7. CHAIRWOMAN REPORT

None.

8. PRESIDENT AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

Dr. David Zambrana, President and Chief Executive Officer, emphasized that delivering safe, high-quality care to every patient remains the organization's highest priority. This commitment drives daily operations and sets the standard for performance across all facilities.

Earlier today, Chief Physician Executive Dr. Chris Ghaemmaghami and Isis Zambrana, Vice President and Chief Quality Officer, presented an update on systemwide quality initiatives and ongoing progress. The metrics shared by Ms. Zambrana reflect strong performance and sustained dedication from teams throughout the system. Progress, however, extends beyond numerical indicators; it is rooted in tangible actions and deliberate improvements implemented by staff to elevate patient care.

A central component of this advancement is the ongoing journey toward becoming a high-reliability organization. Multidisciplinary teams, including physicians, nurses, and support staff participate in daily focused huddles across Jackson Health System. These huddles address immediate operational needs, emerging issues, concerns requiring attention, and lessons learned from prior days.

This may sound simple, but it represents a meaningful shift in team operations and organizational culture. The focus is on identifying risks before they escalate, empowering nurses and other caregivers to speak up when something appears unsafe, and fostering an environment where concerns are acknowledged, addressed, and transformed into opportunities for improvement.

Recognition is extended to Dr. Ghaemmaghami, Isis Zambrana, Dr. Abbo, Chuck Tawwater, and the entire HRO team for sustained leadership and commitment. Appreciation is also extended to all team members who have embraced this operating model. Since the launch of the HRO initiative in October 2024, the organization has observed significant improvements in team collaboration and in approaches to patient safety and quality.

I am proud of the progress made, yet the work remains ongoing. Continued learning, improvement, and accountability will guide efforts to deliver the safest, highest-quality care to every patient.

Another important update is that earlier today, the Annual Operating Agreement with the University of Miami received approval, further solidifying and formalizing the longstanding partnership.

The agreement, reviewed and updated annually, ensures alignment between both institutions regarding patient care, medical education, and joint programs such as organ transplantation and pediatric services.

The collaboration between Jackson and UM has established a nationally recognized model that advances patient care through innovative treatments while training future physicians. The AOA supports the continuation of this partnership and strengthens the foundation for future achievements as one of the nation's leading academic health systems.

9. REPORTS

a. Trust/Medical Schools AOA Negotiating Agreement Update

Chairwoman Sabater noted that the Trust/Medical Schools AOA Negotiating Agreement with the University of Miami is reviewed and approved annually. Earlier this morning, Chief Operating Officer Hamilton Clark delivered a comprehensive presentation highlighting the extensive work completed by the team. The agreement reflects a unique and highly differentiated partnership that supports physicians, educators, and specialists who provide care, train the next generation of healthcare professionals, and advance research across the health system.

The agreement also ensures continued support for critical specialty programs relied upon by the community, including trauma, transplant, pediatrics, and other highly specialized services. Overall, the AOA underscores a shared commitment to delivering world-class academic medicine while responsibly managing public resources.

b. Quality Update

Chairwoman Sabater delivered an overview of the Quality Report, noting that Isis Zambrana, Vice President and Chief Quality Officer, presented an update earlier this morning emphasizing that quality is not an additional initiative but the method by which Jackson Health System fulfills its mission. The report outlined substantial progress achieved over recent years, driven by effective strategy and leadership that position the organization for continued strong performance. More than 550 leaders have completed training, reinforcing a culture in which safety and quality are shared responsibilities throughout the system.

c. Purchasing and Facilities Update

Chairwoman Sabater noted that Michelle Romano, Senior Director of Procurement Services, delivered the Purchasing Report, and Daniel Chatlos, Associate Vice President of Real Estate, presented the Facilities Update. Both reports were presented in detail.

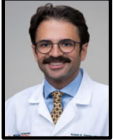

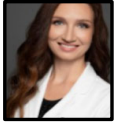

(2711524 - LK) The Microbiology Department, (Microbiology) Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH), is requesting approval to enter into a new reagent rental agreement, for a period of five (5) years, with Bio-Rad Laboratories (Bio-Rad) through which Microbiology will secure the new Bio-Rad Microplate suite to facilitate continued immunoassay testing for Jackson Health System. (ongoing purchase).

