San Ysidro Mobility Hub

Introduction

The 2021 Regional Plan includes a connected network of regional Mobility Hubs near major residential, employment, and activity centers. Each Mobility Hub is anchored by high quality transit while providing on-demand mobility options, safe streets, and supporting amenities.

The San Ysidro Port of Entry is the primary gateway between the U.S. and Mexico and one of the busiest border crossings in the world. Nearly one in five people entering the U.S. by land cross through this port of entry. For decades, the adjacent San Ysidro Transit Center (SYTC) has connected the San Ysidro community and cross-border travelers to the rest of the region. Despite being one of the busiest transit centers in the region, the site endures numerous challenges related to safety, connectivity, and the user experience.

The 2021 Regional Plan envisions a future San Ysidro Mobility Hub that will provide a welcoming experience and multiple travel options that better serve the community. SANDAG is leading a planning study that will establish a vision for bringing the San Ysidro Mobility Hub to life.

Discussion

Project Description

SANDAG is taking a two-phased approach to implementing more immediate improvements to the existing SYTC while building towards a long-term vision for the future San Ysidro Mobility Hub.

Phase I focuses on ways to improve the SYTC in the near term (5-10 years) by addressing long-standing challenges impacting pedestrian connectivity, safety, operational capacity, and optimization of the transit center space. SANDAG, in coordination with MTS, the City of San Diego, and Caltrans, are carrying out Phase I activities including development of station performance criteria, preliminary station concepts, and ongoing stakeholder and public engagement.

Phase II builds on these near-term improvements and incorporates a broader array of mobility, design, and land use considerations to develop a vision for a state-of-the-art Mobility Hub to serve San Ysidro.

Next Steps

Phase I planning activities are anticipated to conclude in summer 2023. Planning and outreach activities for Phase II are anticipated to begin late 2023. Staff will provide project updates at future meetings.

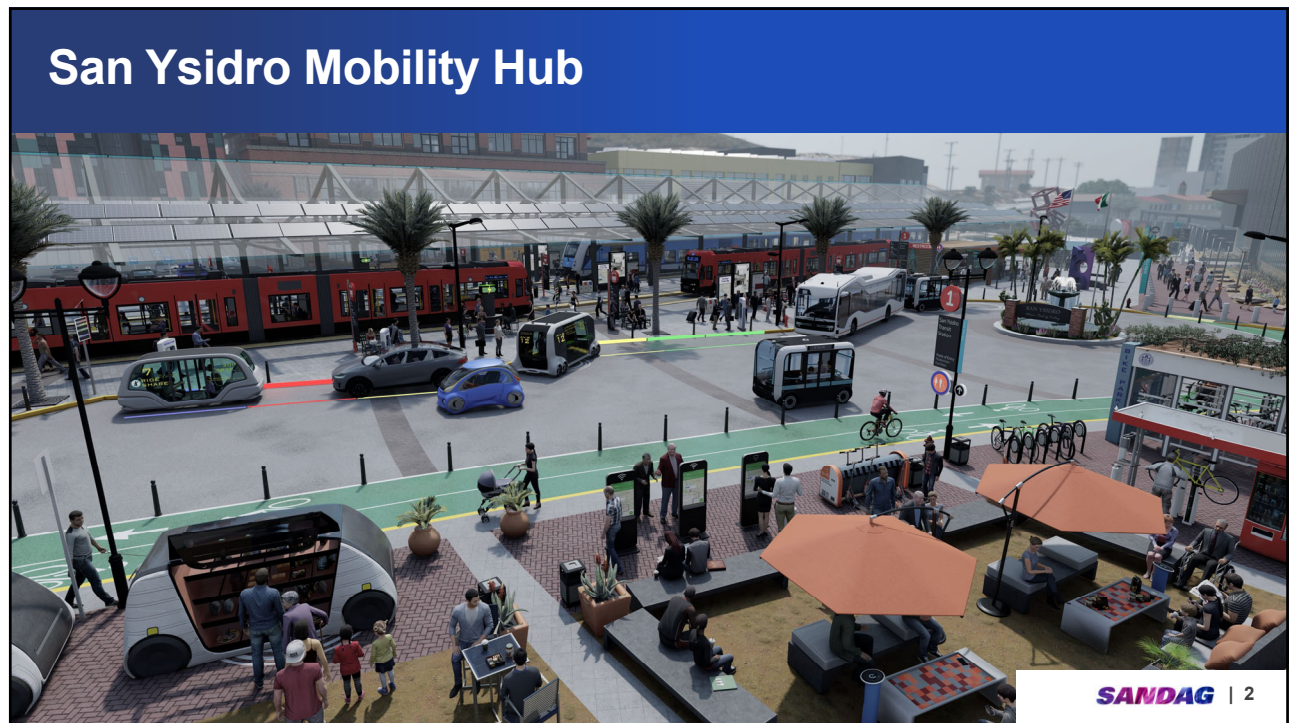

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Challenges Impacting San Ysidro Today

