Downtown Development Committee, Trustee Walsh

Trustee Walsh noted that this has been discussed for some time. He is looking for a motion for the Board to reroute Hwy. 83. He noted he is looking for a motion as indication of this being a live situation.

Johnson/Wamser motion to approve support of Hwy. 83 reroute.

Trustee Decker noted that \$125,000 was spent with (2) years of meeting with the DOT and it was determined that Holtz Parkway would have to be rebuilt. It impedes (3) subdivisions access to roads, schools, church, and retirement community. Our public works can't even get out of their driveway. He questions who will pay for the new lights. Even if you re-route you will only get a 10% reduction in traffic as noted in the prior meetings.

Trustee Walsh noted the DOT didn't talk money but this was the number one recommendation to reroute Hwy 83. There was further discussion regarding the challenges.

Trustee Decker questioned is it practical and do we have the resources?

Trustee Wamser noted he would like to have more background on the item before.

Administrator Weidl noted the Engineer would have to do exploratory before they had more information.

Trustee Walsh confirmed the Village had a feasibility study completed and would like to know if that information still holds true.

Trustee Johnson noted she is additionally concerned about the cost, and remembers the past discussions and would like more information first.

President Winchowky noted that previously they were presented with a 4-lane plan and confirmed they are looking to see if the numbers are the same or to explore before taking any action on it. Johnson/Wamser withdraw their motion.

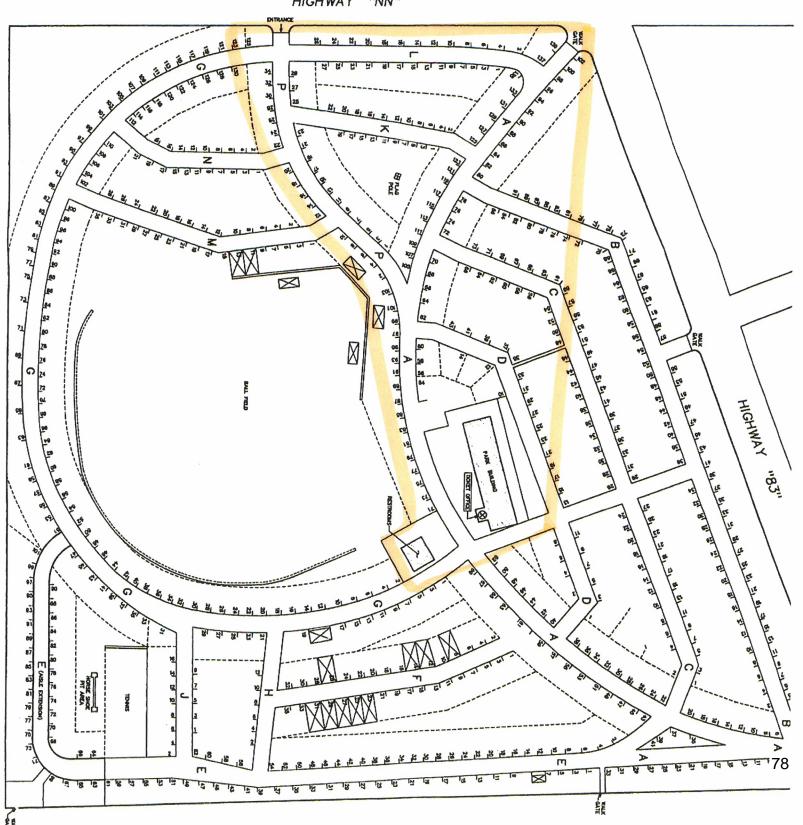
MAXWELL STREET PARK LAYOUT

Per Covid-19 regulations from the State of Wisconsin Executive Orders we will incorporate and direct vendors with the following information:

In Addition until the Covid-19 Regulations are lifted:

- 1. Farmers' markets, farm and produce stands are allowed to be open.
- 2. Shoppers are not allowed to touch the product until sold.
- 3. No samples; all food is to be consumed off-site.
- 4. Practice social distancing; 6 feet apart. Booths set farther apart.

- 6. Vendors tents setup on one side only for one way walking around park circle. Flow of traffic paths will be marked.

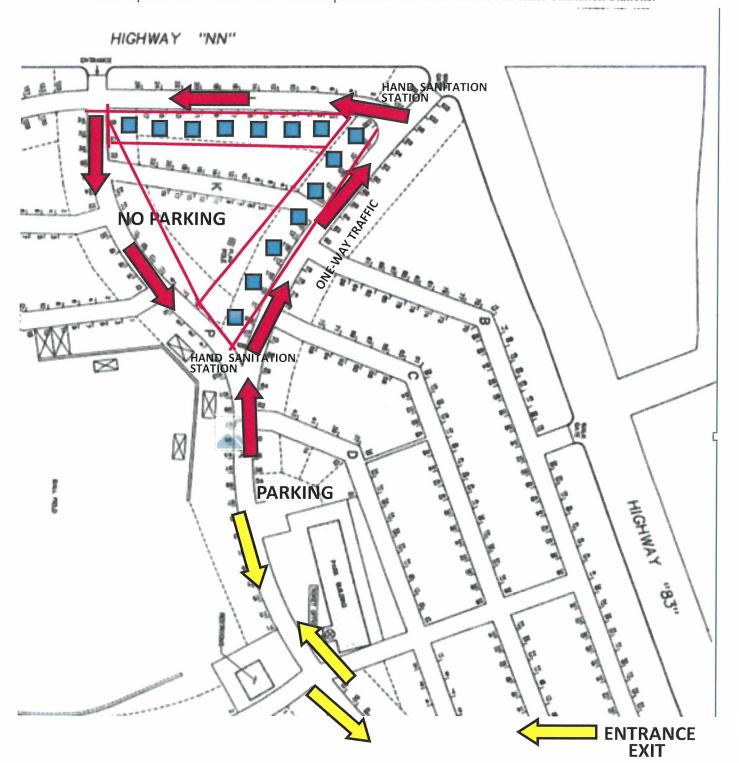

LICENSE AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

Licensor, for and in consideration of the covenants, conditions, and agreements hereinafter contained, hereby grants license and permission unto Licensee, to develop, at Licensee's sole cost and expense, and use a part of Licensor's right of way lands (hereinafter "Lands") as a recreation trail (hereinafter "Premises") and to place thereon a trail for hiking, biking, and cross-country skiing and other similar non-motorized recreational uses (hereinafter "Trail") for use by the general public and for no other purpose or purposes whatsoever (except those purposes as may be determined by Licensor for its own use), which Premises is located West of Holz Parkway to Village Parking lot, north of I-94, being a part of the Southwest ¼ of Section 25, Township 5 North, Range 18 East, Village of Mukwonago in Waukesha County, Wisconsin., The general location of said Lands and Premises is shown highlighted on the maps marked Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof. Licensor recommends a 10 foot wide road grade asphalt trail with a 1 foot gravel edge on both sides of the trail with road grade rating.

The License and permission herein granted is subject to the following conditions:

- Term: The term of this License Agreement (hereinafter "License") shall be for a period of five (5) years (hereinafter "Initial Term") and continue thereafter on a year to year basis subject to termination as hereinafter provided. This License shall commence on the above date which is the date the last of the Parties hereto executed this License (hereinafter "Commencement Date")
- 2. <u>Termination:</u> Upon expiration of the Initial Term, this License may be terminated at any time by either Party hereto by providing at least 90 days prior written notice to the other Party of such termination. Notwithstanding any of the terms and conditions contained herein, should Licensor require exclusive use of any part of its Lands, including the Premises, for its purposes, then Licensor may, at any time, including during the Initial Term, terminate the License in whole or in part on such part or parts of the Lands or Premises it requires, and Licensee shall, not later than 90 days after receiving notice of such termination, at its sole cost and expense, relocate, remove or re-route the Trail from such part or parts of the Lands.
- 3. Non Use: Licensee shall have one (1) full year, beginning at the Commencement Date of this License, to begin construction of the Trail and one (1) full year after the start of construction to complete construction, as permitted herein. If Licensee fails to begin construction of the Trail within one (1) year of the Commencement Date or complete construction of the Trail within one (1) year, this License shall terminate immediately without notice from Licensor.
- 4. Base Rent: During the Initial Term and extensions thereto, no Base Rent shall be due.
- Assignment: Licensee shall not assign this License nor permit any transfer by operation of law or otherwise of the interest in the herein-described Premises acquired through this License unless otherwise approved by Licensor in writing.
- 6. <u>Acceptance of Premises:</u> Licensor offers and Licensee agrees to take the Premises in an "as is" condition and Licensor makes no warranty or representation of any kind as to the condition, quality or suitability of the soil, subsoil

or surfacing of the Premises and Lands or anything thereon or therein, unless the same is specifically set forth in this License, for the purposes to which Licensee will utilize the Premises. Licensee has examined the Premises described hereinabove and knows the condition thereof and no representations as to the condition and repair thereof and no agreements to make any alterations, repairs or improvements in or about the licensed Lands and Trail have been made by Licensor. Licensee's taking possession of the Premises shall be conclusive evidence as against Licensee that the Premises were in good order and satisfactory condition for use as a Trail and other permitted ancillary uses. Licensor shall not be liable for any damages arising from acts or neglect of Licensee or its invitees or users of the Premises, whether authorized to use the Lands and Premises or not.

- 7. Permitted and Prohibited Uses: The Premises shall be used for the purpose of constructing, installing, operating, maintaining, using, repairing, and removing a recreation trail and permitted appurtenances thereto for hiking, biking, and cross-country skiing and other similar non-motorized recreational uses and for no other reason whatsoever. No vehicles, trucks, cars or equipment are to be parked or materials stored on said Lands or Premises at any time without specific written approval of Licensor. Furthermore, the Licensee agrees that no motorized vehicles, including but not limited to cars, trucks, snowmobiles, motor bikes, mini-bikes, motorcycles, mopeds, go-carts and all-terrain vehicles will be used, operated or permitted on the Lands or Premises. However, Licensee shall be permitted to use motorized vehicles for the patrol, maintenance and other permitted uses of the Lands and Premises. The Licensee also agrees that no horses will be used or permitted on the Lands and Premises. Licensee agrees that no kites, model airplanes or similar or dissimilar objects that may come in contact with or in close proximity to the facilities of Licensor or the American Transmission Company LLC (hereinafter "ATC") and its successors and assigns, will be used, operated or permitted on the Lands and Premises.
- 8. <u>Signage:</u> Licensee shall not place or maintain or allow to be placed or maintained by any person or persons, any signs or advertising billboards upon the Lands or Premises at any time, except as required or permitted by this Section. Licensee shall install and maintain signs that are necessary to identify Licensee's Trail and occupancy of the Lands and Premises at every road crossing and at least every 2,600 feet along the Trail or more frequently as desired by Licensor. Such identification signs shall include the We Energies approved corporate logo and shall state "In cooperation with We Energies" or such other signs as Licensor may reasonably require. Licensee further agrees to post, maintain at all times, and if necessary, replace signs that expressly state the uses that are permitted and prohibited under Section hereof. In addition, Licensee hereby agrees to post safety and traffic signs along the Trail and at road crossings, railroad crossings, driveways, farm crossings and any other vehicular crossings along the Trail. All signs must be approved by Licensor prior to erection or installation on the Lands or Premises.
- 9. Zoning and Permits: Licensee hereby agrees that Licensor has made no representations that the Premises are properly zoned for the proposed use by Licensee, and it is expressly understood that Licensee hereby assumes any and all obligations and responsibilities with respect to compliance with all applicable zoning laws and ordinances of any regulatory bodies which may have jurisdiction. Any change in zoning must be approved by Licensor. This License is conditioned on Licensee's obtaining all necessary permits and authority for the proposed use. All permits required hereunder shall be acquired by Licensee at its sole cost and expense. If permits are required, a copy of the final permits must be provided to the Licensor prior to the commencement of any work on the Lands or Premises by Licensee and upon reasonable time for Licensor to review the permits.
- 10. <u>Governmental Jurisdiction</u>: Licensee shall, in the use and occupancy of the Premises, comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations of Village of Mukwonago, Waukesha County, State of Wisconsin and all other governmental bodies having jurisdiction, over the operation of Licensee's or Licensor's business or occupation of the Lands and Premises.
- 11. <u>Construction and Other Liens:</u> Licensee shall have no authority, express or implied, to create or place any lien or encumbrance of any kind or nature whatsoever upon, or in any manner to bind, the interest of Licensor in the Premises or Lands or to charge the Base Rent payable hereunder, if any, for any claim in favor of any person

dealing with Licensee, including those who may furnish materials or perform labor for any construction or repairs. Licensee covenants and agrees that it will pay or cause to be paid all sums legally due and payable by it on account of any labor performed, materials, services or supplies furnished in connection with any work performed on the Premises and Lands by or at Licensee's direction on which any lien is or can be validly and legally asserted against its interest in the Premises or the improvements thereon and that it will save and hold Licensor harmless from any and all loss, liability, cost or expense, including costs of suit and reasonable attorney's fees, based on or arising out of asserted claims or liens against the Leasehold estate or against the right, title and interest of the Licensor in the Premises and Lands or under the terms of this License. Licensee will not permit any construction lien or any other liens which may be imposed by law affecting Licensor's or its mortgagees' interest in the Premises and Lands to be placed upon the Premises or Lands arising out of any action or claimed action by Licensee, and in case of the filing of any such lien Licensee will promptly pay same. Licensee shall provide Licensor with Lien Waivers from all contractors and subcontractors for all work performed and material and services supplied by or on its behalf at the Premises or Lands. If any such lien shall remain in force and effect for ten (10) days after written notice thereof from Licensor to Licensee and Licensee has not posted with Licensor a bond in the amount of at least 125% thereof, Licensor shall have the right and privilege of paying and discharging the same or any portion thereof without inquiry as to the validity thereof, and any amounts so paid, including expenses and interest, shall be so much Additional Rent hereunder due from Licensee to Licensor and shall be paid to Licensor immediately on presentation of a bill therefor. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Licensee shall have the right to contest any such lien in good faith and with all due diligence so long as any such contest, or action taken in connection therewith, protects the interest of Licensor and Licensor's mortgagee in the Lands, and Licensor and any such mortgagee are, by the expiration of said ten (10) day period, furnished such protection, and indemnification against any loss, liability, cost or expense related to any such lien and the contest thereof as are satisfactory to Licensor and any such mortgagee. If Licensee has posted a bond with Licensor in the amount of 125% of the liens, such liens can and will be cleared within 180 days of filing. However, Licensor reserves the right at any time prior to the expiration of said 180 day period to make a demand on said bond to clear its title in the event such liens would prevent Licensor's lawful use or transfer of its property in any way or to prevent any loss of Licensor's fee simple ownership rights. Licensor reserves the right to make demand on any such bond immediately upon expiration of said 180 day period. Licensor agrees to notify Licensee of its intent to secure the release of any such liens from the posted bond. No temporary or permanent construction may occur in wetlands. If any work is proposed within wetlands, the Licensee must obtain the appropriate permits from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ("WDNR") and the Army Corps of Engineers ("ACOE"). The Licensee must provide a copy of the application and final permits to Licensor prior to working within the wetland and provided Licensor has reasonable time to review said permits.

