Action Requested:

Approve a resolution authorizing the purchase of utility vehicle bucket truck retrofits for up to \$700,000 for planned vehicle replacements V776 and V777.

Report Narrative:

The 2025 Vehicle Replacement Plan includes replacement of two Freightliner Altec aerial bucket trucks (V534 and V535), each more than ten years old. These replacements were included in the 2025 RPU Budget.

Due to long lead times associated with vehicle purchases, the chassis units were ordered in advance and drop-shipped directly to the upfit facility to await installation of the aerial bucket equipment. The aerial buckets will be purchased under the Minnesota State Contract from Altec at a cost of \$340,714.66 each, which is within the budgeted estimate.

The replacement vehicles will be assigned Vehicle Identification Numbers V776 and V777. The chassis units have been purchased and delivered to Altec for upfitting.

This expenditure authorization is being requested due to the extended lead times associated with both the chassis procurement and aerial bucket upfit process. In accordance with established Board authorization policy:

- Budget authorization (appropriation) provides formal approval to include expenditures within the annual budget. For RPU, the annual budget is recommended by the Utility Board and approved by the Rochester Common Council. The aerial bucket truck replacements were included in the 2025 Budget recommended by the Utility Board and approved by the Common Council.
- Expenditure authorization (contracting commitment) is the separate approval required to execute the purchase or contract. The authorization requested in this consent item allows staff to proceed with the procurement and upfitting of the replacement vehicles.

Prior Legislative Actions & Community Engagement:

The resolution approving the 2025 Budget was approved by the Utility Board on October 22, 2024.

Fiscal & Resource Impact:

The cost of these aerial buckets was included in the 2025 budget and the appropriate internal controls on

carryover of that budget amount was carried over to 2026. This expenditure request is not an additional budget request. Properly working aerial bucket trucks are critical to maintaining service reliability levels.

Approve a 2026 budget amendment in the amount of \$1,233,000 to construct a new segment of electrical duct bank south of 2nd Street SW between 12th Avenue SW and 14th Avenue SW to eliminate conflicts with the Link Bus Rapid Transit (LinkBRT) construction project and recommend that the Common Council of the City of Rochester authorize the budget amendment.

Report Narrative:

In 1983, Rochester Public Utilities (RPU) constructed the Cascade Creek duct bank project to provide a dedicated electrical feeder from the Cascade Creek Substation to St. Mary's Hospital and the downtown Rochester area. A portion of this feeder is located along the south side of 2nd Street SW between 12th Avenue SW and 14th Avenue SW, within property owned by Mayo Clinic (St. Mary's Hospital campus). A records search with Olmsted County did not identify a recorded easement for the portion of the duct bank located within the St. Mary's Hospital property.

Construction is currently underway for the LinkBRT project along 2nd Street SW. After bidding the project, the design consultant identified a grade conflict between the existing RPU feeder duct bank and an underground pedestrian tunnel associated with LinkBRT.

The LinkBRT project is funded through a combination of federal, state, and local sources. Project funding includes a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Small Starts grant, Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) funding, and local matching funds that include Destination Medical Center (DMC) General State Infrastructure Aid and State and County Transit Aid.

Although the duct bank has been in place for over 40 years and may potentially have some degree of prescriptive rights associated with its long-term presence on private property, the absence of a recorded easement or other documented property interest means the facility may not clearly possess a compensable property right in its current location. Under federal transportation utility relocation guidelines, reimbursement eligibility generally depends on the utility having a property interest that would be considered compensable in an eminent domain action. In the absence of such documentation, there is a material risk that relocation costs may be deemed ineligible for federal participation.

Accordingly, RPU staff is seeking a budget amendment to fund the reconstruction of the affected segment of the Cascade Creek feeder duct bank located on Mayo Clinic property south of 2nd Street SW between 12th Avenue SW and 14th Avenue SW. The relocation requires construction of a new duct bank and installation of new electrical cables prior to removal of the existing facilities in order to maintain

continuous electrical service to St. Mary's Hospital and the downtown Rochester area.

This financial budget amendment requests Board approval to add funds to the RPU 2026 Electric Utility budget to cover the cost of acquiring the necessary easement and constructing the new duct bank and feeder cables. The estimated cost to acquire the easement, install the new duct bank, and provide the cables and materials is \$1,233,000.

RPU is coordinating with City Administration's request for RPU to build this new segment of electric duct bank so that the existing section can be removed for the LinkBRT construction project.

Prior Legislative Actions & Community Engagement:

Numerous meetings have been held with City employees overseeing the LinkBRT project, consultants designing and supporting the LinkBRT project, consultants designing the new duct system, Mayo Clinic representatives, and personnel from other City departments.

