


#### What is ARJIS?



ARJIS also serves as the region's information hub for officer notification, information sharing, and the exchange, validation, and real-time uploading of many types of public safety data.



Provide Regional Crime Analysis




# Analyses of Who is Arrested in the County





Demographics of victims and suspects




