. Mr. Knight provided an update on the Cyber incident but no significant impact to Jackson. Fiscal team began process for FY25 budget.

The Committee met on March 27, 2024. Esther Caravia reported on the last Legislative Session. It was a great Session based on great strategic meetings and partnerships established in Tallahassee.

Staff requests a waiver of formal competition for the contract items listed in this category because only one supplier exists for the required product/service.

1. (2505665-JR) The Perioperative Services Department, Jackson Memorial Hospital, is requesting an agreement with Medtronic USA, Inc. for a period of three (3) years for the provision of transcatheter aortic valve replacement products and related accessories (ongoing purchase).

Medtronic USA, Inc.:

This Request for Funding:

\$3,112,593 (For Three Years)

Background

Medtronic USA will provide the Trust/Jackson Memorial Hospital, with transcatheter aortic valve replacement products and related accessories. The EvolutTM FX transcatheter aortic valve system sets new expectations for precision, control, and predictability in Transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) procedures. Transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) is a minimally invasive procedure to replace the aortic valve in patients with severe aortic stenosis. This condition occurs when the aortic valve narrows and blood cannot flow normally. TAVR is less invasive than open-heart surgery, and the procedure typically takes less than one hour. The Medtronic TAVR heart valve is designed to work the same as the patient's own heart valve. The metal frame is a blend of nickel and titanium. This material allows the frame to shape itself to the patient's anatomy. The EvolutTM FX valve frame also has gold markers beneath the outer wrap, allowing the surgeon to better see the valve during the procedure. The Medtronic TAVR heart valve comes in four different sizes.

The EvolutTM PRO+ system offers the lowest delivery profile for 23–29 mm valves (allows access down to 5.0 mm vessels with 23–29 mm valves), excellent hemodynamics (dynamics of blood flow), the broadest annulus range (indicated to treat annulus ranges up to 30 mm in diameter and has the ability to treat the broadest annulus range of any commercially available TAVR system). It also includes advanced sealing with an external tissue wrap on all valve sizes (more surface contact is provided between the valve and the native (unaltered) aortic annulus, with the external tissue wrap, for all valve sizes). The annulus refers to the ring-shaped base of a heart valve that supports the valve's leaflets (or flaps). The EvolutTM R transcatheter aortic heart valve was built on the proven design of Medtronic's CoreValveTM platform and features a supra-annular, self-expanding nickel titanium alloy (nitinol) frame with a low profile delivery, which has led to significant benefits for the patient – safer and shorter procedure, faster recovery, and decreased pain. The EvolutTM R valve can also be recaptured and repositioned. Its self-expanding nitinol frame enhances the ability to conform and seal to the native annulus. The supra-annular leaflet position keeps the working portion of the valve above and unconstrained by the native annulus. Specifically designed for TAVR procedures, the ConfidaTM Brecker guidewire (CBG) features a continuous, tapered core and pre-shaped curve for secure deployment. It is designed to minimize the risk of ventricular perforation.

In providing a statement in line with the Trust's Environmentally Responsible initiatives, Medtronic has offered that it is committed to set near-term science based emissions reduction targets and long-term net-zero targets for validation by the science based targets initiative. Medtronic mitigates potential disruptions and strengthens the resilience of their operations by assessing business risks from climate change. They also acknowledge that their business impacts the environment, so they target to reduce emissions and promote renewable energy adoption and waste reduction within Medtronic and throughout the healthcare sector.

Recommendation

In light of the forgoing, the Perioperative Department has determined that it would be in the Trust's best interest to award this contract to Medtronic USA, Inc. Through negotiation, vendor will provide a \$77,814.83 rebate (7.5%) based on an annual spend of \$1,037,531, providing the Trust with total savings of \$233,444.49 over the three-year term. **ECRI has reported that pricing for the vast majority of the Medtronic's line items fall below the Supply Guide Low Price; as such, Medtronic has provided a competitive offer to the Trust.**

Terms and Conditions are pursuant to the Master Agreement between the parties, which was approved by Risk Management as to insurance and liability, and by the Perioperative Dept. as to business terms.

