- A. An Ordinance Amending Articles XXII and XXVI of Chapter 15 of the Northbrook Municipal Code, As Amended, Regarding Licensing Requirements and Regulations for Firearm Sales and Massage Establishments

 As reviewed at the April 9, 2024 Committee of the Whole and presented at the May 14 and May 28, 2024 Regular Meetings of the Village Board, amendments to Chapter 15 of the Municipal Code have been prepared to extend business licensing requirements to any home-based firearms dealer and to any massage establishment operated within a residential dwelling unit, but does not include massage therapists who travel to patients' own residences.
- B. An Ordinance Adopting and Authorizing Updates to the Village of Northbrook Annual Fee Ordinance
 An Ordinance to update the Village of Northbrook Annual Fee Ordinance related to business license and registration fees as posted for review as part of the May 28, 2024 Village Board meeting.

PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING JUNE 19 AS JUNETEENTH

WHEREAS, On June 19, 1865, Union Major General Gordon Granger landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the American Civil War had ended two and a half years prior with the signing of President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, and that the enslaved are now free. Texas was the last state to accept an "equality of rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired laborer."

WHEREAS, Many former slaves left the plantations of Texas to embrace freedom and seek out family in Louisiana, Arkansas, and Oklahoma. Settling into these new areas as free men and women brought on new realities and the challenges of establishing a heretofore non-existent status for black people in America. President Lincoln's successor, Andrew Johnson overturned the order that had provided 40,000 freed men with 400,000 acres of land entitled to them and provided it to the very planters that had declared war on the United States years prior. Recounting the memories of that great day in June of 1865 would serve as motivation as well as a release from the growing pressures encountered in their new territory.

WHEREAS, The celebration of June 19th was coined "Juneteenth" as a celebration for recounting the past and for some an annual pilgrimage back to Galveston for that date. Juneteenth today celebrates Black freedom and achievement as it takes on a more national, symbolic, and even global perspective. It is known that decades and centuries of systemic racism have permeated our Nation's history, and active dismantling of these systems is required. The events of 1865 in Texas are not forgotten, for all roots tie back to that fertile soil from which a national day of pride is growing.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kathryn L. Ciesla, President of the Village of Northbrook, County of Cook and State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim June 19, as

JUNETEENTH

in the Village of Northbrook.

Lazy Dog Colorado OPS, LLC d/b/a Lazy Dog – 992 Willow Road has applied for a Class A and Class B (On & Off-Premise) Liquor License and the Ordinance Amendment will increase available licenses in these classes.

Lazy Dog has remitted \$4,400 for the required application fee for both liquor licenses.

Background

Lazy Dog Colorado OPS, LLC d/b/a Lazy Dog – 992 Willow Road has applied for a Class A and Class B (On & Off-Premise) Liquor License and the Ordinance Amendment will increase available licenses in these classes.

The applicant has paid the application fee. The Police Department is completing their investigation for compliance with applicable provisions of the Municipal Code. The attached ordinance amends the Annual Fee Ordinance to increase the number of Class

"A" and Class "B" liquor licenses under Sec. 4-48. Class A allows the prime function of retail sale on the premises specified of alcoholic beverages for consumption only upon the premises where sold, which premises shall be a restaurant, or an entertainment facility with a restaurant, where the food service component of the business is operational during the hours of sale and service of alcoholic liquor and a printed menu is on display and in effect. Classes B allows the prime liquor function of retail sale of alcoholic beverages in original package form only for consumption off the premises specified. Class B licenses authorize sale of all

alcoholic beverages. The applicant is also requesting a secondary license for their Outdoor Dining. Overview

As reviewed at the April 9, 2024 Committee of the Whole and presented at the May 14 and May 28, 2024 Regular Meetings of the Village Board, amendments to Chapter 15 of the Municipal Code have been prepared to extend business licensing requirements to any home-based firearms dealer and to any massage establishment operated within a residential dwelling unit, but does not include massage therapists who travel to patients' own residences.

Background

On May 28, 2024, an Ordinance was adopted amending Chapter 15 of the Northbrook Municipal Code, as amended, regarding business licensing and registration following significant review and discussion. The amendments provided a substantive update to Chapter 15. It was noted at that meeting that, under the new Class 2 Specialized Business License category, additional code amendments would be presented related to:

- Article XXII Retail Sales of Firearms incorporating home based sales (attached for consideration)
- Article XXVI Massage Establishments incorporating home based sales (attached for consideration)
- Article XXIV Special Events (being presented at a future meeting)
- Chapter 21 Scavengers (being presented at a future meeting)

The amendments prepared by the Village Attorney and recommended by staff to Articles XXII and XXVI of Chapter 15 of the Municipal Code maintain consistency for relevant requirements

to a home based business that already exist for the same activities in a commercial setting.

It is also noted that under a separate item on this meeting agenda is an update to the Annual Fee Ordinance to streamline the fees related to business licenses established under the new code.

Following consideration of business license requirements on this agenda, staff will begin communicating the updates to the business community.

An Ordinance Amending Articles XXII and XXVI of Chapter 15 of the Northbrook Municipal Code Regarding Licensing Requirements and Regulations For Firearms Sales And Massage Establishments

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Northbrook, County of Cook and State of Illinois THAT:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLES XXII AND XXVI OF CHAPTER 15 OF THE NORTHBROOK MUNICIPAL CODE, AS AMENDED, REGARDING LICENSING REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS FOR FIREARMS SALES AND MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS

shall be, and is hereby, adopted as follows:

Section 1. BACKGROUND.

The Village of Northbrook has the authority to license and regulate commercial activity conducted within its boundaries pursuant to its home rule authority under Section 6(e) of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution and those regulatory powers granted by the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1 et seq.).

Chapter 15, entitled "Licenses, Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations," of the Northbrook Village Code, as amended ("Village Code") establishes regulations and requirements for the licensing and permitting of certain businesses and activities in the Village.

On May 28, 2024, the Village Board of Trustees adopted Ordinance No. 2024-29 which amended provisions of Chapter 15 to streamline and clarify the licensing and registration process for business activities in the Village.

The Village now seeks to update the licensing requirements and regulations specifically for (i) the sale of firearms, as set forth in Article XXII of Chapter 15, and (ii) massage establishments, as set forth in Article XXVI of Chapter 15.

The President and Board of Trustees have determined that it will serve and be in the best interest of the Village and its residents to amend the Village Code in the manner set forth herein.

Section 2. AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 15 OF THE VILLAGE CODE.

- A. Article XXII of Chapter 15 of the Village Code, entitled "Retail Sales of Firearms," shall be amended as set forth in *Exhibit A* attached to, and by this reference made a part of, this Ordinance.
- B. Article XXVI of Chapter 14 of the Village Code, entitled "Massage Establishments," shall be amended as set forth in *Exhibit B* attached to, and by this reference made a part of, this Ordinance.

Section 3: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

ARTICLE XXII. RETAIL SALES OF FIREARMS DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 15-840. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Ammunition shall have the meaning ascribed to it in section 921 of the Federal Firearms Act, 18 U.S.C. section 921, as the same may, from time to time, be amended.

Bump-fire stock means a butt stock designed to be attached to a semi-automatic firearm and designed, made, or altered, and intended to increase the rate of fire achievable with the firearm to that of a fully automatic firearm by using the energy from the recoil of the firearm to generate reciprocating action that facilitates repeated activation of the trigger.

Category I firearm means and includes:

- (1) Any firearm used exclusively for signaling or safety and required or recommended by the United States Coast Guard or the interstate commerce commission;
- (2) Any device used exclusively for the firing of stud cartridges, explosive rivets or similar industrial fastener; and
- (3) Model rockets used to propel a model vehicle in a vertical direction.

Category II firearm means and includes:

- (1) Handguns, as defined in Section 921 of the Federal Firearms Act, 18 U.S.C. Section 921, as the same may, from time to time, be amended;
- (2) (1) Any firearm that is prohibited to be sold or delivered to any person under any applicable state or federal law now or hereinafter enacted:
- (3) (2) BB guns; and
- (4) (3) Pellet guns.

Category III firearm means and includes all firearms that are not category I firearms or category II firearms.

Category III firearm sales license means a license for the sale of category III firearms and ammunition issued by the village pursuant to, and in accordance with the requirements set forth in, Division 3 of this article.

Firearm shall have the meaning ascribed to it in section 921 of the Federal Firearms Act, 18 U.S.C. section 921, as the same may, from time to time, be amended.

<u>Home-based firearms dealer means any person who buys, sells, rents, stores, handles, transfers, manufactures or otherwise deals in firearms or ammunition in exchange for compensation using a residential dwelling unit as a place of business, whether for transactions, storage, or manufacture.</u>

Retail sales establishment means a retail store whose activities consist of buying, selling, <u>renting</u>, storing, handling, <u>transferring</u>, or dealing to or with the public in one or more of a variety of goods. For purposes of clarification, but not by way of limitation, the definition of "retail sales establishment" shall include (a) all uses classified as "retail and services uses" pursuant to the Northbrook Zoning Code, as the same has been and may,

from time to time hereafter, be amended and (b) all establishments now or hereafter located within any commercial district, as defined in the Northbrook Zoning Code.

Trigger crank means any device that can be externally fitted to the trigger guard or stock of a firearm that actuates the firearm using a crank.

Secs. 15-841—15-855. Reserved.

DIVISION 2. PROHIBITION OF THE SALE OF CATEGORY II FIREARMS

Sec. 15-856. Prohibition of sale.

The sale of any category II firearm, or ammunition used exclusively therefor, by any retail sales establishment or home-based firearms dealer in the village, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited.

Secs. 15-857—15-870. Reserved.

DIVISION 3. LICENSES REQUIRED FOR THE SALE OF CATEGORY III FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

Sec. 15-871. Permitted sales transactions only with license.

The <u>purchase</u>, sale, rental, <u>storage</u>, <u>handling</u>, <u>transfer</u>, <u>manufacture</u> or other disposition of any category III firearm or ammunition by any retail sales establishment <u>or home-based firearms dealer</u> within the corporate limits of the village, without first having secured from the village a category III firearm sales license, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited. No retail sales establishment <u>or home-based firearms dealer</u> within the corporate limits of the village shall engage in the <u>purchase</u>, sale, rental, <u>storage</u>, <u>handling</u>, <u>transfer</u>, <u>manufacture</u> or other disposition of a category III firearm or ammunition without a validly issued and current category III firearm sales license.

Sec. 15-872. Maximum number of licenses.

The maximum number of category III firearm sales licenses <u>for retail sales establishments</u> shall be as established by the annual fee ordinance.

Sec. 15-873. License fee.

The fee for a category III firearm sales license shall be as established by the annual fee ordinance.

Sec. 15-874. Application requirements.

- (a) All applications for a category III firearm sales license shall be made in accordance with the requirements of this article and chapter 15 of this Code.
- (b) All applications shall be made on the forms provided by the village and shall include, at a minimum, the following information:
 - (1) The full name and address of the applicant, or, if a corporation, the name and address thereof and the names of its principal officers and their residence addresses, or, if a partnership or unincorporated

- association, the name and address thereof and the names and residence addresses of each partner or member thereof.
- (2) The location of the retail sales establishment <u>or residence of the home-based firearms dealer</u> at which the sale <u>purchase</u>, rental, <u>storage</u>, <u>handling</u>, <u>transfer</u>, <u>manufacturing</u>, or other disposition of category III firearms and/or ammunition is proposed <u>to be conducted</u>.
- (3) Evidence that the applicant has a current and valid firearms license issued by the United States Department of Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, along with the following information concerning the license:
 - a. The federal firearms license number;
 - b. The class of such license; and
 - c. The expiration date of such license.
- (4) A certification that no the applicant and each employee of the applicant actually involved in the sale or handling transaction of category III firearms and/or ammunition has been convicted of a felony (a) has been issued and maintains a valid and current firearms owners identification (FOID) by the Illinois State Police and (b) has not been convicted of a felony.
- (5) A properly executed agreement to indemnify, save and hold harmless the village from any and all loss, cost, damage, expense, liability or other claim whatsoever related to any claim filed in connection with the sale or use transaction of a category III firearm or the issuance of the category III firearm sales license by the village.
- (6) A sworn statement that the applicant will abide by and comply with the local, state and federal laws associated with the sale of firearms.

Sec. 15-875. Conditions for issuance and maintenance of license.

No category III firearm sales license shall be issued to, or maintained by, a retail sales establishment \underline{or} home-based firearms dealer that does not meet the following conditions:

- (1) Employees actually involved in the sale or handling of category III firearms must be (i) be at least 21 years of age and (ii) certified by the chief of police as being reasonably knowledgeable about the use and operation of category III firearms have been issued and maintain a valid and current firearms owners identification (FOID) by the Illinois State Police;
- (2) All category III firearms and ammunition shall be stored, maintained and displayed in locked cases at all times when customers are present, except for stock being handled for a transaction. Outside of regular business hours when customers are present all category III firearms and ammunition must stored in secure safes, vaults, or other theft-resistant and secured containment;
- (3) <u>For retail sales establishments a A separate register shall be provided and used for all transactions related to the sale or rental of category III firearms and ammunition;</u>
- (4) No property line of the lot on which the retail sales establishment is located shall be within 1,500 feet of the property line of (i) any property owned by the Northbrook Park District or (ii) any property used for a public or private elementary or secondary school;
- (5)(4) No property line of the lot which the retail sales establishment is located shall be within 1,500 feet of the property line of any other retail sales establishment or home-based firearms dealer to which a category III firearm sales license has previously been issued and is currently in effect (for purposes of this requirement, applications for renewal of a category III sales license shall be deemed to have priority over applications for an initial category III firearm sales license);

- (6)(5)The retail Each retail sales establishment or home-based firearms dealer shall require the purchaser of each category III firearm to sign a release statement certifying that the purchaser is familiar with, and reasonably knowledgeable about, the use and operation of category III firearms; and
- (7)(6)The retail Each retail sales establishment or home-based firearms dealer shall permit the village manager, or their designee, to inspect, during regular business hours, all records relating to the sale of firearms required to be maintained pursuant to the Federal Firearms Act, the Federal Gun Control Act, the State of Illinois Firearms Act, and any rules prescribed by the department of treasury, bureau of alcohol, tobacco and firearms.

(7) Safety Plan.