Fiscal & Resource Impact:

Existing RPU internal crew resources and equipment will be utilized to install and terminate the cables in the new duct bank. The approval of this FBA item will result in an increase to the 2026 RPU Electric budget.

Action Requested:

Approve a five-year agreement with Cintas for rental and laundering uniform services for 2026-2031 in the amount up to \$400,000, funded annually through the budget approval process. Authorize the General Manager of Rochester Public Utilities and the City Attorney to finalize the Cintas agreement. Authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the final agreement.

Report Narrative:

RPU requires employees to wear Flame Resistant (FR), Arc-Rated (AR), High-Visibility (Hi-Vis), and non-FR/AR uniforms depending on the employee's job specification. FR/AR uniforms require extra laundry care to preserve the fire-resistant and arc-rated properties of each uniform which ultimately protect employees from electrical hazards. In addition, FR/AR/Hi-Vis uniforms have been deemed personal protective equipment (PPE) by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), which adds to the significance of providing safe and quality uniforms.

The current clothing rental and laundering service contract with City Laundering Company will expire April 30, 2026. Purchasing staff obtained competitive quotes from Cintas, City Laundering, and Vestis. All three proposals received were financially competitive. Past service and repair issues were addressed with each entity. Cintas presented significant improvements in their service process. These improvements include receipt issued of all garments picked up and dropped off, garment damage and repair process, garment replacement procedures and quality of the garments offered. Most of the selected clothes are made by Carhartt and are of high quality.

Based on the Cintas proposal, quality of the garments, service improvements and reference review; staff recommend a five-year contract with Cintas, having an anticipated value of no greater than \$400,000, funded annually through department budgets. The Cintas Workplace Solutions Cooperative Acceptance Agreement includes rates negotiated through Omnia Partners, a public sector purchasing cooperative.

Purchasing will informally extend the City Laundering Company contract for one to two months until all new uniforms can be fitted, obtained, and delivered by Cintas.

Fiscal & Resource Impact:

Uniform rental and laundering are included in the current 2026 - 2027 approved water and electric fund budgets.

By executing this Acceptance Agreement, the Customer identified on Page 1 herein agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth in the Master Agreement as a Participating Public Agency and the terms and conditions set forth in this Acceptance Agreement. 2. **Dispute Resolution – Arbitration and Class Waiver:** This provision shall take precedence over and supersede any contrary or conflicting provision in the Master Agreement.
 - a. **Arbitration Notice:** Customer agrees to the maximum extent permitted by law that any dispute, controversy, or claim arising out of or relating to this Acceptance Agreement (including its enforcement, performance, breach, arbitrability, or interpretation) or to the products or services provided hereunder will be submitted to and resolved by final and binding individual arbitration. ARBITRATION MEANS THAT AN ARBITRATOR, AND NOT A JUDGE OR A JURY, WILL DECIDE THE DISPUTE, CONTROVERSY, OR CLAIM. BY ACCEPTING THESE TERMS, YOU AND CINTAS ARE EACH EXPRESSLY WAIVING THE RIGHT TO A TRIAL BY JURY AND TO PURSUE OR PARTICIPATE IN ANY CLASS ACTION, COLLECTIVE ACTION, OR REPRESENTATIVE CLAIMS OR PROCEEDINGS EITHER IN ARBITRATION OR IN ANY COURT. To the extent a class or collective action or representative claim or proceeding may not be waived, you agree to stay any such actions, claims, and proceedings until after all actions, claims, and proceedings subject to arbitration are fully resolved.
 - b. **Arbitration Procedures:** Any arbitration between Customer and Cintas will be governed by the Commercial Dispute Resolution Procedures and the Supplementary Procedures for Consumer Related Disputes (collectively, "AAA Rules") of the American Arbitration Association ("AAA"), as modified by this Acceptance Agreement, and will be administered by the AAA. The AAA Rules and filing forms are available online at www.adr.org, by calling the AAA at 1-800-778-7879, or by contacting Cintas. Any arbitration hearings will take place in the state in which Customer is located; provided, however, that if the claim is for \$10,000 or less, Customer may choose for the arbitration instead to be conducted: (i) solely on the basis of documents submitted to the arbitrator; or (ii) through a telephonic hearing. The arbitrator must issue a reasoned written decision sufficient to explain the essential findings and conclusions on which the decision and award, if any, are based.
 - c. **Fees:** Arbitration fees will be assessed consistent with the AAA Rules.
 - d. **No Class Actions in Arbitration or in Any Court, No Jury Trial:** CUSTOMER AND CINTAS AGREE THAT, TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, EACH MAY BRING CLAIMS AGAINST THE OTHER ONLY IN THEIR INDIVIDUAL CAPACITIES AND NOT AS A PLAINTIFF OR CLASS MEMBER IN ANY PURPORTED CLASS OR REPRESENTATIVE PROCEEDING, WHETHER IN ARBITRATION OR IN ANY COURT. FURTHER, UNLESS BOTH CUSTOMER AND CINTAS AGREE OTHERWISE, AN ARBITRATOR OR JUDGE MAY NOT CONSOLIDATE MORE THAN ONE PARTICIPATING PUBLIC AGENCY'S CLAIMS AND MAY NOT OTHERWISE PRESIDE OVER ANY FORM OF A REPRESENTATIVE OR CLASS PROCEEDING.
FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBT, CUSTOMER AND CINTAS AGREE TO RESOLVE ANY DISPUTE ON AN INDIVIDUAL, NON-REPRESENTATIVE, NON-CLASS BASIS IN ARBITRATION, BUT IF FOR ANY REASON SUCH DISPUTE PROCEEDS IN COURT, CUSTOMER AND CINTAS AGREE TO WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO HAVE THE DISPUTE PROCEED AS A CLASS ACTION OR IN ANY REPRESENTATIVE CAPACITY WHATSOEVER.  - e. **Enforceability:** If the requirement to submit any and all disputes, controversies, and claims to binding arbitration is found to be unenforceable or contrary to applicable law, the dispute, controversy or claim will be resolved in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State in which the Participating Public Agency exists.
 - f. **Severability:** If any section or provision of this ¶ 2, Dispute Resolution – Arbitration and Class Waiver, is found to be unenforceable or invalid, the parties will substitute an enforceable provision that, to the maximum extent possible under applicable law, preserves the original intentions of the parties, and the remainder will be given full force and effect.
3. **Dispute Resolution – Timing of invoice challenges:** Requests for an invoice adjustment or challenges to invoice amounts must be received by Cintas within 60 days of Customer's receipt of the contested invoice, or any billing dispute is waived. Notification to Cintas of a request for an invoice adjustment must be made in writing and must include the invoice number, disputed amount, and the reason for the disputed charge.
4. In the event of any conflict between this Acceptance Agreement and the Master Agreement, the Master Agreement shall prevail, except to the extent this Acceptance Agreement specifically provides that it is superseding a provision in the Master Agreement.