Bio-Rad Laboratories, Inc.:

(For Five Years)**

Background

The amount of \$525,000 will fund this service for a period of five years. Under this new reagent rental agreement, the cost per kit will cover the rental of a new PR4100 Microplate reader to replace the outdated Microplate system that has been in place for eight years. The cost per kit will also cover washer, comprehensive service, and reagent costs and training. The Bio-Rad Microplate System, a suite of automated and semi-automated platforms designed for high-throughput immunoassay testing, is an essential piece of laboratory equipment used in immunoassay testing including the Aspergillus Antigen Assay. The Immunoassay test comprises a group of biochemical tests that detect and quantify specific molecules or analytes, in a sample, using the specific reactions between antigens (specific types of analytes that trigger an immune response) and antibodies. This test is critical for immunocompromised patients, including transplant recipients, oncology patients, and those in intensive care units.

The Bio-Rad Microplate Suite includes microplate readers, washers, incubators, and automated processors that streamline workflow, minimize manual handling, and reduce error rates. The system supports a wide range of assays and multiplex suspension arrays, making it a comprehensive solution for hospital laboratories. A multiplex suspension array is a technique, which enables the simultaneous detection and quantification of numerous different analytes (molecules being analyzed) in a single sample. The Bio-Rad Microplate is FDA-approved for the detection of invasive aspergillosis. Aspergillosis is an infection (typically affecting the respiratory system) caused by a mold called aspergillus, a common mold found widely in the environment. This test is critical for immunocompromised patients, including transplant recipients, oncology patients, and those in intensive care units.

The Immunology lab currently performs Aspergillus Galactomannan Antigen testing for JHS on the Microplate system to determine systemic fungal infection in bone marrow transplant patients and patients receiving chemotherapy. The test is a laboratory blood or fluid test that detects a component of the *Aspergillus* fungus cell membrane, to help diagnose invasive fungal infections such as the invasive pulmonary aspergillosis (IPA), which is a severe fungal infection primarily targeting the lungs. Timely and accurate diagnosis of IPA leads to improved clinical outcomes, and reduces hospital length of stay. Such timeliness and accuracy also support antimicrobial stewardship, a system-wide coordinated strategy to guarantee appropriate antimicrobial use and improve patient outcomes, reduce microbial resistance and minimize healthcare costs by ensuring targeted antifungal therapy – using the correct drug, dose and duration for the correct infection.

The Bio-Rad Platelia Aspergillus falls under the umbrella of the Aspergillus antigen assays and is also FDA-cleared. It is widely recognized for the detection of Aspergillus Galactomannan, or GM, which is a special protein found in the Aspergillus mold. This assay is critical for diagnosing IPA in immunocompromised patients such as transplant recipients, oncology patients, and those in intensive care units. Early detection enables targeted antifungal therapy, reduces length of stay, and improves patient outcomes.

This proposed five-year agreement ensures uninterrupted testing operations and cost-effective pricing and continued alignment with the Trust's sustainability and operational excellence goals. It locks in pricing for the five-year period, protects the Trust against inflationary cost increases and guarantees uninterrupted reagent supply and technical support.

ECRI has reported that they have no comparable data. Hence, they are unable to make a strong recommendation on the reagent pricing at this time. HC1 has confirmed pricing is aligned with the market.

In providing a statement on the benefits, to the Trust, of this procurement, Microbiology has explained that Bio-Rad's Microplate system and reagents are necessary for the Immunology lab to continue to perform Aspergillus antigen testing for immunosuppressed patients. If the Trust were not able to acquire the Bio-Rad reagents and products, the Immunology lab would operate at limited capacity and the specimens would have to be sent out to a reference lab for further testing at a significant cost. There would also be a delay in the availability of the results. This reagent rental agreement remains the most cost-effective solution for the Trust. Under this model, Bio-Rad provides the equipment at no capital expense, with costs bundled into the purchase of reagents. This eliminates upfront capital outlay, allows predictable budgeting, and ensures that service and maintenance are included. The purchase will ensure continuity of critical testing services, support fiscal responsibility through predictable reagent pricing and protect the Trust from inflationary costs reinforcing the Trust's commitment to sustainability and patient care. The capabilities and performance benefits include the following:

- High Throughput: Capable of processing multiple 96-well plates simultaneously with fast turnaround times.
- Multiplexing: Platforms like the Bio-Plex® 200 can detect up to 100 analytes per sample, supporting advanced diagnostics.
- Regulatory Compliance: Systems are designed for CLIA (Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments), CAP (College of American Pathologists), and the FDA (Federal Drug Administration) environments, supporting accreditation and audit requirements.
- Automation & Efficiency: Walk-away functionality reduces hands-on time, minimizes human error, and improves overall workflow efficiency.
- Data Traceability: Built-in barcoding and reagent tracking ensure compliance with quality and safety standards.

Recommendation

Microbiology has determined that it would be in the Trust's best interest to secure a contract with Bio-Rad for improved efficiencies.

The contract can be terminated by the Trust for convenience with a thirty (30) calendar day notice and includes UAP and OIG fees. The UAP and OIG fees are provided as deductions on the invoices.

