AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO TRAFFIC ON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK, ADDING HANDICAP PARKING ON VAN DEUSEN STREET

WHEREAS, in the interest of safety and the needs of residents, parking on the street must be regulated

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KINGSTON, NEW YORK, DOES ORDAIN AND ENACT THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION 1. ARTICLE 7, SECTION 390-57, "HANDICAP PARKING" is hereby amended by ADDING the following:

Handicap Parking (and signage) at 38 Van Deusen Street.

SECTION-2. All ordinances and parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