The contract can be terminated for convenience with a thirty (30) calendar day-notice and includes UAP and OIG fees. The UAP and OIG fees are taken as deductions on the invoices.

The unique, sophisticated cylinder construction is meticulously layered with silicone and fabric that work together to reinforce and maintain a symmetrical shape regardless of patient anatomy. The result is a phallus that looks natural in both the flaccid and erect state. In addition, the cylinder design minimizes the risk of cosmetic deformities, such as dog ears, that can cause men discomfort and impact their confidence.

Axogen Corporation:

Background

Axogen will continue to provide to the Trust consumables and restorative therapy biologics, generally used for nerve and valve reconstruction surgical procedures. The physicians have found several advantages to using Axogen's products as illustrated by the examples below:

Axogen's *avance* is an off-the-shelf processed human nerve allograft (obtained from a donor) intended for the surgical repair of peripheral nerve discontinuities. Nerve graft implants are intended for use in nerve reconstruction and consist of nerve autografts or allografts usually taken from cadaver donors. Nerve graft implants are typically used in the management of nerve gaps or discontinuities (when the ends of the damaged nerves are too far apart for stitching together), and are intended to provide a scaffold on which nerve regeneration can occur.

In providing a statement in line with the Trust's environmentally responsible initiatives, Mitaka has offered that it is committed to sustainability and developing technologies for the production of renewable energy. Over the past ten years Mitaka has developed solar thermal energy arrays to help bolster the efficiency of solar farms. More recently Mitaka has developed a proprietary wind turbine system that avoids many of the pitfalls of current turbines. Mitaka microscopes, like all surgical microscopes, are supported by single use disposable sterile covers. Mitaka states they are the only microscope manufacturer directly investing in the development of solar and wind energy technologies that offset the carbon footprint of single-use plastics.

In explaining the benefits, to the Trust, of this procurement, JMH Operating Room Department has stated that the acquisition of the Mitaka microscope represents a significant enhancement to the department's neurosurgical capabilities and patient-care standards. This state-of-the-art microscope offers unparalleled quality, particularly for bypass surgery, with exceptional visualization and zoom capabilities. Following recent experiences with the Arvello microscope, it is evident that the Mitaka microscope is better suited for complex cases, which are commonplace in the OR's Cranial group. Dr. Abla has specifically requested the Mitaka microscope, and all surgeons are in agreement due to its superior resolution, smooth handling, and precise balance during surgical procedures. This investment will undoubtedly elevate our neurosurgical outcomes and ultimately improve patient care.

In providing an explanation for the assessed \$70,000 trade in value, the vendor states that they use a broker (Prescott's Inc.) and pass on their offer 1:1 to the customer. To validate, the Trust requested an estimate from Centurion Service Group who are not able to meet the \$70,000 offer.

Negotiations resulted in \$31,616.85 savings. Vendor concessions include the removal of freight charges (\$3,700), one (1) year extended warranty (\$14,560), as well as an additional 2.98% to 3.25% discount per line item.

The factory warranty will begin upon installation of the equipment and run for a period of one-year. At the expiration of the one-year warranty, the extended warranty provided at no additional cost will begin and continue for a period of one year. The extended warranty includes two annual PMs (preventative maintenance), service calls (recommended to occur every six months), and the replacement of up to two lamps and one fiber cable, if the microscope fails a lux level test. PM includes a general inspection of the microscope system and a general analysis of the functionality of optical systems. The

PM also includes an inspection of illumination output (lux level check), fluorescence functionality, camera and video recording functionality, and balancing and mechanical systems.

The Operating Room Department at Jackson Memorial Hospital has determined that it is in the Trust's best interest to procure the MM90 neuro surgical microscope from Mitaka USA. This purchase will be done through a physician/clinical preference bid waiver.