- 12. <u>Diggers Hotline:</u> Licensee shall contact Diggers Hotline at (800) 242-8511 to locate any underground facilities at least five (5) days prior to any work, excavation or construction on the Lands and Premises in order to determine the location of electric, telephone, water, communication and natural gas facilities within the Lands, Premises and surrounding lands in the vicinity of the contemplated work and the applicable clearance requirements for work performed in the proximity of such facilities.
- 13. Plan Review and Approval: Licensee shall submit to Licensor and to ATC for its review and written approval, detailed site plans and construction drawings (hereinafter "Plans") showing the proposed location of the Trail with respect to the Lands and Utility Facilities, which Plans shall also include proposed grade changes, Trail cross sections, signs and other improvements to the Premises which Licensee desires to construct or install. If Licensee intends to use any fill on Licensor's Lands, Licensee shall include the type and source of any fill material on the Plans and any fill material used shall be subject to inspection and analysis by Licensor for the presence of Hazardous Material as defined in Section ______hereinafter. Licensee will not install or construct or permit to be installed or constructed, any improvements upon, or make any alterations or substantive changes to the approved plans for the Premises without first submitting plans and specifications to Licensor and receiving Licensor's approval thereof.

- 14. <u>Height Restrictions:</u> Licensee hereby agrees that no vehicles or equipment will be used, stored operated or permitted on the Lands or Premises having a height in excess of 12 feet above original ground grade level, unless otherwise approved in writing by Licensor and/or ATC as their respective interests lie.
- 15. <u>Runoff Control:</u> Licensee and its contractors shall follow those best management practices to prevent or control site runoff and erosion in accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (hereinafter "WDNR") publication "Wisconsin Construction Site Best Management Practice Handbook." It shall also be the responsibility of the contractor to determine if and when a permit to discharge storm water associated with a construction activity as per Wisconsin NR 216, or subsequent statute, law, ordinance, act, rule or regulation, is required. Following the completion of Licensee's work, all adjoining areas shall be restored.
- 16. <u>Drainage and Grade Changes:</u> Licensee shall be permitted, at its sole cost and expense, to grade, level, and apply crushed stone and/or asphalt paving and plant grass on the Trail and Premises as may be permitted by Licensor except that the Licensee shall not in any manner alter or change the original ground grade level of the Premises, or alter in any manner the drainage on the Lands or Premises without obtaining written permission from Licensor. Licensor, at its sole discretion, may require Licensee to install such drainage facilities as Licensor may deem necessary to adequately drain the Lands and Premises, which facilities are made necessary due to or arising out of any filling, grading, leveling, paving or use by the Licensee hereunder. All such drainage facilities (including culverts, storm sewers, ditches, etc.) shall be installed by and at the expense of the Licensee and to the complete satisfaction of Licensor. Any existing culverts that run beneath Licensor's lands must be maintained or enhanced; they can not be removed, filled or otherwise blocked.
- 17. <u>Maintenance and Landscaping:</u> Licensee shall, at its sole cost and expense, keep the Licensed Lands and Premises routinely mowed and free of weeds to the satisfaction of the local Weed Commissioner and Licensor. Licensor reserves the right to trim and/or cut down any trees and shrubs on the Lands and Premises. Licensee further agrees that it shall maintain the entire Premises as a Trail as described hereinabove, and perform such other landscaping maintenance necessary to maintain an appearance suitable to such use as a Trail for biking, hiking and cross-country skiing and other similar non-motorized recreational uses. Licensee shall not plant any trees or shrubs on the Lands or Premises without the express written permission of the Licensor. Licensee agrees to keep the Lands and Premises clean and free from all debris, rubbish, litter and trash. Licensee shall be permitted or upon request of Licensor, to place trash containers at convenient locations on the Premises. Such containers shall be emptied on a regular basis, prior to overflowing or creating a nuisance, by Licensee.
- 18. <u>Work Standards:</u> During construction, use of and repairs or maintenance to the Lands or Premises pursuant to this License, while in proximity to electrical conductors or gas facilities presently existing or to be installed at some future date, Licensee hereby agrees to conform to all laws, rules, ordinances, acts and regulations such as O.S.H.A. Safety and Health Regulations for Construction dealing with safe work practices and the operation of equipment near electrical lines and equipment and the provisions and requirements of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, Rules of the Department of Commerce and any amendments thereto. Licensee shall, at all times, comply with the provisions of the Wisconsin State Electric Code, compiled by the Department of Commerce and the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin, and all amendments thereto. Any work done by Licensee on the Lands or Premises shall be performed in such a manner as not to interfere with the use of Licensor's Lands for electric lines, gas lines, communication lines and related or unrelated facilities, both overhead and underground, which presently exist or might be installed at a later date.
- 19. <u>Damage to Facilities:</u> Licensee hereby agrees to effectively prevent damage to electrical facilities, communication facilities or related facilities due to or arising out of the construction, installation, operation, maintenance, repairs, removals and use of the Lands and Premises by Licensee, its employees, agents, contractors, customers or invitees. In the event the Lands, Premises or adjoining lands or existing electrical and communication facilities or related or unrelated facilities thereon are damaged as a result of activities conducted

- on or in any way connected with Licensee's construction, installation, operation, maintenance, repairs, removals or use of the Lands or Premises by Licensee, its employees, agents, contractors, customers or invitees, repairs shall be completed by or at the direction of Licensor and paid for by Licensee upon presentation of a bill therefor.
- 20. Movement of Licensor Facilities: In the event it is necessary for Licensor, ATC or existing tenants, permittees or licensees to reconstruct, protect, modify, adjust, replace or relocate its facilities due to the aforementioned use of Licensor's Lands and/or the construction, operation, maintenance or existence of Licensee's facilities, Licensee agrees to promptly reimburse Licensor, ATC or such affected tenants, permittees or licensees upon presentation of a bill for the costs and expenses incurred by Licensor as a result thereof but Licensee shall be given the option of moving or relocating its material and equipment to reduce or eliminate costs associated herewith.
- 21. Proximity to Gas Lines/Facilities: During construction, installation, operation, maintenance, repairs, removals and use of the Lands and Premises pursuant to this License, while in proximity to gas lines and gas facilities presently existing or to be installed at some future date, Licensee hereby agrees to exercise due caution, comply with all applicable safety laws and regulations and take or suffer no action which results in the gas lines or gas facilities being placed in violation of any applicable law or regulation. In the event the Lands, Premises, adjoining lands or existing gas facilities or related facilities thereon are damaged as a result of activities conducted on or in any way connected with Licensee's construction, installation, operation, maintenance, repairs, removals or use of the Lands or Premises by Licensee, its employees, agents, contractors, customers or invitees, repairs shall be completed by or at the direction of Licensor and paid for by Licensee upon presentation of a bill therefor.
- 22. <u>Solid Waste:</u> Licensee shall not cause or permit any solid wastes to accumulate or be stored in or about the Lands or Premises. All solid wastes shall be properly stored, handled and routinely disposed of off the Lands and Premises in a manner that complies with applicable federal, state and local laws, codes and/or regulations. Licensee shall not store, handle or dispose of solid wastes in a manner that will pollute or contaminate the atmosphere, ground or water or which may adversely affect the health, welfare or safety of persons whether located on the Lands. Premises or elsewhere.
- 23. <u>Hazardous Materials</u>: Licensee its agents, employees, contractors, and invitees shall not cause or permit any Hazardous Material to be brought upon, kept, or used in or about the Lands or Premises or Licensor's adjoining lands. The use and/or storage of Hazardous Material by or for any assignee is prohibited. Licensee shall not discharge, leak, or emit, or permit to be discharged, leaked, or emitted, any material into the atmosphere, ground, storm water or sanitary sewer system, or any body of water, if such material (as determined by the Licensor or any governmental authority) does or may pollute or contaminate the same, or may adversely affect (a) the health, welfare, or safety of persons, whether located on the Lands, Premises or elsewhere; or (b) the condition, use, or enjoyment of any other real or personal property.

As used herein, the term "Hazardous Material" means:

- a. Any "hazardous waste" as defined by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, as amended from time to time, and regulations promulgated thereunder;
- b. Any "hazardous substance" as defined by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as amended from time to time, and regulations promulgated thereunder;
- c. Any oil, petroleum products, and their byproducts; and

d. Any substance which is or becomes regulated by any federal, state, or local governmental authority.

Licensee agrees that it shall be fully liable for all costs and expenses related to the use, storage, and disposal of Hazardous Material kept on the Premises or Lands by the Licensee and the Licensee shall give immediate notice to the Licensor of any violation or potential violation of the provisions of this Section _____. Licensee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Licensor and its agents from and against any claims, demands, penalties, liabilities, settlements, damages, costs, or expenses (including, without limitation, attorneys' and consultant fees, court costs, and litigation expenses) of whatever kind or nature, known or unknown, contingent or otherwise, arising out of or in any way related to:

- aa. The presence, disposal, release, or threatened release of any such Hazardous Material which is on, from, or affects soil, water, vegetation, buildings, personal property, persons, animals, or otherwise;
- bb. Any personal injury (including wrongful death) or property damage (real or personal) arising out of or related to such Hazardous Material;
- cc. Any lawsuit brought or threatened, settlement reached, or government order relating to such Hazardous Material; or
- dd. Any violation of any laws applicable thereto. The provisions of this Section shall be in addition to any other obligations and liabilities Licensee may have to Licensor at law or equity and shall survive the transactions contemplated herein and shall survive the termination of this License.

Provided Licensee is not in violation of any federal, state or local laws, rules, ordinances or orders existing at the signing hereof or at some future date pertaining to vehicular discharge, leak, release or emission of any antifreeze, oil, petroleum products and their byproducts from Licensee's vehicles or those of its employees, contractors, visitors and invitees affecting the Premises and Lands and provided any such discharge, release or emission is in the typically small amounts associated with parking lot and driveway usage, Licensee shall not be considered to be in violation of this Section. Any larger discharge, leak, release or emission of antifreeze, oil, petroleum products and their byproducts resulting in pooling or runoff of the products must be quickly and thoroughly cleaned up by Licensee and properly disposed of off Licensor's lands or Licensee will be considered in violation of this Section.

Licensee shall not be considered in violation of this Section due to the presence of fuel in the fuel tanks of its vehicles or the vehicles of its employees, agents, contractors and invitees.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to preclude Licensee from using Hazardous Materials in the routine maintenance of the Lands or Premises without the prior consent of Licensor so long as such materials are readily available to the general public or are applied by a contractor licensed for such application and are used in compliance with federal, state or local laws and regulations for its intended purpose and is applied in the manner and quantities recommended by the product manufacturer and the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.

- 24. <u>Job Inspector Notification:</u> Licensee agrees to contact Rollie Simatic 414-944-5955 or such other person or phone number as Licensor may from time to time designate, within the specified time limits to inform him about the following occurrences:
 - At least seven (7) days prior to the commencement of the project herein permitted.

- b) Within seven (7) calendar days after the termination of the License herein permitted with a plan for restoration.
- c) Within seven (7) calendar days after the restoration has been completed.
- d) Within seven (7) calendar days after a lapse of six (6) months since Licensee accepted this License if the project herein permitted has not been undertaken by such date; within seven (7) calendar days after each six (6) month interval thereafter until the project herein permitted is undertaken.

It is not Licensor's intent to serve as or in lieu of a building inspector, but to serve and protect Licensor's interest in the Lands and Premises and other improvements and its communication, electrical, gas and other facilities. In the event Licensor's inspector(s) reasonably determines that communication, electric, gas or other facilities of Licensor are in danger of being damaged or certain construction activity poses a threat to human life, Licensee hereby agrees that Licensor's inspector(s) is empowered to immediately shut down and stop all threatening activity and the work shall not restart until Licensor's inspector is satisfied that the dangerous situation has been resolved to his or her satisfaction. The cost of Licensor's reasonable supervision shall be itemized and billed separately to Licensee and Licensee agrees to promptly reimburse Licensor for its reasonable cost.

- 25. <u>Indemnification/Insurance</u>: Licensee hereby agrees to indemnify, save and hold harmless Licensor, its affiliated corporations and their respective directors, officers and employees against any and all loss, cost, liability, damage and expense, including attorney's fees incurred by Licensor on account of any injury to or death of any person or persons whomsoever or on account of damage to property sustained by any person or persons whomsoever caused by, connected with or arising directly or indirectly, wholly or in part, from any use, permitted or not, or operation of the Lands and Premises resulting in any manner from the privileges herein given and whether authorized for such use or not, or the failure of Licensee to observe the covenants of this License; excepting, however, any claims or actions arising out of the sole negligence or willful acts of Licensor. Licensee agrees to deliver to the Licensor a certificate to the effect that it has in full force and effect a comprehensive general liability insurance policy, which may be supplemented by an umbrella policy, issued by a reputable insurance company and Bodily Injury Liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 each person, \$2,000,000 each accident, and Property Damage Liability coverage in the amount of \$250,000 each accident, and further providing that Licensor will receive at least ten (10) days notice in writing of any cancellation thereof and naming Licensor as an additional insured. Licensee agrees to continue such insurance in force during the entire term of this License, and shall furnish like certificates for any renewal thereof.
- 26. Safety and Protection: The Licensee hereby agrees, at its sole cost and expense, to erect and maintain any barricades, guard rails, fencing, and/or safety devices for protection as they relate to the protection of the Licensor's and ATC's electric facilities, gas facilities and related construction and operational procedures. The Licensee agrees to maintain the same in good condition, repair and appearance at all times. Licensee will submit to Licensor any and all plans and specifications for the installation of barricades, guard rails, fencing and/or safety devices or protection which may be installed on the Lands and Premises and such installations shall not be made without the consent and prior written approval of Licensor. No fencing, barricades or other improvements shall be installed or erected for any purpose which will obstruct, interfere with or impede the free access of Licensor or ATC to the Lands, Premises or facilities.
- 27. <u>Galvanic/Stray Current/Grounding:</u> Licensee agrees to release Licensor from any responsibility for damage or personal injury resulting from electromagnetic fields electrolysis due to local galvanic or stray current conditions on or along said Lands. Further, Licensee agrees to assume all costs for electrolysis protection. All improvements, including bridges, shall be grounded unless otherwise approved in writing by Licensor.