CINTAS GENERAL SERVICE TERMS SECTION

1. **Prices:** Customer agrees to rent from Cintas, and Cintas agrees to provide to Customer, all of Customer's requirements for uniform rental products and services at the prices listed in the Master Agreement, including annual price adjustments. An amendment to this Acceptance Agreement is not required when pricing in the Master Agreement is updated and adjusted. There will be a minimum charge of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) or 50% of initial invoice (whichever is greater) per delivery (the "Minimum Stop Charge") for each Customer location required to purchase its rental services from Cintas as set forth in this Acceptance Agreement. The Minimum Stop Charge shall supersede any conflicting or different term in the Master Agreement.
2. **Buyback of Non-Standard Garments:** Customer has ordered from Company a garment rental service requiring garments that may not be standard to Company's normal rental product line or include direct embroidery or an unusual emblem placement. Non-standard items will also include standard garments that have been embroidered. Those non-standard products will be designated as such under Garment Description in the Uniform Product Rental Pricing Chart(s). In the event the Customer deletes a non-standard product, alters the design of the non-standard product, fails to renew the Agreement, or terminates the Agreement in whole or in part for any reason, the Customer agrees to buy back all remaining non-standard products allocated to Customer that the Company has in service and out of service at the then current Loss/Damage Replacement Values.
3. **Garments' Lack of Flame Retardant or Acid Resistant Features:** Unless specified otherwise in writing by Cintas, the garments supplied under this Acceptance Agreement are not flame retardant or acid resistant and contain no special flame retardant or acid resistant features. They are not designed for use in areas of flammability risk or where contact with hazardous materials is possible. Flame resistant and acid resistant garments are available from Cintas upon request. Customer warrants that none of the employees for whom garments are supplied pursuant to this Acceptance Agreement require flame retardant or acid resistant clothing.
4. **Logo Mats:** In the event that Customer decides to delete any mat bearing the Customer's logo (Logo Mat) from the rental program, changes the design of the Logo Mats, terminates this Acceptance Agreement for any reason or fails to renew this Acceptance Agreement, the Customer will purchase at the time of deletion, design change or termination, all remaining Logo mats that Cintas has in service and out of service held in inventory at the then current Loss/Damage Replacement Value.
5. **Adding Employees:** Additional employees and merchandise may be added to this Acceptance Agreement at any time upon written or oral request by the Customer to Cintas. Any such additional employees or merchandise shall automatically become a part of and subject to the terms of this Acceptance Agreement. If such employees are employed at a Customer location that is then participating under this Acceptance Agreement, the Customer shall pay Cintas the one-time preparation fee indicated on the Master Agreement and / or outlined above. Customer shall not pay Cintas any one-time preparation fee for garments for employees included in the initial installation of a Customer location. There will be a one-time charge for name and/or company emblems when employees are added to the program in garments requiring emblems.
6. **Emblem Guarantee:** If Customer has requested that Cintas supply emblems designed exclusively for Customer featuring Customer's logo or other specific identification (hereinafter "Customer Emblems"), Cintas will maintain a sufficient quantity of Customer Emblems in inventory to provide for Customer's needs and maintain a low cost per emblem through quantity purchases.
In the event Customer decides to discontinue the use of Customer Emblems, changes the design of the Customer Emblems, terminates this Acceptance Agreement for any reason or fails to renew this Acceptance Agreement, the Customer will purchase at the time of deletion, design change, termination or expiration, all remaining Customer Emblems that Cintas allocated to Customer at the price indicated on the Master Agreement and / or outlined above of this Acceptance Agreement. Schedule 3 shall contain or indicate by reference to a publicly available document the utility's interconnection process, or "distributed generation tariff" adopted in compliance with Minnesota Statutes Section 216B.1611, subd. 3(2), including standard contract forms to be used with customers interconnecting qualifying facilities as well as general technical interconnection and interoperability requirements."

