TransNet Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee: Overview

Overview

In accordance with the TransNet Extension Ordinance (Ordinance), an Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC) was established to provide an enhanced level of accountability for expenditures made under the Expenditure Plan. The ITOC functions in an independent, open, and transparent manner to ensure all voter mandates are carried out as required in the Ordinance and develop constructive recommendations for improvements to the financial integrity and performance of the TransNet program.

The ITOC membership consists of seven voting members, each of whom represents a specified area of expertise intended to provide the skills and experience necessary for ITOC to carry out its

Schedule/Scope Impact:

The ITOC was established as a requirement of the TransNet Extension Ordinance, and its purview is limited to ensuring accountability for expenditures made under the TransNet Expenditure Plan and recommending improvements to the program.

responsibilities. The ITOC has ten primary responsibilities, as outlined in the Ordinance, including conducting both annual fiscal and compliance audits and triennial performance audits of the TransNet program. The ITOC also prepares an annual ITOC report including the results of its audit process in the form of findings and/or recommendations. The most recent annual report, the FY 2022 ITOC Annual Report, was presented to the Board of Directors in July 2022, and the FY 2023 ITOC Annual Report is scheduled to be presented to the Board of Directors in October 2023. Additional information regarding ITOC responsibilities and membership is included in Attachment 1.

Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee Overview

Responsibilities

The Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC) responsibilities will include the following:

- Conduct an annual fiscal and compliance audit of all TransNet-funded activities using the services
 of an independent fiscal auditor to ensure compliance with the voter-approved Ordinance and
 Expenditure Plan.
- Prepare an annual report to the Board of Directors presenting the results of the annual audit process.
- Conduct triennial performance audits of SANDAG and other agencies involved in the implementation
 of TransNet-funded projects and programs to review project delivery, cost control, schedule adherence,
 and related activities.
- Provide recommendations to the Board regarding any proposed amendments to the TransNet Ordinance and Expenditure Plan.
- Provide recommendations as part of the required ten-year review process. This process provides an
 opportunity to undertake a comprehensive review of the TransNet Program every ten years and to
 make recommendations for improving the program over the subsequent ten years.
- Participate in the ongoing refinement of the SANDAG transportation system performance measurement process and the project evaluation criteria used in development of the Regional Transportation Plan and in prioritizing projects for funding in the Regional Transportation Improvement Program.
- On an annual basis, review ongoing SANDAG system performance evaluations, including the "State
 of the Commute" report, and provide an independent analysis of information included in that report.
- Review and comment on the programming of TransNet revenues in the Regional Transportation Improvement Program.
- Review proposed debt financings to ensure that the benefits of the proposed financing for accelerating project delivery, avoiding future cost escalation, and related factors exceed issuance and interest costs.
- Review the major Congestion Relief projects identified in the Ordinance for performance in terms of cost control and schedule adherence on a quarterly basis.

In carrying out its responsibilities, the ITOC shall conduct its reviews in such a manner that does not cause unnecessary project delays, while providing sufficient time to ensure that adequate analysis can be completed to allow the ITOC to make objective recommendations and to provide the public with information about the implementation of the TransNet Program.

Membership

- A professional in the field of municipal/public finance and/or budgeting with a minimum of ten years in a relevant and senior decision-making position in the public or private sector.
- A licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer with demonstrated experience of ten years or more in the fields of transportation and/or urban design in government or the private sector.
- A professional with demonstrated experience of ten years or more in real estate, land economics, and/or right-of-way acquisition.
- A professional with demonstrated experience of ten years or more in the management of largescale construction projects.
- A licensed engineer with appropriate credentials in the field of transportation project design or construction and a minimum of ten years experience in a relevant and senior decision-making position in the government or private sector.
- A chief executive officer or person in a similar senior-level decision-making position of a major private sector employer with demonstrated experience in leading a large organization.
- A professional in biology or environmental science with demonstrated experience of ten years or more with environmental regulations and major project mitigation requirements and/or habitat acquisition and management. *
- * Applications for this position will be considered during the current solicitation process.