- 28. Removal of Improvements: Licensee hereby agrees, upon the expiration or early termination of this License by forfeiture, lapse of time or otherwise, if so requested in writing by Licensor, to remove promptly, at its sole cost and expense, all or part of its improvements including Trail surfaces and drainage structures from the Lands or Premises. In the event Licensee cannot or is unable or unwilling to remove said improvements and related facilities as directed by Licensor, Licensee hereby authorizes Licensor to do so, and Licensee hereby agrees to reimburse Licensor for any and all expenses incurred in connection therewith, including restoration as hereinafter required, upon presentation of a bill therefor, and Licensee hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless Licensor from all liability of any kind whatsoever that Licensor may have incurred by such removal.
- 29. <u>Restoration</u>: Licensee agrees to restore or cause to restore the Lands and Premises of Licensor to the condition existing prior to any disturbance to such Lands and Premises. Licensee further agrees that upon the earlier termination or expiration of this License by either Party, the Lands, including the Premises shall be restored to the condition existing prior to any disturbance or improvement from the aforementioned use of Lands and Premises. Included, but not limited to, in such restoration, after construction and subsequent to termination of this License, shall be the spreading of topsoil and sowing perennial type grass seed on any disturbed areas, replacement of crushed stone and/or paved surfacing, replanting of shrubs and other ground cover and repair of fences and gates or other damages incurred due to or arising out of the permission herein given.
- 30. <u>Snow Plowing:</u> Licensee shall be permitted to plow, but not pile, the snow on the Premises in the event it desires to do so.
- 31. Taxes: During the License Term, Licensee shall be responsible for all taxes on the Licensed Space, such taxes being defined as any and all federal, state and local governmental, quasi-governmental or public authority taxes, assessments and charges of any kind or nature, whether general, special, ordinary or extraordinary (but not including income or franchise taxes or any other taxes imposed upon or measured by Licensor's income or profits, except as provided below), or payments to governmental authorities in lieu thereof, whether or not in contemplation of the parties to this License, which Licensor shall pay or become obligated to pay because of or in connection with the ownership, renting, or operation of the Licensed Space (including but not limited to charges for the installation, maintenance, repair and replacement of sewer/water, curb, gutter and roadway) and of the personal property, fixtures, machinery, equipment, systems and apparatus located thereon or used in connection therewith. Taxes shall include, without limitation, all real and personal property taxes (attributable to the year in which paid), sales taxes, assessments (special or otherwise), fire inspections, transit taxes and ad valorem taxes but shall not include penalties or late fees thereon unless the penalty and/or late fees are directly attributable to Licensee. Taxes shall also include all fees, costs and expenses (including, legal fees and court costs) paid by Licensor in connection with protesting or contesting or seeking a refund or reduction of and/or negotiating with public authorities with respect to any of the aforesaid taxes, regardless of whether Licensor is ultimately successful. If at any time during the term hereof, a tax or excise on rents or other tax however described, other than an income tax, is levied or assessed by the United States or the State of Wisconsin, or any political subdivision thereof, on account of the rents hereunder or the interest of Licensor under this License, such tax shall constitute and be included in taxes. Any taxes paid by Licensor hereunder shall be reimbursable to Licensor by Licensee as Additional Rent
- 32. <u>Breach of License</u>: In the event Licensee shall breach or violate any of the terms, conditions or provisions of this License, or if any governmental agency having jurisdiction shall serve any demand, order or notice, including violations relating to zoning or municipal ordinances, upon Licensor or Licensee, the Licensee shall, at its sole cost and expense, correct said breach or violation and comply with said demand, order or notice within 30 days of its receipt of such written notice or as stated within said demand, order or notice. In the further event that Licensee does not correct said breach or violation or comply with said demand, order or notice within the required time period, it shall be lawful for Licensor, without liability to Licensee, without notice or demand, to declare said License terminated and to re-enter the Premises either with or without process of law and to expel,

remove and put out Licensee or any person or persons occupying the Premises, using such force as may be necessary so to do and to repossess and enjoy the Lands and Premises again as before this grant of License without prejudice to any remedies which might otherwise be used for the preceding breach of covenants; Licensee hereby expressly waiving all right to any notice or demand under any statute relating to forcible entry and detainer. The decision of Licensor shall be final and binding upon Licensee concerning any breach or default in the covenants and agreements contained in this License. Licensee shall be liable to Licensor for any and all costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees owing to or arising out of any action taken pursuant to this provision in which Licensor prevails.

33. <u>Licensor Right to Enter:</u> The Licensor reserves unto itself and ATC and for their employees, agents and contractors the right, at any time, to enter upon the Lands and Premises by any means necessary i) for performing studies, gathering of air, water, soil and other material samples, ii) for inspection of the Premises in order verify Licensee's compliance with the Lease terms, iii) for access to Licensor's Lands including the Premises, iv) to inspect, patrol, construct, install, operate, maintain, replace and repair electric lines, gas lines, communication equipment and related and unrelated facilities and equipment, both overhead and underground, upon, over, across, in and beneath the Premises and the Lands without liability to Licensee, the same as though this License had not been entered into. Licensor or ATC through Licensor may, without liability to Licensee, require Licensee to immediately vacate all or part of the Premises upon notice to do so in the event Licensor deems it necessary to make emergency repairs to its facilities. In the event it becomes necessary for Licensor or ATC to install or erect additional electric lines, natural gas lines, communication lines and/or related facilities at some future date, Licensee hereby agrees to vacate as much of the Premises as Licensor and/or ATC deems necessary and for such periods of times as may be necessary to install, modify, reconstruct or erect such facilities upon receipt of notice from Licensor to do so. Licensor and/or ATC shall perform and complete all work under this Section as quickly as is reasonable possible to minimize the inconvenience to Licensee.

Licensee further agrees that it shall immediately vacate the Premises and close down the Trail upon notification by Licensor that weather conditions exist or may develop which could cause dangerous conditions such as icing on trees and wires.

- 34. Paramount Rights: The rights of the Licensor and ATC to utilize the Lands and Premises in their utility business will at all times be and remain paramount to the rights herein granted to Licensee and nothing stated herein is to be construed as restricting Licensor from granting rights to other Parties or persons in, upon or under the Lands and/or Premises for but not limited to driveways, streets, sidewalks, sewers, water pipes and mains, drainage tiles and pipes, gas mains and pipelines, communication circuits and other allied uses. It is understood and agreed that this License is subject to all existing easements, grants and licenses.
- 35. <u>Fees and Charges:</u> As a condition of the agreement, Licensee shall not charge at any time fee for the use of the Trail except that Licensee may be permitted to charge a fee for group activities or special events upon written consent of Licensor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 36. <u>Alcoholic Beverages Prohibited:</u> Licensee covenants and agrees that alcoholic liquors or beverages are not permitted on the Lands and Premises.
- 37. <u>Police Protection:</u> Licensee shall be permitted to provide or arrange for the provision of all law enforcement and shall be permitted to reasonably require such law enforcement personnel to patrol the Premises as it deems reasonable under this License.
- 38. <u>Notices:</u> All notices to Licensor shall be sent by a reputable overnight delivery service, registered or certified mail, addressed to Wisconsin Electric Power Company, Property Management, Room P129, 231 West Michigan Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53201, or at such other address or place as Licensor may from time to time

designate in writing. Personal delivery with a signature acknowledgement of receipt by Licensor is always an acceptable means of delivery.

All notices to Licensee shall be sent by a reputable overnight delivery service, registered or certified mail addressed to________or at such other place as Licensee may from time to time designate in writing. Personal delivery with a signature acknowledgement of receipt by Licensee is always an acceptable means of delivery.

- 39. Background Information/Rationale:

The state legislature passed a new law in 2017 that made fundamental changes to how municipalities in Wisconsin review and act on conditional use applications. In response, the Village adopted Ordinance 967 in 2019.

Beyond that, staff believes there are other provisions in the zoning code that should be addressed now (in the next several months) instead of waiting to address them with the zoning code rewrite project which will be completed in that last quarter of 2021. Under the new law, approval of a conditional use application is essentially assured as long as the petitioner shows they will comply with the municipality's conditions and requirements. Staff has identified at least 25 conditional land uses that could potentially pose an unacceptable risk to the Village and ultimately to property owners in the area around a proposed conditional use. In addition, staff determined that many of these land uses have few if any conditions/requirements.

If so requested, Civi Tek will undertake a review of the Village's zoning code and develop a set of recommended revisions to address these and other issues. This work will be done as part of the existing contract. The \$2,100 proposed will be simply deducted from the previously

approved amount for the contract.

The homeowner said the outside hose bib froze and broke and ran for some time before being found. The employee did not observe the leak. We were called after billing was done and he complained about the sewer bill and told us what had happened. We have not given credits in the past unless we observed the leak to know it did not go down the sewer. The employee did do a thorough check of all the homes plumbing and could not find any signs of any internal leaks or repairs made. The employee even checked the internal parts of the toilet for signs of a past high water mark and none were found. The employee is strongly convinced that the water all leaked outside and did not go down the sewer. Based on strong observations I would recommend allowing the credit.

Key Issues for Consideration:

Fiscal Impact (If any):

Normal usage was 2,000 gallons and this resident used 45,000 gallons in this billing period. Sewer is billed based on water consumption.

This water did not drain into the sewer system, it drained outside, so there was no treatment or cost to the village for sewer. 43,000 gallons @5.93/1,000 gals is a \$254.99 credit for sewer.

I am writing this letter to appeal my utility bill in the amount of \$589.28 for 1311 Riverton Dr,, Mukwonago. The account number is 4781.

First off, I realize how insignificant this issue is with the coronavirus pandemic going on, and we hope everyone stays well.

I have lived in Mukwonago for about 30 years, and this is the only time I have had an issue. The problem occurred this winter when my rear hose bibb was accidentally turned on. I really do not know how this happened, whether I did not turn the water completely off inside or if the water was accidentally turned on outside. Either way, the hose was attached but there was a leak at the connection of the hose to the hose bibb. This leak continued for a considerable length of time without me noticing it, resulting in a very large water usage. This occurred as a complete accident. I would like to point out that more than half of my Utility Bill is for the Sewer charge. The extra water dripping from the hose connection fell to grade and never utilized the sewer system. The sewer was never "stressed" for this additional amount of water. Also, I typically use a relatively small amount of water due to the fact that I am the only person in the household. I believe I am charged a certain "minimum" amount that results in me paying a premium for the water I actually use. I am not sure this is true, but that is what I am lead to believe.

This Certification relates to the Amendment to the Agreement for the Development of Improvements between the Village of Mukwonago and Box Self Storage, LLC.

AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF IMPROVEMENTS FOR BOX SELF STORAGE, LLC

This Amendment to Agreement for the Development of Improvements for Box Self Storage, LLC (hereinafter "Amendment") is made and entered into between THE BOX SELF STORAGE, LLC (hereinafter referred to as the "Developer") and the VILLAGE OF MUKWONAGO (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality"); and

WHEREAS, the Municipality and Developer entered into a Development Improvement Agreement dated January 24, 2019 for the development of the property known as Certified Survey Map No. 11850 (a copy of CSM 11850 is attached as Exhibit A). That document was recorded with the Waukesha County Register of Deeds on October 22, 2019 as Document No. 4430351 (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Developer was responsible for making road improvements, as well as related appurtenances, such as curbing, in accordance with the terms of that Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the roadway and improvements, including the related appurtenances such as the curb work, was to have been completed prior to the issuance of any Occupancy Permits for the structures that were anticipated as part of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has advised that it will not be able to complete the final lift of asphalt or the replacement of a 100' section of curb that was not approved as part of the inspection of said work.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Municipality consenting to the occupancy for the first three structures constructed on the premises in accordance with the Agreement, which structures are identified on the attached Exhibit B, the Developer agrees to the following:

- 1. Developer acknowledges that there is a 100' section of curb which did not pass inspection and said curbing needs to be removed and replaced. (See Exhibit D attached.) The Developer agrees to perform this work by not later than May 15, 2020 and therefore, the reference on the Construction Schedule to the Agreement (see attached Exhibit C) to the curb installation being completed by May 6, 2019 to May 10, 2019 is hereby revised accordingly. However, the Developer acknowledges that surety for the completion of this work shall remain in full force and effect. In the event the work is not completed by May 15, 2020, the Municipality shall have the right to draw upon the surety and complete the work itself.
- 2. Developer further acknowledges that the Municipality will be withholding Occupancy Permits for anything beyond the buildings as identified in the attached Exhibit B, until all work is satisfactorily completed and approved by the Village.
- 3. As a partial condition for the Village consenting to the occupancy, the Developer further agrees that it will install the binder course of asphalt in conditions satisfactory to the Village, and subject to the Village specifications, on the access road for the development. The Occupancy Permit will not be issued for Buildings 1-3 in Exhibit B until this condition is satisfactorily met. This provision shall be considered as being in addition to the conditions already present in the original Development Agreement. The Occupancy Permit shall not be granted until all conditions of the issuance of that Permit in the original Development Agreement and this Amendment are satisfied, together with all related provisions of the Mukwonago Village Code.

- 4. Nothing within this Amendment will modify the obligation of the Developer to install the final lift of asphalt on the publicly dedicated streets before May 31, 2021, as provided in the Article I, Subparagraph 3, c, of the Agreement.
- 5. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement are hereby ratified and affirmed, and all requirements of that Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Discussion and possible action on a request from Bielinski Development, Inc., to amend the Meadowland Townhomes Developers Agreement to extend the time frame to install infrastructure to December 1, 2022, and direct staff to amend agreement accordingly.

Background Information/Rationale:

Bielinski Development, Inc., has requested the Village to consider extending the timeframe regarding the installation of public water and sanitary sewer service to service their proposed townhome development. The previously approved development of Meadowland Townhomes are proposed to be six (6) duplexes (12 total units) in a townhome architectural style to be located on the Northwest corner of County Highway NN (West Veterans Parkway) and County Highway EE.

The developer has communicated Village staff they intend to start construction following their existing project, Chapman Farms Phase One (Villas). As such, they are requesting the Village Board to consider an amendmen to the Developer's Agreement to have infrastructure to be dedicated to the Village and to service their property to be installed by December 1, 2022.

Key Issues for Consideration:

The Developer agreement, as recorded, states the Developer is to start construction within 12 months after the Village Engineer authorizes construction to commence. There is no timeline by which Bielinski was to commence construction, with the development approval via resolution, and the work never commenced. It is clear that the developer is offering to have everything in place by December 1, 2022 to help in clarifying this guestion.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE MEADOWLAND TOWNHOMES (APARTMENTS) DEVELOPMENT VILLAGE OF MUKWONAGO

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2019, by and between Meadowland Townhomes, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the "DEVELOPER", and the Village of Mukwonago, hereinafter referred to as the "MUNICIPALITY", a Wisconsin municipal corporation located in Waukesha and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin, for the Meadowland Townhome Development at the northwest corner of County Trunk Highway NN (a/k/a Veterans Parkway) and County Trunk Highway EE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, DEVELOPER has gained MUNICIPALITY approval to construct twelve (12) residential rental units on 2.54 acres pursuant to Resolution No. 2018-070 approved by MUNICIPALITY on November 18, 2018 (shown as EXHIBIT A), and

WHEREAS, the subject property is zoned by MUNICIPALITY as R-5 Low Density Multi-Family Residential District, and

WHEREAS, approval of said development includes installation of certain public improvements and completion of site improvements within the public right-of-way and within the subject property (shown on **EXHIBIT B**), and

WHEREAS, the DEVELOPER and MUNICIPALITY desire to memorialize their agreed upon terms of development within this AGREEMENT.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

I. DEVELOPER OBLIGATIONS

- DEVELOPER agrees to extend public sanitary sewer and water main lines (Village utilities) to
 the northern property line as shown on EXHIBIT B. If all or portion of the Village utilities lie
 within the subject property, DEVELOPER shall provide MUNICIPALITY with easements for
 the Village utilities in a form subject to approval by the MUNICIPALITY attorney. Said
 easements shall be recorded in the Office of the Waukesha County Register of Deeds in conjunction
 with the recording of this document.
- 2. **DEVELOPER** agrees to extend the multi-use trail that exists along the north side of County Trunk Highway NN east of County Trunk Highway EE across the intersection of the highways with pavement markings and along County Trunk Highway NN adjacent to the subject site as shown on **EXHIBIT B**, subject to approval of the Waukesha County Highway Department.
- 3. **DEVELOPER** agrees to construct and maintain the emergency access to County Trunk Highway NN as shown on **EXHIBIT B** and approved by **MUNICIPALITY**, subject to approval of the Waukesha County Highway Department.
- 4. **DEVELOPER** shall adhere to conditions of approval appearing within **EXHIBIT A.**

- 5. **DEVELOPER** must comply with all storm water control regulations and erosion control as established by **MUNICIPALITY**, and shall conform to the Storm Water Maintenance Agreement attached as **EXHIBIT** C.
- 6. **DEVELOPER** agrees to obtain all permits necessary to make the improvements to the Property as required by the approving agencies with jurisdiction.
- 7. Upon approval, the plans and specifications as provided for in **EXHIBIT B** approved by **MUNICIPALITY** Public Works Director, Utilities Director, and Village Engineer, the **DEVELOPER** shall promptly commence and diligently pursue and complete the installation of certain public improvements and completion of site improvements within the public right-of-way and site improvements within the subject property, and not the actual construction of the buildings on the subject property, within twelve (12) months after the written approval from Village Engineer to **DEVELOPER** with authorization to commence construction of the approved plans as noted herein. The **DEVELOPER** agrees to construct the project in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and in compliance with all other applicable rules and standards of the **MUNICIPALITY**.
- 8. Storm Water Management Structures:
 - a. The **DEVELOPER** shall install all storm water management facilities including related public and private storm sewers required by the approved storm water management plan, **MUNICIPALITY** ordinances and the plans and specifications approved by the **MUNICIPAL** Engineer. **DEVELOPER** shall furnish the **MUNICIPALITY** with reproducible approved plans of the storm water system for the Property.
 - b. The **DEVELOPER** shall be responsible for the maintenance of all required storm water facilities located inside the property prior to acceptance of the storm sewer facilities by the **MUNICIPALITY**. After such acceptance of the storm sewer facilities the **DEVELOPER** shall remain responsible for the maintenance of the storm water facilities and such responsibilities shall run with the land. Maintenance shall include the responsibility of cleaning of storm water facilities of construction debris to assure that they perform adequately.
 - c. All underground services shall be constructed according to MUNICIPAL specifications and/or as reasonably required by MUNICIPAL Department Heads and MUNICIPAL Engineers.

