# F. "City Government Week" Proclamation - Katrina Hill, Director of Public Affairs & Communication

City Manager Stavres read aloud the proclamation declaring October 21 through 27, 2024 as "Florida City Government Week" in the City of Winter Haven. Director Hill accepted and discussed all of the events in celebration such as the *Capture Winter Haven* photo contest where 135 photos were submitted, the *Touch A Truck & More* event (see attached) on October 26, 2024, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Regional Winter Haven Airport where there would be a dunk tank with various City Officials in it and kids from two local schools would help volunteer.



City Manager Stavres said that although not on the agenda this evening, he wanted to share some insights and information and show how the City responded to the storm.

Assistant City Manager of Public Safety Bird reported the following:

- Police Department All of the shifts were combined from four squads to two so there were two 12-hour shifts so they could respond
- Fire Department Moved 24-hour shifts, which provided an increase in personnel to be able to respond to calls for service, as needed.
- Police resources deployed throughout the City at each of the four Fire Stations with Fire personnel for the duration of the storm
- The City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) manned from Wednesday, October 9 until Friday, October 11 for 24 hours per day for constant communication with the Polk County EOC
- Implemented the low-profile response teams into stations so paramedics could be with fire and police and
  respond to calls of service, however, there were no responses from those teams during this storm
- Police 263 total calls for service. Most for domestic disturbances and perimeter checks, and then wellbeing checks.
- Fire 155 total calls for service from Tuesday through Thursday. 62 for EMS and rescue and the remainder for good intent calls and hazardous conditions. One for a fire that was a false alarm.
- Fire, Police, and other team members Utilized a Survey 1-2-3 Reporting System to take photos and send back to the EOC. Monitoring in real-time and get resources out to deal with the situation as soon as possible. Some loss of communications due to Verizon. Some radios used to help mitigate.
- Safe Neighborhoods Went out and began damage assessments following the storm. These were completed today, but not as much damage as in the past.
- Incidents included: Trees fell into residences, but no one injured. Total collapse of a building that had previous fire damage. Two fires involving gas cans in people's cars. A few employees had impacts to their homes and they were helping them deal with that.

Lastly, Assistant City Manager Bird said that the City had a fantastic team and watching everyone work together, even after the storm, was absolutely incredible.

City Manager Stavres reported that he, Deputy City Manager Carnevale, and Assistant City Manager had begun preparing the Saturday before the storm hit and then worked on Sunday. They also worked with Polk County for all that was necessary for the EOC operations and mitigation strategies. He commented that the City had the finest team of employees that develop a plan, worked that plan, and leading into the hurricane season to review the plan identified shortcomings within that were immediately corrected. At peak, the City had over 80 lift stations without power. Some of these were on permanent generators, that were ok to continue operation, however, staff began chasing every possible electrical issue that was there, which he explained in more detail. He said he felt even more proud than with the Strategic Plan when he walked Downtown and saw police officers, firefighters, the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Assistant City Manager of Public Safety, members of the Finance team, Public Affairs and

Communications Team, and Parks, Recreation and Culture team, and others in the City working together to clean parks and get those ready for the public to come back.

City Manager Stavres gave a special thank you to Chip Tucker with Tucker Paving who arrived at 8:00 a.m. Friday morning to let us know that he had 13 dump trucks with drivers ready to roll at no cost to the City to help his community. These were paired up with the City's trash masters and they began working the City from Downtown outward to begin loading debris then dumped in the landfill.

City Manager Stavres said that the work that took place between Friday and Saturday was amazing, the City team was top notch, and it was a pleasure to work with them.

Lastly, in terms of facility damage, he reported the following:

- Winter Haven Regional Airport a number of airport hangar doors were blown in, which were all being addressed. There was major damage to hangar #10, which was going to require some restoration effort.
- Fleet Maintenance damage to the bays with some roof damage.
- No other losses. Everywhere else was back online.

Deputy City Manager gave an update on debris management strategy going forward:

- Debris collection began immediately after the storm.
- The City was a partner on Polk County's debris hauling contract that consisted of two parts, which he explained in more detail.
- Quantity of debris and timeline Less than Hurricane Ian, but not sure on timeline right now.
- Normal landscaping debris and junk pickup suspended so full focus only on hurricane debris. Public Affairs
  and Communications team have pushed out much information on this and what it should look like such as
  no bagged debris.
- Debris hotline available for specific questions.
- Debris will be mapped out and updates on where pickups have occurred can be provided.
- Polk County EOC goal to have all debris picked up by Thanksgiving, but City's plan to have all picked up sooner.
- Regular garbage routes to start running this Friday to get everything from last week's routine collections.