The vendor has stated the following: "We intend reporting in line with the Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures (TCFD) Risk Management framework and are currently evaluating the development of, and commitment to, science-based targets and a carbon reduction strategy."

In providing a statement on the benefit, to the Trust, of this procurement, the Preoperative Services Departments have offered that Medline Unite Foot and Ankle System is a specialized, indication-specific system that includes unique low-profile anatomically contoured titanium implants which are stronger than stainless steel and fit the patient's anatomy better. The system provides unique instrumentation that helps with procedural efficiency, optimized tray layout and color coding, and single-tray design, all of which help decrease OR time to decrease costs for the facility.

Through negotiations, a \$9,573 price reduction and an annual 1.6% rebate plus 5% Medline Brand growth rebate is offered based on usage of \$1,905,880 per year providing the Trust a total savings of \$57,436 during the contract term. The Intuitive AMP program provides a great opportunity with low financial risk to JHS. There is an additional capacity for the robotic systems at both JSMC and JNMC and having two robotic systems at each location will enhance the ability to target and recruit other surgeons. The AMP Robotic Program from Intuitive will help reducing the wait times for surgeons while improving the OR efficiency. For most patients, robotic surgery offers numerous benefits, including reduced post-surgery pain, less blood loss, fewer and smaller scars. Background

Nym is a medical-coding software provider revolutionizing healthcare processes through its flagship product, the Clinical Language Understanding ("CLU") autonomous coding solution, which processes clinical charts autonomously, efficiently, and accurately, ushering in a new era of transparent and breakthrough medical coding technology. Nym's technology equips computers to recognize the logical relations between various medical records linguistic elements.

The Revenue Cycle Management Department requests approval to engage Nym to automate coding for Outpatient-ED-Unfunded Portfolio, and reduce operational costs. The Department has plans to scale to other service lines, as Nym provides a range of specialized services. However, to ensure a focused and controlled initial approach, Revenue Cycle will have Nym start with Outpatient-ED-Unfunded Encounters.

Nym Health will provide the following to Revenue Cycle:

- 1. CLU (Clinical Language Understanding) Technology
 - An autonomous coding solution that allows clinical charts to be processed autonomously, efficiently, and accurately. The Nym engine interprets clinical language in patient charts with the utmost accuracy, assigning medical codes in seconds, without human involvement
 - This technology integrates with Electronic Medical Record technology
- 2. Audit Trail
 - Provides audit summary with a summary of all assigned codes

- Includes ICD 10 Codes assigned with the ICD 10 applied guidelines
- Includes history of present illness, procedures, medications, and final diagnosis

3. Analytic Dashboards

- Analytics of encounters coded through the engine
- Revenue optimization opportunities by trending; code capture, charge capture, E&M leveling, etc.
- Identified opportunities for clinical documentation improvement

The project cost savings associated with this procurement are as follows:

Revenue Cycle has determined that it would be in the best interest of the Trust to enter into the new Agreement, with Nym, for an advanced autonomous medical coding model, which will streamline and enhance Jackson Health System's coding processes to ensure accuracy and efficiency. Nym will transform the Revenue Cycle management by fully automating the medical coding process. The vendor's engine will maintain over 95% coding accuracy, produce fully transparent audit trails for each code assigned, and will automatically update once new coding guidelines are released.

This procurement has been thoroughly reviewed for potential SBE participation. The coding consulting services provided under this agreement will be performed by Nym Health, Inc. employees. The vendor does not subcontract any of its services. The opportunity to include an SBE partner is not available for this service activity. Nym Health, Inc. is aware of Jackson's SBE program and the expectation of vendor partners to advance that commitment.

The agreement can be terminated by the Trust for convenience upon 60 calendar days' prior notice and includes OIG and UAP fees. These fees will be provided as deductions on invoices.

8. (2509098-JM) The Holtz Children's Hospital, Pediatric Respiratory Therapy Department, requests approval to enter into a five (5)-year Agreement, with INO Therapeutics, LLC d/b/a Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals, for the provision of Nitric Oxide Inhalation Gas Therapy Services (ongoing purchase).