- **Constrained footprint limits capacity** and impairs circulation for transit and other modes
- Various **conflict points** where pedestrians, vehicles, and transit modes converge **impact pedestrian connectivity and safety**
- Configuration of the **space** leads to confusion and is **not optimized** for user experience



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Phased Approach to Future Vision

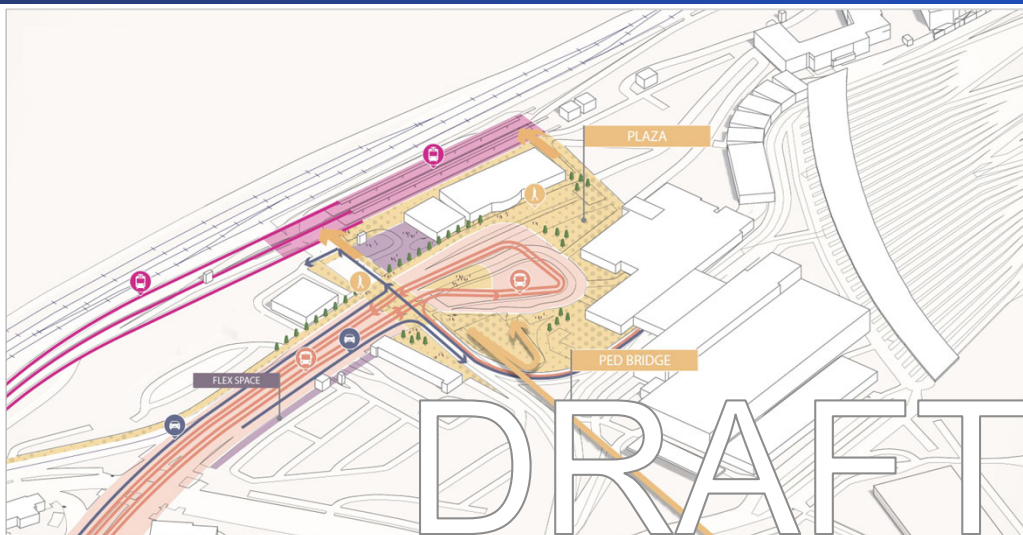

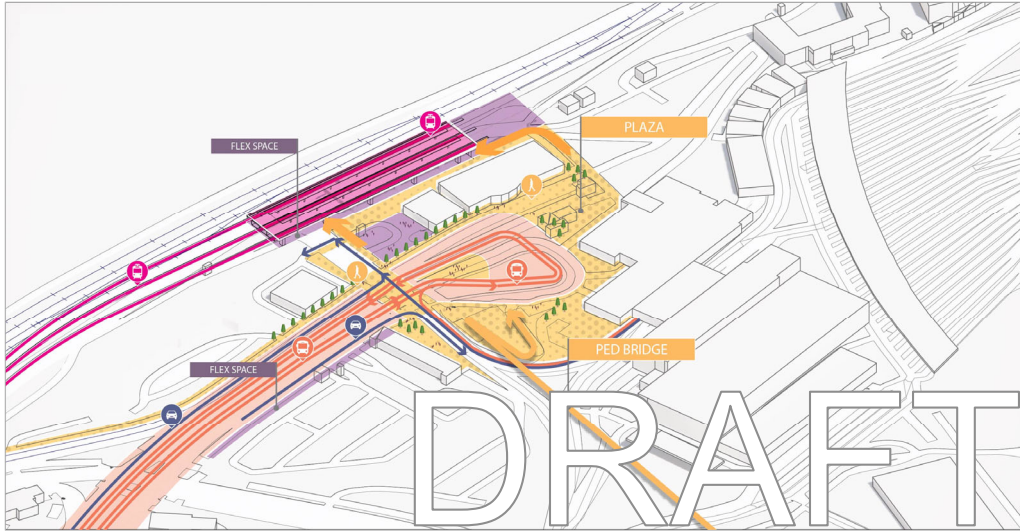
Potential Trolley Configuration

Potential Trolley Configuration

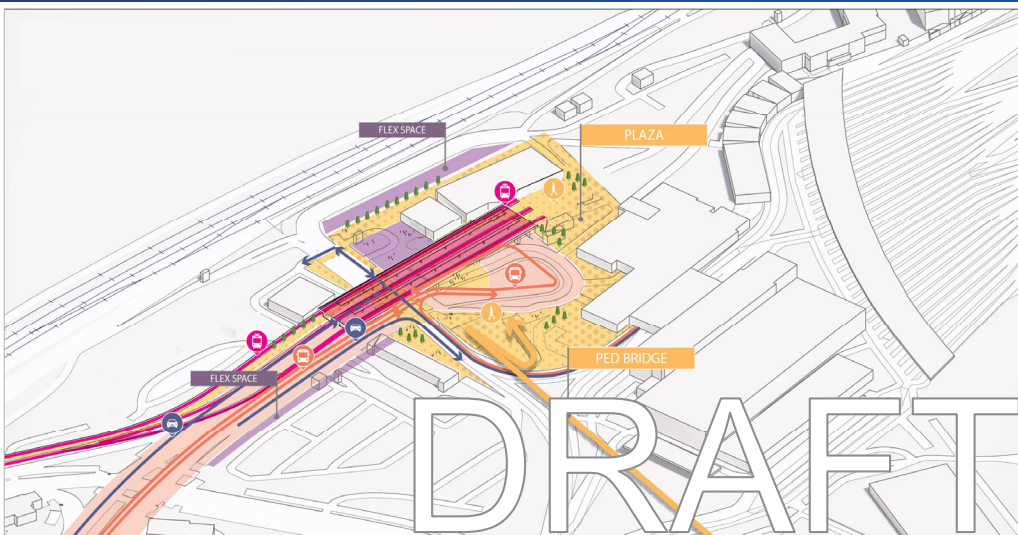

Potential Trolley Configuration

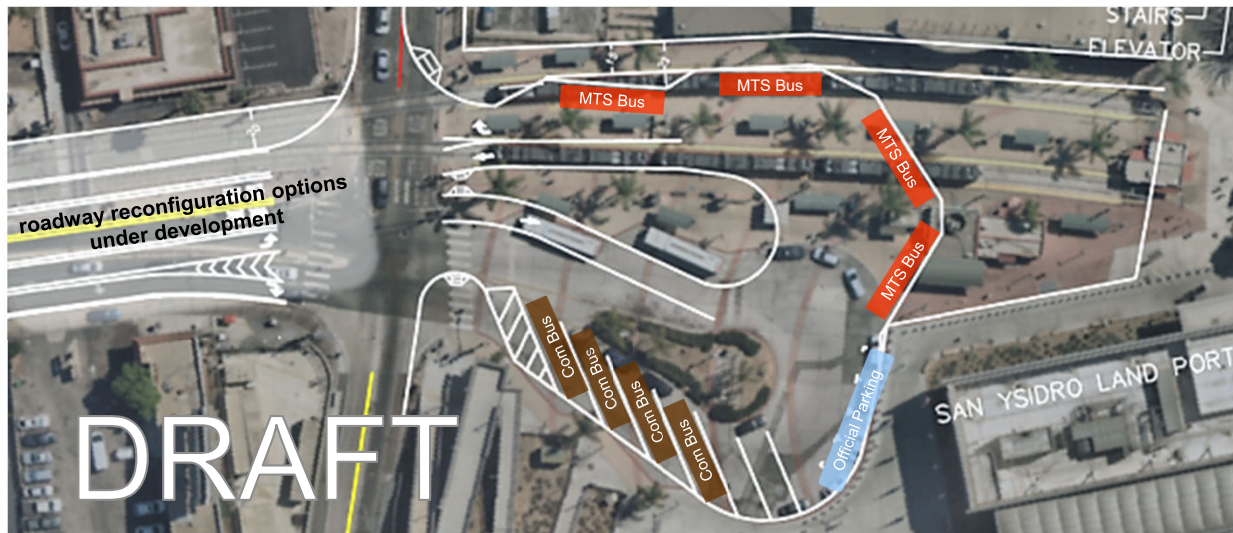


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Studying Options and Layouts