# A. P-24-01-C - PUBLIC HEARING - Request by Harold R. Baxter and HRB Industrial Park, LLC for Conditional Use Approval for airports/aviation uses in the Industrial- Light (I-1) zoning district. (4900 Dundee Road)

Economic Opportunity and Community Investment Director Labbe presented this item as detailed in the summary sheet.

Sean O'Connor, 4900 Dundee Road in Winter Haven, said he represented the applicant and was available to answer any questions.

Discussion ensued.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Yates to approve the request by Harold R. Baxter and HRB Industrial Park, LLC for Conditional Use Approval for airports/aviation uses in the Industrial- Light (I-1) zoning district. (4900 Dundee Road) to include the following conditions recommended by staff:

- 1. The site shall be limited to the storage and flights of one helicopter. No other aviation uses shall be permitted.
- 2. The proposed landing area for the helicopter shall be constructed of a hard surface material.
- 3. Take-offs and landings of the helicopter shall be limited to the hours from dawn to dusk.
- 4. The petitioner shall be permitted through all required Federal, State, and local agencies for use of the property as a heliport.
- 5. A site plan shall be submitted and approved for addition of the heliport, and all required improvements shall be made, prior to the occupancy and operation of the heliport.

Mayor Birdsong closed the Regular City Commission Meeting and opened a Public Hearing stating anyone wishing to speak to this item could come to the podium and state their name and address for the record.

Cherease Gales, 4851 Highway 550 in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item.

Joan Morgan, 2793 Whispering Trails Drive in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item.

William French, 2797 Whispering Trails Drive in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item.

Discussion ensued.

Kelly Smith, 2853 Whispering Trails Drive in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item.

Andrew Alvarez Padgett, 2801 Whispering Trails Drive in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item. He also said they had a petition (see attached) of people who were opposed to this item.

Harold Baxter, 4900 Dundee Road in Winter Haven, said he was the applicant and that they had never received any complaints.

Marie Alvarez Padgett, wife of Mr. Padgett, expressed opposition to this item.

Nancy Abrams, 3257 Whispering Trails Drive in Winter Haven, expressed opposition to this item.

Discussion ensued.

Mr. Baxter said he would abide to any conditions [imposed by the City Commission.]

Director Labbe said he had just been informed by Winter Haven Regional Airport Director Heidel that the City could not condition flight patterns, unless authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Discussion ensued.

City Attorney Murphy reminded everyone that this was a quasi-judicial hearing and explained further.

Mr. Baxter discussed the flight pattern. Discussion ensued to include if the City could revoke approval and other items.

Mayor Pro Tem Yates amended his previous motion of approving the request by Harold R. Baxter and HRB Industrial Park, LLC for Conditional Use Approval for airports/aviation uses in the Industrial-Light (I-1) zoning district. (4900 Dundee Road) to include the following amendments:

- Change original take off and landing time from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 pm (originally dawn to dusk)
- 2. Take off and landings can only occur to or from the north
- 3. Applicant agrees to withdraw request / revocation if FAA prescribes any flight path other than to and from the north
- 4. Use is restricted to an R-44 Helicopter; any change in helicopter make/model will require applicant to amend the Conditional Use Order to include appropriate public hearings.

Mr. French commented that amending a motion did not negate that there would be more pollution and asked why the heliport was not at the airport instead.

Ms. Gales commented that they did not want any disturbance regardless of hour.

Ms. Morgan commented that R-44 helicopters were part of many fatal accidents.

Mayor Birdsong closed the Public Hearing and reopened the Regular Commission Meeting.

Motion carried 3:2 with Commissioners Dantzler and Dollison voting no.

### 14. CITY COMMISSIONERS/LIAISON REPORTS

**Commissioner Dantzler** reported the following: attended a Downtown art exhibit; attended an open house at the Historic Ritz Theatre; and said he was doing much research on the effects of fluoride in water. He also said he would be proposing pausing this for a year and wait for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). He noted that Winter Haven was one of four that still did this in Polk County. Discussion ensued.

