July 15, 2025 8:30 a.m. Sonya L. Margerum City Hall Council Chambers

Members present were M. Michelle Dearing, Thomas J. Kent, and Jeffrey W. Love. Benjamin T. Carson was absent. Clerk Sana G. Booker presided.

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. <u>July 8, 2025, Meeting</u>

Ms. Dearing moved to accept the minutes of the July 8, 2025, Board of Works meeting. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

2. NEW BUSINESS

a. <u>Contract Addendum: CDBG Social Service Agency – Lafayette Transitional</u> Housing Center – Development

Project Manager Ethan Fortner requested approval of an addendum to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) social service agency agreement with Lafayette Transitional Housing Center. This agreement was originally entered on October 15, 2024, with an amendment on April 29, 2025. This addendum allows eligible reimbursement expenses accrued throughout the program year to be reimbursed outside the quarterly program caps. Eligible reimbursements would not exceed the contract amount for the Supportive Housing Program. This funding was allocated in 2024 by the Mayor's CDBG Advisory Board, and the budget was approved at the June 2024 City Council meeting. Funding is provided by the CDBG through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Ms. Dearing moved that the contract addendum be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

Manager Fortner confirmed for Mr. Love that reimbursements can be made outside of the quarterly cap for the whole contract period if they do not exceed the total amount. As the last day to file claims is July 15, 2025, the addendum allows the City to make sure we are utilizing our full public service cap.

The motion was adopted.

b. <u>Agreement: Federal Grant Writing – Merchant McIntyre & Associates, LLC – Development</u>

Manager Fortner requested approval of an agreement with Merchant McIntyre & Associates, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$96,000.00 and will terminate July

31, 2026. This agreement is to engage Merchant McIntyre in conducting research, assessing funding opportunities, and creating an action plan to support the City in all facets of the federal grant process. Merchant McIntyre was instrumental in securing the EDA Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance Program Grant (\$2,073,500.00) and the Indiana Department of Natural Resources Land and Water Conservation Fund (\$492,600.00) in the last year. In addition, they have assisted the City in submitting nearly \$2 million in public works and fire response staffing grants this summer.

Ms. Dearing moved that the agreement be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

c. Road Closure: Chauncey Avenue – Solar Energy Systems LLC – Development Manager Fortner requested approval of a road closure on behalf of Solar Energy Systems, LLC. Chauncey Avenue, between North Street and Columbia Street, will be closed from July 22 to 24, 2025, to set up craning operations to lift solar panels on the roof of the West Lafayette Public Library.

Ms. Dearing moved that the road closure be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

d. <u>Agreement: Water Reclamation Plant Capacity Optimization Study – DHI Water & Environment, Inc. – WWTU</u>

WWTU Director Dave Henderson requested approval of an agreement with DHI Water & Environment, Inc. in the amount of \$68,400.00. DHI will be performing a study to evaluate current capacities and capabilities and create a capacity optimization model for the Wastewater Plant. We are looking to determine the maximum loading we can take with our current situation before we continue with the expansion design.

Ms. Dearing moved that the agreement be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

e. <u>Street, Sidewalk, and Parking Closures: Russell Street and Chauncey Avenue –</u> T-N-T Tree Service – Parks

Greenspace Administrator Brandon Hall requested approval of two street and sidewalk closures with parking restrictions on behalf of T-N-T Tree Service. On July 18, 2025, the parking and southbound lanes at 607 Russell Street will be closed for the removal of two dead linden trees. The parking and northbound lanes at 912 North Chauncey Avenue will also be closed on July 18, 2025, for the pruning of a damaged maple tree. The sidewalks will be closed at both locations to protect pedestrians.

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Ms. Dearing moved that the street, sidewalk, and parking closures be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

f. <u>Maintenance Bond: Lindberg Road Reconstruction – White Construction – Engineering</u>

City Engineer Natalia Bartos requested approval to accept a three-year maintenance bond for the Lindberg Road Reconstruction. The bond was issued by Travelers Casualty and Surety Company of America, on behalf of White Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$348,178.03.