INO Therapeutics, LLC, d/b/a Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals:

This Request for Funding: \$7,625,000 (For Five Years)

Background

In April 2021, via Resolution 04/2021-014, the PHT renewed a sole-source contract with Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals to secure the Nitric Oxide Inhalation Therapy Gas services, for a period of three (3) years, in the amount of \$7,200,000 (\$2,400,000/year), from May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2024. This request for funding of a new agreement, in the amount of \$7,625,000, is for a five-year term, from May 1, 2024 through April 30, 2029, and is based on utilization.

From April 2023 through April 2024, nitric oxide usage within Holtz was projected to be 38,736 hours. The prior 12 months (April 2022 through April 2023), nitric oxide usage was 45,481 hours, which represents a decrease of consumption of -15%. This agreement will be for a fixed annual fee of \$1,525,000 for unlimited amount of hours.

The Holtz Children's Hospital Pediatric Respiratory Therapy Department, in collaboration with the Procurement Management Department, conducted market research, and it was determined that this product and service were no longer a sole source and that there are other companies in the industry that also provide this service. As a result, negotiations were conducted with the incumbent vendor (Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals), Vero Biotech and Linde Gas/PraxAir Healthcare Services. During deliberations, Linder Gas/PraxAir proposed an annual increment cost agreement starting at \$1,300,000 for a total contract value of \$7,041,219 with no cap. However, their equipment presented several patient safety concerns such as, the PB980 current ventilators are not validated by Lin Gas/Praxair, settings would require adjustment supply consumption (O2 cells); system is not user friendly and will require more extensive training of the RRT's; alarms are very loud and volume cannot be adjusted; when using a bag valve mask, the set dose is difficult to determine. Also, settings must be tweaked for the High Frequency Ventilators (HFOV), to deliver the correct dosage. Vero Biotech proposed an annual fixed contract amount of \$2,000,000 with no cap, for a total contract value of \$10,000,000. Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals proposed fixed pricing of \$1,550,000 per year with no cap, from its present cost of \$2,400,000 per year, on a three-year contract.

After further negotiations, Mallinckrodt reduced their offer to \$1,525,000 per year for a total of \$7,625,000 for the five-year Contract. This represents a cost reduction to the Trust in the amount of \$125,000 during the contract term. In addition, Mallinckrodt's fees went from its current pricing of \$2,400,000 per year to \$1,525,000 per year, thus providing a cost reduction to the Trust of \$875,000 per year or \$4,375,000 over the five-year contract period Holtz Children's chose to go with the offer from Mallinckrodt, in spite of final pricing still being a little higher than Linde Gas/PraxAir, but also because the nitric gas delivery system proposed by Linde Gas/PraxAir is not as conducive to the Hospital's needs nor as dependable as Mallinckrodt system's, as explained above. The proposal from Vero-Biotech was the highest.

Inhaled nitric oxide is a selective pulmonary vasodilator (treatment for pulmonary arterial hypertension) that improves ventilation-perfusion matching (the coordination of blood flow and gas flow into a lung unit) at low doses in patients with acute respiratory failure, potentially improving oxygenation and lowering pulmonary vascular resistance. In Neonates, it is used for the treatment of Persistent Pulmonary Hypertension of the Newborn (PPHN). Nitric Oxide Inhalation Therapy Gas is used for pulmonary hypertension treatments of cardio thoracic and transplant patients, post-surgery. The therapy gas is used for heart and lung patients requiring pulmonary vasodilatation (widening of blood vessels), for post pump chorea (a serious cardiopulmonary bypass complication that occurs unexpectedly), and it has the least side effects. This product is primarily utilized in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

This project was reviewed for SBE measures. The product purchased under this agreement is shipped directly by Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals to Jackson facilities via ground shipping. Jackson staff receive and utilize the product without vendor assistance. The vendor does not subcontract services related to this purchase. As such, the project is approved to move forward with no applicable SBE participation