II. INSURANCE

1. DEVELOPER, its contractors, subcontractors, lessees, successors and/or assigns shall, during their occupancy of the Property purchase or cause to be purchased, and continuously maintain in effect, insurance against such risks, both generally and specifically, with respect to the development as are customarily insured against in developments of like size and character, including, but not limited to, casualty insurance, comprehensive general liability insurance, physical damage insurance, builders risk insurance and other forms of insurance reasonably required, in the same form as other Wisconsin municipal entities. Such insurance shall be retained in such amounts and with terms of coverage generally customary to such Property and acceptable as to limits and form by the MUNICIPALITY. Such insurance shall name the MUNICIPALITY as an additional insured as its interests may appear on a primary and non-contributory basis. Said insurance shall further provide that notice will be provided to MUNICIPALITY in the event of cancellation or material modification of the policy not less than thirty (30) days prior to said cancellation, except in the event of cancellation for nonpayment of premium in which case the notice shall not be less

than ten (10) days. Said insurance shall be documented by an endorsement in a form satisfactory to the MUNICIPALITY. In the event the Property is damaged, or partially or fully destroyed, **DEVELOPER** shall cause the insurance proceeds from such loss to be used to promptly repair and restore the Property to its original condition.

III. EVENTS OF DEFAULT

- 1. Failure by the **DEVELOPER** to cause substantial and material completion of the project to occur pursuant to the terms, conditions and limitations of this **AGREEMENT** or to fulfill any obligations, conditions, agreements or covenants under this **AGREEMENT** shall be considered an event of default.
- 2. Failure of the DEVELOPER to observe or perform any other covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed under this AGREEMENT within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of default from the MUNICIPALITY specifying such default, shall also be considered an event of default. In the event that the default is such that immediate harm to person or property may result from such default, the DEVELOPER shall be given five (5) days written notice to cure such default.
- 3. Remedies of Default. Whenever an event of default as referred occurs, the MUNICIPALIY may take any one or more of the following actions:
- a) The MUNICIPALITY may suspend its performance under this AGREEMENT until it receives assurances from the DEVELOPER, deemed adequate by the MUNICIPALITY, that the DEVELOPER will cure its default and continue its performance of this Agreement;
- b) In the case of an event of default which occurs prior to completion of the installation of certain public improvements and completion of site improvements with the public right-of-way, the MUNICIPALITY will have the right to enter the property and complete the improvements to draw upon the Letter of Credit to reimburse the MUNICIPALITY for this expense.
- c) The MUNICIPALITY may take any action, including legal or administrative action in law or equity, which may reasonably be necessary or desirable to enforce performance and the observance of the obligations set forth herein.
 - These remedies shall not be deemed to be exclusive and the MUNICIPALITY shall have the right to pursue all rights or remedies available to it under applicable Wisconsin law. No delay or omission in pursuing any rights in the event of a default shall impair such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof. Such rights may be exercised from time to time as may be deemed expedient by the Village.
- 4. Whenever an event of default occurs and the MUNICIPALITY shall employ attorneys or other professionals or incur other expenses for the collection of payments due or to become due, or for the enforcement or performance or observance of any obligations or agreements on the part the DEVELOPER herein contained. The DEVELOPER agrees it shall, on demand thereof, pay the MUNICIPALITY the reasonable fees of such attorneys, or other professionals and such other expenses as may be incurred by the MUNICIPALITY.
- 5. Indemnification. **DEVELOPER** covenants and agrees that the **MUNICIPALITY** its governing body, members, officers, agents, including independent contractors, consultants, legal counsel, servants and employees, hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Indemnified Parties" shall not be liable for and **DEVELOPER** agrees to jointly and severally indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties against any loss or damage to the Property or any injury to or death of any

person occurring at or about or resulting from any defect in the project or from any costs or claim, including actual attorney fees, which may result from the **DEVELOPER'S** default under this **AGREEMENT**, except for any willful misrepresentation or any willful wanton misconduct of the Indemnified Parties, the **DEVELOPER** agrees to protect and defend the Indemnified Parties now and forever and further agrees to hold the aforesaid Indemnified Parties harmless from any claim, demand, suite, action or other proceedings whatsoever by any person or entity whatsoever arising or purportedly arising from the actions or inactions of the **DEVELOPER** (or other persons acting on its behalf or under its direction or control) under this Agreement or the transactions contemplated hereby or the acquisition, construction, installation, ownership and operation of the project.

IV. SURETY

- DEVELOPER agrees to provide the MUNICIPALITY with estimates of the cost of the
 completion of the installation of on-site public improvements within easements granted to
 MUNICIPALITY and completion of public improvements within public right-of-ways in
 accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT. The MUNICIPALITY shall review these
 estimates and shall approve the use of these estimates for the cost to complete the public
 improvements for the surety.
- 2. The **DEVELOPER** agrees to post a surety in the form of an irrevocable standby letter of credit in a form acceptable to the **MUNICIPALITY** which secures the performance of the construction work for the public improvements as provided for hereunder in the amount consistent with the approved estimate plus 20 percent.
- 3. Said surety shall remain in full force and effect until one year following the MUNICIPALITY acceptance of the public improvements.
- 4. During the course of construction, the DEVELOPER agrees to maintain such safety measures, signage, barriers and necessary traffic control direction as to protect the public from injury or damage during the course of the construction work. Said measures shall be in accordance with applicable traffic control standards and requirements including but not limited to the manual of uniform traffic control devices.
- 5. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to reduce the Letter of Credit based upon the acceptance of completed improvements by the MUNICIPALITY. The reduction of the Letter of Credit will be in the sole discretion of the MUNICIPALITY Village Board upon recommendation of the Village Engineer.
- 6. If **DEVELOPER** does not accurately complete the required work or the completed work is substandard in accordance with the **MUNICIPALITY** development standards and other applicable Codes, or if not less than 30 days prior to the expiration of the Surety, the **DEVELOPER** has not provided evidence of the renewal of the Surety, the **MUNICIPALITY** shall be entitled to draw upon the Surety and shall use the full Surety, or portions thereof, to complete the work by **MUNICIPALITY** Staff or through a contractor. If **DEVELOPER** adequately completes the required public improvements and/or repairs to the public improvements and completion is accepted by the **MUNICIPALITY** Village Engineer after acceptance of as-built drawings, after written request by **DEVELOPER** the **MUNICIPALITY** shall reduce the Surety in an amount equal to not more than twenty (20%) percent of the completed public improvements for a period not to exceed twelve (12) months after the date of the public improvements for which the Surety was provided are substantially complete. The **MUNICIPALITY** Village Board shall approve the reduction and said approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

7. As Built Plans. **DEVELOPER** shall furnish the **MUNICIPALITY** with electronic and reproducible copies of all plans of sanitary sewer, storm water sewer and facilities and the public water supply system, including the location and elevation of laterals. Electronic copies of the plans shall be in the most current version of AutoCAD and in portable document format. The **MUNICIPAL ENGINEER** shall prepare "record drawings" of the improvements at **DEVELOPER's** expense within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt of the plans. These "record drawings are to be completed prior to the **MUNICIPALITY** acceptance of dedication.

V. MISCELLANEOUS

- This AGREEMENT shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- 2. This **AGREEMENT** may be signed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if the signatures thereto and hereto were on the same instrument.
- 3. This AGREEMENT may not be assigned without the express written permission of the MUNICIPALITY.
- 4. This AGREEMENT contains the entire AGREEMENT and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and may not be amended or modified except through an instrument executed by all parties hereto.
- 5. If any provision of the **AGREEMENT** shall be held, deemed to be or shall, in effect, be inoperative or unenforceable, the validity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in this Agreement shall not affect the remaining provisions or portions of this **AGREEMENT**.
- 6. The parties acknowledge that approval for the authority to execute this **AGREEMENT** has been obtained by the governing body of each party.
- 7. The provisions regarding indemnification and insurance shall survive the termination of this AGREEMENT.
- 8. The **DEVELOPER** and the **MUNICIPALITY** agree that there shall be no third-party beneficiaries of this Agreement.
- 9. In addition to the conditions otherwise set forth in this AGREEMENT, DEVELOPER shall pay to the MUNICIPALITY all required fees and charges, including payments or maintenance of an escrow account in favor of the MUNICIPALITY for incurred professional service charges. Said fees or the creation of an escrow account shall be made prior to the Village being required to issue any permit for the development of this Property.
- 10. **DEVELOPER** work on the Property shall start no sooner than 7:00 a.m., Monday through Saturday and work shall not extend beyond 7:00 p.m. at any time. Work on the Property shall not occur on Sundays or National Legal Holidays. For purposes of this provision, "work" shall mean the producing of any sound caused by the construction, construction equipment or construction vehicles or material deliveries. The time limitations do not restrict early arrival for staging or afterhours cleanup by construction workers. The time limitations do not apply to construction work not controlled by the **DEVELOPER**, such as private or public utilities. However, **DEVELOPER** shall make every effort to maintain compliance with these limitations.

- 11. **DEVELOPER** shall, at all times, maintain surrounding rights-of-way free from dirt, gravel and construction debris. When construction work occurs within rights-of-way, the rights-of-way shall be free from dirt, gravel and construction debris prior to the end of the construction day. **DEVELOPER**, at all times, shall maintain the property and surrounding properties free from construction debris and employee waste. If **DEVELOPER** does not comply with the requirements of this paragraph, the **MUNICIPALITY** may, after written notice to the **DEVELOPER** and upon **DEVELOPER** failure to promptly and reasonably act to cure such matters, utilize **MUNICIPALITY** employees and equipment to maintain the area and charge these expenses to the **DEVELOPER**.
- 12. The **DEVELOPER** agrees to abide by such further orders or directions as may be reasonably given by the **MUNICIPALITY**, as may be necessary to implement and carry out the terms and intent of this **AGREEMENT**. It is expressly understood and agreed that the terms of this **AGREEMENT** are covenants running with the land and binding on the **DEVELOPER**, its successors and/or assigns.
- 13. **DEVELOPER** shall be responsible for the repair to existing roadways and infrastructure for damage caused as the result of the construction activities or construction on the Property. Areas of the Project that are within the jurisdiction of other governmental agencies, such as Waukesha County, or the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources or the State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation shall be developed in accordance with the requirements of those agencies. Costs incurred by the **MUNICIPALITY** from other governmental jurisdictions related to this Project shall be reimbursed by the **DEVELOPER** within 30 days of invoicing.
- 14. All work performed under the provisions of this **AGREEMENT** shall be done in a good and workmanlike manner, and in accordance with all Codes, applicable rules and regulations, governing or affecting the Property.
- 15. This Agreement shall be recorded with the Register of Deeds.
- 16. Acceptance of Work. The MUNICIPALITY shall review the DEVELOPER Public Improvements once completed and if acceptable to the MUNICIPALITY Engineer, accept such improvements as being in compliance with the standards and specifications of the MUNICIPALITY. Such review and acceptance where appropriate will occur within 60 days of written notice by the DEVELOPER that the DEVELOPER desires to have the MUNICIPALITY inspect and accept the improvements. At the option of the MUNICIPALITY, if the ground is frozen, the time for final inspection may be extended as necessary so that final inspection may take place in spring of the following year after vegetation has become established. Before obtaining acceptance of any work or any improvements, the DEVELOPER shall present to the MUNICIPALITY valid Lien Waivers from all persons providing materials or performing work on the improvements for which approval is sought. Acceptance by the MUNICIPALITY does not constitute a waiver by the MUNICIPALITY of the right to draw funds under the Letter of Credit because of defects in, or failure of, any improvement that is detected or which occurs following such acceptance. The DEVELOPER agrees that the dedication of the improvements and the required public improvements will not be accepted by the MUNICIPALITY until they have been reviewed and inspected for approval by the MUNICIPALITY Engineer and furthermore, until all outstanding MUNICIPALITY costs, including engineering and construction review charges, have been paid in full and Affidavits and Lien Waivers received by the MUNICIPALITY indicating the contractors and suppliers have been paid in full for all work and improvements furnished under this AGREEMENT. Sanitary sewer main and water main, and their respective service laterals, shall not be accepted until a complete breakdown of all construction, engineering and administrative costs incurred by the DEVELOPER are submitted to the MUNICIPALITY Engineer and MUNICIPALITY Clerk respectively. (This is necessary to aid in determining the sewer and water

utilities value on the MUNICIPALITY Financial Statements.) In addition, the water system installation shall not be accepted until the MUNICIPALITY obtains a bacteriologically safe sample. The MUNICIPALITY shall flush the main, obtain the sample and have all tests completed as may be required by the MUNICIPALITY at DEVELOPER cost. Said lines shall be pressure tested and the sewer mains shall be televised showing that there are no leaks in the lines and no construction debris within the sewer. The acceptance of the water and sewer mains shall be further subject to the DEVELOPER providing verification that they have been constructed in accordance with the MUNICIPALITY Standards and Specifications. DEVELOPER needs to maintain and repair all required DEVELOPER Public Improvements until the MUNICIPALITY formally accepts said improvements. The DEVELOPER shall provide the MUNICIPALITY with electronic and reproducible copies of all improvement plans. Electronic copies of all improvement plans shall be in the most current version of AutoCAD. The MUNICIPALITY Engineer shall prepare record drawings of the improvements at DEVELOPER sole expense within 30 days of the binder course placement.

- 17. Warranty. **DEVELOPER** warrants and guarantees that the installation of the sanitary sewer and water mains installed on the Property for a period of one year from the date of final acceptance by the **MUNICIPALITY** of all improvements completed by the **DEVELOPER** under this **AGREEMENT** against defects, in installation or materials. If any defect shall appear during the guaranteed period, the **DEVELOPER** agrees to make the acceptable repairs of the defective work. This includes but is not limited to the storm water facilities. The guaranteed period shall continue for a period of one year after the acceptance by the **MUNICIPALITY** of the improvements. A Letter of Credit or bond shall remain in full force for the time that any portion of the improvements have yet to be completed, and a portion of the bond is deemed adequate by the **MUNICIPALITY** Engineer, but not to exceed 20% of the original Letter of Credit or bond, shall remain in force for the one-year guarantee period.
- 18. Utility Plans and Locations:
 - A. Utility Transformers, Pedestals and Boxes Location. Developer shall furnish, construct and install the electrical service facilities, including phone, cable and other communication facilities (transformers, pedestals and boxes) in accordance with the designed plans: Work Order No. 4351825, dated: 4/29/2019 and modified 7/10/19, prepared by WE Energies and approved by the Village and the engineering firm representing the village. Any modification to the approved plans must be submitted to the Municipality Zoning Administrator for review and final approval. Landscaping shall be installed on any transformers, pedestals or boxes located in the street or side yard must be completed within 6 months of the energizing of all service facilities or by, prior to the first occupancy permit obtained, whichever occurs first.
 - B. Natural Gas Facilities Location. Developer shall furnish, construct and install the natural gas service facilities in accordance with the designed plans: Work Order No. 4351828, dated: 6/11/2019, prepared by WE Energies and approved by the Village and the engineering firm representing the village. Any modification to the approved plans must be submitted to the Municipality Zoning Administrator for review and final approval.
 - C. Natural Gas Facility Relocation. Developer shall furnish, construct and install the natural gas facilities relocation in accordance with the designed plans: Work Order No. 4355239, dated: 6/11/2019, prepared by WE Energies and approved by the Village and the engineering firm representing the village. Any modification to the approved plans must be submitted to the Municipality Zoning Administrator for review and final approval.