**Commissioner Dollison** reported he had attended a Florida League of Cities (FLC) Legislative Committee Meeting.

**Commissioner Mercer** reported the following: attended the retirement celebration for Fire Lieutenant Jason Ward at Station #1 and thanked all City employees for their 'above and beyond' work and dedication. She commented that she knew firsthand, having been over utilities and how people lose water services.

**Mayor Pro Tem Yates** reported the following: thanked City employees for putting in tireless hours over the last week in keeping the City prepared, safe, and now in repair-mode post-storm. He also thanked Public Affairs and Communications Director Hill and staff for managing the social media aspect and keeping all of the misinformation sorted out.

**Mayor Birdsong** reported the following: attended a Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (TD-LCB) Meeting; attended a FLC Utilities, Natural Resources, and Public Works Legislative Committee Meeting; received surprise phone calls from the U.S. Vice President [Kamala Harris'] Office and U.S. Congressman Rick Scott to see how Winter Haven was faring; and commented that the City did great with the hurricane and urged everyone to keep up the great work.

- 1. CALL TO ORDER Mayor Birdsong called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

### 5. PRESENTATION(S)

### A. City University Class 3 Graduation

City Manager Stavres gave an overview of this item and said there would be a total of 30 graduates in attendance at the Monday, October 28, Regular City Commission Meeting to receive their certificates.

### B. \*\*\* AGENDA REVIEW ONLY \*\*\* Strategic Plan Presentation: Responsible Government

City Manager Stavres said that they wanted to ensure that the Strategic Plan was a living, breathing document so staff would reference it as much as possible. He said that this presentation would be an update on some of the things the City was doing before doing a goal revisit session in April (2025) and then again in October (2025).

Public Affairs and Communications Director Hill gave a *FY 25 Strategic Pillar Update – Responsible Government – Update 1 (see link/attached)* and went over the slides in more detail.

### RESPONSIBLE GOVERNMENT PILLAR

### Bar Graph (slide)

Director Hill explained this slide in more detail. She reported that a survey went out every six months to residents and it was not possible to see any trends yet, but that they were starting to look at it and figure out what they could glean from the data. She explained that the sections represented each of the Strategic Pillars and that scores were reviewed each cycle for overall satisfaction. She noted that each of the scores were calculated from a series of 3-5 questions that made up the score for that individual pillar and that most of the individual scores there continue to fluctuate up or down within a margin of error:

### • Quality of Life, Community Safety, Infrastructure:

o Remained steady within the margin of error.

### • Responsible Government:

- -12 point drop (largest) with biggest factor and a -22 point drop on questions asking citizens to rate the value for the taxes they paid the City
  - Likely due to a misunderstanding about the City's budget and its process. Based on data, social listenings, and other engagement
- -10 point drop transparency and communication to citizens
  - Lowest scores from the northeast and southeast quadrants.

### • Environmental Stewardship:

- o -11 point drop solid waste and recycling services
  - Likely to do with Polk County eliminating recycling. The City had done much work in the last 2 months to ensure citizens were aware that the City was not doing this.

### • Economic Sustainability:

- -9 point drop questions related to the availability of jobs that pay a living wage and also planning for and managing growth
  - Hot topic so staff working on another public awareness campaign to help citizens understand what we can and sometimes cannot do

### City's Net Promotor Score:

 -7 point drop - From 48 points to 43. Primarily driven by the question on how likely a citizen was to recommend Winter Haven as a place to live.

### Strategic Plan Outreach (slide)

Director Hill pointed out that overall satisfaction was very high at 93. Surveys would be done every six months with the next window in November with a report in 2025.

Commissioner Dantzler asked the minimum age to participate in the survey. Director Hill said a minimum of 18.

Commissioner Dollison inquired how large of a sample had been surveyed. Director Hill said she did not have the exact information with her, but that it was usually 600-700 and that she could get this information to him. She noted that they did not know about the home ownership information, however, they did have information on race, gender, age, quadrant of the City, income brackets, so it was a valid survey. He added that it was one of several tools the City was trying to use to help understand the perception of the community and measure the City's effectiveness. Discussion ensued.