Selection Process

A technical screening committee will be established to review applications received from interested individuals. This committee will consist of three members selected by the SANDAG Executive Director from high-level professional staff of local, regional, state, or federal transportation agencies outside of the San Diego region, or from one of the region's colleges or universities in a transportation related field, or a combination thereof. The committee will develop a list of candidates determined to be qualified to serve on ITOC based on the criteria established for the open ITOC position(s). The technical screening committee will recommend two candidates for each open position from the list of qualified candidates for consideration by the Selection Committee.

A selection committee shall be established to select an ITOC member from the list of qualified candidates recommended by the technical screening committee. The selection committee shall consist of the following: two members of the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors; the mayor of the City of San Diego; a mayor from the cities of Chula Vista, Coronado, Imperial Beach, or National City selected by the mayors of those cities; a mayor from the cities of El Cajon, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, or Santee selected by the mayors of those cities; a mayor from the cities of Carlsbad, Del Mar, Encinitas, Oceanside, or Solana Beach selected by the mayors of those cities; and a mayor from the cities of Escondido, Poway, San Marcos, or Vista selected by the mayors of those cities.

Conflict of Interest

ITOC members shall be subject to SANDAG conflict of interest policies. ITOC members shall have no legal action pending against SANDAG and are prohibited from acting in any transactions directly or indirectly involving SANDAG, such as being a consultant to SANDAG or to any party with pending legal actions against SANDAG during their tenure on ITOC. ITOC members also are prohibited from having a direct financial interest or employment with any private entity or public agency division that receives TransNet sales tax funds.

Jonathan is serving in the ITOC position for a professional experienced in real estate and land economics. Les is serving in the ITOC position for a licensed engineer with appropriate credentials in the field of transportation project design or construction and a minimum of ten years of experience in a relevant and senior decision-making position in the government or private sector. He has 40 years of hands-on experience in the management, planning, permitting, and design of both public and private projects from inception through construction. He has a Master's in Business Administration from Chapman University and holds board positions on the local WTS and ACEC chapters. He is a past president of the San Diego Transportation Development Agency and the Society of American Value Engineers. Les enjoys living in North County and works in Mission Valley.

Term Expiring May 2025 Sunnie House

Sunnie is serving in the ITOC position for a chief executive officer or person in a similar senior-level decision-making position, of a major private sector employer with demonstrated experience in leading a large organization. As an executive in operations and business development for large global infrastructure consulting firms for over 23 years, she led diverse teams of professionals in transportation planning, engineering, and program and construction management. Sunnie owns a consulting firm providing management and leadership optimization solutions to public and private organizations to support their growth and success. Sunnie lives and works in Rancho Bernardo area of San Diego.

Pedro Orso-Delgado, Vice Chair

Pedro is serving in the ITOC position for a professional in the management of large-scale construction projects. Mr. Orso-Delgado is the principal of his own consulting firm, Under Construction. He served in the capacity of City Manager for the City of Santee from May 2014 to July 2015 and was named the City of Santee's Deputy City Manager/Director of Development Services in August 2009. In addition, Mr. Orso-Delgado had a 25-year career at Caltrans serving in several capacities, including as the District 11 Director from 2001 through 2009. Mr. Orso-Delgado served as the chair of the Border Governors Infrastructure working table and led the Caltrans team which applied for and within record time obtained the presidential permit for the new border crossing at Otay Mesa II. He currently serves as Advisor to the College of Engineering Board at San Diego State University, is a Commissioner at the Safety Commission for the City of Chula Vista, and is a Board member at Circulate San Diego. Mr. Orso-Delgado is a San Diego native, attended schools in both San Diego and Tijuana, Mexico. He graduated from San Diego State University in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering and began his career with Caltrans in 1984. Mr. OrsoDelgado currently lives in the south bay community of Chula Vista.

TransNet Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee: Appointment of Members

Overview

The membership of ITOC consists of seven voting members, each of whom represents a specified area of expertise. The position for a licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer became vacant in May 2023.

Key Considerations

The ITOC selection process consists of two steps:

- 1. Review by a Technical Screening Committee, responsible for reviewing applications received from interested individuals and recommending two candidates for each position.
- 2. Approval by a Selection Committee responsible for selecting the ITOC member from the list of qualified candidates recommended by the Technical Screening Committee.

