The Participating Customers are seeking to purchase renewable energy from renewable resources through Rocky Mountain Power's Utah Electric Service Schedule 32 or Schedule 34 (or any other applicable tariff allowed by Utah laws and regulations).







Solid Waste Challenges



As a result, the existing working cell at Three Mile Landfill has run out of space and will be closed/capped toward the end of 2018. Efforts are underway to expand the landfill through the construction of six new lined cells; however, even with these expansions, the County estimates it has approximately 35 years left of landfill space if nothing is done to change the way the County manages solid waste. County staff estimate that around 80% of what currently goes into the landfill is recyclable materials primarily from the commercial sector. This presents an opportunity to implement programs to divert these materials from the landfill, thereby extending the life of the landfill beyond 35 years (i.e. well into the 2050's).



GUIDE TO YOUR CITY COUNCIL LIAISON

The Park City Council uses Liaisons to participate on select community boards and commissions in order to ensure direct working relationships and interaction with community partners and stakeholders.

The City Council Liaison role is as follows:

- Serves as the primary communication channel between Council and the board/commission;
- Serves as the primary Council contact for the board/commission;
- Assists in fielding questions the board/commission may have about Park City Municipal;
- Keeps fellow Council Members informed of current events and issues of the board/commission;
- Serves as a conduit to keep the board/commission apprised of City projects and decisions that that affects the organization;
- May speak on behalf of Council at a board/commission meeting when a policy decision has been determined by the Council; and
- Unless specified by applicable agreement or governing rules, Liaisons are not voting members of any board/commission

How you can help your City Council Liaison:

- · Send meeting invitations and event information in advance;
- Send an Outlook invitation to help Council members manage their calendars;
- Provide new Council liaisons with an orientation to your Board/Commission and clarify expectations for participation; and
- Consult with your legal counsel to determine how to preserve confidentiality when required or when to exclude Council liaisons from executive discussions which the liaison may be required to share information with the rest of City Council, such as regarding personnel and/or property negotiations with the City
- While you may use your Council Liaison as a conduit to the City, you are still required to work directly with City staff on items like event applications, land use/building permits, and questions that you believe a single department might answer (such as water service to your building). Liaisons are not permitted to represent private interests of third parties, including non-profits, before city departments/agencies.

Important Notes:

- Liaisons provide information and general feedback, not formal policy positions or direction, unless they have Council permission;
- When a liaison sees a City Council agenda item for a board or commission where the liaison may be asked for an feedback, the liaison will usually try to seek input from that Board/Commission; and
- If a new Liaison is needed, the board/commission should make a request to the Mayor or previous Liaison (Council deliberations will follow at the next available Council Meeting).