- A. Each applicant for a category III firearm license, whether a retail sales establishment or home-based firearms dealer, must submit a safety plan to the Village's chief of police containing all of the elements set forth in Subsection 7.B. After review of the proposed safety plan, the chief of police, in consultation with the village manager, the fire chief, and any other appropriate department, shall either approve or deny the safety plan within 30 days of its submission. During the 30-day review period, the chief of police may consult with the applicant to recommend amendments to the proposed plan. If the chief of police denies a safety plan, he shall state, in writing, the basis for such denial.
- B. Every safety plan must include a floor plan of the premises proposed to be used for the purchase, sale, rental, storage, handling, transfer, manufacture or other disposition of firearms or ammunition that address: (i) the installation and maintenance of adequate exterior lighting; (ii) the installation and maintenance of interior and exterior surveillance cameras installed at the licensed location; (iii) the installation of an alarm system; (iv) protocols for the safe display and secure storage of ammunition and firearms; (v) the employment of adequately trained personnel; (vi) procedures for inventory audits; and (vii) procedures for the detection and deterrence of straw purchasing; all in accordance with rules prescribed by the chief of police. Recordings from the surveillance cameras required by clause (ii) shall be maintained for not less than 30 days and shall be made available upon request to members of the police department.
- C. The licensee shall obtain all necessary permits, including a public way use permit if applicable; provided that notwithstanding any other provision of the code to the contrary, no fee for a public way use permit will be imposed when the permit is for any surveillance camera installed pursuant to this subsection solely because the camera or its wiring is in any portion of the public way.
- D. Any proposed change to the approved safety plan shall be submitted to the chief of police, in a form and manner prescribed by the chief of police, prior to the implementation of such change. The chief of police shall approve or deny the proposed change within 30 days.
- E. Every holder of a category III firearm sales license shall keep a copy of the approved safety plan at the licensed premises and make it available upon request for inspection by members of the department or the police department.
- F. <u>No license may be issued or renewed unless and until the chief of police approves a safety plan</u> for the premises proposed to be used for the purchase, sale, rental, storage, handling, transfer, manufacture or other disposition of firearms or ammunition.
- G. <u>Every holder of a category III firearm sales license shall comply with the safety plan for the licensed premises, as approved by the chief of police.</u>

H. The failure to adequately implement, maintain, or adhere to the provisions of the approved safety plan under this section shall be grounds for suspension or revocation of the category III firearm sales license.

Sec. 15-876. Issuance.

Upon (a) receipt of a completed application for a category III firearms sales license, with the approval of both the chief of police and the village manager endorsed thereon, and (b) payment of the applicable license fee, the village clerk shall issue the category III firearm sales license.

Sec. 15-877. License term.

The term of the category III firearm sales license shall be as established by the annual fee ordinance.

Sec. 15-878. Renewal.

A retail sales establishment licensed hereunder may apply to renew its category III firearm sales license prior to the end of the license term. The right to apply for renewal provided herein shall not be construed as a vested right to renewal.

Sec. 15-879. Transfer restrictions.

A category III firearms sales license shall be purely a personal privilege and shall expire at the end of the standard license term occurring next after issuance unless sooner revoked. It shall not constitute property, shall not be subject to attachment, garnishment or execution, and shall not be alienable or transferable, voluntarily or involuntarily, and shall be subject to being encumbered or hypothecated. For the purposes of this section, to "alienate" or "transfer" a license shall mean to give, sell or convey a license or 50 percent or more of the total number of shares of stock or securities convertible into stock of a corporation or entity that holds a license.

Sec. 15-880. Denial; revocation.

A category III sales license may be temporarily suspended, or revoked, or an application for issuance or renewal of a category III sales license mat be refused, by the village manager if they determine that:

- (1) The application for the license contains any false, fraudulent or misleading material statement; or
- (2) The license applicant has made any false, fraudulent or misleading material statement, or has been convicted of perpetrating a fraud upon any person or has committed a felony; or
- (3) The license applicant has conducted any business in an unlawful manner or in such manner as to constitute a breach of the peace or a menace to the health, safety or general welfare of the public; or
- (4) The licensee has violated any of the provisions of this chapter or of any other code, ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation of the village.

An applicant or licensee aggrieved by the action of the village manager in refusing to issue any license or in suspending or revoking any license already issued shall have the right to appeal such decision to the village board of trustees in accordance with, and as provided by, section 15-881 below.

Sec. 15-881. Administrative appeal.

If any application for a license under this section is denied, or if any license already issued shall have been suspended or revoked, the retail sales establishment shall be notified in writing of the reasons for such denial, suspension or revocation by the village manager. Within ten days thereafter, the retail sales establishment may request a hearing before the village board of trustees to appeal the denial, suspension or revocation. The retail sales establishment shall be given five days advance notice of the hearing date. At the hearing, the retail sales establishment may be present and submit evidence and witnesses to rebut the reasons cited for denial, suspension or revocation of the license.

Sec. 15-882. Sale of bump-fire stocks and trigger cranks prohibited.

The sale of a bump-fire stock, or a trigger crank by any retail sales establishment in the village, shall be prohibited. Violation of this prohibition by a retail sales establishment possessing a firearms sales license shall be grounds for the immediate suspension and revocation of the license in accordance with the procedures set forth in sections 15-880 and 15-881 in addition to the penalties set forth in section 15-897.

Secs. 15-883—15-895. Reserved.

DIVISION 4. EXEMPTION OF CATEGORY I FIREARMS

Sec. 15-896. Category I firearms.

The restrictions and regulations of this article shall not apply to the sale of category I firearms or ammunition used exclusively therefor.

DIVISION 5. PENALTIES AND SEVERABILITY

Sec. 15-897. Fine upon conviction.

Any person who violates any of the sections of this article XXII shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine in an amount not less than the amount stated in the annual fee ordinance.

Sec. 15-898. Severability.

If any provisions of this article XXII or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this article and the applicability of such provisions to other persons not similarly situated or to other circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Secs. 15-899—15-919. Reserved.

EXHIBIT B

ARTICLE XXVI. MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS

Sec. 15-961. Definitions.

For the purposes of this article, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

Act means the Illinois Massage Licensing Act 225 ILCS 57/1 et seq.

Employee means any person other than a massage therapist who renders any service for the licensee and who receives compensation directly from the licensee but has no physical contact with customers or clients.

<u>Home-based massage establishment means a massage establishment operated within a residential dwelling unit, but does not include massage therapists who travel to patients' own residences.</u>

Licensee means any owner or operator of a massage establishment that has obtained a license from the village pursuant to, and in accordance with, this article.

Massage means "massage" or "massage therapy," as those terms are defined in Section 10 of the Act, 225 ILCS 57/10.

Massage establishment means any establishment having its place of business where any person, firm, association or corporation engages in, carries on, or permits to be engaged or carried on any of the activities referenced in the definition of "massage" in this article. <u>Massage establishment includes home-based massage establishments</u>.

Massage services means the performance of a massage.

Massage therapist means a person who administers massage for compensation and who is licensed by the State of Illinois pursuant to, and in accordance with, the Act.

Person means any individual, copartnership, firm, association, joint stock company, corporation, or any combination of individuals of whatever form or character.

Sexual or genital area means the genitals, pubic area, anus, or perineum of any person, including the vulva or breasts of a female.

Therapeutic treatment means the clinical massage therapy treatments for post-mastectomy scar tissue, including myofascial release therapy, or of other therapeutic treatment of breast tissue and muscles for pre- and post-surgical mastectomy, lumpectomy, or breast reconstruction; clinical perineal massage therapy for pregnant women to ease the pain of childbirth; and clinical lower abdominal massage therapy to relieve menstruation-related pain.

Sec. 15-962. Massage establishment license required.

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to operate a massage establishment within the village without first obtaining a massage establishment license pursuant to, and in accordance with, the provisions of this article.
- (b) A separate massage establishment license must be obtained for each massage establishment location operated within the village regardless of common ownership or operation.
- (c) Massage establishment licenses are not transferable. In the event of a change of ownership or control of a licensed massage establishment, or a change in location of a licensed massage establishment, the existing massage establishment license will automatically become null, void, and of no further force and effect.

(d) A massage establishment license is valid for a term commencing on the date the license is issued by the village and ending on the last day of December of the year in which it is issued. Massage establishment licenses do not renew automatically and must be renewed annually.

Sec. 15-963. Fees.

- (a) The annual license fee for each massage establishment shall be as established in the annual fee ordinance and shall be paid as required in section 15-26 15-7.
- (b) Applicants shall pay a fee for fingerprinting required for background checks under section 15-965, in the amount established in the annual fee ordinance as well as any additional fee charged by the Illinois State Police. These fees will be payable prior to the taking of fingerprints.

Sec. 15-964. Application requirements.

Any person desiring to operate a massage establishment shall submit a license application to the village manager, on a form supplied by the village manager. The application shall comply with the requirements of section 15-23 15-6 of this Code and shall include the following additional items:

- (a) The name of the person(s) who will serve as the licensee under whose management or supervision the massage establishment will be operated.
- (b) The name, address, and social security number of all of the following people:
 - (1) Each person who has an ownership interest in the applicant and the proposed massage establishment.
 - (2) If the applicant is an association, partnership, corporation, or limited liability company, each member, partner, officer, and director of the applicant.
 - (3) Each person who will be responsible for operating or managing the proposed massage establishment.
 - (4) Each massage therapist who will administer massage at the proposed massage establishment.
 - (5) Each other person who will provide and perform any other type of work, labor, or services at the proposed massage establishment.

As proof of the information required above, the applicant shall include a copy of United States or State of Illinois government-issued photographic identification for each of the persons listed herein.

- (c) Copies of a valid license or licenses issued by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation pursuant to the Massage Licensing Act, 225 ILCS 57/1 et seq., for each massage therapist who will provide massage services at the massage establishment;
- (d) The fingerprints, and written authorization for the village to perform criminal background checks on each and every person that must be identified in the massage establishment license application pursuant to section 15-964(b) of this Code; provided, however, that no fingerprints or background checks will be required for any person who is a massage therapist licensed pursuant to the Act. The applicant shall be responsible for the cost of administering all background checks associated with the application.
- (e) The business, occupation, and employment history of all persons identified in section 15-964(b) of this Code, for the three years preceding the date of application.
- (f) The name, address, and telephone number of the owner of the property at which the proposed massage establishment will be located, if the owner is different than the applicant.

- (g) A written certification regarding whether any person identified in section 15-964(b) of this Code has been convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this Code or any other state or local statute, ordinance, or rule regulating or involving the operation of a massage establishment or the practice of massage.
- (h) A written certification regarding whether the applicant has ever applied for a license to operate a massage establishment in the village or in any other jurisdiction, and if any such application was denied, or if any such license was ever suspended or revoked. If any application for a massage establishment license was denied or any massage establishment license was suspended or revoked, the applicant must include a written explanation of the circumstances and final disposition of the denial, suspension, or revocation.
- (i) A full description of the massage and other services proposed to be offered and provided at the proposed massage establishment.
- (j) A description of how the operation of the proposed massage establishment will satisfy the massage establishment operating requirements set forth in section 15-969 of this Code.
- (k) Payment of the license fee, in the amount set forth in the annual fee ordinance, as well as any costs arising from the background checks required by section 15-964(d).
- (I) Such other information as the village manager may request.

Sec. 15-965. Investigation before license issuance.

- (a) In addition to the investigation pursuant to section 15-24 of this chapter, the village manager shall have the right and opportunity to request information and assistance from any appropriate federal, state, or local governmental agency as part of the authorized investigation of the applicant or any employee of a proposed massage establishment. Criminal background check forms will be completed and forwarded to the Illinois State Police who will conduct a criminal background investigation. In addition, the village manager shall review the materials required pursuant to this article. Payment of all costs associated with any investigation or criminal background check pursuant to this section shall be paid by the applicant.
- (b) Information concerning convictions or findings of guilty of a person investigated under this section, including the source of the information and any conclusions or recommendations derived from the information, shall be provided, upon request, to the applicant prior to final action by the village on the application. Such information on convictions or findings of guilty shall be provided, upon request, to the person investigated.
- (c) Any information concerning criminal convictions or findings of guilty obtained by the village shall be confidential and may not be transmitted outside the village, except as required herein or otherwise required by state law, including without limitation the Freedom of Information Act, and may not be transmitted to village employees, agents, or attorneys except as needed for the purpose of evaluating the applicant, an employee, or other person investigated pursuant to this section.
- (d) Only information and evaluation standards that bear a reasonable and rational relation to the operation of a massage establishment shall be used by the village in its evaluation of an application for a massage establishment license. Any person receiving confidential information under this section who gives or causes to be given any confidential information concerning any criminal convictions or findings of guilty of an applicant, employee, or other person investigated shall be in violation of this article unless a release of such information is authorized by this section, or by a court of competent jurisdiction, or by the person investigated.

Sec. 15-966. Denial, suspension, or revocation of license.

- (a) Grounds for denial, suspension or revocation. The village manager, or their designee, may deny an application for a new massage establishment license, deny an application for the renewal of a massage establishment license, or suspend or revoke a massage establishment license upon the occurrence of any of the following causes, as determined by the village manager, or their designee:
 - (1) The massage establishment is not permitted by, or does not comply with, any provision of the Northbrook Zoning Code.
 - (2) The applicant has failed to comply with any applicable provision of this Code, including without limitation this article, or any applicable state law or regulation.
 - (3) The applicant has failed to obtain a necessary license, permit, or approval from any governmental authority with jurisdiction over the massage establishment, including the village, from which any approval is required.
 - (4) Operation of a business without the license required pursuant to this chapter 15.
 - (5) Issuance of a false statement in connection with an application filed pursuant to this article.
 - (6) The applicant or any of the people that must be identified pursuant to section 15-964(b) of this Code has been convicted (including a sentence of supervision or conditional discharge) of a felony or of any of the following offenses:
 - a. Any sex offense, including without limitation prostitution and any sexual misconduct involving minors, as defined in the Criminal Code, 720 ILCS 5/11-1 et seq.
 - b. A felony, misdemeanor, or ordinance violation based upon conduct or involvement in a business or activity related to massage therapy within the past five years.
 - c. A felony, misdemeanor, or ordinance violation involving the use of any weapon, violence, or the use, sale, or purchase of controlled substances.
 - d. An offense in any other state, or a federal offense, the elements of which are similar and bear a substantial relationship to any offense described in this section 15-966(a)(6).
 - (7) The applicant has had any village-issued license revoked for cause.
 - (8) Any person other than a massage therapist has been found to have administered massage at the massage establishment.
 - (9) The applicant or any of the people that must be identified pursuant to section 15-964(b) of this Code has violated any provision of the Act.
- (b) Suspension and revocation procedures. No massage establishment license shall be revoked or suspended except after a public hearing or a waiver thereof provided by the licensee, held by the village manager, or their designee, in accordance with the following provisions:
 - (1) Written notice of the date, time, and place of, and the general reasons for, the hearing shall be transmitted to the licensee at the licensed premises by personal service, if possible, and/or by certified United States mail, affording the licensee an opportunity to appear and defend.
 - (2) No public hearing authorized by this section 15-966(b) may be conducted less than three days prior to receipt by the licensee of the notice required pursuant to section 15-966(b)(1). Within three days of receipt of said notice, the licensee must notify the village in writing of their intent to participate in the

- hearing. Failure to timely notify the village shall constitute a waiver of the licensee's right to a public hearing.
- (3) The hearing officer shall hold the hearing at the date, time and place set forth in the notice, and shall give the licensee an opportunity to be heard.
- (4) Within 14 days after the public hearing, the hearing officer shall issue a written order setting forth any penalties to be assessed against or imposed upon the licensee, and the reasons therefor. A copy of the written order shall be served upon the licensee by personal service or by certified United States mail.