Ms. Dearing moved that the maintenance bond acceptance be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

g. <u>Lane and Sidewalk Closure: Pierce Street – Andersen Windows – Engineering</u>
Project Manager Benjamin Neild requested approval of a lane and sidewalk closure on behalf of Andersen Windows. The closure will take place in front of 214 Pierce Street from July 22 to 23, 2025. During this time, crews will perform sash replacement on windows with tempered glass in the south stairwell of the Monterey Apartments.

Ms. Dearing moved that the lane and sidewalk closure be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

h. Road Closure: Chauncey Avenue (Between North Street and West Columbia Street) – CORE Construction – Engineering

Manager Neild requested approval of a road closure on behalf of CORE Construction. From July 29 to August 31, 2025, Chauncey Avenue, between North Street and West Columbia Street, will be closed for the removal and replacement of concrete driveway aprons and sidewalks along this section of the roadway.

Ms. Dearing moved that the road closure be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

i. Road Closure: Brown Street – Brinkmann Constructors – Engineering Manager Neild requested approval of a road closure on behalf of Brinkmann Constructors. From July 16 to August 25, 2025, Brown Street, west of Roebuck Drive, will be closed to facilitate continued construction of a new building. Access to local businesses will be available during construction activities. The southern portion of Brown Street will receive temporary striping following placement of the base course asphalt to assist with traffic flow.

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Ms. Dearing moved that the road closure be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

Mr. Love asked if people can still access the business using the north lane of Brown Street. Manager Neild confirmed that is correct.

The motion was adopted.

j. <u>Lane Shift: West Navajo Street – Kettelhut Construction, Inc – Engineering</u> Manager Neild requested approval of a temporary lane shift on behalf of Kettelhut Construction, Inc. On July 18, 2025, traffic will shift to the median on West Navajo Street, between North Salisbury Street and Sacramento Avenue, for the relocation of the County Emergency Siren. The siren will be relocated to the east end of the property, adjacent to the sidewalk and grass area of Fire Station No. 2, due to the construction of the new Public Safety Center.

Ms. Dearing moved that the lane shift be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

The motion was adopted.

Ms. Dearing moved that the claims be approved. Mr. Kent seconded the motion.

Ms. Dearing asked what the \$1.8 million transfer from General Fund to Motor Vehicle Highway (MVH) Fund is for. Controller Peter Gray explained that the City Council approves the Finance Department's ability to temporarily borrow money from City Funds to supplement the City's cash flow or other Funds. In this case we borrowed from the MVH Fund, and it was paid back with money received from property tax payments, which we receive every June. Ms. Dearing asked if we are likely to see a similar big transfer at this time of year. Controller Gray confirmed a similar transfer will happen every year.

The motion was adopted.

5. OTHER ITEMS

- ➤ Director of IT Chris Benavidez informed everyone that a new City call tree has been rolled out. A couple of the menus are more detailed, but not too long. He thanked ERP System Administrator Zack Walsh for getting this implemented, installed, and tested. He asked everyone to let the IT Department know of any issues so they can resolve them as quickly as possible.
- ➤ Engineer Bartos introduced Jenny Miller, PE from Christopher B. Burke Engineering (CBBEL). Engineer Miller will be the on-call City Engineer while Engineer Bartos is on FMLA leave from July 21 to October 13, 2025. Engineer Miller will assist Manager Neild with the Board of Works meetings and other needed assistance. Engineer Miller can be reached at the CBBEL Downtown Lafayette office and will attend Board of Works as able. Engineer Bartos is excited to have her on the team.





EASEMENT

State of Indiana County of Tippecanoe

THIS EASEMENT ("Easement") is made this _____ day of ______ 20____, from CITY OF WEST LAFAYETTE, INDIANA ("Grantor", whether one or more), to DUKE ENERGY INDIANA, LLC, an Indiana limited liability company ("Grantee").