This procurement has been thoroughly reviewed for potential SBE participation. The laboratory products purchased under this agreement are provided from the original equipment manufacturer, Bio-Rad. SBE firms are not available to support this category. Bio-Rad is encouraged to engage Miami-Dade County SBE firms in the fulfillment of services during this contract period, should the opportunity present.

In accordance with our Contractor Due Diligence review, Bio-Rad Laboratories has provided a Sworn Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of proposal to the Trust; (2) the company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

A Bid Waiver justification has been provided and Conflict of Interest Declarations have been signed by Michelle Quintana, Medical Technologist II; Sallie-Anne Wright, Director of Pathology Services, JMH, and, Sean Dumlao, Customer Service Contracts Supervisor, Bio-Rad Laboratories, with no reported disclosures (**J. Ruggiero**).

(2780846-LG) The Jackson Health System Care Transition Department ("JHS Care Transition") is requesting approval to enter into a new professional services agreement with NexCare Consulting, LLC ("NexCare") to continue the provision of repatriation services for unfunded patients currently receiving care within Jackson Health System (ongoing purchase).

NexCare Consulting, LLC:

Background

The new agreement with NexCare, in the amount of \$800,000, will cover continuation of its services for a three-year term and will also include two (2) options to renew of one (1) year each. Under this agreement, the vendor will continue to provide a coordinated solution for unfunded patients who are medically appropriate for discharge but require assistance returning to their country of origin or another approved point of entry.

Under the agreement, NexCare will:

- Discharge patients from Trust facilities to an appropriate temporary housing facility.
- Provide all aspects of housing and medical treatment/healthcare services pending repatriation final approval date from the Consulate of the country of origin.
- Coordinate medical air services to the applicable patient's country of origin/approved point of entry.
- Coordinate ground medical transportation of the patient from the patient's country of origin/approved point of entry to the approved medical facility in the patient's country of origin.
- At no additional cost to the Trust, find and retain legal representation for the patient related to the purpose of repatriation to the patient's country of origin.

The pricing is subject to the patient's medical condition and physical assessment. The fee range is \$45,000-\$95,000 per patient. The parties agree that the fees will be contingent on key factors such as, the level of care for the referred patient, the country of origin, and the timeframe given by the country of origin.

In providing a statement on the benefit, to the Trust, of this procurement, JHS Care Transition has offered that without this contract, Jackson Health System would need to continue caring for unfunded patients, in-house or in our contracted facilities, occupying beds at a higher daily rate and reducing availability for other patients that may require a higher level of care. Additionally, keeping patients in an acute-care bed when patients are ready for post-acute care, is not best practice.

Recommendation

JHS Care Transition has determined that it would be in the best interest of the Trust to execute an agreement with NexCare to continue the provision of the vendor's logistical coordination of the repatriation process for unfunded patients.

This procurement has been thoroughly reviewed for potential SBE participation. The patient discharge and transition services provided under this agreement will be performed by NexCare Consulting, LLC employees. The vendor does not subcontract any of its services. The opportunity to include an SBE partner is not available for this service activity. NexCare Consulting, LLC is aware of Jackson's Responsible Purchasing initiatives and the expectation of vendor partners to advance that commitment.

The Trust has termination for convenience rights, within thirty (30) calendar days of notice. The contract also includes the OIG and UAP fees. These fees are provided as deductions on the invoices.

A Bid Waiver Justification has been provided and Conflict of Interest Declarations signed by Loretta Aguilar, Director of Care Transition, JHS, and Jorge G. Aguirre, Director of Healthcare Consulting of NexCare, LLC, with no reported disclosures. **ECRI is unable to provide an analysis at this time. (M. Puga).**

Background

In February 2016, the PHT Board approved, via Resolution No. PHT 02/16-008, a PSA with HKS for Project 'C' (Jackson Memorial Medical Center Campus Project) in the amount of \$22,161,298. This PSA resulted from open competitive Request for Qualifications (RFQ A15-JHS-01, Project C). This RFQ covered professional architectural and engineering design services in support of renovations and new construction for five separate projects, pursuant to Section 287.055, Florida Statutes, Sections 2-8.2.14 and 2-10.4 of the County Code and JHS Procurement Policy. In May 2022, the PHT Board approved, via Resolution No. PHT 05/2022-025, additional design funding with HKS in the amount of \$15,572,108, and authorized revised project scope elements for the ED Expansion and DTC ICU Expansion projects.