Sec. 15-967. Compliance inspections.

Upon issuance of a massage establishment license, in addition to the inspection requirements of article II of this chapter, the licensee shall provide any representative of the village with a reasonable opportunity to inspect the premises for which the permit is requested and to interview the licensee's agents and employees for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article and other applicable ordinances and state and federal laws are being complied with. It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to allow any representative of the village access to the premises of the massage establishment or to hinder such access in any manner.

Sec. 15-968. Employment of licensed massage therapists; prohibition of employment of unlicensed massage therapists.

Only massage therapists who have maintained a current and effective license with the State of Illinois pursuant to the Act may conduct massage in a massage establishment. Each massage establishment shall maintain a current listing of all licensed massage therapists who perform massage services at the massage establishment, along with proof of their valid and current Illinois licensure and must allow inspection of such records at any reasonable time upon the request of any representative of the village.

Sec. 15-969. Operating requirements.

- (a) All licensees must maintain and update accurate records containing all of the information set forth in section 15-964 of this Code. All licensees must notify the village manager, or their designee, of any change to information contained within these records no later than ten days after the licensee first knows of the change. These records must be made available for examination upon request by village personnel during the massage establishment's hours of operation.
- (b) No massage establishment may be open to the public for business, and no massage may be administered at any massage establishment, prior to 7:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. on any day. Any persons on the premises of the massage establishment prior to 7:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. must be engaged solely in activities necessary to close or open the massage establishment to the public or to clean the massage establishment premises.
- (c) No licensee may knowingly permit any person to remain in or upon the premises of the licensed massage establishment who commits any act of public indecency or obscenity, as provided by state statute or by village ordinance.
- (d) Every massage establishment shall provide prospective customers with written notice stating the following:
 - "State law prohibits soliciting another for the purpose of a sexual act. Solicitation can be punishable as a Class A misdemeanor, subjecting an offender to fines and imprisonment, and impoundment of any vehicle used by the offender to commit the offense. We immediately report all offenders or requests to buy sexual services to law enforcement."

- (e) At all times during the massage establishment's hours of operation, at least one manager or operator identified pursuant to section 15-964(b)(2) of this Code must be on the establishment premises.
- (f) No portion of a massage establishment licensed pursuant to this article may be designed, modified, equipped, or used for residential purposes or for sleeping quarters. No person may reside, dwell, or sleep in any portion of any licensed massage establishment. This prohibition does not apply to home-based massage establishments.
- (g) All employees and massage therapists shall wear clean, nontransparent outer garments fully covering the employee's chest, thighs, and sexual and genital areas.
- (h) The sexual or genital areas of clients must be covered with nontransparent towels, cloths, or undergarments when in the presence of an employee or massage therapist, unless the client is receiving a therapeutic treatment.
- (i) It shall be unlawful for any person in the massage establishment to place their hand upon, to touch with any part of their body, or fondle in any manner, or massage a sexual or genital area of any person, provided however, that this subsection shall not apply to the administration of therapeutic treatments.
- (j) No massage therapist, employee, or licensee shall perform, offer, or agree to perform any act which shall require the touching of a client's sexual or genital area.
- (k) No client shall be permitted to operate any device capable of recording or transmitting still or moving images in any area of the massage establishment, including, without limitation, still or video cameras, video recorders, camera phones, or any similar device. This subsection should not be interpreted to prohibit a cellular telephone device from being brought into any area of the massage establishment, provided however, the device is not used for the purpose of recording or taking pictures while on the premises.
- (I) No alcoholic liquor may be sold, dispensed, provided, kept, or consumed on any premises licensed pursuant to this article.

Sec. 15-970. Building requirements.

- (a) At all times that a massage establishment is open to the public for business, all doors providing public entry to and egress from the massage establishment premises must be unlocked.
- (b) All store-front windows of the massage establishment premises must be transparent, and the interior waiting area of the massage establishment premises must be visible from the exterior of the premises without obstruction.
- (c) Rooms used for administering massage must be accessible by no more than one door, which door must remain unlocked and unobstructed at all times during which two or more persons are in the room.
- (d) Price rates for all massage services shall be prominently posted in the reception area of the massage establishment in a location available to all prospective customers.

Sec. 15-971. Cleanliness of premises.

- (a) Every massage establishment, <u>and all portions of dwelling units used for home-based massage establishments</u>, shall comply with the following minimum requirements:
 - (1) All massage tables, lavatories, and floors shall have surfaces which may be readily disinfected.
 - (2) Every portion of the massage establishment, including any and all appliances, apparatus, or other mechanical and therapeutic devices shall be kept clean and operated under sanitary conditions.

- (3) All massage establishments shall be provided with clean laundered sheets and towels in sufficient quantity which shall be laundered after each use thereof and stored in a sanitary manner. All towels and linens furnished for use of one patron shall not be furnished for use of another patron until laundered.
- (4) Closed cabinets shall be provided for use in the storage of clean linens, towels, and other materials used in administering massage services. All soiled linens, towels, and other materials shall be kept in properly covered containers or cabinets which shall be kept separate from the clean storage areas.
- (5) All walls, ceilings, floors, pools, showers, baths, and steam rooms and any other physical facilities shall be kept in good repair and maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Wet and dry heat rooms, steam or vapor cabinets, shower compartments and toilet rooms shall be thoroughly cleaned each day the massage establishment is in operation. Bathtubs and showers shall be thoroughly cleaned after each use. When carpeting is used on the floors, it shall be kept dry.
- (6) Oils, creams, lotions, and other preparations used in administering massages shall be kept in clean, closed containers or cabinets.
- (7) Each massage therapist shall wash their hands in hot running water using a proper soap or disinfectant before administering any massage to any customer or client.
- (8) No massage therapist shall administer a massage to a client exhibiting any skin fungus, skin infection, skin inflammation or skin eruption, unless a physician duly licensed by the State of Illinois shall certify in writing that such person may be safely massaged and shall describe the conditions under which such massage may be performed.
- (b) Subsection (a)(2) shall not apply to a massage establishment where all massages are administered to patrons who are fully clothed and where there is no application of oils, creams, lotions, or other liquids to the body of any client.

Sec. 15-972. Restrictions on advertising.

No massage establishment shall depict, place, publish, distribute, or cause to be depicted, placed, published, or distributed any advertising matter that suggests to prospective clients that any services are available other than those services permitted by this article, or which would suggest that employees or massage therapists are dressed in any manner other than that permitted by this article.

Sec. 15-973. Employment of minors.

It shall be unlawful for any massage establishment to employ any person who is not at least 18 years of age.

Sec. 15-974. Massage establishment exemptions.

- (a) No massage establishment license shall be required for those professions exempted by Section 25(a)—(c) of the Act.
- (b) A massage establishment with only a single owner-operator, no employees, and which has no more than one massage room with no more than one chair and one massage table <u>as well as all home-based massage establishments</u>, shall be exempt from the requirements set forth in section 15-970 of this article.

Sec. 15-975. Violation—Penalty.

In addition to the provisions set forth in section 15-41 for the revocation and suspension of licenses, any person who violates any section of this article shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine as set forth in the annual fee ordinance. Each day that a violation is found to have existed shall be deemed a separate violation.

Sec. 15-976. Nuisance.

The village hereby declares that any building used as a massage establishment in violation of this article is a public nuisance.

Overview

An Ordinance to update the Village of Northbrook Annual Fee Ordinance related to business license and registration fees as posted for review as part of the May 28, 2024 Village Board meeting.

Fiscal Impact

The adopted FY25 General Fund Budget includes \$175,000 in revenues from Business Licensing. The updates adopted on May 28, 2024 to Chapter 15 simplified the the prior structure of licensing from 75 plus categories for two primary classes of licenses and reduced associated fee categories to fewer than 30. The majority of fees were held flat or reduced and a number of categories were moved to optional registrations. As a result, revenues will be reduced from licensing. However, creating a more business friendly environment is intended to encourage and support sales tax revenue producing businesses and maintain that important revenue stream for the Village.

Recommendation

Approval.

Background

On May 28, 2024, an Ordinance was adopted amending Chapter 15 of the Northbrook Municipal Code, as amended, regarding business licensing and registration following significant review and discussion and were presented in order to streamline the business license categories and application/renewal procedures for impacted businesses within the community. The amendments provided a substantive update to Chapter 15.

This item is the corresponding update to reflect the new license categories and associated fees within the Annual Fee Ordinance which is similarly being streamlined.

Following consideration of on this agenda, staff will begin communicating the updates to the business community.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Northbrook, County of Cook and State of Illinois THAT:

An Ordinance Adopting and Authorizing Updates to the Village of Northbrook Annual Fee Ordinance

shall be, and is hereby, adopted as follows:

Section 1. AUTHORITY.

This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to and in accordance with Section 1-11 of the Northbrook Municipal Code.

Section 2. SHORT TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Annual Fee Ordinance" as provided herein.

Section 3. APPLICABILITY.

Each fee, charge, rate, or regulatory measure set forth in this Ordinance and corresponding *Exhibit A* attached thereto shall apply to the provisions of each indicated section of the Northbrook Municipal Code and other pertinent Code Sections or Ordinances in which a reference is made to the "Annual Fee Ordinance". This Ordinance shall not apply or have any effect on fees, taxes, or regulatory measures which do not expressly reference the "Annual Fee Ordinance".

It is intended that fees, charges, rates, and regulatory measurers set forth herein will be reviewed periodically by the President and Board of Trustees. Accordingly, these may be modified from time to time by separate Ordinance.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall become effective the later of June 1, 2024 or ten days after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law unless specifically indicated otherwise in Exhibit A.

for Zoho Corporation Software from Northwind Technologies

Overview

This Resolution approves the purchase of an annual maintenance and support contract for Zoho Corporation systems management software from Northwind Technologies.

Fiscal Impact

The adopted Fiscal Year 2024/2025 budget provides funding in Account Number 11-1400-523-00 for the renewal of the annual maintenance and support for Zoho Corporation systems management software in the amount of \$22,000.00.

Recommendation

Approval.

Background

In September 2015, the Village Information Technology (IT) Department implemented an IT Service Desk system from Zoho Software called ManageEngine. ManageEngine ServiceDesk Plus is a complete IT management system that manages IT service requests, assets, contracts, changes, metrics, and reporting. ManageEngine's Endpoint Central allows IT staff to automatically schedule software updates and patches for computers and servers and to remotely push manual software updates, as needed. After evaluating the various ManageEngine products in use, the IT staff determined that these products continue to provide value and are integral systems in the IT operations for the Village.

The Village's Annual Budget for FY 2024/2025 provides for the continued maintenance and support of the Zoho ManageEngine software. IT Staff identified an authorized reseller, Northwind Technologies, based in West Palm Beach, Florida, who is the partner listed on the General Services Administration (GSA) Contract, 47QTCA19D009H, for contractual pricing for ManageEngine products and services. This GSA Contract period is April 5, 2019 through April

4, 2029, and meets the requirements of the Village's Procurement Policy. Village IT Staff requested a quote from Northwind Technologies for the ManageEngine products in use. Northwind provided a quote in the amount of \$21,310.38 utilizing the pre-negotiated discounts contained in the GSA contract.

Based on these factors, Village IT Staff recommend purchasing a one year maintenance and support agreement from Northwind Technologies in a total amount not to exceed \$21,310.38. Sufficient funds are available in Account No. 11-1400-523-00 to complete this purchase.

Staff will be available at the meeting of the Board of Trustees on June 11, 2024, to answer any questions that may arise.

Overview

This Ordinance authorizes the purchase of a new cardiac monitor and the disposal of the 10-year old cardiac monitor which will be replaced.

Fiscal Impact

The fiscal year 2024/25 budget includes \$45,000 in account # 11-3100-649-00 for the purchase of a new cardiac monitor/defibrillator. The vendor provided a quote for one Zoll X Series Advanced cardiac monitor in the not to exceed amount of \$41,277.72. This price includes the trade-in value of \$5,500 for one Zoll X Series cardiac monitor.

Recommendation

Approval.

Background

The Village currently owns 10 cardiac monitors which are carried on front-line fire apparatus such as ambulances, engines, trucks, and a rescue squad. The vendor is the department's current supplier of cardiac monitors. As the department requires cardiac monitors that are both current and reliable, the new Zoll X Series Advanced cardiac monitor will replace the most appropriate cardiac monitor within the Village's inventory, which is a 10 year old Zoll X Series. Currently, the department's replacement schedule is to purchase one cardiac monitor per year. This schedules the equipment on the industry standard ten-year life cycle.

Based on both interoperability and necessity of replacement, fire department staff recommends the purchase of one Zoll X Series Advanced cardiac monitor for fiscal year 2024/25 from the vendor in the not-to-exceed amount of \$41,277.72.

Century Network

Overview

This Resolution approves a Service Order to upgrade the Village's existing Internet service with the State of Illinois Department of Innovation & Technology/Illinois Century Network.

Fiscal Impact

The adopted Fiscal Year 2024/2025 budget provides funding in Account Number 11-1400-537-07 for the Village's various Internet services in the amount of \$52,000.00.

Recommendation

Approval.

Background

In 2016, the Village entered into a Master Services Agreement with the State of Illinois Department of Innovation & Technology (DoIT)/Illinois Century Network (ICN) for Internet services. These Internet services are used by all Departments at the Village. Additionally, the unique offering by ICN allows for secure connectivity for the Police Department to the State of Illinois Law Enforcement Agencies Data System (LEADS) through this same service. In 2019, the initial three-year term with ICN was renewed for another three years. In 2020, the Internet service was upgraded due to the Village's usage of the Internet services. The Internet service contract expired in 2023 and the Village continues to utilize the service on a month-by-month basis.

Given the Village's usage of cloud-hosted applications, the demand for Internet bandwidth continues to increase. After reviewing the Village's current bandwidth utilization, the Village's Information Technology (IT) Department is recommending another bandwidth upgrade.