Grantor, for and in consideration of the sum of One and 00/100 Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant unto Grantee a perpetual and non-exclusive easement, to construct, reconstruct, operate, patrol, maintain, repair, replace, relocate, add to, modify, and remove electric and communication lines including, but not limited to, all necessary supporting structures, and all other appurtenant apparatus and equipment for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy, and for technological purposes related to the operation of the electric facilities and for the communication purposes of Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers (collectively, "Facilities").

Grantor is the owner of that certain property described in Section 30, Township 23 North, Range 4 West, Wabash Township, Tippecanoe County, State of Indiana; being a part of a tract as recorded in **Instrument Number 91-13392**, in the Office of the Recorder of Tippecanoe County, Indiana ("**Property**").

The Facilities may be both overhead and underground and located in, upon, over, along, under, through, and across a portion of the Property within an easement area described as follows:

For Grantee's Internal Use: Work Order #: 57776473-20 Page 1 of 4

A strip of land twenty feet (20') in uniform width for the overhead portion of said Facilities and a strip of land fifteen feet (15') in uniform width for the underground portion of said Facilities, lying equidistant on both sides of a centerline, which centerline shall be established by the center of the Facilities as installed, along with an area ten feet (10') wide on all sides of the foundation of any Grantee enclosure/transformer, vault and/or manhole, and as generally shown on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and becoming a part hereof (hereinafter referred to as the "Easement Area").

The rights granted herein include, but are not limited to, the following:


- 1. Grantee shall have the right of ingress and egress over the Easement Area, Property, and any adjoining lands now owned or hereinafter acquired by Grantor (using lanes, driveways, and adjoining public roads where practical as determined by Grantee).
- 2. Grantee shall have the right to trim, cut down, and remove from the Easement Area, at any time or times and using safe and generally accepted arboricultural practices, trees, limbs, undergrowth, other vegetation, and obstructions.
- 3. Grantee shall have the right to trim, cut down, and remove from the Property, at any time or times and using safe and generally accepted arboricultural practices, dead, diseased, weak, dying, or leaning trees or limbs, which, in the opinion of Grantee, might fall upon the Easement Area or interfere with the safe and reliable operation of the Facilities.
- 4. Grantee shall have the right to install necessary guy wires and anchors extending beyond the boundaries of the Easement Area.
- 5. Grantee shall have the right to relocate the Facilities and Easement Area on the Property to conform to any future highway or street relocation, widening, or alterations.
- 6. Grantor shall not place, or permit the placement of, any structures, improvements, facilities, or obstructions, within or adjacent to the Easement Area, which may interfere with the exercise of the rights granted herein to Grantee. Grantee shall have the right to remove any such structure, improvement, facility, or obstruction at the expense of Grantor.
- 7. Excluding the removal of vegetation, structures, improvements, facilities, and obstructions as provided herein, Grantee shall promptly repair or cause to be repaired any physical damage to the surface area of the Easement Area and Property resulting from the exercise of the rights granted herein to Grantee. Such repair shall be to a condition which is reasonably close to the condition prior to the damage, and shall only be to the extent such damage was caused by Grantee or its contractors or employees.
- 8. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary above, the general location of the Facilities is shown on the sketch attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. The final and definitive location of the Easement Area shall become established by and upon the final installation and erection of the Facilities by Grantee in substantial compliance with Exhibit A.
- 9. All other rights and privileges reasonably necessary, in Grantee's sole discretion, for the safe, reliable, and efficient installation, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities.

The terms Grantor and Grantee shall include the respective heirs, successors, and assigns of Grantor and Grantee. The failure of Grantee to exercise or continue to exercise or enforce any of the rights herein granted shall not be construed as a waiver or abandonment of the right thereafter at any time, or from time to time, to exercise any and all such rights.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said rights, privilege, and easement unto Grantee, its successors, licensees, and assigns, forever. Grantor warrants and covenants that Grantor has the full right and authority to convey to Grantee this perpetual Easement, and that Grantee shall have quiet and peaceful possession, use and enjoyment of the same.