Jackson Memorial Medical Center Campus Project C (Current Scope):

As of July 2026, the new Emergency Department and Observation Unit expansion/renovation project is three levels and 236,814 Building Gross Square Feet (BGSF). The expansion and renovation project includes the following key services and areas:

Level 1:

The Level 1 total building area is estimated to be approximately 115,641 BGSF, comprised of 67,249 BGSF of new construction and 48,392 BGSF of renovation. The Emergency Department (ED) expansion and renovation consist of 112 adult exam rooms and 24 pediatric exam rooms, for a combined total of 136 exam rooms. Within this department area are: customized clinical services for patient intake and triage, acuity-focused areas, such as low acuity, universal treatment, and critical care/resuscitation, infectious disease isolation rooms, mental and behavioral health rooms, imaging modalities, and decontamination rooms. Non-clinical areas will include a main lobby and waiting area, staff offices, and related support spaces, such as staff lounges and respite rooms. The patient room quantity is subject to slight adjustment, since the technical facility requirements are better understood as the architectural/engineering process advances.

Level 2:

The Level 2 total building area is estimated to be approximately 57,183 BGSF, comprised of 56,462 BGSF of new construction and 721 BGSF of renovation. The Observation Unit consists of approximately 55 patient rooms, including a dedicated area for incarcerated patients. The patient room quantity is also subject to slight adjustment, since the technical facility requirements are better understood as the architectural/engineering process advances.

Level 3

The Level 3 is an addition of a third shell space, bridge and helipad totaling 58,006 SF. This scope was added as a change order through previous funding approval.

Site Development:

The existing site area consists of approximately 3.5 acres and will include a total of 72 new parking spaces for patients, ambulances, police, and dedicated specialty transfer vehicles for incarcerated persons. Accordingly, several new dedicated entrances and canopies are planned. These new entrances and canopies will accommodate adult walk-in patients on the northeast side, ambulance patient arrivals and patient transfers on the west side, pediatric walk-in patients on the south side, and ambulance pediatric patient arrivals on

the east side. The site contains existing underground utility lines, some of which are uncharted, requiring specialized manual excavation to locate, identify, and re-route.

Coordination with Existing Structures:

Immediately adjacent to the east, is the current Ryder Trauma Center, which will have physical connectivity to this new addition on Level 1. Additionally, it is currently anticipated that some circulation/connectivity modifications may be required in the existing ambulance arrival area. On the south side, entrance canopy work may be necessary. On the west side of the site, coordination of work with the existing sky bridge and exit stairs will be required.

Diagnostic Treatment Center Intensive Care Unit (DTC ICU) East Side Expansion Project:

Phase 3 of the DTC ICU tower will consist of two floors built on top of the east side of the Diagnostic Treatment Center to match Phase 1, completed January 2021, and Phase 2, that is underway currently (4th Floor Buildout). Phase 3 will be a two-story, approximately 34,000 square feet space to house thirty-four (34) ICU beds. The exterior will match the recently completed expansion. The interior bed units will be very similar to the recently completed ICU units on floors 4, 5 & 6.

Additional scope to be implemented (Current Request):

ED Level 3 Shell Buildout

This funding request covers the design services for the ED 3rd floor shell buildout, which includes an Interventional Suite with five (5) Cardiac Cath Labs, four (4) Angio Cath suites, one (1) Interventional Radiology/Computed Tomography (IR/CT) room, two (2) Neuro Biplane rooms, and associated Prep/Post-Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU) and OR support spaces. This is a consolidation of the interventional platform from existing West Wing and Central buildings. The design intent is to maximize suites up to sixteen (16) rooms if possible. Scope includes interior finishes for new bridge and elevator design specifications.

DTC Level 3 Renovation

Design services for renovation of current Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (CVICU) to Registration, Surgery Waiting and connection to Interventional Platform at ED

DTC Level 4 Shell Buildout

Design services for level 4 Floor Buildout from current shell space to 17-18 ICU beds.

Lobby Design Standardization

Ryder Trauma Center Lobby Design and Design Standardization for future lobby improvements systemwide.

Current Funding Request:

Currently, A/E design services funding is needed to authorize HKS to perform professional design services for the ED Expansion Level 3 Shell Buildout, DTC Level 3 Renovation and Level 4 Shell Buildouts, and design standardization for the Ryder Trauma Center lobby and other JHS lobbies. Project 'C' Recommendation

FDC has determined that it would be in the best interest of the Trust to provide additional design funding for this agreement. **The negotiated contract resulting from RFQ No. A15-JHS-01 (C), includes a 26.15% SBE-A/E sub-consultant goal and a 0.47% SBE-G/S sub-contractor goal.**

The underlying contract was approved by Risk Management as to insurance and liability and by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

The underlying contract can be terminated for convenience (without cause) upon thirty (30) calendar days' prior written notice and includes OIG fees. This contract is UAP exempt per county code. The OIG fee is provided as a deduction from the invoices.

