SUBJECT: Building Codes Update and Adoption

BACKGROUND:

Typically, Summit County Building Codes are updated every 6 years. The building inspection department works with the BOCC, the Building Board of Review, Fire Districts and the community to develop local amendments to the codes that have been published by the International Code Council (ICC).

The 2024 International Code Council (ICC) Code adoption, will include building, plumbing mechanical and energy codes (11 in total). The current codes adopted by the County are the 2018 ICC codes, with local amendments. The 2024 ICC Codes are the most up to date codes available for adoption.

DISCUSSION:

A Building Board of Review meeting was held January 15th. The meeting agenda focused on introducing two new board members and laying out the code adoption objectives for the 2024 ICC codes.

Jay with RWB Fire discussed Fire district priorities and introduced the DRAFT Colorado Wildfire Resiliency Code. This code is tied to a house bill that requires it to be completed and adopted by the State in Mid-2025. Local jurisdictions will likely be required to adopt the code within 3 months of the State adoption.

Additionally, we have engaged, the Summit County Builders Association, local design teams, independent local contractors and our partner towns to listen to their likes and concerns about the status quo and discuss how our current codes can be improved and or enhanced.

Of the eleven ICC Building Codes the County has currently adopted, Building, Plumbing, Fuel Gas etc. the code update that will garner the most community input will be the International Energy Conservation Code, (IECC).

Prior to moving the code update process forward with the Board of Review; and the subsequent public outreach, direction from the BOCC is sought on the following matters,



1. Does the Board support, including a Renewable Energy Mitigation Program (REMP) into the Energy Conservation Code?

If yes, should we pursue requiring only electric/ heat pump supported systems (not gas except for fire pits)? The direction our local energy conservation initiatives are headed is to require electric ready and or electric only power sources. This is based on the renewable energy progress the XCEL grid has achieved over the last 10 years, and the difficulties XCEL has voiced in meeting existing and future demands on the existing gas infrastructure. It seems to make sense that the struggling gas infrastructure should not be further burdened by allowing gas for new outdoor energy intensive uses.

A secondary question related to a REMP code is whether the board supports the concept of allowing payment (writing a check) in lieu of providing onsite renewable energy off sets. It is the building inspection departments position that writing checks to meet code, degrades the integrity of the building code compliance process.

2. Does the Board support adopting the robust 2024 IECC code as written and developed by the national code development committees, with minimal local amendments?

The 2024 Energy code was developed through a new standard based inclusionary national code development process. It provides a robust prescriptive path along with options to follow alternative performance base solutions.

The currently adopted energy code in Summit County is the 2018 IECC with local amendments (Summit Sustainable Code) that reflect the prescriptive provisions of the 2021 IECC. The 2021 IECC is the current minimum energy code mandated by the State. The 2024 IECC represents modest incremental increases in minimum building energy performance over the 2021 IECC and provides additional performance-based paths and options to meeting code, that are not available under the currently adopted code.

In short, adopting the 2024 IECC without extensive local amendments will,

- move the needle toward reaching the 2030 Climate Action Plan Goals.
- allow for multiple paths to achieving code compliance that the current energy code does not provide.
- provide clarity to a code that is currently burdened by confusion and difficulty in achieving effective consistent enforcement and compliance.

Adding locally developed above code, sustainable amendments to the 2024 IECC combined with the new State Wildfire Resiliency Code will inflate the cost of construction of new housing for both market and deed restricted projects.



Inclusion of the wildfire code in the 2024 code adoption will most likely be required and will add to the resiliency of buildings in the event of a wildfire therefore the additional costs associated with wildfire resiliency amendments are both unavoidable and potentially beneficial to the whole Summit County community.

With concern for those construction cost increases and the negative perceptions the design and construction industry have shared regarding the past, Zero Energy Ready Home (ZERH) code adoption process, we have purposely distanced the County from the stretch code discussion being held in the Town of Breckenridge. We have been listening but not participating as continuity with our partner Towns (Silverthorne, Frisco, Keystone Dillon and Montezuma) seems more important than continuity with Breckenridge where we have no shared jurisdictional oversight. We will, however, continue to review and evaluate their progress.

Electric ready, solar ready and EV ready provisions are not included in the 2024 IECC but are required to be included in our code adoption through a state house bill mandate. The new 2024 codes will need to include a referenced exhibit that will encompass the State Electric, Solar and EV charging ready provisions.

Adoption of the 2024 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) without adding locally developed sustainable code provisions will provide market driven, enforceable requirements with robust minimum efficiency requirements that will result in the maximum level of energy efficiency that is safe, technologically feasible and life cycle cost-effective; considering economic feasibility, including potential costs and savings for consumers and building owners and return on investment.

Maintaining the energy code without adding locally developed sustainable provisions will provide much needed continuity and clarity with our partner towns, that we have inspection services agreements with (Silverthorne, Frisco, Keystone, Dillon and Montezuma).

REQUEST:

The building inspection department would like direction moving forward with a Building Code update and adoption process which will include the most recently published 2024 International Codes, and whether we should include additional sustainable code amendments to the Energy Conservation Code (IECC), including REMP provisions. The effective date for the updated codes is anticipated to be January 1, 2026.







Colorado Counties Casualty Property Pool Loss Ratio Report as of December 31, 2024




Summit County CAPP Loss Ratio



Top Five in Frequency




Top Five in Severity