Since the Village has been utilizing the ICN Internet service for the past 8 years, service has been exceptional with minimal outages or disruptions. Because of this, and the fact that the Police Department utilizes the secure access to LEADS through this same service, IT Staff recommends continuing to utilize the same ICN service but with an upgrade.

Village IT Staff requested and received a proposal from ICN in an amount of \$3,022.89 a month with a 36-month term. This upgrade does not require the installation of any new services and can be completed by ICN in a short timeframe.

The Village's Annual Budget for FY 2024/2025 includes funding in Account No. 11-1400-537-07 to cover the cost of the Internet upgrade. Future budget requests will include sufficient funding to cover years 2 and 3 of the 36-month term.

Based on these factors, Village IT Staff recommends executing the Service Order to upgrade the Village's Internet service with Illinois Century Network in an amount not to exceed \$3,022.89 for the next 36 months.

Staff will be available at the meeting of the Board of Trustees on June 11, 2024, to answer any questions that may arise.

Subject: An Ordinance Providing for the Disposal of Surplus Property and Evidence

Overview

The Police Department is seeking authorization pursuant to the Law Enforcement Disposition of Property Act, 765 ILCS 1030/0.01 et seq. and according to Section 2-193 of the Northbrook municipal code to dispose of surplus property and evidence that has been determined to be unclaimed.

Fiscal Impact

The Village will receive all sales proceeds, minus applicable fees, should any items be sold. Fees are set within the Vendor agreement (Resolution 2023-36 approved March 14, 2023). After roughly 120 days, any unsold items will become the property of PropertyRoom.com or will be destroyed. There is no upfront cost for this service.

Recommendation

Approval.

Background

A review of the current inventory of property held by the Police Department has identified items which are related to cases that have been adjudicated and the victim no longer wishes them returned or are found property that belongs to an owner that cannot be located after all required measures have been taken. Pursuant to the Law Enforcement Disposition of Property Act, 765 ILCS 1030/0.01 et seq., the Police Department is authorized to sell certain abandoned, lost or stolen or otherwise illegally possessed personal property six months after making a reasonable inquiry and efforts to identify and notify the owner or other person entitled to possession. Therefore, the items identified may now be categorized as "non-evidentiary" or "found property" without an owner and since it is not feasible for the Department to continue to store such property, this property is recommended for disposal in accordance with Section 2-193 of the Municipal Code.

The Code requires Village Manager approval to dispose of items with a value less than \$20,000 and Village Board approval for items with a value greater than \$20,000.

On March 14, 2023, by Resolution 2023-36, the Village Board authorized an Agreement with PropertyRoom.com of Frederick, Maryland, to dispose of excess non-evidentiary and found property through an online auction platform. In order to streamline the process, the Police

Department has prepared a list of the items (Attachment A) to be disposed which are individually expected to be valued less than \$20,000 and have an aggregate value greater than \$20,000; therefore, Village Board approval is recommended. Subject to Village Board approval, the items identified in the attached inventory list will be picked up by the vendor as soon as possible for sale by auction.

All sale proceeds, minus applicable fees, will be returned to the Village. After roughly 120 days, any unsold items will become the property of PropertyRoom.com or will be destroyed. In regards to electronic items, all information will be removed from the item's memory by Police Department staff or PropertyRoom.com staff prior to their sale.

Section 1. Background.

After reviewing inventory held in the Police Department's property rooms, Police Department staff have noted an excess of property that can been categorized as "non-evidentiary" or "found property" without an owner. These items are related to cases that have been adjudicated and the victim no longer wishes them returned or are found property that belongs to an owner that cannot be located after all required measures have been taken. Due to this excess inventory, there is currently very limited room to store any new evidence or found property.

The Village Board authorized, via Resolution 2023-36, an agreement with PropertyRoom.com of Frederick, MD ("Vendor") to handle the disposition of the department's surplus evidence/property inventory through an online auction platform. Police Department staff have prepared surplus items to be picked up by the vendor as soon as possible. An inventory list of the items to be disposed is attached as *Exhibit A*.

Section 2. Disposal of Property

Pursuant to the Home Rule powers of the Village of Northbrook, the Illinois Municipal Code 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4 and the Illinois Law Enforcement Disposition of Property Act 765 ILCS 1030/3, the Village President and Board of Trustees hereby find that the following described items in *Exhibit A* ("Surplus Property") are no longer necessary or useful to the Village, and the best interests of the Village would be served by disposal of same.

Section 3. Manner of Disposal

The Village Manager is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the Surplus Property to Vendor for sale via its online auction platform. The sales shall be advertised and the auction conducted by the Vendor as provided in the previously authorized agreement.

The Vendor shall return any sales proceeds to the Village as prescribed in the previously authorized agreement.

Section 4. Alternate Manner of Disposal.

In the event that any of the Surplus Property is not able to sell for the minimum sale price within 120 days, the Village Manager is authorized to allow the Vendor to be dispose of the Surplus

Overview

The Village of Northbrook utilizes crack sealing services to improve the service life of asphalt roadways. This agenda item was originally considered on May 28, 2024, however the incorrect agreement was attached. Thus staff is bringing it back for the Village Board's reconsideration in the interest of transparency.

Fiscal Impact

The budgeted cost for this project is \$25,000. The Fiscal Year 2024/25 Budget contains sufficient funds in Account No. 11-4100-531-71 (Street Repairs). Funds will be taken from this account as needed to pay for the work which will be completed at rates outlined in Exhibit A.

Background

As previously mentioned, this agenda item was originally considered on May 28, 2024, however the incorrect agreement was attached. Thus staff is bringing it back for the Village Board's reconsideration in the interest of transparency.

The Village of Northbrook owns and maintains roughly 97 centerline miles of asphalt streets. To help the Village's roads reach the full extent of their useful life, the Public Works Department performs maintenance tasks such as selective patching and crack sealing. Crack sealing is used to help prevent moisture and debris from entering the road base through seams or cracks in the pavement that can form over time. As water seeps into these seams/cracks it can cause premature failure to the roadway as it expands in freezing temperatures and contracts in warmer temperatures.

In March 2023, staff solicited competitive bidding for these services with two one-year optional renewals included in the bid package. On March 14, 2023 the Village received three proposals which were all considered to be responsive.

Patriot Pavement Maintenance Inc. of Wheeling, Illinois (the "Contractor") submitted the most responsive and responsible proposal and was awarded the contract. The contract included an initial one-year term with provisions for up to two one-year renewals. The Contractor performed well during the initial term of the agreement and both staff and the Contractor wish to renew the agreement. This would be the first renewal of the agreement. Staff will be present at the Village Board meeting to address any questions that may arise.

The Village of Northbrook owns and maintains roughly 97 centerline miles of asphalt streets. Crack sealing is a common maintenance procedure used to prolong the useful life of the pavement. Public Works released a Request for Proposals for a contract for providing crack sealing services ("Work") and opened proposals on Tuesday, March 14, 2023. Three contractors submitted bid proposals. The lowest responsive bid was received from Patriot Pavement Maintenance Inc, of Wheeling, Illinois ("Contractor").

In April 2023, the Village awarded the contract for the Work to the Contractor in the total amount of \$25,000 ("Agreement"). The Agreement provided for two optional one-year renewals. The Contractor performed well during the initial term, and both staff and the Contractor wish to renew the Agreement ("Renewal"). The term of the Renewal will be from the date of execution to April 30, 2025.

Based on these factors, Village staff recommends execution of the Renewal with the Contractor in an amount not to exceed \$25,000 for the Work.

The President and the Board of Trustees have considered the Renewal and determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and the public to enter into the Renewal.

Section 2. Approval of the Renewal

The Renewal shall be, and is hereby, approved in a form acceptable to the Village Attorney and the Village Manager.

Section 3. Authorization to Execute Renewal.

The Plan Commission recommends approval of the following approval documents related to the rezoning and subdivision at 2830 Highland Road:

i. An Ordinance Rezoning the Property at 2830 Highland Road and Amending the District Zoning Map; and

ii. A Resolution Approving a Subdivision Variation and Combined Tentative and Final Plat of Subdivision.

Review and consider approval.

Background

On June 11, 2024, the Board of Trustees is scheduled to consider draft documents approving an application submitted by KZF Venture Group LLC (the "Applicant") as the owner of the property commonly known as 2830 Highland Road (the "Subject Property") for final plat approval of a proposed three-lot single family residential subdivision.

On May 21, 2024, the Plan Commission considered the rezoning and combined tentative and final plat request, including a request for the stormwater detention area to be allowed in an easement instead of an outlot. The Commission found the overall proposal to be acceptable. The members asked questions related to the stormwater detention area and the request to be in an easement versus an outlot. No written public comments were received prior to the public hearing, however, eight (8) members of the public spoke at the meeting. The comments received were primarily related to stormwater concerns and increase in density in the area.

The public hearing was subsequently closed and the Commission discussed the application. The majority of the Commission found the proposal to be acceptable with one member stating that two lots would be preferable and acceptable to him. The Plan Commission Chair briefly explained to the public the issues of stormwater and how any new construction in Northbrook has to comply with the strict stormwater detention regulations of the Village of Northbrook and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD), which is meant to improve the stormwater situation. Finally, the Plan Commission adopted, by a vote of 4-1 (two members absent), Resolution No. 24-PC-06 (see attached) recommending approval of the rezoning and combined tentative and final plat as presented. The staff report is attached but the meeting minutes are not available at this time.

On June 11, 2024, the Village Board is scheduled to consider the following approval documents:

- i. An Ordinance Rezoning the Property at 2830 Highland Road and Amending the District Zoning Map; and
- ii. A Resolution Approving a Subdivision Variation and Combined Tentative and Final Plat of Subdivision.

The Village Attorney has explained that given that there are seven (7) seated members of the Plan Commission currently, a vote of 4-1 (one member voting no and two absences), will be considered as a recommendation of approval, however since the vote was not unanimous, the application has been placed under the Planning & Economic Development portion of the Village Board agenda.

The Applicant and staff will attend the June 11, 2024 meeting in case there are any questions.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Northbrook by a majority vote in the manner required by law and publication in pamphlet form in the manner required by law.

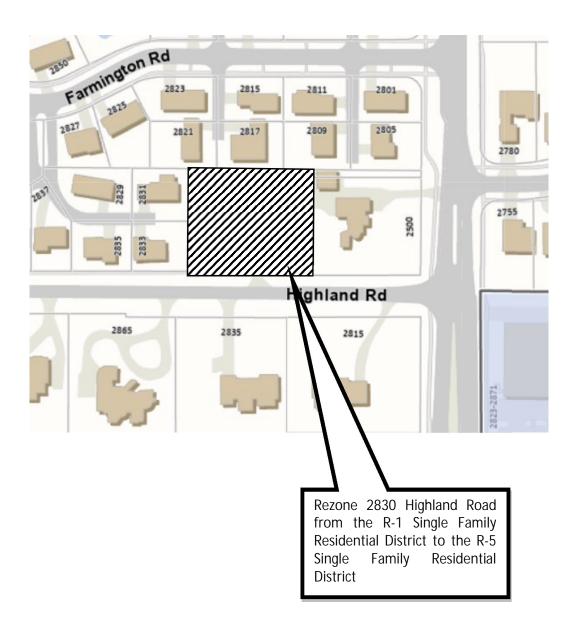

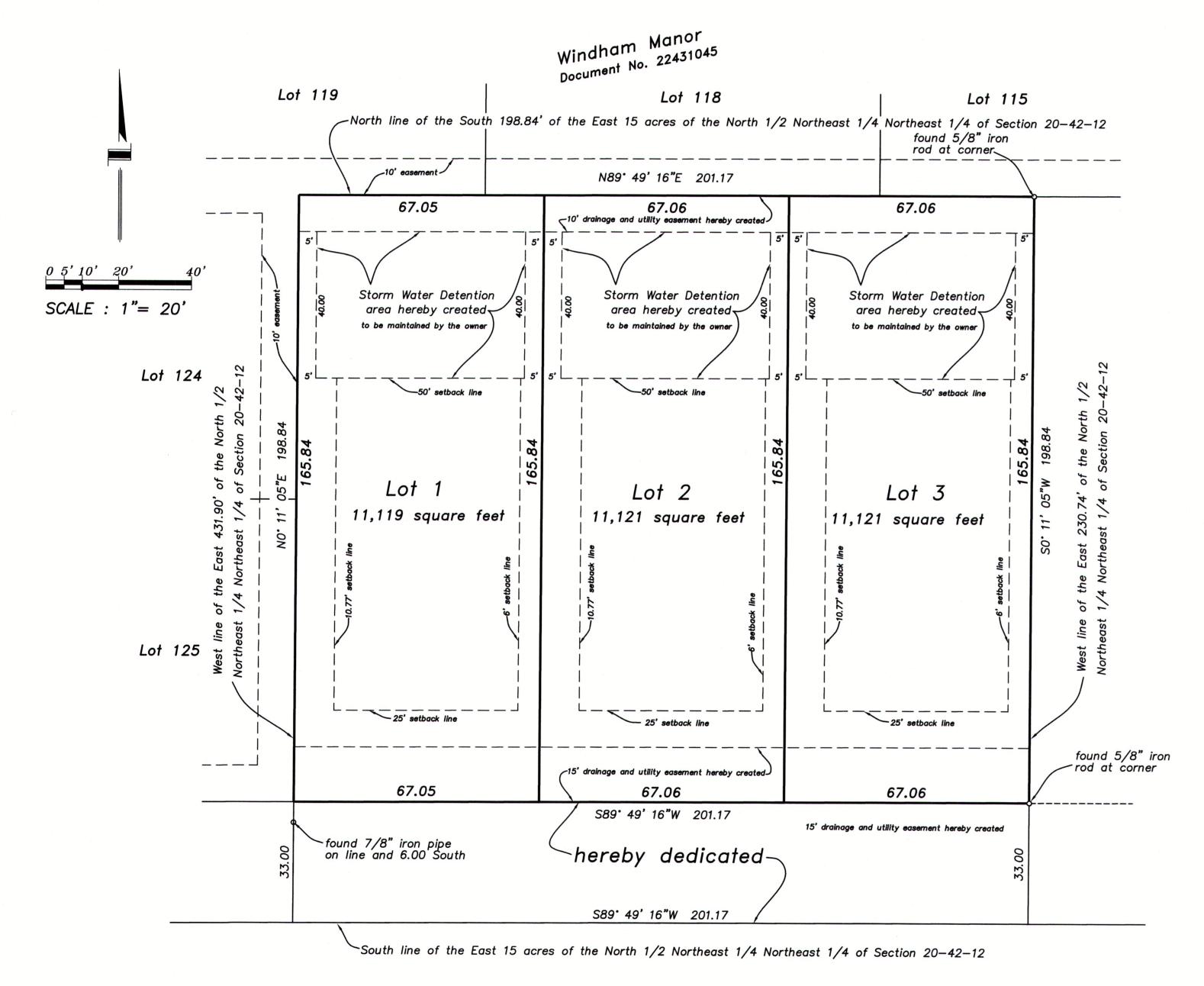

OPERATING AGREEMENT KZF VENTURE GROUP, L.L.C.