In explaining the benefits, to the Trust, of this procurement, FDC has stated that the involvement of HKS, as the Architect of Record for the Jackson Memorial Medical Center Campus Project, is crucial to the success of the Trust’s ongoing capital improvements program and the vision of the JHS Strategic Plan. With this funding, HKS is providing continued A/E design services to the JHS Facilities Design and Construction team for the completion of Project ‘C’.

In providing a statement in line with the Trust’s responsible purchasing initiatives, FDC has offered that in keeping with its goals related to the Environmentally Preferred Sourcing Program and overall sustainability objectives, it will ensure that certain design elements include environmentally preferred attributes within the overall project scope. (2818773 - LS) The Jackson Health System Biomedical Engineering Department (JHS BioMed) requests approval exercise the two remaining options-to-renew (OTR) of the agreement with Stryker Sales, LLC, (Stryker) acting through its Instruments Division, for their ProCare Prevent and ProCare Protect Coverage services (ProCare Coverage) for existing Stryker surgical equipment (ongoing purchase).

Background

On September 1, 2023, the Trust entered into Contract BW-23-22667-AH with Stryker to procure its ProCare Coverage, for an initial term of three years through August 31, 2026, for certain Stryker surgical equipment. The contract includes two successive OTRs.

BioMed has requested the continuation of Stryker’s ProCare Coverage to support the maintenance and repair of covered Stryker equipment used in clinical operations. The covered equipment supports surgical and clinical operations at Jackson Memorial Hospital, where equipment uptime, repair turnaround, and continuity of support are important to patient care and operating room readiness.

This two-year OTR will continue to cover the continuation of the Stryker ProCare Coverage for the equipment identified in the Revised Exhibit B-1 to Modification No. 1 of the existing contract. The OTR includes existing covered equipment and additional equipment identified by BioMed and Stryker. Certain System 8 equipment is subject to Stryker’s obsolescence schedule and will be covered only through November 30, 2027. The obsolescence schedule is used by Stryker to manage inventory, procurement and compliance in the case of medical devices such as the System 8 tools. This modification does not include the purchase or replacement of System 8 equipment with System 9 equipment.

In providing a statement on the benefits to the Trust of this procurement, JHS BioMed has explained that the continued ProCare Coverage supports quick repair turnaround, maintenance continuity, operating room readiness, and ongoing clinical operations. Without continued coverage, equipment downtime and repair delays could impact clinical workflows and patient care operations.

Recommendation

JHS BioMed has determined that it would be in the Trust’s best interest to execute Modification No. 1 with Stryker and exercise the two remaining options-to-renew for continued ProCare Coverage through August 31, 2028.

As a result of Procurement’s review and negotiations, Stryker reduced its total pricing to \$450,457. ECRI’s review of Stryker’s ProCare Coverage, subsequent to initial negotiations between Stryker and Procurement, suggested that the discount Stryker had quoted, during these negotiations was within the typical market range for similar service coverage. However, the ECRI report went on to recommend additional negotiation to achieve the higher end of the benchmarked discounted pricing. Following ECRI’s review and Procurement’s subsequent follow-up negotiation, Stryker further reduced the two-year renewal pricing by \$8,334.96, thus achieving Stryker’s total discounted pricing of \$450,457 for the two-year renewal.

The underlying contract can be terminated for convenience with written notice and includes UAP and OIG fees. The UAP and OIG fees are provided as deductions on the invoices.

The underlying contract was reviewed and approved by Risk Management as to insurance and liability and by the County Attorney’s Office for legal sufficiency.

This procurement has been reviewed for potential SBE participation. The Stryker equipment support and maintenance services purchased under this agreement are provided from the original equipment manufacturer, Stryker. SBE firms are not available to support this category. Stryker is aware of Jackson’s Responsible Purchasing initiatives and the expectation of vendor partners to advance that commitment.

In accordance with JHS’ Contractor Due Diligence review, Stryker Sales, LLC has provided a Sworn Statement to the Trust’s Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the company within the five (5) years prior to submission of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and (3) the company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

A Bid Waiver Justification has been provided, and Conflict of Interest Declaration signed by Emilia Faraj, Manager, Biomedical Engineering; Charles Berberette, Senior Director, Biomedical Engineering, JHS, and, Micki Mihailovich, Regional Sales Manager, Stryker Sales, LLC, with no reported disclosures. **(J. Alvarez)**

(2850384- GP) The Jackson Health System Office of Internal Audit requests approval to continue services with Consertus under the three (3) year Agreement, BW-24-23066-GP, with Consertus, formerly Anchor Enterprises, LLC, by exercising the two renewal options (OTRs) of one year each. This agreement covers the purchase of construction audit and advisory services for the capital construction projects that include the Emergency Department (“ED”) expansion (ongoing purchase).