Estimated Marginal Energy Costs

The estimated system average incremental energy costs are calculated by seasonal peak and off-peak periods for each of the next five years. For each seasonal period, system incremental energy costs are averaged during system daily peak hours, system daily off-peak hours, and all hours in the season. The energy costs are increased by a factor equal to 50 percent of the line losses.

The energy needs of Rochester Public Utilities are served through its membership in Southern Minnesota Municipal Power Agency (SMMPA). SMMPA, in turn, is a member of the Midcontinent ISO (MISO). As a result, the municipal’s incremental energy cost is equivalent to the MISO hourly Locational Marginal Price (LMP). Actual hourly LMP will vary significantly based on several parameters such as weather, energy demand, and generation availability. The table above represents a forecast of the MISO hourly LMP values averaged over each specific time period at the MISO Minnesota Hub.

Capacity Payment for Firm Power (Net annual avoided capacity cost)

A capacity payment will be made for energy delivered by the qualifying facility to the utility with at least a 65 percent on-peak capacity factor in the month. The capacity factor is based upon the qualifying facility's maximum on-peak metered capacity delivered to the utility during the month. The capacity component applies only to deliveries during on-peak hours.

Report Narrative:

Management has worked with 1898 & Co. to develop a 20-year financial projection model for the Electric Utility. The purpose of the model is to assess the long-term financial impacts of the Power Supply Resource Plan on the Electric Utility's balance sheet, operating expenses, and ultimately customer rates.

The model results were reviewed with the Board during the July 22, 2025, Board meeting and are intended to provide a long-term planning tool to evaluate financial sustainability as major power supply investments are implemented.

The current 2026 through 2030 budgets and financial projections anticipate the issuance of Electric Enterprise Revenue Bonds in the first quarter of 2027 in the range of \$180 million to \$241 million. The final size of the bond issuance will depend in part on the decision to repair or replace Gas Turbine 1 (30 MW), which was damaged by a fire in July 2025.

To further evaluate the financial implications of this potential debt issuance, Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors has been engaged to analyze the potential impact on both the Electric Enterprise Fund and the City of Rochester's overall financial position.

In 2022, Moody's, one of the two credit rating agencies used by the City and RPU, revised its rating methodology to include enterprise fund revenue debt in the evaluation of municipal credit quality. As a result of this change, the current analysis evaluates both:

- The financial impact of the proposed Electric Enterprise Revenue Bonds, and
- The potential impact on the City's overall bond rating.

The financial model and analysis are based on several key assumptions, including:

- Use of both Moody's and Fitch rating methodologies, recognizing that the two agencies evaluate

municipal and enterprise fund debt differently.

- Financial inputs based on the approved 2025–2030 City and Electric Utility budgets and projections.
- Certain economic variables, such as local economic conditions, held constant using 2024 actual financial data.
- Inclusion of anticipated City debt issuances through 2030.

Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors will present the results of their analysis to the Board.

Prior Legislative Actions & Community Engagement:

July 22, 2025, RPU Board review of 20-year financial projection and sensitivity analysis.

October 28, 2025, RPU Board approved the 2026-2027 Electric Fund operating and capital budgets.

December 1, 2025 City Council approved the 2026-2027 Electric Fund operating and capital budgets.

Fiscal & Resource Impact:

The fiscal impact is reflected in the approved 2026 through 2030 budget and projections.
