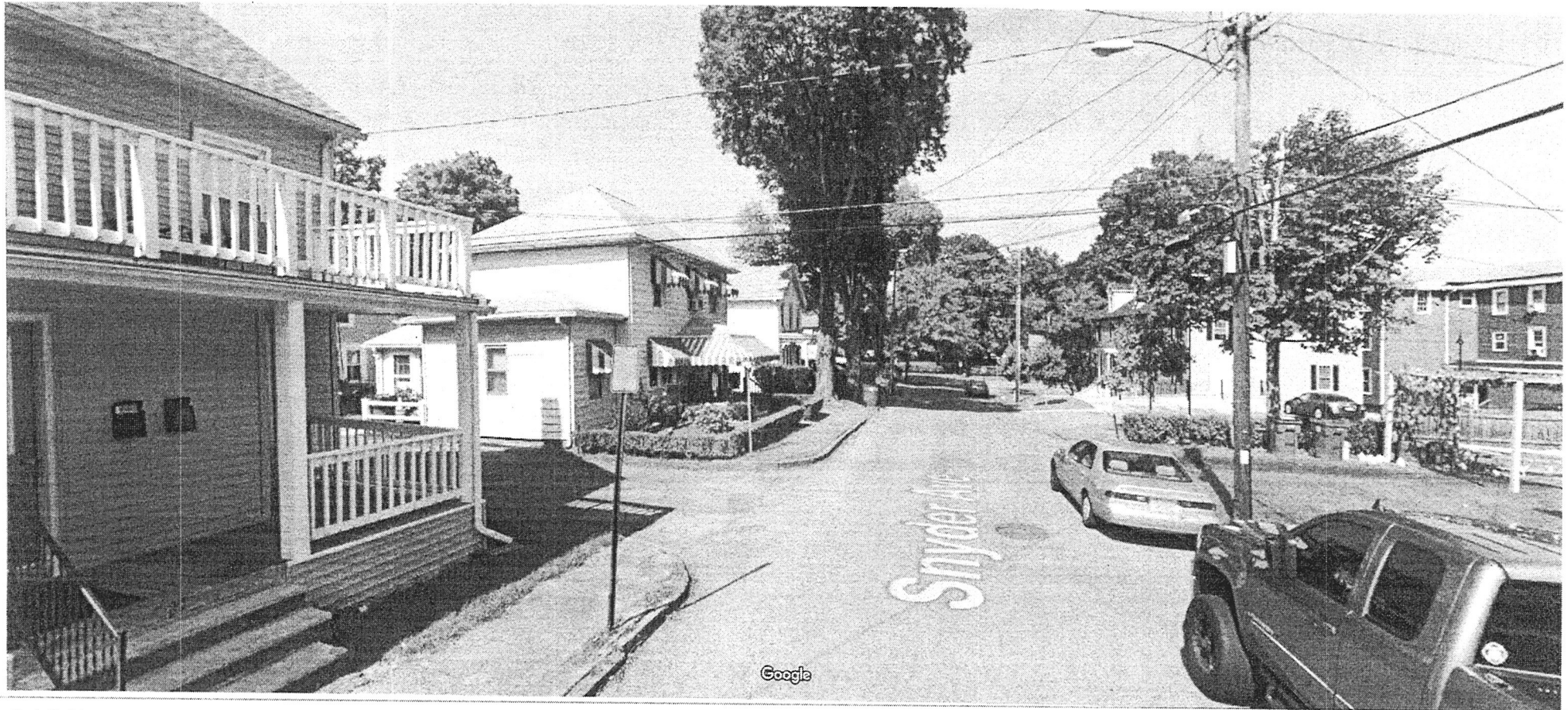

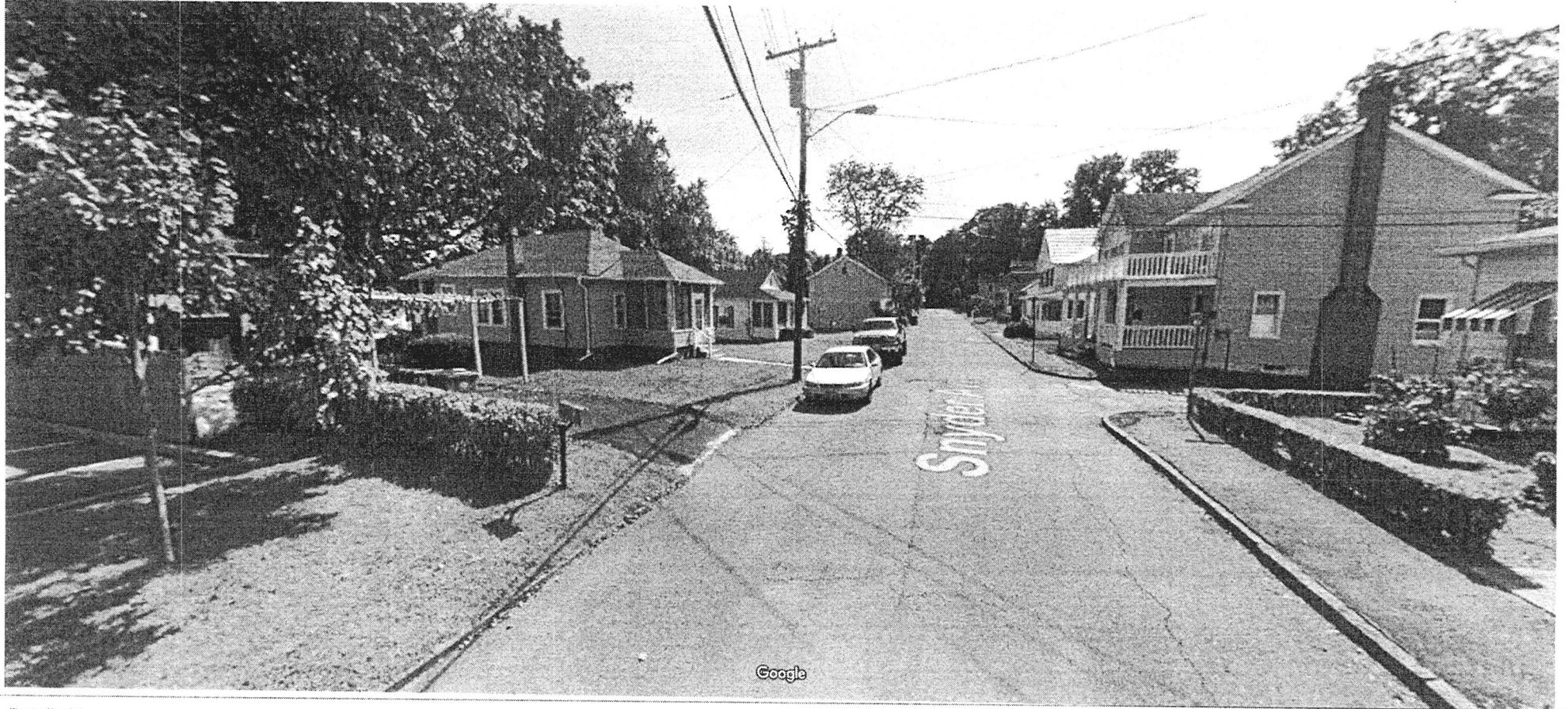

Re: Uptown business district loading zone review

1. Add a loading zone on John St. at the corner of Wall St. adjacent to 301 Wall St.
 - a. Removal of two parking meters; three parking spaces.
 - b. Approximately 70' in length would easily accommodate delivery truck and at least one car for hotel valet service at the same time.
2. Add a small loading zone on N Front St. between Wall and Fair St. closer to Wall St.
 - a. This might help with deliveries at that end of Wall St. and the N Front businesses hopefully easing double parked trucks on Wall and N Front.
3. Shorten the current loading zone on Fair St. off of N Front St.
 - a. Possibly relocate one or two metered parking from John St. to Fair St.