Mayor Pro Tem Yates inquired if it was possible for the same person to fill out the survey all three times. Director Hill said she believed there were controls for that and that there was a different sample each time.

Director Hill reported that City Manager Stavres had met with all employees to talk to them about the Strategic Plan and distributed a citizen's version of it, which was also placed at each Commissioner's place on the dais.

### Transparency Dashboard (slide)

Director Hill showed the transparency dashboard on the website, which she said would stay there, and contained all of the performance metrics.

Mayor Pro Tem Yates asked if it made sense to also add to the *Access Winter Haven* app. Director Hill said yes and that staff could put it on the home page of the app.

City Manager Stavres commented that this was something the City had never done before with so much transparency and this type of information.

Discussion ensued.

### GFOA - Distinguished Budget Award (slide)

Chief Financial Officer Scott explained this slide in more detail and reported that the City had received the Government Finance Officers Association's (GFOA) Distinguished Budget Award for the past 31 consecutive years and thanked former Chief Financial Officer Cal Bowen for making that happen. She explained how the GFOA evaluated budgets and said that when the GFOA first started, they had 9 rating factors, but now had 25. Also, that the City aligned the budget book with those best practices.

### Budget Book to Budget in Brief (slide)

Chief Financial Officer Scott explained this slide in more detail, and noted that the City provided a lot of detailed information, especially with capital accounts, machinery and equipment, capital improvements, and debt schedules. She added that the downside to the budget book was that it was 500 pages and challenging to read so they created a Budget in Brief and a copy had been placed at each Commissioner's place on the dais (*see attached*). This version captured the essence of the budget book and also showed the City being close to a \$300 million budget. She noted that the City's millage had not gone up since 2018 and actually went down in 2022. Lastly, she thanked City Manager Stavres and Director Hill for helping them create a very attractive and informative document.

City Manager Stavres commented this could be given to any citizen or business, staff would make sure they all had additional copies, it would also be on the City's website, and gave additional details.

### Credit Ratings & Criteria (slide)

Chief Financial Officer Scott explained this slide in more detail. She said that very much like people had credit scores, the City also did and the three credit score agencies were Moody's, Standard & Poor (S&P) and Fitch. The City had contracted with Fitch and S&P who would be evaluating the City based on certain criteria, listed on the slide, which she explained further. She reported that the City was doing well and that in the past two years, had received two promotions, which she explained further (also listed on the slide).

### Credit Ratings (slide)

Chief Financial Officer Scott explained this slide in more detail.

City Manager Stavres commented that the City was right where it needed to be in that area and if we could get to AA+ and have positive outlooks it would be even better. However, the problem with getting to AAA was to maintain it, which was extremely difficult and a slip back was likely at some point, therefore, it was better to be a strong number two [High Grade] category with much opportunity to maintain it.

### RFQ for Depository Services (slide)

Chief Financial Officer Scott explained this slide in more detail. She noted that per the Florida Statutes, the City could not receive interest from the \$6 million in customer utility deposits, so they wanted to invest those monies in a local bank, which would help support the local economy. She added that there was a selection committee that would look at the responses and move on from there.

City Manager Stavres said this item would come to the Commission for final action in the next 30-60 days.

Mayor Birdsong asked for a clarification on what was considered "local" because it could mean different things. City Manager Staves said there was criteria for this outlined in the Request for Qualification (RFQ) and that staff had researched similar RFQs and proposals from a number of cities to craft it. He said he did not know how many banks were in Winter Haven specifically, but they were not necessarily headquartered here, so they were looking specifically within Polk County. He also noted that the City banked with Truist, which was not a local bank, and explained further. Discussion ensued.

(Commissioner Dantzler left the room at 5:51 p.m.)

### Fire Chief Recruitment (slide)

City Manager Stavres reported that Fire Chief Emery would be retiring at the end of January, 2025. Human Resources Director Dykes, with the assistance of the marketing [Public Affairs and Communications] team, created a brochure (see attached) for this position and copies were [at each Commissioner's place] on the dais.

(Commissioner Dantzler reentered the room at 5:52 p.m.)

City Manager Stavres went over the interview dates in more detail and said that the new Fire Chief was expected to start by January 2025 to spend time with the current Fire Chief for a smooth transition. However, if someone was not selected, they were confident that Assistant City Manager of Public Safety Bird would continue to keep the department afloat and guide them, as needed, until they found the right candidate.

