Village of Key Biscayne School Speed Camera Report

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Each participating school zone speed detection camera program must prepare an annual report of the results of all school zone speed detection cameras (traffic infraction detectors). The report must be placed on the agenda of the governing body of the municipality as a single reporting item. As per the requirements of the law, this special presentation must be read aloud at a regular meeting.

#### DISCUSSION

**Background:** In 2024, the Village Council approved Red Speed as the vendor for the Village school zone speed camera. The cameras were installed in the 100 block of Harbor Drive, directly adjacent to St. Agnes Academy. According to the Key Biscayne School Zone Speed Detection System: Camera Location Table (Attachment A), two cameras were activated on May 5, 2025: Camera RSFL0461 (eastbound) located at EB Harbor Dr @ St. Agnes Academy, and Camera RSFL0462 (westbound) located at WB Harbor Dr @ St. Agnes Academy. Both cameras operate during designated school zone hours (06:45–16:00, with heightened enforcement periods from 07:18–08:00 and 13:48–15:30), enforcing a restricted school zone speed limit of 15 mph and a posted speed limit of 30 mph at other times. This annual report includes data collected from May 5, 2025, through the end of the school year on June 4, 2025.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Each participating red light camera program must prepare an annual report of the results of all redlight cameras (traffic infraction detectors). The report must be placed on the agenda of the governing body of the municipality as a single reporting item. As per the requirements of the law, this special presentation must be read aloud at a regular meeting.

#### **DISCUSSION**

**Background:** The following red-light camera (traffic infraction detectors) reporting period data is from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. During this time, a total of 730 Notices of Violation (NOVs) were issued to drivers. Out of these (0) NOVs were contested, (0) were upheld and (0) were dismissed. Additionally, (109) NOVs resulted in Uniform Traffic Citations (UTCs) being issued. Regarding payments, (621) NOVs were successfully paid.

The total amount of a Notice of Violation is \$158.00. Funds collected from each payment were distributed as follows:

- \$100 State General Fund
- \$45 Local Government
- \$10 Local Trauma Center
- \$3 Spinal/Brain Injury research through the Miami Project

Funds collected from these payments were distributed as follows:

- \$88,638 were paid from violators
- \$45,563 was remitted to the Department of Revenue
- \$42,075 was paid to our 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor administering the red-light camera program.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2025-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF KEY BISCAYNE, FLORIDA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2024-12, AS AMENDED BY EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 2025-13, RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF ELECTRIC BICYCLES, MOTORIZED SCOOTERS, AND OTHER MOTORIZED MOBILITY DEVICES WITHIN THE VILLAGE, TO DELETE THE SUNSET PROVISION; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2024, the Village Council adopted Ordinance No. 2024-12, codified as Article V, "Electric Bicycles, Motorized Scooters, and other Motorized Mobility Devices," of Chapter 26 of the Village Code of Ordinances (the "Ordinance"), which prohibits the operation of Electric Bicycles, Motorized Scooters, and Other Motorized Mobility Devices (collectively, the "Motorized Devices") on all streets and sidewalks under the Village's jurisdiction; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 6 of the Ordinance specifically provides that the Ordinance shall automatically sunset on August 30, 2025, unless otherwise extended; and

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2025, the Village Council adopted Emergency Ordinance No. 2025-13, to extend the expiration date of the Ordinance's provisions governing the operation of Motorized Devices on streets and sidewalks under the Village's jurisdiction to protect the life, health, and property of residents and visitors within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to delete the sunset provision from the Ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Council hereby finds that this Ordinance is in the best interest and welfare of the residents of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF KEY BISCAYNE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:1

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Recitals.</u> That each of the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Amendment to Ordinance No. 2024-12.</u> That Ordinance No. 2024-12, as amended by Emergency Ordinance No. 2025-13, is hereby amended to delete the sunset provision set forth in Section 6 thereof.

**Section 3.** Codification. That it is the intention of the Village Council, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Village's

Code of Ordinances, and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intentions, and that the word Ordinance shall be changed to Section or other appropriate word.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**Section 5. Conflicts.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or parts of resolutions, in conflict herewith, are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Effective Date. That this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption on second reading.

Recommend the Village Council approve the capital project authorizing ordinance to purchase forty-two (42) Motorola Police Radios, two (2) APX dispatch Consolettes, and related services in the amount of \$556,051.92.