Background

In June 2024, an agreement was executed with Anchor Enterprises, LLC for a period of three years, and approved via PHT 05/2024-023, in the amount of \$985,220, to provide oversight and detailed reviews of all phases of the Jackson Capital program, as well as independent advisory capabilities for Capital Construction projects, including the ED Expansion scheduled for completion in June 2027. On October 8, 2025, Consertus acquired Anchor Enterprises, LLC, and the company was rebranded as Consertus, a larger capital program management and advisory firm. The acquisition integrated Anchor’s expertise into Consertus’ broader portfolio of services. In 2026, under CPO delegated authority, Contract Mod. No. 1 was executed, in the amount of \$114,485.22, to cover past due invoices as well as memorialize the acquisition of the agreement by Consertus. Previously approved funding to date is, therefore, \$1,099,705.22.

This request, for approval of \$834,435, will exercise both OTRs for continuation of service through 2029. The continued independent technical construction Audit and Advisory support that will be provided by Consertus for the Capital Construction projects and the ED will include the following: Task 1 will be the continued review of all construction costs, including Time & Materials Contracts, which are fully supported by documentation and require extra attention to ensure accuracy and compliance; quarterly briefings to members of the PHT Board on the capital program’s status; assistance with the development of construction contracts; evaluation of existing project

and program management processes; review and comment on Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) cost proposals from Jackson's Construction Managers at Risk (CMARs); review of CMAR invoiced costs and change orders for contractual compliance; and, assistance with closing out CMAR contracts and projects, in accordance with Consertus' expertise in the healthcare industry.

Task 2 will include implementation and deployment of the Consertus Iridel Suite to support JHS and its capital construction projects. The Suite includes AI Assistants that will be provided on an annual enterprise subscription basis with an initial one-year term and will be renewed annually. The initial year comprises a one-time consertus.com implementation fee plus the annual subscription geared to sustaining access, support and ongoing maintenance and support. Task 2 will start immediately upon authorization by the Office of Internal Audit. The Audit Assistant is an AI assistant designed to enforce contractual compliance across expenditures and pay applications by continuously referencing executed prime contracts, subcontracts, amendments, and approved change orders. It supports auditing expenditures associated with Professional Services. This tool will be monitored and maintained by the Consertus team members, who will provide regular patches and updates as required.

Recommendation

Internal Audit has determined it would be in the best interest of the Trust to exercise the two OTRs together for continuation of these services by Consertus.

This procurement has been thoroughly reviewed for potential SBE participation. Contractor has agreed to 10% SBE subcontracting participation with Miami-Dade County SBE firms during this contract. Consertus is aware of Jackson's Responsible Purchasing initiatives and the expectation of vendor partners to advance that commitment.

In accordance with JHS' Contractor Due Diligence review, Consertus, LLC has provided a Sworn Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

In explaining the benefits, to the Trust, of this procurement, Internal Audit has stated that Consertus has the expertise required to provide the technical engineering audit review on large-scale healthcare capital construction projects, such as the ED Expansion project. Additionally, Consertus' service advisory capabilities presently include: Capital Program governance, Program/Project Controls, Program/Project Finance, Program compliance, and Project Management, which are all key to the successful completion of the JHS capital construction projects. This healthcare industry construction expertise that vendor possesses in its field, would prove to be the best option for JHS and its Internal Audit Department.

In providing a statement in line with the Trust's responsible purchasing initiatives, the vendor has offered the following: "Consertus has been dedicated to conducting business with integrity, caring for the communities in which they operate and respecting the environment. Through sustainability initiatives, Consertus endeavors to be a responsible corporate steward of the environment, and, wherever possible, encourages eco-friendly business practices. Increased environmental awareness in their core business practices is important to Consertus."

ECRI reported that pricing is consistent with the lowest pricing previously seen offered by this vendor. As such, the company is unable to provide a savings recommendation at this time.

The underlying contract can be terminated for convenience with a thirty (30) day written notice and includes the UAP and OIG fees. The UAP and OIG fees are provided as deductions on the invoices.