In providing a statement on the benefits to the Trust, of this procurement, Holtz Children's Hospital has offered that inhaled nitric oxide (INO) is a pulmonary vasodilator. It has a major role in the regulation of the vascular muscle tone. It is indicated as the treatment for hypoxemic respiratory failure (insufficient oxygen in the blood although carbon dioxide levels are close to normal) in newborn infants. This is associated with persistent high pulmonary vascular pressure and resultant right-to-left shunting of blood (persistent pulmonary hypertension of the newborn). Nitric Oxide improves oxygenation and decreases outcomes of death or the frequent need for extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO) in infants ≥35 weeks' gestational age. The use of nitric gas is the standard of care for complex neonates and other patients with severe respiratory disorders (including Covid-19). Jackson treats a disproportionate number of tertiary cases and nitric oxide is part of the clinical therapies available to treat these patients. Jackson's inability to treat patients with this therapy, would mean that a large number of pediatric and adult patients would have to be transferred to other healthcare systems. This would have a negative impact on some of our stellar programs such as Transplant, Neonatology, and other major service lines. In addition, the cost of using Nitric Oxide is significantly lower than costs associated with a patient's response to a 3-5-day alternative therapy.

Recommendation

Based on past utilization, Holtz Children's Hospital, Pediatric Respiratory Therapy Department, has determined that it is in the Trust's best interest to establish a five-year contract with Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals for the provision of its Nitric Oxide Inhalation Gas Therapy Services.

INO Therapeutics, LLC, d/b/a Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals is an FDA approved vendor for this particular drug and its delivery system.

This contract may be terminated by the Trust for convenience (without cause) after thirty (30) months upon prior ninety (90) calendar day's written notice of termination and includes the UAP and OIG fees. The UAP and OIG fees are provided as deductions on the invoices.

The contract has been reviewed and approved by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency and by Risk Management as to Insurance and Liability.

In accordance with our Contractor Due Diligence review, INO Therapeutics, LLC has provided a Sworn/Notarized Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the Company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the Company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the Company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

In providing an evaluation of the vendor's performance during the current contract year, Holtz Children's Hospital Pediatric Respiratory Therapy Department has reported the following:

- The average turnaround time of products and services meets standard.
- The deliverables meet contract requirements.
- The ability to provide preventive maintenance on equipment meets standard.
- The ability to successfully respond to emergency situations meets standard.
- The responsiveness to safety issues and safety standards also meets standard.

For this five-year contract, the following performance and quality measures will be used to monitor vendor's performance under the Agreement.

1. Average turnaround time of goods/services delivery to be received no later than 24 hours from date promised for routine orders.

- 2. Deliverables must meet contract requirements at a minimum of 95% of the time.
- 3. Ability to successfully respond to emergency situations should be within 15 minutes and emergency deliveries provided within 8 hours.

(**2418361-LM**) The Nursing Home Placement Department at Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH) requests approval for a one-year extension and additional funds to the Contract with Better Living Investments, LLC, d/b/a Normandy Estates for Specialized Assisted Living Facility (ALF) Services (ongoing purchase).

Background

On October 1, 2020, the JMH Nursing Home Placement Department entered into an Agreement with Better Living Investments, LLC, d/b/a Normandy Estates, for a period of one (1) year in the amount of \$39,000. Initially, there were three (3) patients residing at the Normandy Estates Assisted Living facility; however, there was a subsequent need to place additional patients at the facility. As a result, the initial funding of \$39,000 was exhausted and the Contract had to be modified under CPO's delegated authority to add \$200,000 under modification No.1 on October 1, 2020. Modification No. 2 was issued on October 1, 2021 to extend the contract with no impact to the contract total value; Modification No. 3 under CPO delegated authority was issued on April 1, 2022 to add funds in the amount of \$138,000 and extend the contract for 180 days; Modification No. 4 was issued under CPO delegated authority on October 1, 2022 to extend the contract for six months with no impact to the total contract value; Modification No. 5 was issued under CPO delegated authority and extended the contract for two additional months with no impact to the contract; Modification No. 6 was approved under PHT 05/2023-023 for a one-year extension from June 1, 2023 to May 31, 2024 in the amount of \$502,200; Modification No. 7 issued under CPO delegated authority was issued in the amount of \$300,000 to support services through May 31, 2024 due to increase utilization. From January 2023 to August 2023 the number of patients housed at the facility increased to 7, and, since September 2023 there has been an increase to 17 patients. The JMH Care Transition team predicts that the patient count will remain at 17 or will increase by the end of the current term on May 31, 2024. This request in the amount of \$1,300,000 will extend the contract term for an additional year from June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025.