- 19. Tracking Pad and Parking of Vehicles During Construction. On the first day of construction as approved by MUNICIPALITY engineer, DEVELOPER shall install a tracking pad onto the PROPERTY from either of the two adjacent public right-of-ways as approved by Waukesha County Highway Department, after which a gravel parking lot or lots shall be installed for the parking of construction vehicles, construction deliveries, vehicles of construction employees and other vehicles involved in the construction of all improvements, including installation of private utilities. The tracking pad shall remain in place until the gravel base of private drive to access the residential buildings on the PROPERTY is completed. DEVELOPER shall adhere to all required erosion control measures during installation and usage of the tracking pad and on-site parking. No parking of construction vehicles, construction deliveries, vehicles of construction employees and other vehicles involved in the construction of all improvements, including installation of private utilities shall occur outside the boundary of PROPERTY after the first day of construction. Should MUNICPALITY have the need to install signs to enforce these access parking restrictions on neighboring public right-of-ways, the cost of the signs and installation shall be borne by DEVELOPER. These parking restrictions include any vehicle involved with MUNICIPALITY inspection of construction. Notwithstanding the forgoing, construction vehicles used for the installation of utilities or other improvements that are installed outside of the PROPERTY may be parked outside of the PROPERTY when such off-PROPERTY work is taking place.
- 20. Building Permits. No building permits shall be issued for any of the residential buildings until the MUNICIPALITY has made all necessary approvals; utilities to serve the individual building sites are in place, inspected and accepted; a drivable year-round private drive (full asphaltic binder course pavement installed) is in place, inspected and accepted; all storm water management facilities have been completed, and all other required public improvements, except the final lift of asphalt, have been completed, inspected and approved. MUNICIPALITY shall provide written notice to DEVELOPER when all conditions within this paragraph have been satisfied to allow issuance of building permits. Notwithstanding the above, footing and foundation permits may be requested by SUBDIVIDER prior to acceptance as noted above with installation of the asphaltic binder course pavement on the private drive.
- 21. Payment of Fees. **DEVELOPER** shall be responsible for payment to **MUNICIPALITY** of all professional fees incurred during review, coordination and inspection of all activities related to **PROPERTY** development and installation of improvements. The fees may involve reimbursement of **MUNICIPALITY** staff time involving inspection of improvements and coordination with others to correct installation of improvements in accordance with **MUNICIPALITY** specifications.
- 22. Compliance With Agreement. The **DEVELOPER** shall fully comply with any and all provisions of this **AGREEMENT** and with all **MUNICIPAL** Ordinances, whether or not specifically addressed in this **AGREEMENT** including but not limited to:
 - 1. Grading, Erosion Control and Barricades:
 - a. The **DEVELOPER** shall furnish, install, and maintain during construction and until the **IMPROVEMENTS** are accepted by the **MUNICIPALITY**, all barricades and signs as required by the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) at all points where new rights-of-way extend or intersect existing streets and all street ends. Signs and barricades shall be required, furnished, and installed so as to conform to the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

- b. The **DEVELOPER** shall obtain the approval of the **MUNICIPAL** Engineer for erosion and runoff control measures as required by the **MUNICIPAL** Ordinances prior to grading, utility installation or any other land disturbance activity.
- 22. Notice. Any notice required or permitted by this **AGREEMENT** shall be deemed effective when personally delivered in writing or transmitted via email to the emails set forth below, provided that the transmitting party retains evidence of the successful facsimile transmission or three (3) days after notice is deposited with the U.S. Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified, and return receipt requested, and addressed as follows:

- 23. Recordation. The MUNICIPALITY may record a copy of this AGREEMENT or Affidavit indicating the existence of this AGREEMENT in the Register of Deeds Office. The DEVELOPER shall pay all cost of recording.
- 24. No Vested Rights Granted.
 - A. Except as provided by law, or as expressly provided in this AGREEMENT, no vested right in connection with this project shall inure to the DEVELOPER. Nor does the MUNICIPALITY warrant by this AGREEMENT that the DEVELOPER is entitled to any other approvals required.
 - B. No Further Lot Division. No lot shall be further divided or lot lines adjusted by **DEVELOPER** without **MUNICIPALITY'S** approval.

- C. No Waiver. No waiver of any provision of this AGREEMENT shall be deemed or constitute a waiver of any other provision, nor shall it be deemed or constitute a continuing waiver unless expressly provided for by a written amendment to this Agreement, nor shall this AGREEMENT be deemed a waiver of any subsequent default or defaults of the same type. THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2020, by and between Meadowland Townhomes, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the "DEVELOPER", and the Village of Mukwonago, hereinafter referred to as the "MUNICIPALITY", a Wisconsin municipal corporation located in Waukesha and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin, for the Meadowland Townhome Development at the northwest corner of County Trunk Highway NN (a/k/a Veterans Parkway) and County Trunk Highway EE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the DEVELOPER and the MUNICIPALITY entered into a Development Agreement for Development Improvements for the Meadowland Townhomes (Apartments) Development within the Village of Mukwonago, which document was executed on August 21, 2019 by the MUNICIPALITY and on September 13, 2019 by the DEVELOPER (hereinafter rereferred to as the "Developer Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, said Developer Agreement was recorded with the Waukesha County Register of Deeds on September 24, 2019 as Document No. 4423617; and

WHEREAS, the MUNICIPALITY and the DEVELOPER are desirous of amending the Developer Agreement in light of circumstances arising from the existence of the COVID-19 pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

A. Paragraph I, (7) of the Developer Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

Upon approval, the plans and specifications as provided for in EXHIBIT B approved by MUNICIPALITY by its Public Works Director, Utilities Director and Village Engineer, the DEVELOPER shall promptly commence and diligently pursue and complete the installation of certain public improvements and completion of site improvements within the public rights-of-way and site improvements within the subject property as described in the plans as set forth in EXHIBIT B, on or before December 1, 2022. DEVELOPER acknowledges that the Village Engineer has given authorization to the DEVELOPER to commence construction of the approved plans as noted herein. The DEVELOPER construct the project in accordance with the approved plans and specifications and in compliance with all other applicable rules and standards of the MUNICIPALITY.

The MUNICIPALITY and the DEVELOPER acknowledge that they are aware of the existence of the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as the fact that the Federal Government, State of Wisconsin, Waukesha County and the Village of Mukwonago have all issued Emergency Orders arising from that pandemic. They further acknowledge that the Centers for Disease Control have issued guidelines to deal with, amongst other things, the operation of government and business during the course of this pandemic. The MUNICIPALITY and the DEVELOPER further acknowledge that they are aware of the Safer at Home Order, as well

as the extensions and amendments thereto, issued by the State of Wisconsin, Department of Health Services. In deciding to execute this Amendment, the **DEVELOPER** and the **MUNICIPALITY** acknowledge that they are aware of the aforementioned circumstances and have decided to proceed with this Developers Agreement, notwithstanding these circumstances and that the COVID-19 pandemic and the existing Orders by governmental entities with jurisdiction shall not be a considered a force majeure that would preclude either party from performing the terms of the Developer Agreement, except in the event of the issuance of further Orders by governmental entities with jurisdiction specifically precluding such performance.

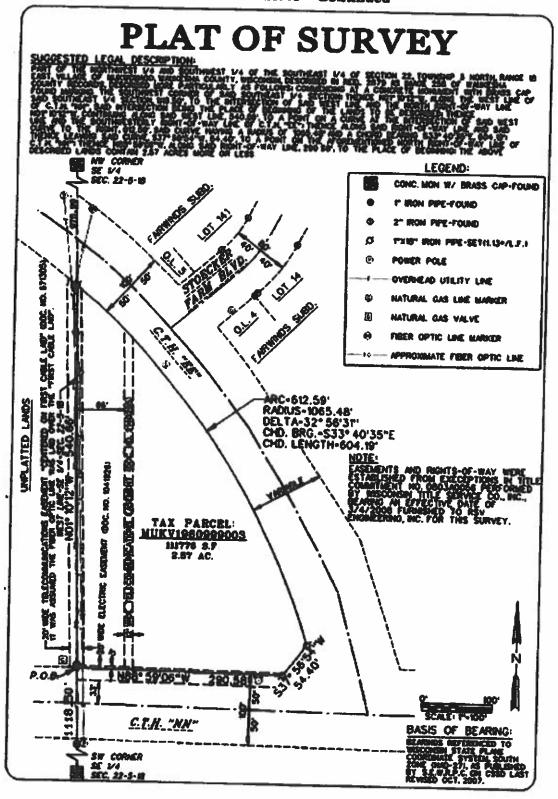

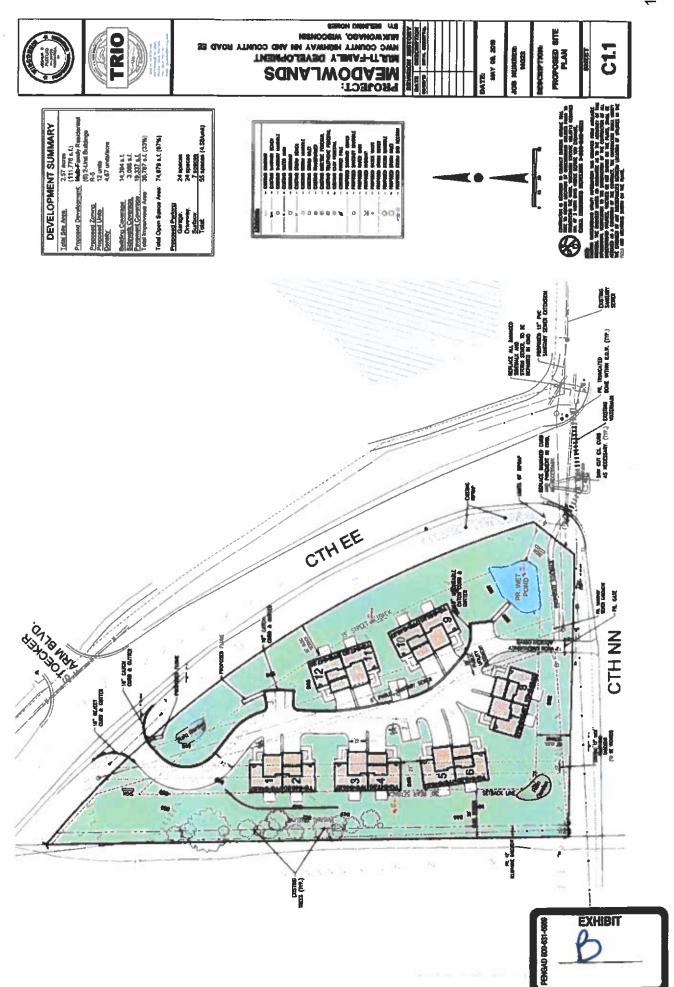

Re: Ordinance Amending Sections 45-14 and 45-16

Dear Ron:

I have been doing some thinking about the Village's public site fee and its interrelationship with the park impact fee. When you and I originally discussed this, I indicated that I felt there was a redundancy between the parkland site fee and park impact fee and therefore, we could not charge both.

I still agree there is a redundancy in this regard; however, I have some concerns about repealing the parkland site fee altogether. As you know, the way the parkland site fee is structured, the Ordinance references the dedication of public lands as part of a Plat or CSM. If there is no parkland being dedicated as part of the Plat or CSM, we establish the parkland site fee so money would be reserved towards the cost of acquisition of future parkland. I believe there will continue to be instances where the Village will want land dedicated to it. That begs the question if that does not occur, whether there should be a fee to be charged for the acquisition of future park lands.

As I believe I have also mentioned to you, there are different rules regarding the length of time we have to maintain both the public site fees, as well as the impact fees. In addition, there are restrictions on what we can use each fee for. As a consequence, my feeling is that it would be a mistake to delete the public site fee altogether. In fact, I think there would be a place for both, although I do believe there needs to be language stating the amount of the public site fee that may have already been paid should be offset against whatever impact fee might be due for park lands. I believe this would maximize the Village's options with respect to these fees, while preventing a situation where there is a double charge for the same thing.

As a result of these conclusions, I am prepared to recommend to the Board that we not appeal the public site fee; but rather, we make revisions to Chapter 45 of the Code (specifically Sections 14 and 16) to accommodate the co-existence of the public site fee with the park impact fee. Enclosed is a draft of the Ordinance I propose to be used to accomplish this.

If you still wish to go ahead with a complete repealing of the public site fee, I can certainly do that. However, that would beg the question of what we do with the land dedication portion of the Ordinance and the circumstance where a developer does not dedicate land.

ORDINANCE NO. ____

ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-14 and 45-16 OF THE VILLAGE OF MUKWONAGO MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING PARKLAND SITE FEES

WHEREAS the Village of Mukwonago, pursuant to Section 45-14 of the Village Code provides that whenever a tract of land is to be divided to create a subdivision, and includes a proposed playground, park, open space site or other public land, the proposed public lands are to be dedicated to the Village at the rate of one acre of land for every proposed fifteen dwelling units as set forth on the Plat; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance further provides for a parkland site fee; and

WHEREAS, the parkland site fee is further referenced in Section 45-16 of the Code, and provides that if the sub-divider is not required to dedicate public lands that a fee for the acquisition of public sites is to be assessed; and

WHEREAS, the Village has created a new impact fee for parklands; and

WHEREAS, it appears the parkland site fee and the park impact fee would be redundant to each other; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board wishes to clarify the circumstances under which each fee would be assessed.

The Village Board of the Village of Mukwonago do ordain as follows:

SECTION I

Section 45-14(b)(3) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

(3) In the event the subdivider is not required to dedicate lands for playgrounds, parks, open space or other public lands, a public site fee shall be levied against the subdivider at the time of application for final Plat or CSM approval at the rate, and according to the procedures, established in Section 45-16(k).

SECTION II

Section 45-16(k) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

(k) Public Site Fees. If the subdivider is not required to dedicate public lands within this proposed Plat or Certified Survey Map as provided in Sec. 45-14 of this Chapter, the fee for the acquisition of public sites to serve future inhabitants of the proposed subdivision or minor subdivision shall be paid to the Village Treasurer at the time of the first application of approval for final Plat or CSM of said CSM or subdivision. However, any parkland site fees shall be offset against the amount of the park impact fees being charged.

SECTION III

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances contravening the terms and conditions of this Ordinance are hereby to that extent repealed.

SECTION IV

The several sections of this Ordinance shall be considered severable. If any section shall be considered by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the other portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION V

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as approved by law, and the Village Clerk shall so amend the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Mukwonago, and shall indicate the date and number of this amending ordinance therein.