#### DISCUSSION

**Purpose:** There is a need to replace our entire allotment of police radios and existing dispatch consolettes, as the equipment has reached end of life. Additionally, due to the age of our radio inventory, the communication devices are breaking down more frequently. The department requests the purchase approval to continue our public safety operations and ensure officer safety.

**Background:** Miami Dade County Sheriff's Office, who is our current 9-11 emergency dispatch center, transitioned to the Motorola Radio platform in 2024. Our current radio provider Harris is supported by the system but will become non-serviceable. Our existing radios, the Harris 7300, were discontinued in 2021. Due to the age of our radio inventory, the communication devices are breaking down more frequently.

**Justification:** The purchase of the Motorola radio platform will ensure continuity of operations and replace end-of-life legacy radio equipment to modernize the Village of Key Biscayne Police Department.

#### **Operational Benefits:**

- Enhanced officer safety and situational awareness for command
- Improved communications and operational efficiency across facilities and transports
- Mitigate liability with existing end-of-life radio equipment
- Our law enforcement partners at the Miami Dade Sheriff's Office and the City of Miami Police Department are currently utilizing the Motorola radios.
- Several agencies in Miami Dade County have transitioned to the Motorola platform.



#### **Warranty and Cost:**

The purchase of Motorola radios is the total cost of ownership. It includes seven years of subscription services and warranty. Additionally, the 7-year commitment locks in the 2025 pricing through 2032.

The Village of Key Biscayne will piggy-back the existing Motorola Sourcewell Contract #042021-MOT.

**Implementation/Integration Plan:** Upon Council approval, the radios will be ordered. Once Motorola receives the order, Motorola will work with the Miami Dade County radio shop to program the purchased equipment for deployment. The time frame provided by Motorola is sixeight weeks. The payment to Motorola will be divided into two payments. A 50% deposit will be applied from the Police FY 2025 budget. Upon approval of the proposed 2026 CIP budget, a final payment will be made to Motorola for the outstanding balance. After the radios are programmed, a roll-call training will be conducted for all department personnel, and the radios will be in-service.

#### RESOURCE IMPACT

**Recurring Funding:** No additional funding is requested for the first seven years of the purchase. Upon completion of year seven, the department would assume an annual subscription rate for each radio. (see Motorola attachment)

Equipment: No additional equipment needed. Radios come with all accessories required.

**Training:** The department is currently testing demo radios in the field. Once the radios are programmed, a roll-call training will be conducted for all department personnel, and the radios will be in-service.

WHEREAS, the Village of Key Biscayne (the "Village") Police Department needs to replace its existing police radios and dispatch consolettes as the equipment has reached the end of its useful life and the Miami-Dade County Sheriff's Office, which serves as the Village's 911 emergency dispatch center, has transitioned to the Motorola Radio platform; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to purchase 42 Motorola police radios, two APX dispatch consolettes, and related services (collectively, the "Equipment") to replace the Village's existing police radios and dispatch consolettes; and

WHEREAS, the type of purchase contemplated by the Village has been competitively bid by Sourcewell, a local government and service cooperative created under the laws of the State of Minnesota, which has entered into Sourcewell Contract No. 042021-MOT ("Sourcewell Contract") with Motorola Solutions, Inc. (the "Vendor") for the Equipment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 2-86 of the Village Code of Ordinances, the Village Council desires to authorize the Village Manager to purchase the Equipment from the Vendor in an amount not to exceed \$556,051.92 consistent with the Vendor's quote attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (the "Quote") and the Sourcewell Contract, as the pricing offered pursuant to the Sourcewell Contract is in the Village's best interest; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council finds that this Capital Project Authorizing Ordinance is in the best interest and welfare of the residents of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL
OF THE VILLAGE OF KEY BISCAYNE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS: 1

Section 1. Recitals. The above-stated recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Approval. That the Village Council hereby approves the purchase of the Equipment from the Vendor in an amount not to exceed \$556,051.92.

Section 3. Authorization. That the Village Council hereby authorizes the Village Manager to purchase the Equipment in an amount not to exceed \$556,051.92, consistent with the Quote attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and the Sourcewell Contract, subject to the availability of budgeted funds.

Section 4. Implementation. The Village Council hereby authorizes the Village Manager to execute any purchase order or required documentation for the purchases described in this Ordinance, subject to approval by the Village Attorney as to form, content, and legal sufficiency, and to take any action that is reasonably necessary to implement the purpose of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption on second reading.