Consistent with the TransNet Extension Ordinance, the Technical Screening Committee reviewed all applications received. The Technical Screening

Action: **Appoint**

The Selection Committee is asked to consider appointment of one ITOC member in the licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer, for a term of up to three years, through May 2026.

Fiscal Impact:

Consistent with TransNet Extension Ordinance provisions, ITOC members shall serve without compensation except for direct expenses (parking/mileage for attendance at meetings) related to the work of the ITOC.

Schedule/Scope Impact:

The position for a licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer became vacant in May 2023. If approved, the newly selected member is anticipated to begin serving in October 2023.

Committee's recommendation memo and the applications for each recommended candidate are included as Attachments 1 and 2, respectively. Additional information regarding the selection process is included in Attachment 3.

The candidates recommended for consideration by the Technical Screening Committee have been notified of the September 29, 2023, Selection Committee meeting and are anticipated to participate in the meeting.

Next Steps

Following the Selection Committee's consideration, all applicants will be notified of the final selection results. The successful candidate for the position of licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer is anticipated to begin serving in October 2023. Should the Selection Committee be unable to reach an agreement on a candidate from the qualified candidates recommended by the Technical Screening Committee, the Selection Committee will request that the Technical Screening Committee recommend two additional qualified candidates for consideration, and the same selection process outlined above for new members will be initiated.

As required by the TransNet Extension Ordinance, a Technical Screening Committee composed of the following members was formed to provide recommendations to the Selection Committee regarding candidates for ITOC:

- Darin Chidsey, Chief Operating Officer, Southern California Association of Governments
- Wm. Joel King, Assistant Vice Chancellor, Campus Architect, UC San Diego
- Kristina Svensk, Director of Transportation, Sacramento Area Council of Governments

Request for Appointment

Consistent with the TransNet Extension Ordinance, the Technical Screening Committee met via MS Teams on June 28, 2023, to discuss candidate applications.

A total of two applications were received for one position:

A licensed architect, civil engineer or traffic engineer with demonstrated experience of ten years or more in the fields of transportation and/or urban design in government or the private sector.

The Technical Screening Committee commented on the well qualified applications received from both candidates. In its review, the Screening Committee considered factors such as the applicant's quality of the responses to the questions in the application, the depth of experience of each applicant, the level of demonstrated understanding of the role of ITOC, and the type of skills that the applicant would bring to ITOC.

Consistent with Ordinance provisions, the Technical Screening Committee recommends two candidates for the professional licensed architect, civil engineer or traffic engineer be advanced for consideration by the Selection Committee based on their qualifications.

The candidates for the Licensed Architect, Civil Engineer or Traffic Engineer are:

Franciso Rivera – Technical Screening Committee members considered Mr.
 Rivera's extensive experience working in numerous technical and managerial

- engineering positions with the City of Chula Vista. In addition, the Committee considered Mr. Rivera's affiliation with various professional associations.
- Brian Stephenson Technical Screening Committee members considered Mr. Stephenson's substantial experience working in various project management and engineering positions for the private and public sector. The committee also considered Mr. Stephenson's membership in multiple professional organizations.

Conflicts of Interest Review

An applicant's affiliations with business entities may present potential conflicts of interest should they be appointed. Based on SANDAG Board Policy No. 31, as well as guidance from SANDAG's Office of General Counsel (OGC), staff noted that the possibility of a potential conflict of interest does not automatically require disqualification of an applicant.

Discussion Memo

Background

In accordance with the TransNet Extension Ordinance, an Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC) was established to provide an enhanced level of accountability for expenditures made under the Expenditure Plan. The ITOC functions in an independent, open, and transparent manner to ensure all voter mandates are carried out as required in the Ordinance, and to develop constructive recommendations for improvements to the financial integrity and performance of the TransNet program.

The membership of the ITOC consists of seven voting members, each of whom represents a specified area of expertise. The position for a licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer became vacant in May 2023.

Selection Process

The ITOC selection process consists of two steps pursuant to the TransNet Extension Ordinance. First, the Technical Screening Committee reviews applications and recommends candidates for each position. Second, the Selection Committee is asked to consider applications for each position based on recommendations provided by the Technical Screening Committee.