THIS OPERATING AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into this 14th day of February, 2001, between the following person (referred to herein as a "Member):

KZF HOLDINGS, L.L.C.

and the following person (referred to herein as the "Manager"):

KZF HOLDINGS, L.L.C.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are desirous of establishing and operating a limited liability company under the laws of the State of Illinois (the "State").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, adequacy and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 Formation of Company

- 1.1 <u>Statutory Authority</u>. The parties hereby agree to form and operate a limited liability company (the "Company") under and pursuant to the provisions of the Limited Liability Company Act from time to time in force in the State (the "Act"). Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, the rights and obligations of the Company, its Member and the Manager shall be governed by the Act.
- 1.2 <u>Filings</u>. The Manager shall file or shall cause to be executed and filed Articles of Organization or a Certification of Formation conforming to the requirements of the Act in the Office of the Secretary of State and the Manager shall make or cause to be made such other filings and recordings and it shall do or cause to be done such other acts and things conforming thereto as shall constitute compliance with all requirements for the formation of a limited liability company under the Act and the laws of such other states in which the Company elects to do business.

ARTICLE 2 Name

The name of the Company shall be the name set forth in the heading of this Agreement. The affairs of the Company shall be conducted under the Company name or such other name as the Manager may select in accordance with the Act. The Manager shall execute and file with the proper offices any and all certificates required by the fictitious name or assumed name statutes of the states in which the Company elects to do business. The Company shall have the exclusive ownership of and right to use the Company name and any other name under which the Company shall elect to conduct its affairs as long as the Company continues.

ARTICLE 3 Purpose of the Company

The purpose of the Company is to engage in any and all lawful businesses, make any and all lawful investments and undertake such other activities related or incidental thereto as the Manager may determine is in the interests of the Company.

ARTICLE 4 Offices, Records and Agents

- 4.1 <u>Principal Office of the Company</u>. The principal office of the Company shall be located at such place within or outside the State as the Manager may from time to time designate. The Company may have secondary offices at such other place or places as the Manager may from time to time designate.
- 4.2 <u>Records to be Maintained</u>. The Manager shall at all times during the continuance of the Company keep at the Company's principal office such records and information as the Company may be required to maintain in accordance with the Act.
- 4.3 Registered Office and Registered Agent. The Manager shall designate a registered office and a registered agent for service of process in accordance with the Act. The Manager may from time to time in accordance with the Act change the Company's registered office and/or registered agent. The Manager shall select and designate a registered office and registered agent for the Company in each other state in which the Company is required to maintain or appoint one.

ARTICLE 5 Term of Existence and Termination of the Company

- 5.1 <u>Term of the Company</u>. The Company shall commence upon the filing of the Articles of Organization of the Company with the Office of the Secretary of State and shall continue in perpetuity, unless sooner terminated in accordance with Section 5.2, below.
- 5.2 <u>Termination</u>. The Company shall terminate prior to the time set forth in Section 5.1 upon notice by either the Manager or the Member to the other; provided, however, that this Agreement generally and Article 12 in particular shall govern the conduct of the parties during the winding up of the Company.

ARTICLE 6 Contributions to Capital

- 6.1 <u>Capital Contributions</u>. The Member shall contemporaneously with the execution of this Agreement contribute to the capital of the Company the amount of money or property set forth or described under the heading "Capital Contribution" opposite the Member's signature hereto.
- 6.2 <u>Additional Capital Contributions</u>. The Member may at any time or from time to time make such additional capital contributions to the Company as the Member may see fit to make. Except as set forth in this Section 6.2 or as required by the Act, the Member shall not be assessed for additional capital contributions.

ARTICLE 7 Allocations and Distributions

- 7.1 <u>Books of Account.</u> (a) *Maintenance of Books of Account.* At all times during the continuance of the Company the Manager shall cause proper and true books of account to be maintained in conformity with sound accounting principles consistently applied wherein there shall be entered particulars of all monies, goods or effects belonging to or owing to or by the Company, or paid, received, sold or purchased in the course of the Company's activities, and all of such other transactions, matters and things relating to the Company as are usually entered in books of account kept by persons engaged in activities of a like kind and character.
- (b) Financial Statements. The Company's books of account shall be closed as soon as practicable after the close of each calendar year (which shall be the Company's "Fiscal Year") and, in the discretion of the Manager, an annual compilation, review or audit shall be performed at the expense of the Company by an accountant selected by the Manager. A written report shall thereafter be provided to the Member containing the financial statements prepared by the accountant.
- (c) No Tax Returns. While all of the interests in the Company are owned by a single Member, the Company shall for income tax purposes be disregarded as an entity separate and distinct from its single Member pursuant to the authority of the Treasury Regulations Section 301.7701-3(b)(1)(ii) and any comparable rule or regulation under applicable tax laws; provided, however, that the parties hereto do not intend that the Company will be disregarded as an entity separate from its single Member for purposes of any other law or circumstance, and the Manager and the single Member shall at all times deal with third parties in the name of the Company and they shall comply with all of the provisions of this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Distributions of Cash Flow</u>. (a) Cash flow shall be distributed to the Member according in such amounts and at such times as the Manager shall determine in its discretion.
- (b) Restrictions on Distributions. Notwithstanding the distributions contemplated by this Section, if the Company has creditors, no distribution may be made if, after giving effect to such distribution, either (i) the Company would be unable to pay its debts as they become due in the usual course of business or (ii) the net assets of the Company would be less than zero.

ARTICLE 8

Rights, Duties, Liabilities and Restrictions of the Manager

- 8.1 <u>Managers</u>. (a) *Generally*. As further set forth in this Agreement, the Company shall be managed by the Manager.
 - (b) *Number*. There shall be one Manager of the Company.
- (c) Election; Removal; Replacement. The Member hereby elects the person identified on the first page of this Agreement as the initial Manager of the Company. The Member shall have the authority at any time and from time to time to (i) remove a Manager from office and (ii) appoint a new Manager whenever there is a vacancy in the office of Manager.
- 8.2 <u>Authority of Manager</u>. (a) *Exclusive Right to Manage*. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Manager shall have the sole and exclusive right and authority to manage, control and conduct the affairs of the Company. The Manager shall make all decisions affecting the affairs and business of the Company and shall carry out the purposes of the Company as set forth herein.
- (b) *Power and Authority*. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, and consistent with the purposes of the Company, the Manager shall have the power and authority to acquire assets: purchase goods and services; sell, exchange, lease, license or otherwise deal in or with any and all assets of the Company; borrow funds to finance the Company's activities and in connection with such borrowing, to mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, lien or otherwise encumber the revenues and assets of the Company; to enter into any contract or agreement or amend or cancel the same; and to invest and reinvest any funds or other assets of the Company -- all as incident to or necessary for the operations of the Company. Without limitation of the foregoing, and for the avoidance of any doubt, it is explicitly declared that the Manager has the absolute authority to sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of all or substantially all of the Company's assets, including in a transaction that is not in the ordinary course of business.
- (c) No Duty to Inquire. Nothing herein contained shall impose any obligation on any person or firm doing business with the Company to inquire as to whether or not a Manager has exceeded its power and authority in executing any contract, lease, mortgage, security agreement, deed or other instrument on behalf of the Company, and any such third person shall be fully protected in relying upon such authority.
- (d) *Proscriptions*. Without the written consent or ratification of the Member, the Manager shall have no authority to expend or use Company money or property other than on the account and for the benefit of the Company or to pledge any of the Company's credit or property for other than Company purposes.
- 8.3 <u>Bank Accounts.</u> Pending any expenditure or long-term investment, all funds of the Company shall be deposited in the Company name in such bank account or accounts as shall be designated by the Manager from time to time. All withdrawals therefrom shall be made upon the signature of such person or persons as the Manager may designate.

- 8.4 <u>Compensation of Manager</u>. During the term of the Company, the Manager shall not be entitled to any fees or other remunerations for its services as Manager of the Company.
- 8.5 <u>Expenditures by Manager</u>. The Company shall reimburse the Manager for any costs that may be properly expended by the Manager on behalf of the Company made out of funds other than those of the Company.
- Liability of Manager. The Manager (which for purposes of this Section 8.6 and 8.6 Section 8.7 shall include its partners, officers, directors, shareholders, members, managers, employees, agents and affiliates) shall not be liable to a Member or the Company for honest mistakes of judgment, or for action or inaction, taken reasonably and in good faith for a purpose that was reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Company, or for losses due to such mistakes, action or inaction, or for the negligence, dishonesty or bad faith of any employee, broker or other agent of the Company, provided that such employee, broker or agent was selected, engaged or retained and supervised with reasonable care. The Manager may consult with counsel and accountants in respect of Company affairs and be fully protected and justified in any action or inaction that is taken in accordance with the advice or opinion of such counsel or accountants, provided that they shall have been selected with reasonable care. The Member shall look solely to the assets of the Company for the return of their capital and, if the assets of the Company remaining after payment or discharge of the debts and liabilities of the Company are insufficient to return such capital, they shall have no recourse against the Manager for such purpose. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing to the contrary, the provisions of this Section shall not be construed to relieve (or attempt to relieve) any person of any liability by reason of gross negligence, recklessness or intentional wrongdoing or to the extent (but only to the extent) that such liability may not be waived, modified or limited under applicable law, but shall be construed so as to effectuate the provisions of this Section to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- Indemnification. (a) Indemnification for Actions. The Company shall indemnify any 8.7 person who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party, to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding (other than an action by or in the right of the Company), whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a manager, member, officer, employee or agent of the Company, or is or was serving at the request of the Company as a director, officer, manager, employee or agent of another limited liability company, corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by the person in connection with the action, suit or proceeding, if the person acted in good faith and in a manner the person reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Company or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe the person's conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner that the person reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Company or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that the person had reasonable cause to believe that the person's conduct was unlawful.
- (b) Indemnification for Actions By or in the Right of the Company. The Company shall indemnify every person who was or is a party, or is threatened to be made a party, to any threatened,

pending or completed action or suit, by or in the right of the Company to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that the person is or was a manager, member, officer, employee or agent of the Company, or is or was serving at the request of the limited liability company as a director, officer, manager, employee or agent of another limited liability company, corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorney' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by the person in connection with the defense or settlement of the action or suit, if the person acted in good faith and in a manner the person reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Company, provided that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue or matter as to which the person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of the person's duty to the Company, unless, and only to the extent that, the court in which the action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, the person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for those expenses as the court shall deem proper.

- (c) Expenses. To the extent that a manager, officer, employee or agent of the Company has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any action, suit or proceeding referred to in paragraph (a) or (b), above, or in defense of any claim, issue or matter therein, the person shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorney's fees) actually and reasonably incurred by the person in connection therewith.
- (d) Determination. Any indemnification under paragraphs (a) and (b), above (unless ordered by a court), shall be made by the Company only as authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, manager, employee or agent is proper in the circumstances because the person has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in either paragraph (a) or (b), above. The determination shall be made (i) by the Manager, excluding any Manager who is a party to the action, suit or proceeding; or (ii) by independent legal counsel in a written opinion, at the discretion of the Manager, excluding any Manager who is a party to the action, suit or proceeding, or (iii) by Member holding a majority of the Percentage Interests.
- (e) Payment in Advance. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding may be paid by the Company in advance of the final disposition of the action, suit or proceeding, as authorized by the Manager or Member in the specific case, as provided in paragraph (d), above, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, officer, manager, employee or agent to repay that amount, unless it shall ultimately be determined that the person is entitled to be indemnified by the limited liability company as authorized in this Section 8.7.
- shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under the Company's Articles of Organization or Certificate of Formation, or any agreement, vote of Member or disinterested managers, or otherwise, both as to action in the person's official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, manager, employee or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person.
- (g) Insurance. The Company may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a manager, officer, employee or agent of the Company, or who is or was serving at the request of the Company as a director, officer, manager, employee or agent of another

limited liability company, corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against the person and incurred by the person in any capacity, or arising out of the person's status as such, whether or not the Company would have the power to indemnify the person against the liability under the provisions of this Section 8.7.

- (h) Report to Member. If the Company has paid indemnity or has advanced expenses to a manager, officer, director, employee or agent, the Company shall promptly report the indemnification or advance in writing to the Member.
- (i) Definitions. For purposes of this Section, references to "other enterprises" shall include employee benefit plans; references to "fines" shall include any excise taxes assessed on a person with respect to an employee benefit plan; and references to "serving at the request of the Company" shall include any service as a manager, employee or agent of the Company that imposes duties on, or involves services by the manager, employee or agent with respect to an employee benefit plan, its participants or beneficiaries. A person who acted in good faith and in a manner the person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the participants and beneficiaries of an employee benefit plan shall be deemed to have acted in a manner "not opposed to the best interests of the Company" as referred to in this Section 8.7.
- 8.8 Officers of the Company. The Manager may from time to time appoint one or more persons to serve as officers of the Company, in such capacities and with such delegated rights and powers as the Manager may approve; provided, however, that no such officer shall have any different or greater rights and powers than the Manager has under this Agreement. Officers appointed by the Manager shall be entitled to be indemnified by the Company in accordance with Section 8.7.

ARTICLE 9 Membership

- 9.1 <u>Rights and Obligations of the Member</u>. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement to the contrary, the Member shall take no part in the control or management of the affairs of the Company, nor shall the Member have any authority to act for or on behalf of the Company or to sign for or bind the Company.
- 9.2 <u>Voting Rights</u>. Should this Agreement expressly provide that any matter be put to the Member for approval, the Member's approval shall be obtained in writing.
- 9.3 <u>Liability</u>. The Member shall not be personally liable for any of the debts of the Company or any of the losses thereof beyond the amount contributed or required to be contributed by it to the Company under this Agreement and as otherwise specified in the Act.
- 9.4 <u>Expenditures of Member</u>. In the discretion of the Manager, the Company shall reimburse the Member for any costs that may be properly expended by it on behalf of the Company made out of funds other than those of the Company.
- 9.5 <u>Trustee Liability</u>. (a) *Actions as Trustees*. When the Member is a trust, the execution of this Agreement by the Member shall be by its trustee, not individually, but solely as trustee in the exercise and under the power of authority conferred upon and vested in such trustee, and it is

expressly understood and agreed that nothing herein contained shall be construed as creating any liability on the part of any such trustee personally to pay any amounts required to be paid hereunder, or to perform any covenant, either express or implied, contained herein, all such liability, if any, being expressly waived by the parties hereto by their execution hereof. When the Member is a trust, the liability of the Member to the Company or to any third person shall be only that of such trust to the full extent of its trust estate and shall not be a personal liability of any trustee, grantor or beneficiary thereof.