Dear President Winchowky:

We have reviewed Infinity Development's request, dated April 6, 2020, for a reduction in the Letter of Credit and acceptance of work for the Phantom Lakes Preserve development. Through review of punch list items and discussions with the Village Sewer and Water Utility staff, we are <u>not</u> recommending acceptance of the public utilities at this time as there are still punch list items to complete for the public sanitary sewer and water main. Additionally, the reduction amount requested by the developer did not fully align with the amount of work remaining on the site, nor the terms of the recorded Developer Agreement for the development. Through discussions with Infinity Development, we are recommending a reduction as shown in the table below:

We believe that the current letter of credit in the amount of \$410,378.40 may be reduced by \$317,997.00 down to a new letter of credit amount of \$92,381.40. The new amount accurately represents the work remaining and amount of contingency that is required to be held under Article I, Section H of the Developer Agreement, until the 1-year guarantee period has expired.

We have discussed the punch list items with the Developer, and they have indicated that they are working on completing the items. We have recommended to the Developer that they resubmit for acceptance of the public utilities once those items are completed.

Attached to this letter you will find the required lien waivers form the Developer's Contractors, as required by the Developer Agreement.

Village Community Planner & Zoning Administrator is the point of contact between the consultants and DDC.

DEVELOPER GUARANTY AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 13th day of August, 2019, by and between the Village of Mukwonago, a Wisconsin municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") and The Pointe Apartments, LLC, with his principal office and place of business located at W3468 County Road J, East Troy, Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as "Developer").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Village and Developer have entered into a Commercial Offer to Purchase dated February 26, 2019 ("Purchase Agreement"), for the Developer's purchase of land, which is known 915 Main Street, Mukwonago, Wisconsin, 53149 (the "Property"), more specifically described in the legal description attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Developer intends to develop the Property into a residential development consisting of 4 buildings containing 88 apartment units (the "Development"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute Sec. 66.1105, the Village has created a Tax Increment District (the "TID District") and approved a Project Plan for redevelopment within TID #4 known as the TID Project Plan. The boundary of the TID District is inclusive of the Property; and

WHEREAS, subject to the Village providing the financial assistance set forth herein, Developer intends to acquire the Property and construct a multi-family residential development and other improvements on the Property. The Village's approved Site Plan depicting the protected future development of the Property is attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Site Plan"). Said Site Plan, which is consistent with the current zoning of the Property is also consistent with the Village's Comprehensive Plan and the terms of the TID Project Plan; and

WHEREAS, the projected aggregate assessed value for the property when fully developed which is anticipated to be on or before January 31, 2021, is anticipated to be \$10,000,000.00 in excess of the value of the Property as of January 1, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the tax increment revenue from the TID District shall provide reimbursement to the Village for the acquisition costs of the Property, as well as the Village's debt service expense and costs related to the ownership and maintenance of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that the Developer's development of the Property is a material inducement for the conveyance of the Property to the Developer; and

WHEREAS, the construction of the Development would not occur without the financial assistance provided for hereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Village, pursuant to its action of the Village Board dated August 7, 2019, has approved the terms of this Agreement and authorized its execution by the property Village Officers on the Village's behalf; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the construction of not less than one (1) building in the Development will be completed by December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary that the Developer and the Village enter into an agreement to provide for the manner and method by which the Property will be developed, and to set forth the rights and obligations of the parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

Responsibilities of the Village:

- 1. The Village agrees to convey the Property to the Developer pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Purchase Agreement. The value of the Property deemed by the Village to be \$1,050,000.00, which represents the sales price that is being credited to Developer at closing.
- 2. The parties acknowledge that the Property has areas of high ground water and soils which will add expense to the Development beyond what the Developer would normally expect. Therefore, the parties have determined that, but for the TIF assistance in the sum of \$1,150,000.00, this Development will not proceed.
- 3. The Village agrees to pay the Developer a TIF grant in the sum of \$1,150,000.00 (the "TIF Funds") in the following fashion:
 - (a) An amount equal to one-third of the total TIF Funds (\$383,333.33) shall be disbursed to Developer within forty-five (45) days of the completion of the footings and foundations for the last structure to be constructed on the Property as part of the Development;
 - (b) An amount equal to one-third of the total TIF Funds (\$383,333.33) shall be disbursed to Developer within forty-five (45) days of the completion of the exterior shell of the final building to be constructed on the Property as part of the Development; and
 - (c) The remaining TIF Funds shall be disbursed to Developer within forty-five (45) days of the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for all buildings constructed as part of the Development.
- 4. The parties acknowledge that public road access exists to the Property and that public utilities, including sewer and water, have also been made available to the Property line at no additional cost.

Responsibilities of the Developer:

- 5. Subject to satisfaction of the conditions set forth in this Agreement, the Developer shall perform the following:
 - (a) By January 31, 2021, Developer agrees to complete construction of the Development.
 - (b) Subsequent to completion of construction of the Development, but prior to December 31, 2019, the Property shall have an assessed value of not less than Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) (the "Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value") in excess of the assessed value of the Property on January 1, 2019, which is deemed to be \$0.00. For example, if the Property is assessed for tax purposes at \$5,000,000.00 as of January 1, 2020, Developer will be deemed to have created \$5,000,000.00 of increment or fifty percent (50%) of the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value; however, no payments under this Agreement shall be due because the assessment occurred prior to completion of the Project other than the payment of property taxes that would otherwise be due and owing as a result of such assessment in the ordinary course.
 - (c) Developer further agrees that by December 31, 2020, it shall have completed construction of one of the buildings on the Property.
- 6. In the event the Developer fails to achieve the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value as of January 31, 2021 in the sum of \$10 Million and thereafter through the expiration of the TID District, the Village shall be permitted to collect the guaranteed payments as set forth below, which payments shall be deemed indebtedness of the Developer to the Village.

Security for Guaranteed Payments

- 7. To secure performance of the guaranteed payments, the Developer agrees to provide the Village with an Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). The Letter of Credit will be in a form attached hereto as Exhibit C
- 8. If any time prior to the release of the Letter of Credit, the actual assessed value of the Property as improved, pursuant to Section 5(b) above, determined to be less than the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value, the Village shall be entitled to submit an Affidavit of Default and Sight Draft in an amount which is equal to the full amount of the Letter of Credit, multiplied by a percentage calculated in the following fashion: the difference between 100% and the percentage created by the fraction, whose numerator is the actual assessed tax value and the denominator is the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value. For example: if Developer requests the Property be assessed on January 31, 2021, and the assessed value of the Property as improved is \$8,000,000.00, the difference between the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value of \$10,000,000.00 and the estimated assessed value in this example would be \$2,000,000.00, which represents 20% of the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value, in which case the Village would be permitted to draw upon the Letter of Credit in the amount equal to 20% of the Letter of Credit. The amount drawn upon

the Letter of Credit by the Village (the "LOC Proceeds") will be held by the Village and applied to the annual guaranteed payments owed by the Developer pursuant to Paragraph 11 below as those payments may become due and payable. The provisions of this Section 8 shall be subject to force majeure as defined herein. If a force majeure event occurs and such force majeure event is the primary cause of Developer failing to reach the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value in a timely fashion, Developer shall remain obligated to make all payments required hereunder; provided however, in the event of a force majeure as defined herein, Developer shall be entitled to a refund of any excess funds held by the Village immediately upon the Project being assessed at or more than the Guaranteed Assed Tax Value in accordance with this Agreement. The amount of excess funds shall be any amounts left after payment sufficient to match any taxes that would have been paid if Developer had met the Guaranteed Assessed Tax Value plus any interest charges incurred by the Village as a result of such tax payments not being made. For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "force majeure" shall include, without limitation, any fire, flood, explosion, and other acts of God, war, hostilities, rebellion, riot, strikes, lock outs, or other labor disputes, acts or threats of terrorism, governmental actions, and other events outside of Developer's reasonable control.

- 9. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the Letter of Credit shall be released in accordance with the following schedule:
 - (a) \$500,000.00 at such time as the first building is fully enclosed, with the framing inspection having been approved by the Village, and the footings and foundation approval have been issued for the remaining buildings in this Development;
 - (b) The remaining \$500,000.00 shall be released at such time as an Occupancy Permit has been issued by the Village for the first building.
- 10. Developer warrants and represents that the Property shall be owned by entities that are not exempt from real estate taxes, and that either (i) the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value shall be maintained throughout the duration of the TID District or (ii) the Property generates total property taxes in an amount equal to or greater than the amount generated as of January 31, 2021. It shall be a further condition of this Agreement that ownership or occupancy of any portion of the Property may not be transferred to an entity which is exempt from real estate taxes without the prior written consent of the Village, which consent may be conditioned upon the execution by such new owner or occupant of an agreement to make payments in lieu of taxes in an amount of the then-existing non-exempt property assessment, multiplied by the applicable tax rate for the Village of Mukwonago. This obligation shall survive and continue until the expiration of the TID District. In the event Developer receives an exemption from general real estate taxes prior to said date, and/or the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value is not reached, the Village may exercise its right under the guaranty as provided for under this Agreement.
- 11. In the event Developer fails to perform its obligations, conditions, agreements or covenants under this Agreement, such circumstance shall constitute an event of default unless the Developer makes the guaranteed payments provided for hereunder. If an event of default occurs such that the actual tax assessed value is less than the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value, then for the calendar year in which such event occurs, the Developer shall pay the Village an amount equal

to the difference between the net real estate taxes from all taxing jurisdictions that would be payable based on the Guaranteed Tax Assessed Value and the actual taxes due for such calendar year. The guaranty payment shall be due on or before June 20th of each year following the applicable calendar year of such default. In the event that Developer fails to make one or more guaranty payments as described herein, the parties acknowledge that the Village shall have the right, with twenty-one (21) days prior written notice, to impose special assessment or charges for any amount to which it is entitled by virtue of this Agreement and otherwise consistent with the special assessment statute, Wisconsin Statute Section 66.0701, et. seq. Developer's obligation to make guaranteed payments hereunder shall terminate on the earlier of (i) the date the increment created by the TID District generates real property tax revenue equal to the TIF funds paid, plus any interest charges incurred by the Village as a result of such tax payments not being made to the Developer by the Village, or (ii) the date of the expiration of the TID District. In addition, in the event that the Village makes a claim under the Letter of Credit which the Developer has agreed to provide hereunder, the payment shall be first applied to any tax deficiency as provided for hereunder.

- assessment rights may be exercised pursuant to this paragraph on the Property without notice or hearing. Developer does hereby waive hearing on such special assessment and agrees that an assessment to cover the Village's lost tax revenue is reasonable and benefits the Property. Such special assessments or charges shall be collected in the next succeeding tax roll or as other special assessments or special charges may be. This paragraph constitutes Developer's waiver of notice and its consent to the special assessment and special charges which may be required by law to the extent of an amount equal to the then-remaining balance and any shortfall on the actual tax increment due under this Agreement. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement until the Village's loan for the acquisition of the Property, as well as its grant to the Developer has been paid.
- 13. The parties acknowledge that the special assessment procedure noted herein is not the exclusive method of enforcement of the obligations of this Agreement, and that the Village shall be entitled to pursue those remedies which may be available to it according to law.
- 14. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon its execution and shall continue until the termination of the TID District. This Agreement shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- 15. The Village has entered into this Agreement with Developer on the basis of the identity of the Developer. Therefore, Developer hereby warrants and represents to the Village that prior to the completion of the Project the Developer may not transfer any rights under this Agreement other than collaterally to a lender of Developer's choice, unless approved by the Village, which permission shall not be unreasonably withheld. The Village agrees the Developer may transfer the rights of the development to a wholly owned subsidiary of the Developer or an entity in which the Developer is the primary shareholder and possesses a majority interest or day-to-day operational control. Any violation of this covenant without securing the prior written consent of the Village shall be considered an event of default and the Village shall have the right to pursue its remedies for default payment hereunder.

- 16. Subject to force majeure, failure of the Developer to observe or perform any covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed under this Agreement within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of default from the Village specifying such default shall be an event of default, provided that if such default cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, such thirty-day period shall be extended to allow for such cure provided the Developer commences the cure within such thirty-day period and diligently pursues the same. In the event that the default is such that immediate harm may result from such default, then the Developer shall be given five (5) days written notice to cure such default.
- 17. <u>Remedies of Default.</u> Whenever an event of default referred to herein occurs and is continuing, the Village may take any one or more of the following actions:
 - (a) The Village may suspend its performance under this Agreement until it receives assurances from the Developer, deemed reasonably adequate by the Village, that the Developer will cure its default and continue its performance of this Agreement;
 - (b) The Village may take any action, including legal or administrative action in law or equity, which may reasonably be necessary or desirable to enforce performance and the observance of the obligations hereunder.
 - (c) The Village may pursue the financial guarantees as provided for above.

These remedies shall not be deemed to be exclusive and the Village shall have the right to pursue all rights or remedies available to it under applicable Wisconsin law. No delay or omission in pursuing any rights in the event of a default shall impair such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof. Such rights may be exercised from time to time as may be deemed expedient by the Village.

- 18. Whenever an event of default occurs and the Village shall employ attorneys or incur other expenses for the collection of payments due or to become due, or for the successful enforcement or performance or observance of any obligations or agreements on the part of the Developer herein contained, the Developer agrees it shall, on demand thereof, pay the Village its attorney fees and such other reasonable expenses so incurred by the Village.
- 19. The Developer hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Village, its governing body, members, officers, agents, including independent contractors, consultants, legal counsel, servants and employees (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Village Indemnified Parties") as and against any and all claims, demands, actions or causes of action, including actual attorney fees, arising from the construction of the development on the Property by the Developer and the operation of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Developer shall not be required to indemnify the Village against its own breach, intentional, reckless or negligent conduct.
- 20. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

- 21. This Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if signatures thereto and hereto were on the same instrument.
- 22. This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and may not be amended or modified except through an instrument executed by all parties hereto.
- 23. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held or deemed to be inoperative or unenforceable, the validity of any one or more phrases, sentences, causes or sections contained in this Agreement shall not affect the remaining provisions or portions of this Agreement.
- 24. The parties acknowledge that approval for the authority to execute this Agreement has been obtained by the governing body or members of each party.

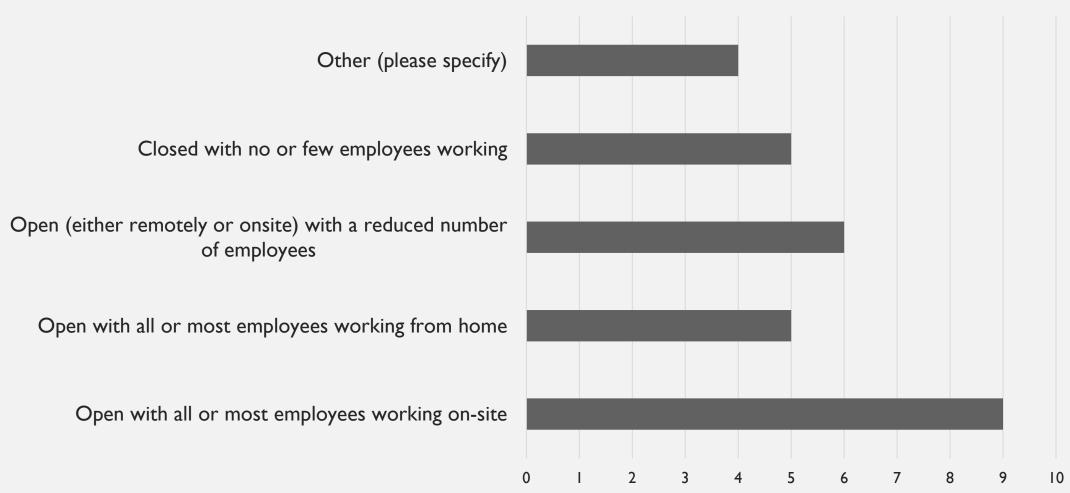

ORDINANCE NO. 980

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 44 OF THE VILLAGE OF MUKWONAGO MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO IMPACT FEES

WHEREAS, the Village of Mukwonago caused an updated public facilities needs assessment to be prepared for library, police, fire protection, water system, and sanitary sewer system facilities, entitled 'Impact Fee Study Update prepared for the Village of Mukwonago', November 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board adopted updated impact fees for library, police, fire protection, water system, and sanitary sewer system facilities on January 16, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the impact fees for library, police, fire protection, water system, and sanitary sewer system facilities were increased by the percentage increase in the 20-City Construction Cost Index published by Engineering New Record over the most recent 12-month period on January 1, 2019 and January 1, 2020 in accordance with Section 44-5.(e) of the Village of Mukwonago Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Village of Mukwonago Municipal Code section 44.5(e) the impact fees for park facilities, library, police, fire protection, water system, and sanitary sewer system facilities will be increased annually in the future by the percentage increase in the 20-City Construction Cost Index published by Engineering New Record over the most recent 12 month period; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Mukwonago caused a public facilities needs assessment to be prepared for park facilities, entitled 'Public Facilities Needs Assessment and Parks Impact Fee Study prepared for the Village of Mukwonago', November 2019; and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2020 the Village of Mukwonago held a public hearing on the proposed park impact fees and this ordinance as required by Wis. Stats. §66.0617;

NOW THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Mukwonago, Waukesha and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION I.</u> Sec. 44-1.(b) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-1. – Intent; authority.