The TransNet Extension Ordinance states:

- 1. Technical Screening Committee: A technical screening committee will be established to review applications received from interested individuals. This committee will consist of three members selected by the Executive Director from high-level professional staff of local, regional, state, or federal transportation agencies outside of the San Diego region, or from one of the region's colleges or universities in a transportation-related field, or a combination thereof. The committee will develop a list of candidates determined to be qualified to serve on the ITOC based on the criteria established for the open position(s) on the ITOC. The Technical Screening Committee will recommend two candidates for each open position from the list of qualified candidates for consideration by the Selection Committee. The recommendations shall be made within 30 days of the noticed closing date for applications.
- 2. Selection Committee: A selection committee shall be established to select the ITOC members from the list of qualified candidates recommended by the Technical Screening Committee. The Selection Committee shall consist of the following:
 - Two members of the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors
 - The Mayor of the City of San Diego
 - A mayor from the cities of Chula Vista, Coronado, Imperial Beach, or National City selected by the mayors of those cities.
 - A mayor from the cities of El Cajon, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, or Santee selected by the mayors of those cities.
 - A mayor from the cities of Carlsbad, Del Mar, Encinitas, Oceanside, or Solana Beach selected by the mayors of those cities.
 - A mayor from the cities of Escondido, Poway, San Marcos, or Vista selected by the mayors of those cities.

The selection of ITOC members shall be made within 30 days of the receipt of recommendations from the Technical Screening Committee. All meetings of the Selection Committee shall be publicly noticed and conducted in full compliance with the requirements of the Brown Act. Should the Selection Committee be unable to reach an agreement on a candidate from the gualified candidates recommended by the

Technical Screening Committee, the Selection Committee will request that the Technical Screening Committee recommend two additional qualified candidates for consideration, and the same selection process outlined above for new members will be initiated.

Technical Screening Recommendations

Request for Appointment

Following the original solicitation for the position, two applications were considered for the following publicly noticed ITOC position:

A licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer with demonstrated experience of ten years or more in the fields of transportation and/or urban design in government or the private sector.

Consistent with the TransNet Extension Ordinance, the Technical Screening Committee reviewed all candidate applications received and recommends two candidates be advanced for consideration by the Selection Committee based on their qualifications.

The candidates for the Licensed Architect, Civil Engineer or Traffic Engineer are:

- Franciso Rivera Technical Screening Committee members considered Mr. Rivera's extensive
 experience working in numerous technical and managerial engineering positions with the City of
 Chula Vista. In addition, the Committee considered Mr. Rivera's affiliation with various
 professional associations.
- Brian Stephenson Technical Screening Committee members considered Mr. Stephenson's substantial experience working in various project management and engineering positions for the private and public sectors. The committee also considered Mr. Stephenson's membership in multiple professional organizations.

Conflicts of Interest Review

All applicant's affiliations with business entities may present potential conflicts of interest should they be appointed. Based on SANDAG Board Policy No. 31, as well as guidance from SANDAG's Office of General Counsel (OGC), staff noted that the possibility of a potential conflict of interest does not automatically require disqualification of an applicant.

Should the Selection Committee not approve the requested appointments, the selection process for a new member would be initiated. A Technical Screening Committee would be established to review applications received from interested individuals and recommend qualified candidates for consideration by the Selection Committee.

ITOC Term Limits

In 2017, the SANDAG Board of Directors amended the TransNet Extension Ordinance to further stagger ITOC terms to prevent turnover of more than two members at any one time and to allow members filling mid-term vacancies to serve additional terms (not to exceed a total of ten years). In addition, the TransNet Extension Ordinance amendment acknowledged that if more than two members need to be replaced during the same recruitment period, the Selection Committee would determine the length of each member's first term to limit concurrent future turnover.

The ITOC member in the licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer category was reappointed in May 2022 for another four-year term and through May 2026. After serving ITOC for one more year, and

due to new employment and potential conflict of interest, the licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer was not eligible to serve on ITOC.

Based on the proposed term end date of May 2026 for the replacement of the licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer category, term limits for all seven ITOC members would be as follows and would ensure term expirations do not result in more than two vacancies at any one time. Alternatively, the Selection Committee could elect to stagger the term differently than proposed below for the licensed architect, civil engineer, or traffic engineer as shown in grey cells.