- (b) Successor Trustee. Any successor trustee or trustees of the Member trust shall be entitled to exercise the same rights and privileges and be subject to the same duties and obligations as its predecessor trustee. As used in this Agreement, the term "trustee" shall include any or all such successor trustees.
- (c) Termination of Trust. The termination of the Member trust shall not terminate the Company. Upon the allocation or distribution of all or any portion of the Company interest of a Member trust pursuant to the exercise of any power of appointment, or otherwise, to a beneficiary of such trust or to another person or persons or to another trust or trusts, whether or not such distribution shall terminate such distributing trust, each such distributee shall be entitled to be admitted to the Company as a Member to the extent of the proportionate share of the Company interest distributed to it, subject to the terms of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the restrictions contained in Article 10.

ARTICLE 10 Admission of Additional Members; Assignment Provisions

- 10.1 <u>Additional Members</u>. (a) *Additional Members*. The Manager may admit one or more additional Members in its discretion on such terms as the Manager shall deem reasonable and fair.
- (b) Amendment and Restatement of this Agreement. Coincident with the admission of an additional Member, this Agreement shall be amended and restated in its entirety to reflect the rights, privileges, obligations and economic interests of the several Members.
- 10.2 <u>General Provisions</u>. The following rules shall apply to transfers of Company interests and the admission of additional persons to the Company:
- (a) Procedure for Admission. No person shall be admitted as a transferee or additional Member hereunder unless and until (i) in the case of an assignment of an interest in the Company permitted hereby, the assignment is made in writing, signed by the assignor and accepted in writing by the assignee, and a duplicate original of the assignment is delivered to and accepted by the Manager, and (ii) the prospective admittee executes and delivers to the Company the amended and restated operating agreement contemplated by Section 10.1(b), above.
- (b) Binding Effect. Any person acquiring or claiming an interest in the Company, in any manner whatsoever, shall be subject to and bound by all terms, conditions and obligations hereof to which its predecessor in interest, if any, was subject or bound, without regard to whether such person has executed a counterpart hereof or any other document contemplated hereby. No person, including

the legal representatives, heirs or legatees of a deceased Member, shall have any rights or obligations greater than those set forth herein and no person shall acquire an interest in the Company or become a Member except as permitted hereby.

- (c) Actions Prior to Compliance with Procedures. The Company and the Manager shall be entitled to treat the assignor of the assigned interest as the absolute owner thereof in all respects and shall incur no liability for distributions made in good faith to such assignor prior to such time as the documents specified in paragraph (a), above, have been delivered to and accepted by the Manager.
- (d) Consent of Member. Each Member hereby consents to the substitution of any assignee of a Member's interest or the admission of any additional person as a Member as approved by the Manager.
- (e) Costs. The costs incurred by the Company in processing an assignment (including attorney's fees) shall be borne by the assignee, and shall be payable prior to and as a condition of admission to the Company.
- 10.3 <u>Transfers by the Manager Prohibited</u>. The Manager's interest in the Company is that of an agent of the Company and is not susceptible of being sold, assigned, pledged, mortgaged or otherwise disposed of or transferred. Insofar as the Manager may also be the Member, Section 10.4 shall govern the transfer of the Manager's membership interest.
- 10.4 <u>Transfers by Member</u>. (a) Continuation of Company Upon Certain Events. The death, disability, court declaration of incompetence, bankruptcy, dissolution, liquidation or other dissociation of a Member shall not dissolve the Company, but it shall be continued with the successor or legal representative of the Member; such successor or legal representative shall, to the extent of the interest acquired, be entitled only to the predecessor Member's rights, if any, in the capital, profits and losses and distributions of the Company, and no such person shall have any right to participate in the management of the affairs of the Company or vote on any Company matter without the written consent of the Manager.
- (b) Restrictions of Transfer. In addition to the general restrictions set forth herein, no Member shall sell, exchange, pledge, mortgage, hypothecate or otherwise transfer or encumber its interest in the Company without the prior written consent of the Manager. Any such transfer or encumbrance shall be void from inception and of no force or effect whatsoever.
- (c) Permitted Transferees. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Member shall be entitled to transfer all or any part of the Member's interest (i) to such Member's spouse; (ii) to a lineal descendant or ancestor of such Member or a spouse of any of the foregoing; (iii) to a trust established for the benefit of the Member or any person described in clauses (i) or (ii), above; (iv) to any entity wholly-owned and controlled by the Member or any person described in clauses (i), (ii) or (iii), above; or (v) to any other Member, and such permitted transferee shall succeed to all of the rights of the predecessor Member in the capital, profits and losses and distributions of the Company, and to participate in the management of the affairs of the Company and vote on any Company matter.

10.5 "Bring-Along" Rights. In the event that the Manager proposes to enter into one or more agreements to sell to any persons or persons (referred to herein collectively as the "purchaser") all or substantially all of the membership interests in the Company in a single transaction or related series of transactions in lieu of a sale of all or a substantial part of the assets of the Company, the Member hereby agrees to sell its interest in the Company to the purchaser on the terms set forth in such agreements. The Manager is hereby granted by the Member a power of attorney, coupled with an interest, to execute in the name of the Member any and all agreements, contracts, documents and other instruments (including instruments of assignment) which the Manager deems necessary or useful in order to consummate the transactions aforesaid. Said instruments shall be deemed to have been executed on behalf of the Member as if signed by the Member itself. The costs associated with the sale shall borne by the Member.

ARTICLE 11 Resignations and Withdrawals

The Member shall not be entitled to withdraw or resign from the Company, except pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. The Member shall not be entitled to receive any money or property from the Company except (a) by way of distributions upon the winding up of the Company pursuant to Article 12, (b) by way of distributions of cash flow as provided pursuant to Section 7.2, (c) in respect of any bona fide loans to the Company then due and owing and (d) as expressly provided elsewhere in this Agreement.

ARTICLE 12 Winding Up

- 12.1 <u>Liquidation Procedures</u>. Upon termination of the Company pursuant to Article 5, the affairs of the Company shall be wound up and the Company shall be dissolved. As part of the winding up of the Company, a proper accounting shall be made of the net profit or net loss of the Company from the date of the last previous accounting to the date of termination.
- 12.2 <u>Liquidating Trustee</u>. Upon the winding up of the Company business for any reason, the Manager shall act as "Liquidating Trustee" or shall elect a Liquidating Trustee. If the Manager has been removed, has withdrawn or is unwilling or unable to act as or elect a Liquidating Trustee, the Member shall act as or elect a Liquidating Trustee. The Liquidating Trustee shall have full power to sell, assign and encumber Company assets. All certificates or notices required by law shall be filed on behalf of the Company by the Liquidating Trustee.
- 12.3 <u>Distribution on Winding Up</u>. In the event of the winding up of the Company for any reason, the proceeds of liquidation shall be applied by the end of the Fiscal Year in which the liquidation occurs or, if later, within 90 days after the date of such liquidation, in the following rank and order:
- (a) *Creditors*. To the creditors of the Company, including the Member if a creditor, in satisfaction of liabilities of the Company, all in the order of priority and to the extent provided by law.

- (b) Member. To the Member.
- 12.4 <u>Liquidating Trust</u>. In the discretion of the Liquidating Trustee, a pro rata portion of the distributions that would otherwise be made to the Member pursuant to Section 12.3 may be distributed to a trust established for the benefit of the Member for the purposes of liquidating Company assets, collecting amounts owed to the Company and paying any contingent or unforeseen liabilities or obligations of the Company arising out of or in connection with the Company. The assets of any such trust shall be distributed to the Member from time to time in the reasonable discretion of the Liquidating Trustee, in the same proportions as the amount distributed to such trust by the Company would otherwise have been distributed to the Member pursuant to this Agreement.
- 12.5 <u>Distributions In Kind</u>. The Liquidating Trustee may in its discretion make a distribution of Company property in kind, subject to such reasonable conditions and restrictions as are necessary or advisable in order to preserve the value of the assets distributed or for legal reasons.

ARTICLE 13 Conflicts and Covenants

- 13.1 <u>Manager's Time Commitment</u>. The Manager shall cause so much time to be devoted to the business of the Company as, in its judgment, the conduct of the Company's business shall reasonably require.
- 13.2 <u>Related Business Partners</u>. The Company may employ, contract for services with, acquire or sell goods, property and materials from or to and otherwise deal with the Member or Manager or any affiliate of the Member or Manager, on any basis which is customary and competitive, or otherwise fair and reasonable.
- 13.3 <u>Competitive Undertakings</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Member and the Manager may engage in business ventures of any nature and description independently or with others, including, but not limited to, business of the character described in Article 3 (or any part thereof), and neither the Company nor any of the Member shall have any rights in or to such independent ventures or the income or profits derived therefrom.

ARTICLE 14 Power of Attorney

The Member hereby agrees that, upon the execution of this Agreement, it shall and hereby does consent and appoint the Manager as its true and lawful attorney, coupled with an interest in its name, place and stead to sign, execute, acknowledge, swear to and file any and all documents which in the discretion of such attorney are required to be signed, executed, acknowledged, sworn to or filed by the Member to discharge the purposes of the Company as hereinabove stated. Without limitation, among the documents which the Manager may execute on behalf of the Member shall be the following:

(a) Amendments to Agreement. Any amendments to this Agreement, when this Agreement is amended in accordance with Article 15.

- (b) Articles and Other Instruments. The Articles of Organization or Certificate of Formation required of the Company by the Act (and the laws of any other jurisdiction deemed necessary by the Manager) and any other instrument which may be required of the Company or the Member pursuant to the Act or the laws of any other jurisdiction.
- (c) Amendments to Articles. Any amendments to the Articles of Organization or Certificate of Formation of the Company made pursuant to Article 15 or which are described in the Act.

The grant of authority set forth in this Section is a special power of attorney coupled with an interest, is irrevocable and shall survive the death, incapacity, liquidation or dissolution of the Member; may be exercised by the Manager for the Member by a facsimile signature or by listing the name of the Member executing any instrument with the signature of the Manager, as attorney in fact for the Member; and shall survive the delivery of an assignment by the Member of all or any portion of its interest, except that where the assignee has been approved by the Manager for admission to the Company as a substituted Member, the power of attorney shall survive the delivery of such assignment for the sole purpose of enabling the Manager to execute, acknowledge and file any instrument necessary to effect such substitution, and the grant of authority set forth in this Article shall be deemed to have been made by such substitute Member.

ARTICLE 15 Amendments

The terms and provisions of this Agreement may be modified or amended only upon the written approval of the Member and the Manager.

ARTICLE 16 General Provisions

- 16.1 <u>Notices</u>. All notices, offers or other communications required or permitted to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be considered as properly given:
 - (a) Upon personal delivery.
- (b) On the fifth business day following mailing from within the United States by first class United States mail, postage prepaid, certified mail.
- (c) On the next business day following delivery via a recognized overnight delivery service such as Federal Express or DHL.

Notices, offers or other communications to the Company shall be addressed to the Company in care of the Manager at the address beneath the Manager's name on the signature page of this Agreement. Notices, offers or other communications to the Manager shall be addressed to the Manager at the address beneath the Manager's name on the signature page of this Agreement. Notices, offers or other communications to the Member shall be addressed to the Member at the address beneath the Manager's name on the signature page of this Agreement. Either the Member or Manager may

change its address for all future notices, offers or other communications by giving notice to the other stating its new address.

- 16.2 <u>Successors</u>. This Agreement and all the terms and provisions hereof shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Member and its legal representatives, heirs, successors and permitted assigns, except as expressly herein otherwise provided.
- 16.3 <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be construed in conformity with the laws of the State of Illinois, as applied to agreements whose only parties are residents of such state and which are to be performed entirely within such state.
- 16.4 <u>Personal Jurisdiction</u>. The Company, the Manager and each Member hereby irrevocably consent to the jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division or in the Circuit Court of Cook County for purposes of any litigation among or between the Company, the Manager and the Member concerning the Company or this Agreement. In any such proceeding, the Company, the Manager and the Member shall be deemed to have waived its right to a trial by jury. The parties hereto hereby individually agree that they shall not assert any claim that they are not subject to the jurisdiction of such courts, that the venue is improper, that the forum is inconvenient or any similar objection, claim or arguments. Service of process on any of the parties hereto with regard to any such action may be made by mailing the process to such person by regular or certified mail to the address of such person set forth herein or to any subsequent address to which notices shall be sent.
- 16.5 <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 16.6 <u>Pronouns and Headings</u>. As used herein, all pronouns shall include the masculine, feminine, neuter, singular and plural thereof wherever the context and facts require such construction. The headings, titles and subtitles herein are inserted for convenience of reference only and are to be ignored in any construction of the provisions hereof.
- 16.7 <u>Entire Understanding</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding among the Member and supersedes any prior understanding and/or written or oral agreements among them with respect to the Company.
- 16.8 <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement, or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other then those to which it is held invalid by such court, shall not be affected thereby.

MANAGER

We propose rezoning 2380 Highland to R-5; subdividing into three single-family lots.

The North side of Highland Rd. and the subdivision behind on Farmington Rd. and Auburn Ln. are zoned R-5.

We plan homes between 2,500 and 3,500 square feet. Homes will be designed for both families with children and empty-nester living. All homes will include full basements with two or three car garages.

Engineering Review Comments

1. Plat - Dimensions on plat are consistent with what is expected. We do not need a development agreement, however the storm water detention area needs to be called out as owned and maintained by the respective lot owners. Additionally, a similar note shall be included on the plan set. (Must Be Addressed Prior to Plan Commission) Response:

"To Be Maintained By Owner" note was added to the Plat and Plat Exhibit and similar note will be added to the engineering plan set.

2. Plat Exhibit - Include the sidewalk continuation on the Plat exhibit (Must Be Addressed Prior to Plan Commission)

Response: Walk continuation was added to the Plat Exhibit.

3. Sidewalks - The sidewalk shall be comprised of five inches (5") of Class "SI" concrete, six inches (6") across the driveway, over a three-inch (3") CA-6 stone base. The sidewalk should drain at a 1/4" per foot towards the roadway.

As Plans develop, the developer will be required to install sidewalk along Highland Drive and include in their plat of dedication to provide connectivity with the existing sidewalk to the west.

<u>Response:</u> Understood that the Highland Drive walk to have connectivity with existing walk to the west.