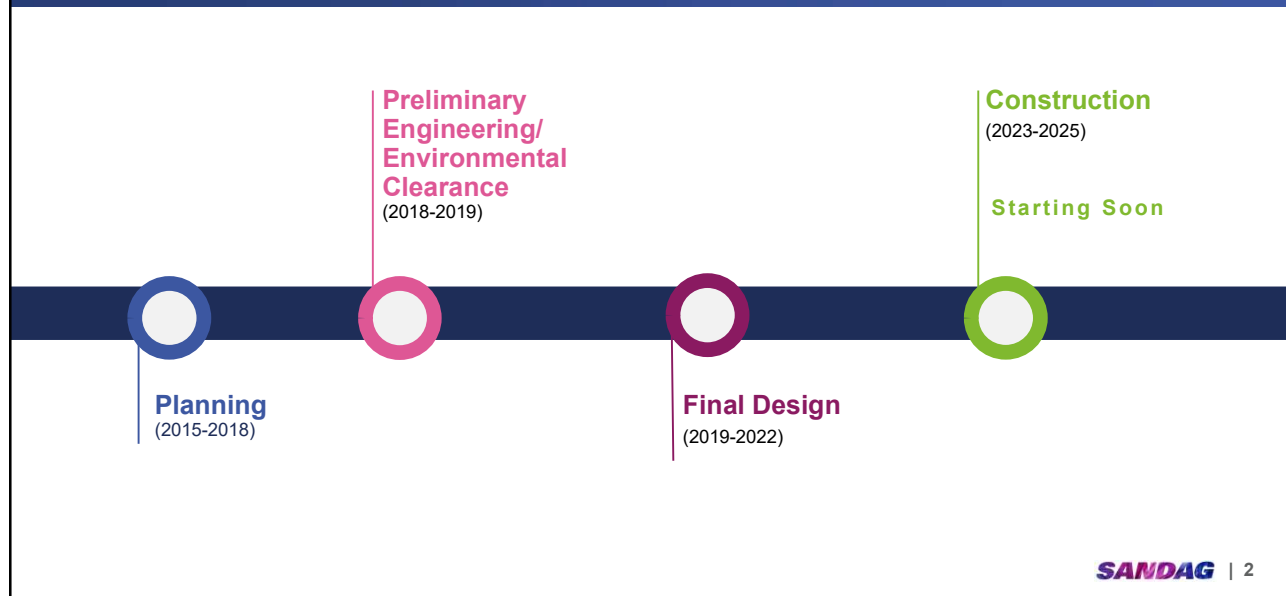

Construction of the Border to Bayshore Bikeway project will begin this month and is anticipated to last approximately 2 years. ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Border to Bayshore Bikeway is a 6.5-mile bikeway that will connect the world's busiest land border crossing at the San Ysidro Port of Entry to the Bayshore Bikeway in Imperial Beach. The project aims to provide safe biking connections within and between the communities of San Ysidro, San Diego, and Imperial Beach. Once complete, the project will provide a vital connection for residents and visitors to travel to and from the Mexican border, helping fulfill the vision laid out in the San Diego Bike Plan Early Action Program (EAP).

Related Project: Construction of the Beyer Boulevard Slope Improvements Project in San Ysidro is expected to begin in July 2023.

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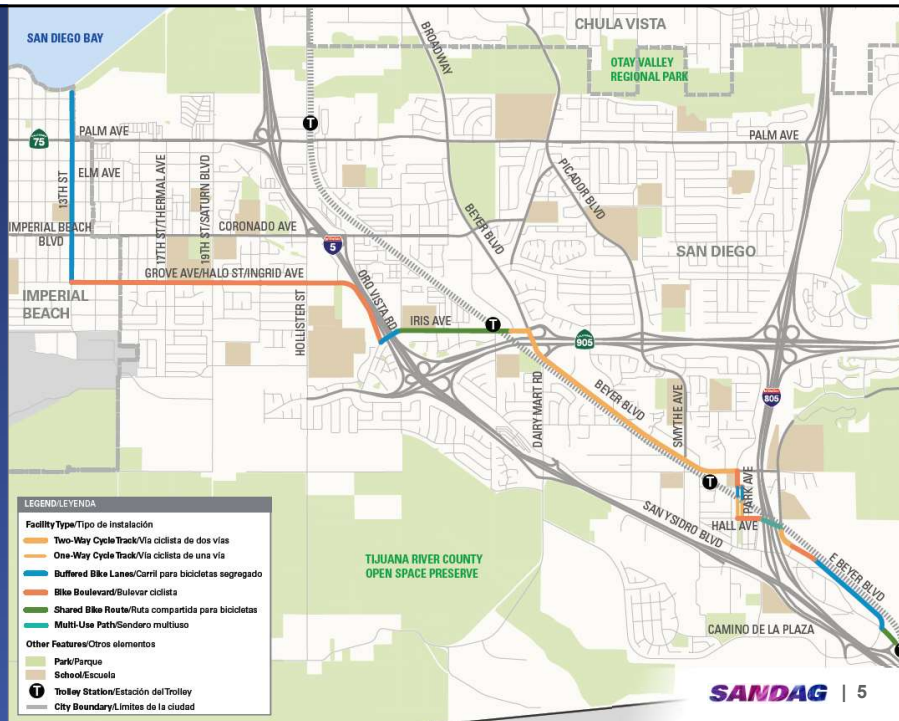