(b) Impact fees shall be imposed for library, police protection, fire protection, park facilities, water service facilities and sewer service facilities.

<u>SECTION II.</u> Sec. 44-3.(a) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-3. – Imposition of impact fees.

- (a) Impact fees for library, police facilities, fire protection facilities and park facilities.
 - (1) Impact fees for library, police facilities, fire protection facilities and park facilities are hereby imposed upon all new residential development within the village. The expansion, remodeling, rehabilitating, or rebuilding of existing residential structures that results in the creation of additional dwelling units shall also be subject to impact fees for library, police facilities, fire protection facilities and park facilities.
 - (2) Impact fees for police facilities and fire protection facilities are hereby imposed upon all new nonresidential development within the village. The expansion, remodeling, rehabilitating, or rebuilding that results in the creation of additional square footage of usable building area shall also be subject to impact fees for police and fire protection.
 - (3) The amount of impact fees for library, police facilities, fire protection facilities and park facilities shall be as set forth in section 44-5(a) of this division.

<u>SECTION III.</u> Sec. 44-3(e) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 44-3. – Imposition of impact fees.

(e) The impact fees established under this ordinance are imposed under the authority granted in Wis. Stat. Sect 66.0617 as amended and are subject to the conditions and limitations as provided for in that statute.

<u>SECTION IV.</u> Sec. 44-5.(a) through (c) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-5. – Impact fee schedules.

- (a) Library, police facilities, fire protection facilities and park facilities.
 - (1) Residential development. The following fee schedule per residential unit shall apply:

- (b) Water facilities impact fees. A fee of \$2,484.00 per REC shall apply to all development.
- (c) Sewer facilities impact fees. A fee of \$918.00 per REC shall apply to all development.

<u>SECTION V.</u> Sec. 44-6.(c) and (d) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago are hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-6. – Payment; refunds.

- (c) Refund. Any funds not expended or encumbered by the end of the time limit for the expenditure of such funds as specified in W.S.A., § 66.0617 shall, upon application, be returned to the payer of fees for the property with respect to which the impact fees were imposed, with interest.
- (d) *Denial of refund request*. In the event a payer requests a refund and the request is denied, then the review/appeal process in section 44-9 shall control.

<u>SECTION VI.</u> Sec. 44-7.(a) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-7. – Fund established.

(a) There is hereby established a separate impact fee fund. All impact fees collected shall be deposited into a segregated interest bearing account. A separate accounting shall be maintained for impact fees for library facilities, police facilities, fire protection facilities, park facilities, water system facilities, and sewerage system facilities.

<u>SECTION VII.</u> Sec. 44-8.(c) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 44-8. – Use of funds.

(c) At least once each fiscal period, on or before September 1, of each year, the village finance director or administrator shall present to the village board an updated proposed capital improvement program for library, police, fire protection, park, water and sewerage facilities. The capital improvement program (CIP) shall be the plan for public facilities capital expenditures over a period of time. The capital improvement program shall include an assignment of funds, including any accrued interest, from the impact fee trust fund to specific capital improvement projects and related expenses.

<u>SECTION VIII.</u> All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances contravening the terms and conditions of this Ordinance are hereby to that extent repealed.

<u>SECTION IX. SEVERABILITY.</u> The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section shall be declared by decision of a Court of competent

SECTION X. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect upon publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 981

ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 6-36 OF THE VILLAGE OF MUKWONAGO MUNICIPAL CODE TO ELIMINATE THE LOCAL LICENSE QUOTA

The Village Board of the Village of Mukwonago do ordain as follows:

SECTION I

<u>Section 6-36</u> of the Municipal Code of the Village of Mukwonago is hereby repealed.

Sec. 6-36. - License quota.

- (a) Number of licenses.
 - (1) The number of persons and places granted a retail "Class B" intoxicating liquor license under this section is limited as provided in W.S.A., § 125.51(4).
 - (2) The number of persons and places granted a retail "Class A" intoxicating liquor license under this section shall be five.
 - (3) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "B" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be 13.
 - (4) The number of persons and places granted a six-month Class "B" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be two.
 - (5) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "A" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be 13.
 - (6) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "C" wine license under this section shall be one.
- (b) Exceeding quota.
 - (1) Approval by village board. Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, the village board may, by two thirds vote of all of the members of the village board, grant a new "Class A" intoxicating liquor, Class "A" fermented malt beverage, reserve "Class B" intoxicating liquor, Class "B" fermented malt beverage, six-month Class "B" fermented malt beverage or a Class "C" wine license in excess of the quota set forth in subsection (a).
 - (2) Guidelines for exceeding quota. It having been found by the village board in imposing the quotas in this section that the proliferation of taverns and liquor stores can be a detriment to the village of Mukwonago and the community by reducing property values, deteriorating the quiet enjoyment of neighborhoods and costs considerable tax dollars to police said business, it is determined that quota may be exceeded if the establishment meets the provisions set forth in this chapter and the following criteria be met:
 - a. The applicant shall submit to the village clerk's office a petition for exceeding quota. The petition shall include the requested license class, a plan of operation and the relevant experience, background and signatures of the individual, partners or directors, officers and agent of a corporation or limited liability company, as well as the signature of the owner or owners of the building or land; and
 - b. The applicant shall supply proof of ownership or lease or options to purchase or lease of land or a building that is properly zoned for the proposed venture; and

- c. The applicant shall show that the proposed establishment will have a greater economic impact upon the community than simply the addition of another tavern, liquor store, convenience store or restaurant; and
- d. The applicant shall show that the proposed establishment will benefit the community by substantially improving the tax base (i.e. the establishment will extensively rehabilitate a blighted or deteriorated building, will construct a new building on vacant land, will benefit the community by conferring some other tangible and substantial improvement for the area).
- (3) Public hearing. Prior to a vote, the village board shall hold a public hearing, pursuant to section 100-901, upon each petition.
- (4) Fee. The applicant shall pay a fee specified in the most current village board resolution to cover the costs associated with the public hearing.

SECTION II

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances contravening the terms and conditions of this Ordinance are hereby to that extent repealed.

SECTION III

The several sections of this Ordinance shall be considered severable. If any section shall be considered by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the other portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION IV

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as approved by law, and the Village Clerk shall so amend the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Mukwonago, and shall indicate the date and number of this amending ordinance therein.

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 6-1. - State statutes adopted.

The provisions of W.S.A., ch. 125, defining and regulating the sale, procurement, dispensing and transfer of beverages, exclusive of the provisions relating to the penalties to be imposed or the punishment for violation of such statutes, are adopted and made a part of this section by reference. A violation of any of such provisions shall constitute a violation of this chapter.

Sec. 6-2. - Violations by agents and employees.

A violation of this chapter by an authorized agent or employee of a licensee shall constitute a violation by the licensee.

Sec. 6-3. - Licenses, permits, authorization required.

No person, except as provided by W.S.A., § 125.06, shall, within the village, sell, manufacture, rectify, brew or engage in any other activity for which this chapter or W.S.A., ch. 125, requires a license, permit, or other authorization without holding the appropriate license, permit or other authorization as provided in this chapter or in W.S.A., § 125.04(1).

Sec. 6-4. - Employment of minors.

An underage person may possess alcohol beverages in the course of employment during his working hours if employed by any of the following:

- (1) A brewer.
- (2) A fermented malt beverages wholesaler.
- (3) A permittee other than a class B or class B permittee.
- (4) A facility for the production of alcohol fuel.

(5) A retail licensee or permittee under the conditions specified in W.S.A., §§ 125.32(2) or 125.68(2) or for delivery of unopened containers to the home or vehicle of a customer.

Sec. 6-5. - Sales by clubs.

No club shall sell intoxicating liquors or fermented malt beverages except to members and guests invited by members.

Sec. 6-6. - Closing hours.

(a) No premises for which an alcohol beverage license has been issued shall remain open and/or sell alcohol beverages during the hours listed below:

Class "A"	9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.	Not permitted

"Class A"	9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.	Not permitted

(b) Hotels and restaurants whose principal business is the furnishing of food or lodging to patrons, and bowling alleys and golf courses, may remain open for the conduct of their regular business, but no intoxicating liquors or fermented malt beverages shall be sold during prohibited hours.

ARTICLE II. - LICENSES AND FEES

DIVISION 1. - GENERALLY

Sec. 6-31. - License application.

- (a) Form. Application for a license to sell or deal in intoxicating liquor or fermented malt beverages shall be made in writing on forms prescribed by the department of revenue, or village board for operators' licenses and filed with the village clerk. The premises shall be physically described, including every room and storage space to be covered by the license and including all rooms joined by connecting entrances or not separated by a solid wall.
- (b) Application to be notarized. Applications shall be signed and sworn to by the applicant as provided by W.S.A., § 125.04(3)(e).
- (c) Investigation. At the time the application is filed, an investigation fee specified in the most current village board resolution shall be paid to the village treasurer to cover the cost of investigating the facts stated in the application. The village clerk or deputy clerk shall institute an investigation to determine if the applicant meets the qualifications as set forth in W.S.A., § 125.04 et seq.

Sec. 6-32. - License restrictions.

- (a) Statutory requirements. Licenses shall be issued only to persons eligible therefor under W.S.A., § 125.04 et seq.
- (b) Location. No class A or class B license shall be issued for premises the main entrance of which is less than 300 feet from the main entrance of any established public school, parochial school, hospital or church except that this prohibition may be waived by a majority vote of the village board. Such distance shall be measured by the shortest route along the highway from the closest point of the main entrance of such school, church or hospital to the main entrance to the premises covered by the license. This prohibition does not apply to any of the following:
 - (1) Premises covered by a license or permit on June 30, 1947.
 - (2) Premises covered by a license or permit prior to the occupation of real property within 300 feet thereof by any school, hospital or church building.
 - (3) A restaurant located within 300 feet of a church or school. This subsection applies only to restaurants in which the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than 50 percent of their gross receipts.
- (c) Separate premises for class A intoxicating liquor. No class A intoxicating liquor license may be granted for any premises where another business is conducted in connection with the premises. This restriction does not apply if intoxicating liquor is displayed and sold in a room separate from the remainder of the premises where the other business is conducted. All checkouts and purchases shall be made in the room in which the intoxicating liquor is displayed.
 - (1) Businesses that were licensed on January 1, 2006, have until January 1, 2011, to be in compliance with the restrictions and requirements of this subsection.
 - (2) The restrictions and requirements of this subsection do not apply to the display and sale of wine.
- (d) Online or telephone ordering and curbside pickup of alcohol beverages.
 - (1) No establishment shall allow online or telephone ordering of alcohol beverages and curbside delivery of such purchase without first completing the following:

- a. Designated pick-up areas.
 - If the establishment already holds a current alcohol beverage license, the
 establishment shall apply for and must obtain village board approval of a revision to
 the current license to include a designated inside or outside pick-up area in the
 description of the premises to be licensed; or
 - If the establishment is filing an application for an original or renewed alcohol beverage license, the establishment shall include a designated inside or outside pick-up area in the description of the premises to be licensed.
- b. Operation plan. Concurrent with filing an application as set forth in section (d)(1)a., the establishment shall file an operation plan that clearly details how the online or telephone ordering and curbside or instore pickup operation will function. The required operation plan shall include the licensee's protocol for assuring that underage persons and intoxicated persons do not secure or purchase alcohol via the online or telephone ordering or curbside or instore pickup program.
- c. In the event the licensee or proposed licensee fails to provide an operation plan as set forth in subsection (d)(1)b., the application shall be considered incomplete and the application shall be rejected.
- (2) No establishment holding an alcohol beverage license that designates an outside pick-up area shall allow online or telephone purchase and pick-up of alcohol beverages unless the sale is consummated on the licensed premises and satisfies each of the following:
 - a. The sale and delivery of online and telephone alcohol beverage order shall be made only by a licensed operator.
 - b. Payment for the purchase must be completed on premises and may not be completed until the purchaser is at the licensed premises and has presented valid photo identification that has been verified by a licensed operator employed by the premises.
 - c. The licensed operator must verify that the person placing the online or telephone order is the same person picking up the order.
 - d. No alcohol sales are permitted if the purchaser fails to present valid photo identification.
 - e. The online or telephone ordering system must allow the purchase of alcohol to be denied without affecting the remainder of the transaction.
 - f. The designated pick-up area as outlined in the description of premises to be licensed must be clearly identified with markings, signs, or barriers.
 - g. An establishment shall only allow customers to pick up orders under this section between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
 - h. An establishment shall not allow a customer to pick up an order made under this section until at least four hours have elapsed from the time the customer placed the order.
 - i. Any order placed after 4:00 p.m. cannot be picked up by a customer until the following day.
 - j. If the purchaser is not the driver of the vehicle into which the order is being loaded, the licensed operator must verify that the driver of the vehicle is at least 21 years of age.
 - k. The licensed operator shall report to his or her manager any purchaser who shows signs of alcohol consumption, and in conjunction with the manager, shall assess sobriety for purposes of approving or denying the sale.
- (3) No events other than the delivery of orders placed under this section shall be allowed in the outside pick-up area designated in the description of the premises to be licensed.
- (4) For each transaction under this section, the establishment must capture and retain for not less than 30 days an image of the vehicle into which the order is being loaded.

- (5) For each transaction under this section, the establishment must record and retain the following information for not less than 30 days:
 - a. The name of the purchaser.
 - b. The type of identification card presented and the number and expiration date of that identification card.
 - c. The purchaser's date of birth.
 - d. The license plate of the vehicle into which the order is being loaded.

Sec. 6-33. - Qualifications for licenses and permits.