- 4. IDOT permit A permit will be required from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for all work within the IDOT right-of-way (R.O.W.). As plans develop level of impact onto Pfingsten will dictate whether an IDOT permit is required. Contact IDOT District One office at (847)705-4401 for permit submittal instructions. Please furnish the Engineering Department with a copy of all your correspondence with IDOT and note on the Plan that the Contractor will not begin work within the R.O.W. until a permit is received. Response: Understood that an IDOT permit may be required before Pfingsten R-O-W work can begin.
- 5. Unimproved streets Additional elevations will be required for the existing roadside ditch system. Invert elevations should be obtained for at least three downstream driveway culverts along with intermediate flow line elevations for the ditch itself. The elevations can be submitted in tabular form along with a rough sketch. This information will be helpful in determining if the existing ditch system can adequately convey the runoff from the larger sized home or if minor improvements will be necessary.

 Response: Understood that the existing Highland north ditch and culvert drainage system is to be evaluated.
- 6. Silt control fencing Indicate on the Plan by note and leader that silt control fencing will be installed along all perimeter lot lines e prior to the start of construction. In addition, include a detail to ensure proper installation of the fencing.

7. Sanitary - The proposed sanitary service shall consist of 4" PVC SDR 26 pipe conforming to ASTM D-3034 with gasket joints conforming to ASTM D-3212 and connection to existing main line sewer shall be made with a Sewer Tap machine w/ Hub-Tee and stainless steel saddle.

Response: Understood the use of 4" dia. PVC-SDR-26 pipe having ASTM D-3034 gasket joints conforming to ASTM D-3212 and use of sewer tap machine connect with Hub-Tee and stainless steel saddle.

8. Lot grading - Include an additional note to specify that the Owner must furnish the Engineering Department with an "As-Built" Site Plan certified from the original plan preparer stating that the finished lot grades, drainage pattern, utilities and impervious coverage calculations conform to the approved Site Plan prior to the issuance of the Temporary Occupancy Permit and release of the Engineering Department Escrow.

<u>Response:</u> Understood of requirements for As-built Drawings and conformance to approved Site plan prior to Temp. Occupancy Permit issuance and release of Eng. Dept. Escrow.

9. Impervious Coverage Calculations: - Detailed impervious coverage calculations provided in a tabular format of both existing and proposed conditions with delineation of the resulting net increase. As requested, Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) has reviewed the Preliminary Kogen Friedman Development Subdivision Plat prepared by Norman J. Toberman and Associates and dated November 15, 2023. This review is intended to serve as a "high level review" and additional comments may be generated once the full submittal is made. The following comments are provided at this time:

- 1. The existing address is zoned in the R-1 classification. The subdivision is seeking to be reclassified to R-5 classification. Approval will be required. (*Understood*)
- 2. The Cook County GIS and Northbrook GIS both indicate that the lot includes a panhandle along the north property line of 2500 Pfingsten Rd. that is not shown on the submitted Plat of Survey or Plat of Subdivision. Was this panhandle previously removed from this parcel or will this panhandle be included in the subdivision? (The panhandle was previously removed from the parcel)
- 3. The proposed subdivision will dedicate a 33-foot half right of way. This is in compliance with Village Standards, presuming Highland Road is classified as a neighborhood collector. (Understood the required dedication of 33-foot half of right-of-way)
- 4. We presume that watermain, sanitary sewer and storm sewer are available on the lot frontage. (The subdivision will provide for water and sanitary sewer services as well as storm sewer for each lot.)
- 5. The subdivision will be required to provide the required School and Park land donations. We presume that cash in lieu of land will be acceptable. (Yes)

Dear Mr. Bielak:

The purpose of this letter is to summarize a Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. (CBBEL) preliminary stormwater/floodplain review for the proposed 3-lot residential subdivision located at 2830 Highland Road in the Village of Northbrook (Village).

We received the following stormwater related items for review:

- Subdivision Plat Exhibit, prepared by Norman J. Toberman & Associates, LLC, dated February 13, 2024.
- Project narrative, prepared by KZF Venture Group, LLC, dated February 16, 2024.

CBBEL has reviewed the above information with respect to the Village Ordinances, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO), and standard engineering methods. Based on our review of this information, we offer the following comments:

- 1) The current parcel size is listed as 42,558 SF (0.98 acres) per the Cook County GIS viewer. Residential subdivisions involving property holdings ≤ 1 ære are exempt from the stormwater requirements of the WMO. The installation of sanitary services for singlæfnily homes is not considered qualified sewer construction under the WMO, however, any proposed public sanitary sewer will require a Watershed Management Permit (WMP) from MWRD. (Agreed that no extension of public sanitary sewer is being proposed)
- 2) The Subdivision Plat Exhibit shows stormwater detention facilities on each of the three proposed residential lots to meet the Village's requirements. A detailed review of the proposed drainage system will be performed once engineering plans have been developed for the project. We offer the following comments for the applicant's use as the design advances:

- a) From the provided information, it appears the land area allocated for the required volume is reasonable based on the Village's stormwater detention requirements. Detailed calculations supporting the required/provided volumes will be required at the permitting stage of the project. (Understood that detailed storm water calculations required for permitting)
- b) Ensure there is an emergency overflow mechanism (either internal baffle wall within outlet control structure or traditional overland flow route) for the proposed detention system. (*Emergency overflow will be provided*)
- c) The proposed storm sewer transitions from a 24-inch RCP to a 15-inch RCP before ultimately connecting to the existing 18-inch Pfingsten storm sewer. The storm sewer sizing should be revisited and verified as the engineering advances.
- d) Ensure that the existing drainage within the northern ROW is being captured by the proposed drainage system. (*Drainage will be provided*)
- 3) According to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), there is not mapped floodplain associated with the subject property. Additionally, based on discussions with Village staff, there are no known drainage issues in the vicinity either. (*Agreed*)

Northbrook's Climate Action Plan (CAP) calls to foster sustainability and reduce 80% of community-wide carbon emissions by 2050 through strategic planning and action item implementation. With CAP adoption, development proposals are reviewed with respect to best environmental practices. Applicable action items from the CAP are listed below for all parties to consider during the preliminary review.

(1) WASTE MANAGEMENT

1A: Cook County's Demolition Debris Diversion Ordinance requires all demolitions to divert 70% of debris from landfills through recycling. Applicant should provide statement as to how they plan to meet Cook County Demolition Diversion compliance.

*Response: We will be working with licensed contractors that will follow all of the Cook County Diversion & Demolition ordnances; as well as follow all engineering requirements noted for work that is required on this site.

(2) WATER AND WASTEWATER

2A: Prioritize mitigating storm water before it enters the sewer system through a combination of overland flow, detention, and green infrastructure infiltration strategies (for example, permeable paving or replacement of turf with native landscaping).

*Response: All storm water mitigation will be per engineering plans and specifications

(3) GREENSPACE AND TREE CANOPY

3A: Include a detailed landscape plan with species listing and maintenance plan. Include a column next to plant species specifying whether or not the plant is native to our region. Strive for inclusion of least 75% natives. Consider eco-grass alternatives to traditional turf grass such as ryes, sedges, and fescues.

 Response: Each individual lot will be landscaped specifically to the layout of the home; we will strive for at least 75% native plants. Landscaping will be directed buy the buyer at the time of sale.

- <u>Plat of Subdivision</u>: The Plat of Subdivision is missing multiple signature blocks including the Owner, Engineer, Village President, Plan Commission, Village Treasurer and Village Engineer. <u>All signature blocks are attached</u>
- Common Area: Based on the Plat of Subdivision it does not appear that there are any common areas that are shared between the three parcels. Please confirm. If there is any common area, an Declaration of Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions or other similar document will be required which delegates responsibility for the common areas (e.g. maintenance, ownership, payment of taxes, etc.). there are no common areas

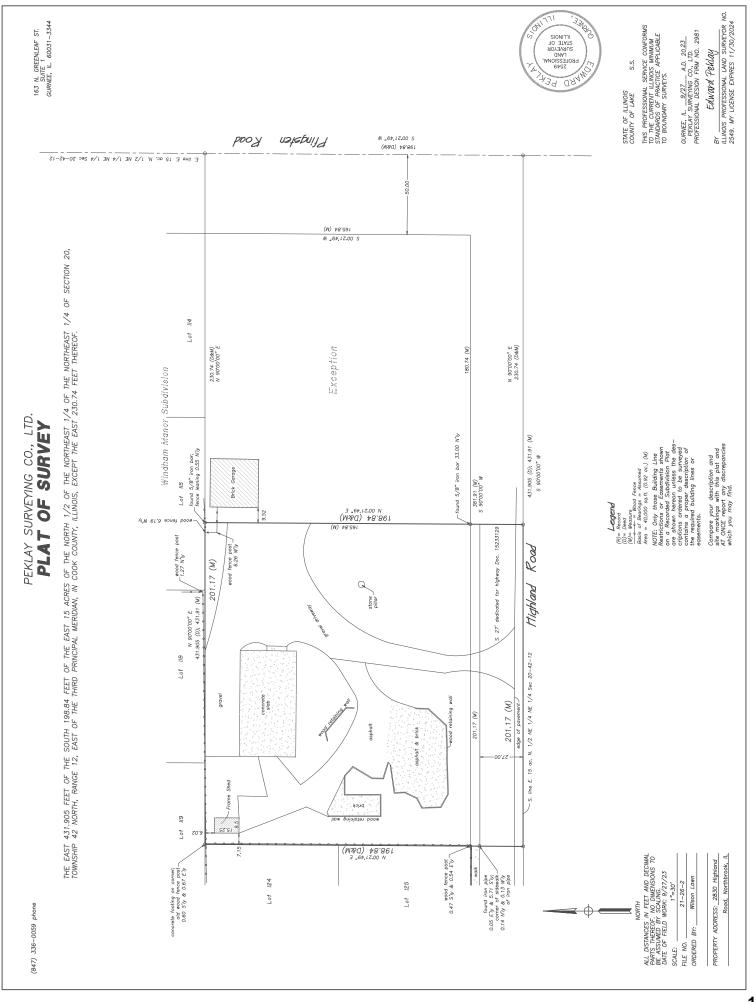

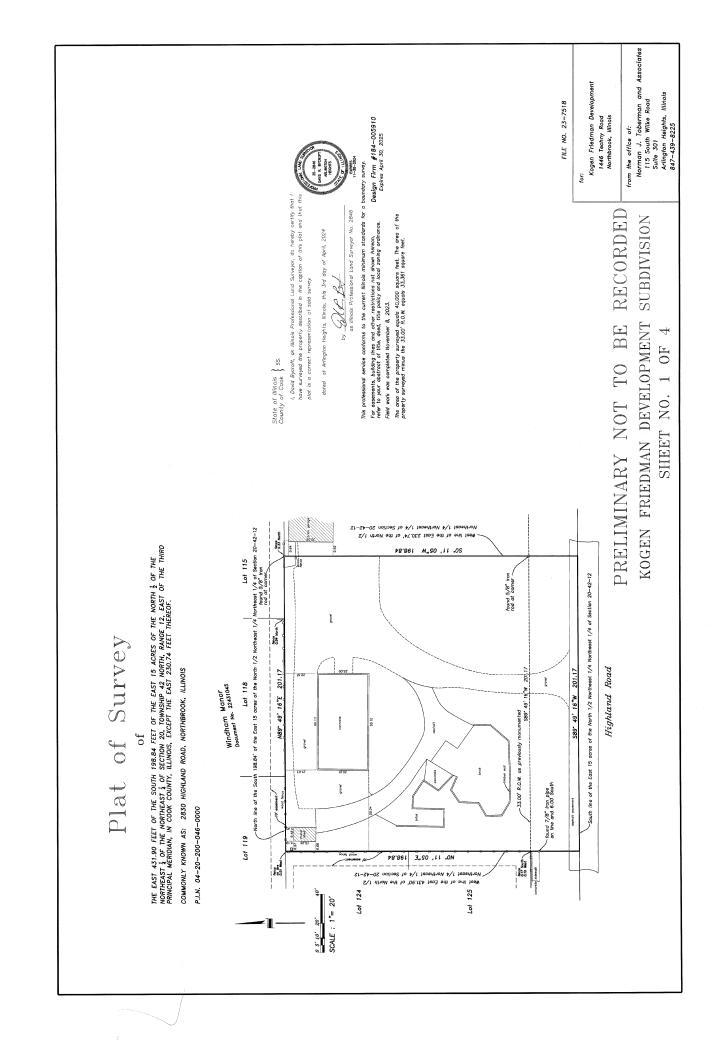

TREES, SHRUBS, FENCES AND NORMAL LANDSCAPE PLANTING SHALL BE PERMITTED WITHIN THE STORM WATER DETENTION AREA ONLY WITH THE PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL OF THE VILLAGE MANAGER OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTHBROOK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "VILLAGE"). THE ASSOCIATION SHALL MAINTAIN A GRASS COVER ON THE SURFACE OF THE STORM WATER DETENTION AREA AND SHALL KEEP SUCH GRASS IN A NEAT AND TRIMMED CONDITION.

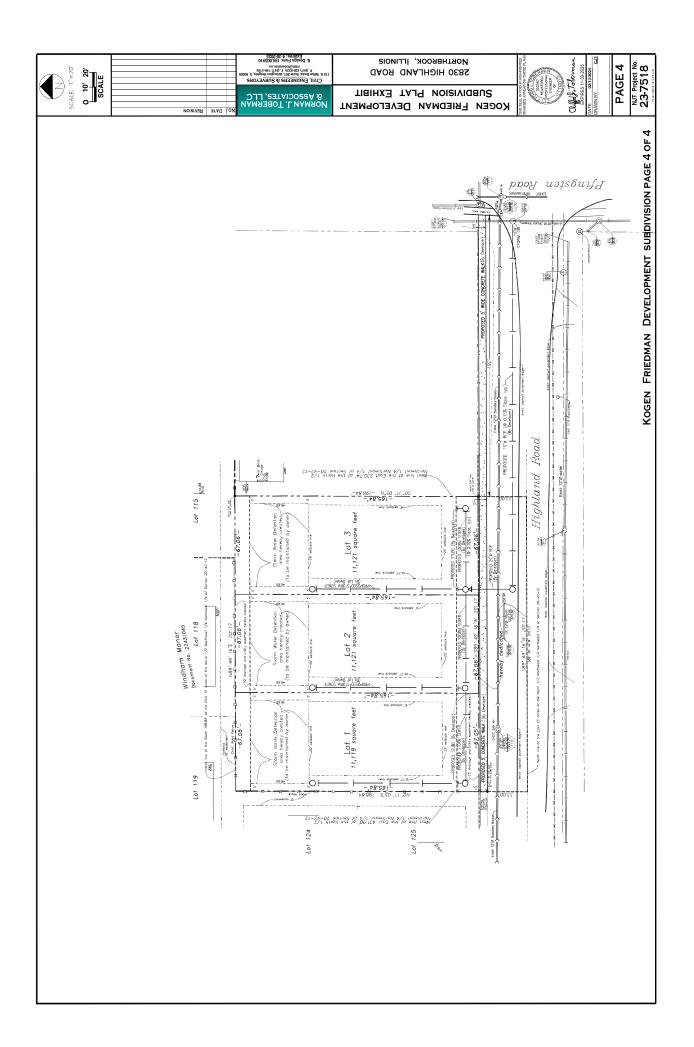

Findings.