The continuation of services with this provider will assure that patients with this level of acuity are treated regardless of their ability to pay. Per JMH's Nursing Home Placement Department, it is of utmost importance that these patients are placed in facilities where they are provided the appropriate level of care.

The provisions of the Agreement dictate that the vendor must provide the patients with 24-hour supervision, must assist with daily activities such as bathing and grooming, meal preparation, laundry, getting these patients to doctor's appointments, ensuring they have the required medication and are taking them, as well as supporting them with any additionally-required appropriate care.

The Procurement Management Department negotiated with the vendor to retain the current Per Bed/Per Day rate of \$135.00.

Recommendation

The Nursing Home Placement Department has determined that it would be in the Trust's best interest to extend the contract with Better Living Investments, LLC, d/b/a Normandy Estates, for a period of one year, from June 1, 2024 to May 31, 2025, to facilitate the continuation of specialized assisted-living facility services for this specific patient population. The

Nursing Home Placement Department will also continue to conduct market research to determine the availability of other suitable ALFs, with the appropriate level of care that will accept these unfunded and special-needs patients.

In accordance with the Contractor Due Diligence review, Better Living Investments, d/b/a Normandy Estates, has provided a Sworn/Notarized Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the Company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the Company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the Company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

In providing an evaluation of the vendor's performance during the current contract year, the Nursing Home Placement Department has reported the following:

- The competencies of contracted staff meet the required standard.
- The deliverables meet the required standard.
- The effectiveness of on-site management meets the required standard.

The assessment will identify the clinical improvements, operational improvements, documentation and coding improvements, and programmatic improvements to achieve and sustain high-quality performance and top-tier designation.

The implementation phase of each statement of work will focus on the following:

National Quality Scorecard Optimization: Vizient will focus implementation efforts in various areas identified in the assessment to include but not be limited to surgical quality improvement, readmission reduction, mortality reduction, and many other possible metrics. The Vizient team will rank order and prioritize initiatives and work with JHS executives to determine the top initiatives to implement. <u>Scope</u>

The scope of this resolution is limited to the environmental assessment, environmental remediation, and demolition of the building.

Fiscal Impact

The total project budget to demolish the Building is approximately \$100,000 and is expected to be funded from Jackson's operating budget.

Track Record/Monitor

Demolition of the Building will be overseen by Isa Núñez, vice president for construction and design.

Background

The Building was constructed in 1975 and historically occupied by the Miami-Dade County Community Action and Human Services Department. The building occupancy was terminated, and subsequently returned to the Trust in 2023. The building is functionally obsolete and is an open case with the Miami-Dade unsafe structures board for an overdue 30-year building certification, which necessitate repairs or demolition.

Demolition of the building is recommended to allow the Trust to use the property for overflow parking, materials lay down, and storage for the Jackson Memorial Hospital Emergency Department Expansion project, which is currently underway. Pursuant to Section 25A-4(d) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, approval by the Board of County Commissioners is required to demolish any designated facility of the Trust.

Accordingly, the board's approval of this resolution is recommended to authorize the Chief Executive Officer or his designee to seek approval of the Board of County Commissioners to demolish the building and to take all actions necessary to effectuate the same.