In June, 2023, a non-competitive contract, BW-22-21352, was awarded to CCS, as a Physician Preference, approved via PHT 06/2023-031 in the amount of \$24,126,570, for an initial term of three years. The contract also provided for two OTRs of one year each. In October, 2023, Modification No. 1, was executed, with no impact to total contract value, under CPO's delegated authority adding new required Florida Electronic Health Records Exchange Act to the agreement. In December, 2023, Modification No. 2, was executed, with no financial impact to total contract value, under CPO's delegated authority adding additional disposables supplies to the agreement. In December, 2023, Modification No. 3, was executed, with no financial impact to total contract value, under CPO's delegated authority adding the "Talis ACG-Perfusion: Perfusion Information Management System (PIMS)" to the agreement. In September, 2024, Modification No. 4, was executed, in the amount of \$48,000, under CPO's delegated authority, adding consignment inventory. In October, 2025, Modification No. 5, was executed, in the amount of \$9,721.40, under CPO's delegated authority, adding additional funding for Jackson South Medical Center and replacing and adding additional disposables supplies to the agreement. In December, 2025, Modification No. 6, was executed, in the amount of \$8,155.86, under CPO's delegated authority adding additional funding to Jackson West Medical Center. In June, 2026, Modification No. 7, was executed, with no financial impact to total contract value, under CPO's delegated authority, extending term and adding additional disposables supplies to the agreement. This request, in the amount of \$7,880,406, will exercise the first renewal option for a one-year period through August 31, 2027.

CCS specializes in perfusion and autotransfusion services, which are very critical aspects of cardiac surgery and complex patient care. The program supports hospitals in delivering high-quality, safe and efficient cardiac care, particularly for open heart surgery, heart transplantation, and extracorporeal membrane oxygenation and extracorporeal life support (ECMO/ECLS). CCS will continue to provide the Trust with Extracorporeal Perfusion and related services, which include cardiovascular products, ECMO and LVAD (left ventricular assist device) services. Perfusion services include expert perfusion support for adult and pediatric cardiac surgery, including minimally invasive, robotic and transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) procedures.

In explaining the benefits, to the Trust, of this procurement, Peri-Op Services has offered that JHS clinicians continue to confirm that CCS provides superior and reliable, high-quality perfusion and auto-transfusion services in a timely manner in order to help Jackson Health System provide the best possible care for its patients. CCS is comprised of highly skilled board-certified or board-eligible perfusionists, anesthesia technicians, Peri-Operative Blood Management technicians, and licensed Registered Nurses. The CCS program supports many cardiac and transplant surgeries, which includes Jackson's LVAD and ECMO programs. CCS' comprehensive portfolio comprises a support system that cannot be achieved with another vendor. CCS provides the Trust with full support for most of its cardiac procedures, and has a great working relationship with the Trust's clinicians, as attested to by these clinicians. CCS provides the Trust with onsite specialists, every day, for superior management of day-to-day operations.

Under this contract renewal, Comprehensive Care Services will continue to provide the following services among others:

- Perfusionists services for Pediatric and Adult Cardiac Surgery
- Support in Congenital Heart Surgery Procedures with cardiopulmonary bypass
- Auto transfusion and perfusion support
- Intraoperative dialysis in cardiac, transplant, and trauma surgery
- 24/7 on-call services

Peri-Op Services has determined that it would be in the Trust's best interest to exercise the first OTR in order to continue securing extracorporeal and related services from CCS.

In accordance with JHS' Contractor Due Diligence review, Comprehensive Care Services, Inc. has provided a Sworn Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

Due to the high volume of legacy records, this new request is to exercise a five-year agreement extension with GRM via a bid waiver process.

GRM brings over 35 years of industry experience, anchored by a robust, cloud-based content-services platform. Their secure, climate-controlled Miami facility features a modern fire suppression system, 24-hour closed-circuit surveillance, and security personnel. GRM ensures total oversight via its Precision Plus chain-of-custody barcoding system and provides seamless remote file management through the eAccess online portal.

GRM has held its baseline pricing flat since 2016. To account for current labor and operational market pressures, the Trust negotiated a 5% annual increase distributed across the new five-year term. This equates to an average year-over-year adjustment of \$54,176. A market review confirms that GRM's a la carte pricing remains highly competitive, and the Trust has successfully maintained favorable rates for the storage and destruction of remaining legacy records.

Recommendation

The JMH Contracts and Records & Risk Management Departments have determined that it would be in the Trust's best interest to continue services with GRM into a five-years agreement extension.

In accordance with our Contractor Due Diligence review, GRM has provided a Sworn/Notarized Statement to the Trust's Procurement Management Department that: (1) no lawsuits have been filed against the company within the five (5) years prior to submittal of a bid or proposal to the Trust; (2) the company has not defaulted in the five (5) years prior to bid or proposal submittal to the Trust; and, (3) the company has not been debarred nor has the firm received a formal notice of non-compliance or non-performance in the five (5) years prior to proposal submittal to the Trust.

In providing an evaluation of the vendor's performance during the current term, the following has been reported:

- The vendor meets all the requirements of the contracted service.
- The deliverables meet the applicable standards required.
- The competencies of contracted staff meet the standards

Jackson's Responsible Purchasing Department reviewed this procurement for SBE participation. The records storage services will be performed by the vendor's own workforce. The opportunity to include an SBE partner is not available for this service activity. GRM is aware of Jackson's Responsible Purchasing initiatives and the expectation of vendor partners to advance that commitment.