- A) <u>Comprehensive Plan Compliance</u>. The Northbrook Plan Commission does hereby find that with respect to Docket No. PCD-24-05, the proposed application is in general compliance with the Northbrook Comprehensive Plan, and specifically in compliance with the Future Land Use Map.
- B) Zoning Map Amendment. With respect to Docket No. PCD-24-05A, the Plan Commission hereby finds that the Applicant's request to rezone the Subject Property from R-1 Single Family Residential to R-5 Single Family Residential District is consistent with the Northbrook Comprehensive Plan, as amended, and does comply with the standards for approval of such rezoning requests as established in Subsection 11-301 E(8) of the Northbrook Zoning Code.

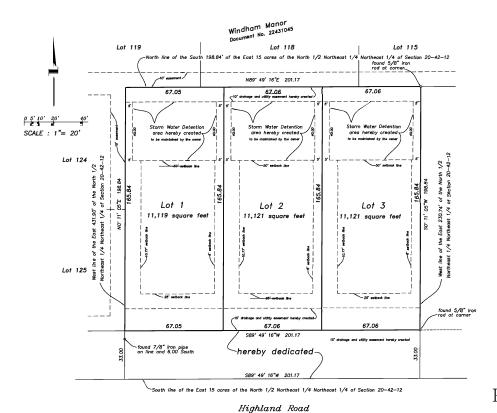

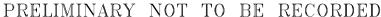

INTRODUCTION

On May 21, 2024 the Plan Commission will conduct the first public hearing on an application filed by KZF Venture Group LLC (the "Applicant") as owner of 2830 Highland Road (the "Subject Property"), for the purpose of authorizing the following zoning relief to allow a three-lot single family residential subdivision:

- A. Rezone R-1 Single Family Residential to R-5 Single Family Residential District;
- B. Variation of the Subdivision Code to allow a combined tentative and final plat of subdivision for a three-lot subdivision;
- C. Variation of the Subdivision Code to allow detention in an easement rather than an outlot; and
- D. Approval of any other such variations, waivers, and zoning relief as may be necessary to accomplish development and use of the Subject Property as requested by the Applicant.

A sign has been posted on the Subject Property indicating the time and date of the Plan Commission public hearing. The Applicant has submitted evidence that the mailed notice requirements of the Zoning Code have been satisfied. The Plan Commission hearing was properly noticed in the May 2, 2024 edition of the *Northbrook Star.* To date staff has not received any public comments on the application.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

The Subject Property:

- is located on north side of Highland Road, west of Pfingsten Road;
- is approximately 36,000 square feet in size. The site is currently unoccupied with remnants of accessory structures from the previous use (landscaping company);
- Comprehensive Plan's Future Land Use designation is Single Family;
- is zoned R-1 Single Family Residential;
- is surrounded by R-5 Single-Family Residential zoning to the north and west, and R-1 Single Family Residential to the south and east;
- is not located within the 100-year flood plain; and
- is not located in proximity to any areas identified in the Master Stormwater Management Plan.
- The Village's Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan identifies Pfingsten Road for a sidepath (separate path for pedestrians, bicycles, and other wheeled users) and shall be considered higher priority based on the overall implementation of the plan. There is no bike infrastructure proposed on Highland Road in front of the Subject Property

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- On April 25, 2023, the Subject Property was annexed into the Village of Northbrook. The
 ordinance approving the annexation is attached (Ord. No. 2023-29). Prior to annexation, the
 Subject Property was a former landscape contractor facility in unincorporated Cook County. It is
 unoccupied but has several accessory structures including a shed from the previous use.
- On July 11, 2023, the Subject Property to the east, located at 2500 Pfingsten was annexed into Northbrook as well. It was earlier in unincorporated Cook County. The property is improved with a single family residence which is currently occupied.

Preliminary Review

On January 23, 2024, the Board of Trustees conducted a preliminary review of the request for a rezoning and three-lot subdivision. The Village Board asked some questions and found the request to be appropriate. An excerpt of the Board of Trustees minutes is attached for reference, and the meeting can be viewed on the Village website as well to hear the actual commentary from the Trustees. The proposed plan is in general conformance with the plan presented at preliminary review. The following is a table of the comments made by members of the Board of Trustees:

Staff Review

Prior to scheduling a public hearing the application underwent the standard review process and was reviewed by the following departments/entities:

- Development and Planning Services (Planning & Zoning; Sustainability)
- Engineering & Stormwater Consultant
- Tree Preservation
- Fire
- Police
- Village Attorney

Staff reviewed the application and provided comments and requested revisions and information through the review process. All departments have approved the application to proceed for a public hearing, including the Village Engineer. There are engineering comments pending, which is typical of such single family residential subdivision requests and are reviewed at the time of site work and building permit submittal.

Included with the material submitted by the Applicant are the responses to those questions as well as staff review comments.

Compliance with Village Plans

The Subject Property is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan. There is only one other Village Plan applicable to the Subject Property (Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan) as noted earlier in this memo.

PROPOSED PROJECT

- The Applicant is proposing to rezone the Subject Property from R-1 to R-5 Single Family Residential and subdivide the property to allow a three-lot single family subdivision on the Subject Property.
- The Subject Property would result in three single-family residential lots with detention located on each lot in an easement. All residential lots would be compliant with the bulk standards of the R-5 District. The future proposed new homes for each lot would have to comply with all district setbacks, lot coverage, and FAR standards. All three lots will face Highland Road.
- Based on the proposed lot areas, the maximum allowable floor area ratio (FAR) on the individual lots would be 4,447 square feet (the maximum allowed FAR in all single family residential districts is 40% of the lot area). The Applicant has stated in the attached narrative that the homes proposed for the subdivision would be between 2,500 to 3,500 square feet which is under the maximum allowed size. The Applicant has proposed three different home styles, which includes: (i) ranch; (ii) two-story home with primary bedroom on first floor; and (iii) two-story home with standard layout and all bedrooms on the second floor.
- Each home would have three or four bedrooms, 2-3 car garage, and a full basement. Each home would be reviewed further for all zoning and building requirements at the time of building permit submittal, including design for the front façade to ensure that the homes are not monotonous with one another.
- The Applicant has shown surface stormwater detention area in an easement to be provided in the rear of
 each of the three proposed lots, located on the north side of the Subject Property. The design of the
 stormwater system has been reviewed and approved by the Village Engineer. A stormwater detention
 area in an easement, instead of an outlot requires a variation of the Subdivision Code.
- The Applicant is requesting that the subdivision be processed as a combined tentative and final plat. It is
 typical for small three-lot subdivisions to undergo a combined tentative and final plat approval application
 process rather than the two steps separately, which requires a procedural variation of the Subdivision
 Code.
- The Applicant has stated that there will be no development sign proposed for this subdivision.
- Considering the proposal is for a three-lot residential subdivision, the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance (IHO) is not applicable to the project. New single-family subdivisions with five or less units are not required to provide affordable housing.

ZONING RELIEF

Rezoning

The Applicant is requesting to rezone the Subject Property from R-1 to R-5 Single Family Residential. The R-5 District requires a minimum lot area of 7,500 square feet for interior lots and the proposed subdivision is compliant as each lot is 11,120 square feet. The proposed lots also meet the minimum lot width of 60' per interior lot with 67.05 feet lot width; and 125 feet lot depth with 165.84 feet, in the R-5 District. The proposed lots are all in compliance with the R-5 district minimum and lot widths. The lot coverage and floor area ratio per lot would be assessed as each lot is developed with a specific home at the time of building permit.

Combined Tentative and Final Plat of Subdivision Approval

The Applicant is requesting a resubdivision of the Subject Property to allow for one single family lot to be three lots of record. The proposed new lots will be in compliance with the minimum lot area and dimensions of the R-5 district of the zoning code. The Applicant is seeking approval of a combined tentative and final plat at this time, per the requirements of the Subdivision Code.

Variation for Detention in an Easement.

As noted above, the Applicant is seeking approval to subdivide the Subject Property into three lots of record. To accomplish the requested subdivision, the proposed development requires a variation to allow the detention to be placed in an easement rather than an outlot.

A surface stormwater detention area is proposed individually in the rear yard of each zoning lot. The plat shows that an approximately 40'x57' area will be dedicated and maintained by each owner in an easement

for stormwater detention purposes. The detention area will be outside of the ten-foot drainage and utility easement along the rear property line and five-foot away from the interior side property lines, as shown on the Plat. The stormwater easement area will be restricted in terms of constructing any permanent structures or landscape installation. The Village Engineer has approved the proposed stormwater detention design and the Plat of Subdivision.

SUSTAINABILITY

A summary of the Village's Climate Action Plan (CAP) action items as it relates to the development proposal is attached. The attached Sustainability Addendum to this report goes into further detail on CAP items that are relevant to the Subject Property and the proposed plan.

SUMMARY

In reviewing this request, staff suggests the Plan Commission consider the following policy questions:

- 1. Is it appropriate to allow a three-lot subdivision of the Subject Property?
- 2. Is it appropriate to rezone the property from R-1 to R-5 District to allow for three new single-family homes?
- 3. Is it appropriate to grant a variation of the Subdivision Code for the following?
 - a. combined tentative and final plat approval; and
 - b. stormwater detention in an easement on each lot.

Given the limited relief and general direction from the Plan Commission, staff has prepared the attached draft resolution for consideration by the Commission. If the Commission should choose to amend and/or take action on this resolution, it would be **Resolution No. 24-PC-06.**

The Applicant and staff will attend the May 21, 2024 Plan Commission meeting to answer any questions.

Subject: PCD-24-05: 2830 Highland – Rezone and 3-Lot Subdivision

Northbrook's Climate Action Plan (CAP) calls to foster sustainability and reduce 80% of community-wide carbon emissions by 2050 through strategic planning and action item implementation. With CAP adoption, development proposals are reviewed with respect to best environmental practices.

Below are Climate Action Plan items generated from the first review of the Applicant's proposed project. *Items noted in italics are referencing what the Applicant has stated that they intend to include in their proposal.*

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The CAP points to procedures that may facilitate waste reduction (with a goal of at least 50% landfill wasted diverted by 2030) in its Waste Management section:

<u>WM 2-3</u> Reduce construction and demolition waste by ensuring that strong recycling and reuse requirements are met. Compliance with Cook County's construction and demolition requirements to divert 70% of construction debris through recycling is required.

Applicant states that licensed contractors will follow all of the Cook County Diversion and Demolition ordinances.

WATER AND WASTEWATER

In the Water and Wastewater category, the CAP states to prioritize mitigating stormwater before it enters the sewer system through multiple capture techniques:

<u>WW 2-1</u> Prioritize managing stormwater before it enters the sewer system through a combination of overland flow, detention, and infiltration strategies (for example, permeable surfaces)

Applicant states that all storm water mitigation will be per engineering plans and specification.

GREENSPACE

The Plan's Greenspace category includes the following for expansion of tree canopy coverage, transforming beneficial lawns, and mitigation of heat island impacts:

<u>GS 1- 12</u> Promote diversity of native tree cover and performance-based tree island within parking lots with goals on percentage of pavement shaded. Utilize a mix of canopy trees, shrubs, groundcovers, and raingarden components appropriate to the lot and its surroundings.

Applicant states that each individual lot will be landscaped specifically to the layout of the home; striving for at least 75% native plants but, landscaping will be directed by the buyer at the time of sale.

Overview

As discussed at the May 28, 2024 Committee of the Whole, the Village's consultant, paleBLUEdot and the Sustainability Commission has recommended a new set of priority action items. This resolution approves the proposed 2024-2025 CAP Priority Action Items.

Fiscal Impact

The adopted FY25 General Fund budget includes sustainability revenue and expenditures. In the event the Village Board's designated Climate Action Plan (CAP) Priority Items require additional appropriations, staff will prepare a budget amendment.

Recommendation

Background

At the May 28, 2024 Committee of the Whole meeting, the Village's consultant, paleBLUEdot and Sustainability Coordinator Kate Carney presented the 2023 CAP Progress Report and proposed 2024-2025 CAP Priority Action Items.

In general, the 2024-2025 Priorities recommended at that meeting which were proposed by paleBLUEdot and the Village's Sustainability Commission are:

- Increased EV use
- Decreased natural gas consumption
- Increased landfill diversion and overall solid waste reduction
- Understand water use increase and reduction strategies

In addition to the above, the Sustainability Commission recommended two additional work items at their September 21, 2023 meeting:

- Explore additional incentive and educational programs to remove Buckthorn cooperatively with an end period of five years at which time regulatory enforcement is considered
- Create a new World Environment Day celebration outreach event to be held on a

Saturday in June 2025

The action items are detailed fully in the attached Exhibit A.

is hereby adopted, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals.

Northbrook's Climate Action Plan (CAP) calls for fostering sustainability and reducing 80% of community-wide carbon emissions by 2050 through strategic planning and action item implementation. The CAP establishes a goal of reducing local GHG emissions by 35% below 2010 levels by 2030 and 80% below 2010 levels by 2050. Rather than a rigid step-by-step agenda, the strategies and actions set forth in the CAP provide the Village with multiple avenues and options to attain this goal, allowing future Village Boards to prioritize and adjust their response over time.

The purpose of the CAP is to encourage the Village's sustainability initiatives and minimize the generation of GHG emissions from all sources to mitigate and prepare for the effects of climate change. The CAP sets forth a comprehensive set of strategies and over 100 detailed actions that the Village can choose to implement to reduce GHG emissions. After the CAP was first adopted in 2021, the Village Board of Trustees' Community and Sustainability Committee met and established the first set of CAP Top Ten Priorities.

The Village Board, in approving and accepting the 2024-2025 CAP Priority Action Items, recognizes that staff will utilize these actions to inform a workplan and plan outreach and programming efforts.

The President and the Board of Trustees have considered the 2024-2025 CAP Priority Action Items and determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and the public to approve and accept these action items.

Section 2. Approval and Acceptance of the Climate Action Plan.

The Village of Northbrook 2024-2025 Climate Action Plan (CAP) Priority Action Items, a copy of which is attached to, and by this reference made a part of this Resolution as Exhibit A, is hereby approved and accepted.