City Manager Stavres noted that this was the same process the City had used before for other City positions.

### **COMMUNITY SAFETY PILLAR**

City Manager Stavres said there would be presentations given [at the Wednesday, November 6, 2024, Agenda Review Session] on cybersecurity by Smart City Officer Nguyen, lead and copper rule compliance pertaining to water safety by Winter Haven Water, and new technology involving virtual reality training by the Police Department.

City Manager Stavres said that items 9A and 9B (which are companion Ordinances) were heard at a Regular City Commission Meeting in August and transmitted to the Department of Commerce (DOC). He said that no comments were received from them or any other agencies that review these matter.

There were no questions or discussion.

C. O-24-45 - Request by Claussen Trust to assign Neighborhood Support Future Land Use to an annexed parcel (2400 Avenue E, SW)

City Manager Stavres said there had been no changes to this item since first reading.

There were no questions or discussion.

D. O-24-46 - Request by Claussen Trust to assign Commercial- Highway (C-3) zoning district to an annexed parcel (2400 Avenue E, SW)

City Manager Stavres said there had been no changes to this item since first reading.

There were no questions or discussion.

E. O-24-47 - Request by AdventHealth Polk North, Inc. to amend Planned Unit Development Ordinance O-22-54 (6945 Cypress Gardens Boulevard)

City Manager Stavres said there had been no changes to this item since first reading.

There were no questions or discussion.

F. O-24-48 - Administrative request to amend the Potable Water Sub-element of the 2035 Winter Haven Comprehensive Plan for the purpose of revising Policy 1.1.2 relating to potable water Level of Service (LOS) standards and to amend Sanitary Sewer Sub-element Policy 1.1.2 relating to sanitary sewer LOS standards

City Manager Stavres gave an overview of this item and noted that it had to be transmitted to the Department of Commerce (DOC). The DOC again issued an ORC (Objections Recommendations Corrections or Changes) report and there were no comments from any of the State agencies.

There were no questions or discussion.

### 10. CONSENT AGENDA

## A. Rowdy Gaines Olympic Pool Renovations Task Order & Limited Construction Administration Task Order

City Manager Stavres gave an overview of this item and said that this project was slated to begin on December 2, 2024, which he discussed in more detail.

Commissioner Mercer inquired if the pool would be brand new so there would be no leaks. City Manager Stavres said there should not be any leaks now and that the biggest issue that they were dealing with was that they were dealing with filtration and chemical application systems that were installed in 2002 and a briquette-style chlorine product was still being used, which contained a lot of byproduct, which he explained in more detail.

City Manager Stavres added that over the next two weeks, he would look to see if he could identify the funds to also do the diving well liner. If done separately, staff projected the cost at \$150,000, however, it could probably be done for \$130,000 now so he would work with the Financial Services Department on this.

### B. Department of Energy EECBG Grant Application - Purchase of GEM Vehicles

Deputy City Manager Carnevale gave an overview of this item.

Mayor Birdsong asked if this item was basically to purchase the vehicle and asked who would operate. Deputy City Manager Carnevale clarified that the purchase would take place later and that this item was to apply for the grant allocation.

Discussion ensued about color, pricing, windows, doors, the vehicle being all electric, and publicity.

### C. Purchase of (3) Solid Waste Lightening Loader (Claw Truck) Vehicles

Deputy City Manager Carnevale gave an overview of this item and said staff was requesting a ratification, which he explained in more detail. He added that these vehicles would help the City in the [hurricane] debris management efforts. Public Works Director Hart said that the turnaround time for delivery was within the month.

City Manager Stavres asked how many of these vehicles were currently within the City's fleet. Public Works Director Hart said 15. She also explained how they operated in more detail and said that they were all now picking up debris. Discussion ensued.

Mayor Birdsong asked for clarification on furniture and junk pick up because he saw much junk around the City. Public Works Director Hart said that because of the effects of Hurricane Milton coming through, the City and Polk County had shifted to only collecting hurricane debris and those were phased based off of the guidelines set by the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA). The first phase was the actual debris collection and the second phase was bagged brush and then moving into construction debris and household furniture, which she explained in more detail. Deputy City Manager Carnevale said staff would make a pass at those locations before resuming normal operations.