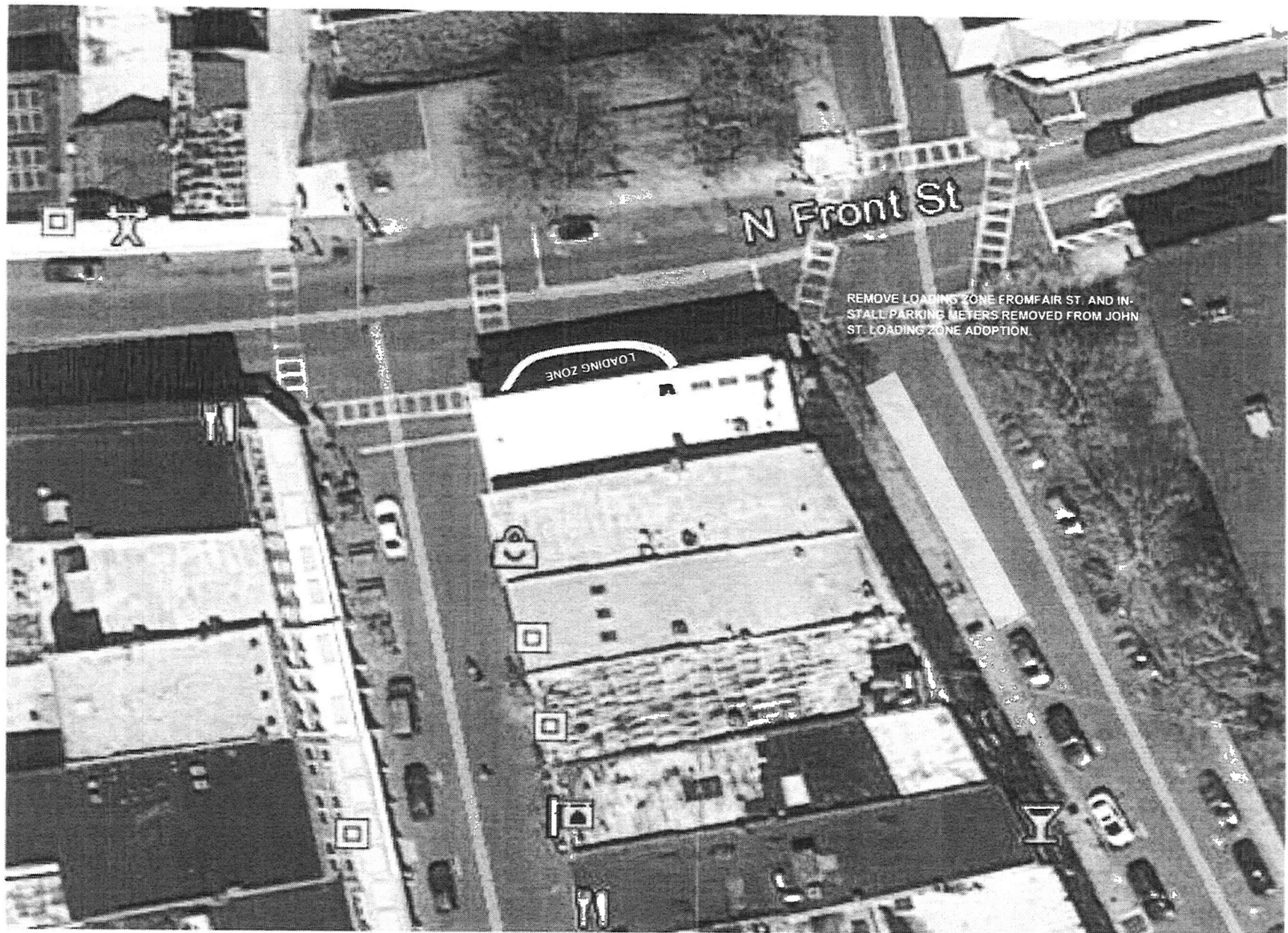
All loading zones would be delineated by pavement markings indicating loading zone. These pavement markings will make it easier for delivery trucks to locate legal loading zones in addition to highlighting illegally parked vehicles for ticketing.

Further evaluation is needed for possibly adding another loading zone on N Front St. down toward Washington Ave. Also, to look for other locations to relocate any meters removed to accommodate need loading zones proposed.

Add loading zone on John St. at the corner of Wall St. to accommodate truck deliveries to area businesses and access to new hotel for valet parking drop off/pickup. It will require the removal of three parking meters, which will be relocated to Fair St. at the corner of N Front St. in place of the relocated loading zone.



Relocating loading zone from Fair St., removing right turn only from N Front St. to Fair St. and placing loading zone on N Front St. between Wall and Fair St. Relocate the meters removed from John St. to the old loading zone on Fair St.

Re: Request to designate Jansen Ave. from East O'Reilly St. to City Hall as employee parking only

Dear President. Noble;

For many years, the employees of the Fire Department and the Water Department have used Jansen Avenue, from the intersection of East O'Reilly St. to just before City Hall for parking during work hours. However, in recent months, our employees have been competing for those spaces with a small group of hospital employees who seem to prefer to park along that stretch of Jansen rather than utilize the off-site parking that is provided for them. This forces the employees of both the KFD and KWD to seek alternate parking, often forcing them onto side streets where they compete with residents or into visitor slots for City Hall or the Water Department. I have spoken to both Chief Brown and Mayor Noble about this matter and we are all in agreement that the most efficient solution would be to ask that the Council designate that portion of Jansen Avenue as parking for City of Kingston Employees. Therefore, I respectfully request your consideration of this proposal. I am available to meet with you or members of the Council to answer questions or provide additional documentation.