- (a) Natural persons. Licenses and permits related to alcohol beverages, issued to natural persons under this chapter, may be issued only to persons who fulfill all of the following requirements:
 - (1) Do not have an arrest or conviction record, subject to W.S.A., §§ 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335.
 - (2) Have been residents of this state continuously for at least 90 days prior to the date of application.
 - (3) Have attained the legal drinking age.
 - (4) Have submitted proof under W.S.A., § 77.61(11).
 - (5) Have successfully completed within the two years prior to the date of application a responsible beverage server training course at any location that is offered by an authorized educational institution.
- (b) Criminal offenders. No license or permit related to alcohol beverages may, subject to W.S.A., §§ 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, be issued under this chapter to any person who has habitually been a law offender or has been convicted of a felony unless the person has been duly pardoned.
- (c) Corporations. No license or permit may be issued to any corporation or limited liability company unless that entity meets the qualifications in subsections (a)(1) and (4) and (b) of this section, unless the agent of the entity appointed under section 6-34 and the officers and directors, or members or managers of the entity meet the qualifications of subsections (a)(1) and (3) and (b) and unless the agent of the entity appointed under section 6-34 meets the qualifications under subsections (a)(2) and (a)(5) of this section. The requirement that the entity meet the qualifications in subsections (a)(1) and (b) does not apply if the entity has terminated its relationship with all of the individuals whose actions directly contributed to the conviction.
- (d) Operators' and managers' licenses. Subsection (a)(2) of this section does not apply to applicants for operators' licenses issued under W.S.A., § 125.17 or to applicants for managers' licenses issued under W.S.A., § 125.18. Managers' licenses may be issued only to applicants who are residents of this state at the time of issuance.
- (e) Applicability. Subsections (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section do not apply to any of the following:
 - (1) Applicants for operators' licenses under W.S.A., § 125.17.
 - (2) Applicants for managers' licenses under W.S.A., § 125.18.
 - (3) Applicants for temporary class B licenses under W.S.A., § 125.26(6) who are not required to hold a seller's permit under subch. III of W.S.A., ch. 77.
 - (4) Applicants for temporary class B licenses under W.S.A., § 125.51(10) who are not required to hold a seller's permit under subch. III of W.S.A., ch. 77.

Sec. 6-34. - Licenses to corporations and limited liability companies; appointment of agents.

- (a) Agent. No corporation or limited liability company organized under the laws of this state or of any other state or foreign country may be issued any alcohol beverage license or permit unless:
 - (1) The entity first appoints an agent in the manner prescribed by the authority issuing the license or permit. In addition to the qualifications under section 6-33, the agent must, with respect to character, record and reputation, be satisfactory to the issuing authority.
 - (2) The entity vests in the agent, by properly authorized and executed written delegation, full authority and control of the premises described in the license or permit of the entity, and of the conduct of all business on the premises relative to alcohol beverages, that the licensee or permittee could have and exercise if it were a natural person.
- (b) Successor agent. A corporation or limited liability company may cancel the appointment of an agent and appoint a successor agent to act in the agent's place, for the remainder of the license year or until another agent is appointed, as follows:
 - (1) The successor agent shall meet the same qualifications required of the first appointed agent.
 - (2) The entity shall immediately notify the village board, in writing, of the appointment of the successor agent and the reason for the cancellation and new appointment.
- (c) Authority of successor. A successor agent shall have all the authority, perform all the functions and be charged with all the duties of the previous agent of the corporation or limited liability company until the next regular or special meeting of the village board if a license is held. However, the license of the corporation or limited liability company shall cease to be in force if, prior to the next regular or special meeting of the village board, the clerk of the village board receives notice of disapproval of the successor agent by a peace officer of the village.

Sec. 6-35. - Separate license or permit required.

Except as provided under W.S.A., §§ 125.27(2)(a) and 125.51(5)(c)1, wholesalers, manufacturers, rectifiers, brewers and retailers shall have a separate permit or license covering each location or premises, except a licensed public warehouse, from which deliveries and sales of alcohol beverages are made or at which alcohol beverages are stored.

Sec. 6-36. - License quota.

- (a) Number of licenses.
 - (1) The number of persons and places granted a retail "Class B" intoxicating liquor license under this section is limited as provided in W.S.A., § 125.51(4).
 - (2) The number of persons and places granted a retail "Class A" intoxicating liquor license under this section shall be five.
 - (3) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "B" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be 13.

- (4) The number of persons and places granted a six-month Class "B" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be two.
- (5) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "A" fermented malt beverage license under this section shall be 13.
- (6) The number of persons and places granted a retail Class "C" wine license under this section shall be one.

(b) Exceeding quota.

- (1) Approval by village board. Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter, the village board may, by two-thirds vote of all of the members of the village board, grant a new "Class A" intoxicating liquor, Class "A" fermented malt beverage, reserve "Class B" intoxicating liquor, Class "B" fermented malt beverage, six-month Class "B" fermented malt beverage or a Class "C" wine license in excess of the quota set forth in subsection (a).
- (2) Guidelines for exceeding quota. It having been found by the village board in imposing the quotas in this section that the proliferation of taverns and liquor stores can be a detriment to the village of Mukwonago and the community by reducing property values, deteriorating the quiet enjoyment of neighborhoods and costs considerable tax dollars to police said business, it is determined that quota may be exceeded if the establishment meets the provisions set forth in this chapter and the following criteria be met:
 - a. The applicant shall submit to the village clerk's office a petition for exceeding quota. The petition shall include the requested license class, a plan of operation and the relevant experience, background and signatures of the individual, partners or directors, officers and agent of a corporation or limited liability company, as well as the signature of the owner or owners of the building or land; and
 - b. The applicant shall supply proof of ownership or lease or options to purchase or lease of land or a building that is properly zoned for the proposed venture; and
 - c. The applicant shall show that the proposed establishment will have a greater economic impact upon the community than simply the addition of another tavern, liquor store, convenience store or restaurant; and
 - d. The applicant shall show that the proposed establishment will benefit the community by substantially improving the tax base (i.e. the establishment will extensively rehabilitate a blighted or deteriorated building, will construct a new building on vacant land, will benefit the community by conferring some other tangible and substantial improvement for the area).
- (3) *Public hearing.* Prior to a vote, the village board shall hold a public hearing, pursuant to section 100-901, upon each petition.
- (4) Fee. The applicant shall pay a fee specified in the most current village board resolution to cover the costs associated with the public hearing.

Sec. 6-37. - Delinquent taxes, assessments and claims.

No license shall be granted for any premises for which taxes, assessments or other claims of the village are delinquent and unpaid, or to any person delinquent in payment of such claims to the village.

Sec. 6-38. - Issuance of license for sales in dwellings.

No license shall be issued to any person for the purpose of possessing, selling or offering for sale any alcohol beverages in any dwelling house, flat or residential apartment.

Sec. 6-39. - Compliance with chapter required; revocation of license upon failure.

Any license issued pursuant to this chapter shall be subject to such further regulations and restrictions as may be imposed by the village board by amendment to this section or by the enactment of new ordinances. If any licensee shall fail or neglect to meet the requirements imposed by such law restrictions and regulations, his license may be revoked in accordance with this section. In case of revocation of any license or any violations of any provisions of this chapter in accordance with this section or by the court or for any reasonable cause except the imposition of new restrictions, no refund shall be made of any part of the license fee. If a license issued under this chapter is not used within 120 days after its issuance or its usage is discontinued for a period of 120 days or more, such situation shall be grounds for cancellation of the license in accordance with the provisions of this section.

Sec. 6-40. - Form and expiration of licenses.

All retail licenses shall be numbered in the order in which they are issued and shall state clearly the specific premises for which granted, the date of issuance, the fee paid and the name of the licensee and, unless sooner revoked, shall expire on June 30 thereafter except as otherwise provided by law.

Sec. 6-41. - Transfer of licenses.

- (a) To person. No license shall be transferable as to licensee except as provided by W.S.A., § 125.04(12)(b).
- (b) To place. Licenses issued pursuant to this section may be transferred as provided in W.S.A., § 125.04(12)(a). Application for such transfer shall be made on blanks furnished by the state department of revenue. Proceeding for transfer shall be had in the same manner and form as the original application.

Sec. 6-42. - Posting and care of licenses.

Every license or permit required under this section shall be framed and posted and at all times displayed as provided in W.S.A., § 125.04(10). No person shall post such license or permit or allow any other person to post it upon premises other than those mentioned in the application, or knowingly deface or destroy such license.

Sec. 6-43. - Health and sanitation requirements.

No retail "class B" or class "B" license shall be issued for any premises which does not conform to the sanitary, safety and health requirements of the state department of industry, labor, and human relations pertaining to buildings and plumbing, to the rules and regulations of the state department of health and social services applicable to restaurants and to all such ordinances and regulations adopted by the village.

Sec. 6-44. - Revocation and suspension of licenses.

- (a) Procedure. Whenever the holder of any license under this section violates any portion of this section, proceedings for the revocation or suspension of such license may be instituted in the manner and under the procedure established by W.S.A., § 125.12, and the provisions therein relating to granting a new license shall likewise be applicable.
- (b) Effect of revocation. Whenever any license has been revoked, at least six months from the time of such revocation shall elapse before another license shall be granted for the same premises and 12 months shall elapse before another license shall be granted to the person whose license was revoked.

Sec. 6-45. - Nonrenewal of licenses.

Before renewal of any license issued under this section is refused, the licensee shall be given written notice of any charges or violations or the reasons proposed for nonrenewal and a copy of any proposed motion for nonrenewal and shall have an opportunity to be heard before the village board.

DIVISION 2. - CLASSES AND FEES

Sec. 6-56. - Classes of licenses and fees.

The following classes and denominations of licenses may be issued by the village clerk under the authority of the village board after payment of the fee specified in the most current village board resolution, which, when so issued, shall permit the holder to sell, deal or traffic in alcohol beverages as provided in W.S.A., §§ 125.17, 125.25, 125.26, 125.28, and 125.51. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the full license fee shall be charged for the whole or fraction of any year. A license may be issued after July 1 in any license year. The license shall expire on the following June 30. The fee for the license shall be prorated according to the number of months or fractions thereof remaining until the following June 30. Licenses valid for six months may be issued at any time. The license may not be renewed during the calendar year in which issued.

(1) Class "A" fermented malt beverage retailer's license. (See W.S.A., § 125.25(4).) For the sale of malt beverages for consumption off-premises.

- (2) Class "B" fermented malt beverage retailer's license. (See W.S.A., § 125.26(4).) For the sale of malt beverages for consumption on-premises or off-premises. Two types of such class "B" licenses are as follows:
 - a. Six-month. A license may be issued at any time for six months in any calendar year, but such license shall not be renewable during the calendar year in which issued. Licenses may be issued to nonprofit organizations that have been in existence for at least one year.
 - b. Temporary Class "B" (picnic) beer license and a temporary "Class B" (picnic) wine license. See W.S.A., §§ 125.26(6) and 125.51(10). Temporary licenses may be granted by the village clerk/treasurer to applicants for a temporary Class "B" and "Class B" license, if the applicant has applied for and appears to meet all criteria for the issuance of a temporary Class "B" and "Class B" license.
- (3) Wholesaler's fermented malt beverage license. (See W.S.A., § 125.28.)
- (4) Retail "class A" liquor license. (See W.S.A., § 125.51(2)(d).) For the sale of liquor for consumption off-premises.
- (5) Retail "class B" liquor license. Wine may be sold in the original packages or containers in any quantity to be consumed off the premises. (See W.S.A., § 125.51(3).) For the sale of liquor for consumption on-premises or off-premises. Two types of such "class B" licenses are as follows:
 - a. Regular "class B" liquor license.
 - b. Reserve "class B" liquor license. The applicant must pay the initial issuance fee at the time of application. such fee shall be specified in the most current village board resolution and shall not be less than \$10,000.00.
- (6) Retail class C liquor license. (See W.S.A., § 125.51(3)(m).)
- (7) Pharmacists.
- (8) Operators. (See W.S.A., § 125.17.) The classifications of operators' licenses are as follows:
 - a. Regular. Operators' licenses may be issued to individuals by the village clerk for the purposes of complying with W.S.A., §§ 125.32(2) and 125.68(2). Operators' licenses may be issued only upon written application on forms provided by the village clerk. Operators' licenses shall be valid for one year and shall expire on June 30 of each year.
 - b. Provisional. The village clerk may issue a provisional operator's license to applicants who are enrolled in the responsible beverage server training course and who meet other standards established in this chapter or who are waiting for approval of the application for regular operator's license. Those applicants must provide proof to the clerk's office that they enrolled in the responsible beverage server training course. The license shall be valid for a period not to exceed 60 days unless sooner revoked by the village board.
 - c. Temporary. Temporary operators' licenses may be issued to individuals by the village board for the purpose of allowing the individual to dispense and serve fermented malt beverages at a public or social gathering licensed under subsection (2)b. of this section. Such license may be issued only to operators employed by, or donating their services to, the licensed entity. No person may hold more than one license of this kind per year. The license is valid for any period from one day to 14 days, and the period for which it is valid shall be stated on the license.

The Village is aware of and has reviewed the Wisconsin Supreme Court decision which has invalidated the Secretary of the Department of Health's Safer at Home Order. The Village would further observe that there continue to be cases of COVID-19 in Waukesha County and that sustained community transmission continues to exist in this area.

As a result of these circumstances, we would ask for your patience as we evaluate our programming and the use of our public facilities. We will work toward reopening these facilities as soon as practicable consistent with prevailing best practices and in a safe and reasonable manner.

We trust that private businesses who choose to reopen will do so following the CDC and DHS guidelines, as well as industry best practices. We further recommend that everyone recognize that the COVID 19 pandemic is far from resolved and that all Village residents should follow the CDC recommendations including social distancing, personal hygiene and limits on the size of gatherings in order to protect themselves, their families and the community at large. There will be further information provided should additional Federal, State or County regulations be issued; and once the Village completes its review of its own rules, facilities and programming.

Considering that decision and in consultation with staff, the following guidelines will be used to reopen Village Hall and related facilities.

Phased Re-opening Guidelines for Village Hall

Phase 1 - Present to May 26 – Village Hall will continue to be closed to the public.

Phase 2 - May 27 - May 31 - Village Hall will be open by Appointment Only.

- Appointments will be held in the conference room. No in-person meetings will be held in staff offices. Sanitizing Standards per CDC will be followed after each meeting.
- Kiosk will be closed, chairs and reading materials will be removed from the lobby. Social distancing will be used.

Phase 3 – June 1 to June 15 – Village Hall will be open to the public from 9AM to Noon.

- Private Meetings held in conference room and will be sanitized after each use.
- Distance Markers will be placed on floor.
- One Window will be open for in-person consultation with staff.
- DPW will be sanitizing all public areas with spray each morning.
- Facemasks and gloves offered for use when distancing is not possible.
- Office Staff will be sanitizing each day mid-day: counters, elevators, door handles.
- Kiosk will be closed; however, staff can assist use and sanitize after each.

Phase 4 – June 15th Village Hall to open to public 100% regular business hours.

- Private Meetings continue to be held in Conference Room. Sanitized.
- DPW will be sanitizing with spray each morning.
- Distance Markers will be maintained through Fall Elections
- Facemasks and gloves continually offered for use when distancing is not possible.



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Office Staff will be sanitizing each day mid-day: counters, elevators, door handles

Community Room (Basement) – Will remaining closed until after August 11th Election.

Parks - Will open slowly.

Play Structures – use at your own risk. May15th – pickle ball court and ball fields will be available for use provided users follow CDC guidelines. May 27th – Baseball field preps will be available with CDC guidance for game usage.

Park Bathrooms – My 27th – Field Park and Phantom Glen Park restrooms will open with daily sanitizing and be locked at closing time.

Miniwakan Park – Will open as time permits as there are portable restrooms available.

Confirmation yet to come on the sanitizing of portable restrooms.

Indian Head Beach bathroom will be under construction this summer so it will be closed. Portable restrooms will be available onsite.

DPW -- shop will remain by appoint for visits services to emergency vehicles.

The Village will require a COVD plan of operation for all rentals and special events on Village property through the end of the year.

The Village staff will use sanitization & precautionary methods.

Staff will be provided personal protective equipment (PPE) and sanitizing tools for workstations. Disposable and reusable masks will be available as well as disposable gloves. Sanitizer and wipes are available.

Please contact me if you have any questions, concerns, or suggestions for improvement. This set of protocols may be amended from time to time to reflect changing best practices or legal requirements.