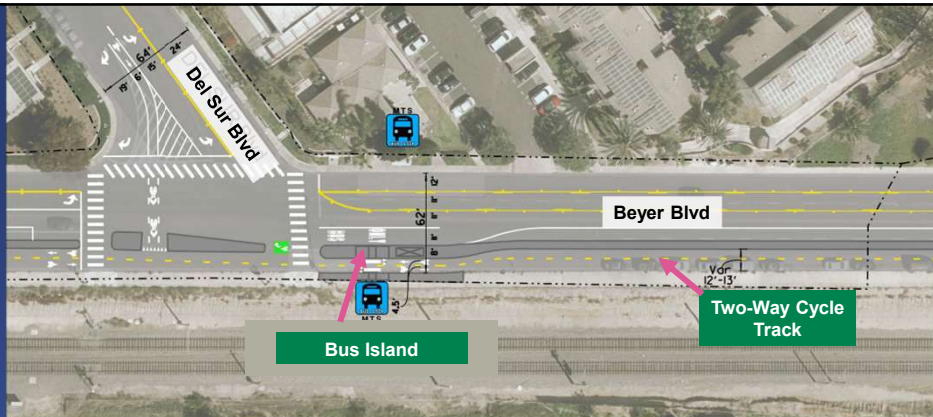

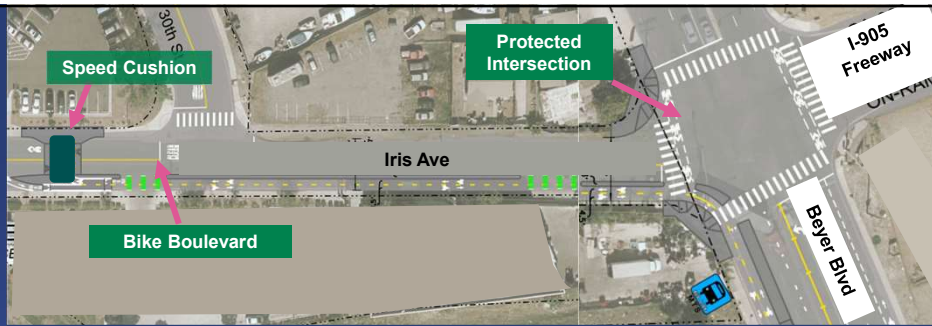

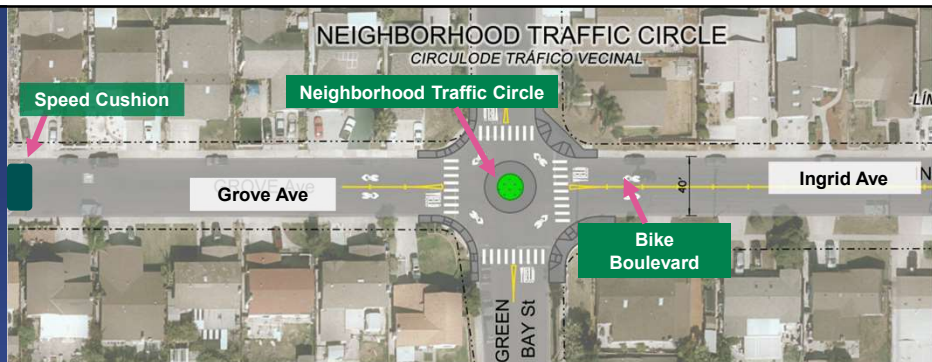