In line with the Trust's Responsible Purchasing initiatives, GRM has offered to minimize pollution. The company consistently minimizes waste generated in its operations and maintains high rates of reuse and recycling. The vendor optimizes energy selection and use to reduce impacts to the environment, minimizes greenhouse gas emissions and gives preference to renewable energy sources when financially responsible. GRM also designs products and services to reduce consumption of natural resources and energy requirements to reduce waste and emissions and to maximize overall product functionality.

The underlying contract was reviewed and approved by Risk Management as to insurance and liability and by the County Attorney's Office for legal sufficiency.

The underlying contract can be terminated for convenience with a ninety (90) calendar day notice and include UAP and OIG fees. The OIG and UAP fees are provided as a deduction on the invoices.

A Bid Waiver Justification has been provided and Conflict of Interest Declaration have been signed by Glenn Ponte, Director Risk Safety Analytics & Strategy Risk Management; Michelle Romano, Sr. Director Procurement Services, JHS, and Quilvio Munoz, GRM General Manger, with no reported disclosures (**R. Costanzo, J. Tawwater**).

Scope

The Amendment allows both the Trust and Tenant to terminate the Lease by giving at least 30 days’ written notice.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with the Amendment.

Track Record/Monitor

Real Estate Services staff would be responsible for managing the Amendment and Lease on behalf of the Trust.

Background

On October 23, 2021, the Trust entered into the Lease with Tenant for the use of 3,209 rentable square feet of medical office space at Jackson West for the operation of a pediatric practice by the Tenant. The Term of the Lease is scheduled to expire on September 30, 2031 and the Lease does not include a mutual termination right.

The Trust is currently constructing a 5,570 square foot pediatric pavilion on the third floor of the Jackson West Medical Pavilion (“Pediatric Pavilion”) and the parties intend on relocating the existing pediatric practices operating within the Premises to the new Pediatric Pavilion upon completion of construction by the Trust, which is expected in December 2026.

In consideration of the future relocation and need to terminate the Lease in advance of its natural expiration, the University has requested that the Lease be amended to incorporate a termination for convenience provision for both parties. Trust and Tenant desire to enter into the Amendment to allow either party to exercise an early termination upon Tenant’s relocation and commencement of operations at the Pediatric Pavilion.

Accordingly, it is recommended that the Board authorize the Chief Executive Officer or his designee to execute the Amendment and exercise the rights conferred therein.

RE: Lease Agreement with Quest Diagnostics Clinical Laboratories Inc.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Public Health Trust Board of Trustees (“Board”) authorize the execution of a lease agreement (“Lease”) between Quest Diagnostics Clinical Laboratories Inc., (“Tenant”) and the Public Health Trust (“Trust”) for use of 1,420 rentable square feet of medical office space at Ambulatory Care Center-West, located at 1611 NW 12 Avenue, Suites 201 and 206, Miami, Florida, (“Premises”).

Scope

The Lease allows Tenant use of the Premises for an initial three (3) year term with one (1) option to extend the term for a period of five (5) years. Either party may terminate the Lease for any reason upon 90 days’ written notice.

Fiscal Impact

The projected revenue to the Trust is \$219,461 for the three-year initial term of the Lease. The projected cumulative rental revenue to the Trust should the Tenant exercise all its options to extend, is estimated to be \$631,403. The proposed rental obligations in the Lease are consistent with fair market value as determined by an independent appraiser.

Track Record/Monitor

Real Estate Services staff would track and monitor the Lease on behalf of the Trust.

Background

The Trust currently operates a phlebotomy laboratory in the Premises which primarily serves patients of the adjacent medical clinics operated by the Trust that are located within the Ambulatory Care Center. Trust staff evaluated the existing operations at the Premises and determined that leasing the Premises to a third party laboratory operator would result in expanded and more convenient access to laboratory services for patients across all Jackson Memorial Medical Center facilities and the wider surrounding community.

Tenant is a well-established clinical laboratory operator that currently operates approximately 2,563 locations across the United States and performs over 3 million diagnostic tests annually across all of its facilities. Tenant is also the national preferred laboratory partner of the Trust’s medical insurance administrator, Aetna, making Tenant an ideal on-campus laboratory operator for the Trust and a cost-effective in-network option for Trust employees who are enrolled in one of the Trust-sponsored medical insurance plans.

Accordingly, staff recommends that the Board authorize the Chief Executive Officer or his designee to execute the Lease and to take all actions necessary to effectuate the same.