Discussion ensued regarding pickup, large items, illegal dumping, the "a la carte" service, and the current service.

Commissioner Mercer pointed out that it is always assumed that everyone used a form of social media, however, not everyone did. She asked if staff could write down the address if they see a pile and place a door hanger with callin information on the same address. City Manager Stavres commented that maybe a driver or a side-loader that would see the pile, however, they would not necessarily know if the pile was called in or not so obtaining addresses and bringing it back to the office would allow staff to make contact with the resident. Public Works Director Hart added that these [reports of piles] come in from the Access Winter Haven app or [Solid Waste] drivers report them to office staff so they can reach out to the account holder and let them know that it was not a scheduled collection, but that they would be scheduled. Staff was also putting mailers into the mail with information and adding it onto utility bills. Another piece of communication they were working on was a postcard to notify residents that the City was still recycling and about the bulk schedule. Discussion ensued.

Mayor Pro Tem Yates explained how the yard waste that was being bagged now was mostly on top of tree limbs and other debris, so in previous storms this pile got passed and was not picked up. He inquired if this kind of pile would be passed up again and commented that although the instructions to separate items was always being distributed to the public, asked for a clarification of the process. Public Works Director Hart said that right now due to the sheer volume of debris being collected [by Solid Waste], if there were bags or comingled junk within the pile, they were not picking that up. Solid Waste was rotating those for the second round of collection because there was no disposal site here unless the City wanted to pay to take it into the landfill. The disposal site in Winter Haven did not allow any bagged or comingled materials in, which she explained further. City Manager Stavres added that what the

City ended up doing in Hurricane Ian was collecting all bagged debris and getting additional labor to open the bags, create another pile, then transfer that pile. He noted that he did not know how the City could better educate citizens and said it was a challenge everywhere.

### D. Authorization for Travel and Training: International City Manager's Association (ICMA) Local Government Reimagined Conference (Stavres)

City Manager Stavres gave an overview of this item and said that while he was there, he would also spend time with folks in Denver to learn from them what they were doing with some of their housing initiatives and homeless efforts. They had a net zero homeless initiative that pertained to veterans so he wanted to see if he would bring more of that back to the City.

There were no questions or discussion.

He noted that the person could not be affiliated with any of the non-profits and asked Commissioner Dollison to provide the name to him.

City Manager Stavres gave an overview of this item.

There was consensus of the Commission to keep, and not cancel, the Monday, November 25, 2024, Regular City Commission Meeting.

There was consensus of the Commission to cancel the Monday, December 23, 2024, Regular City Commission Meeting.

Commissioner Dantzler reported that former Commissioner and U.S. Congressman Andy Ireland had passed away and that the City should fly a flag at half-mast for him. City Manager Stavres said staff would research his information [and request to be able to do so from the State].

Commissioner Dantzler suggested that the City present a proclamation to Winter Haven High School for opening up as shelters during the hurricane. Discussion ensued. City Manager Stavres said they could do whatever they wished and noted that Chain of Lakes Elementary had also assisted so both would be recognized likely in the first Commission Meeting in November.

City Manager Stavres said that they would have a fluoride item on the agenda and needed a little more time between the two meetings to turn it around. Winter Haven Water Director Hubbard commented that the fluoride issue was a community decision and that personally, he felt that the less chemicals were added to the water, the better he felt so he was supportive [of its removal]. City Attorney Murphy reported that Winter Haven Water staff had reached out to the Florida Department of Health for a viewpoint on this issue. He had also done research, which he shared with staff, and it was very controversial, giving the examples of Collier County and Pinellas County who stopped fluoridation of the public water supply and then resumed the fluoridation of the public water supply presumably because elected officials were voted out of office [due to their decision].



# **Major Investments**

Winter Haven Recreation & Cultural Center

Set to be completed late 2025, this \$23.7 million investment will result in a state-of-the-art facility with a multi-use gymnasium, a zero-depth entry swimming pool, splash pad, playground, outdoor sport court, fitness center, library, and community spaces.

### Chain of Lakes Park

This project is a combined investment from the City (\$12 million) and Polk County (\$12 million). When completed in Summer 2025, it will feature four collegiate, artificial turf baseball fields complete with dugouts, batting cages, team pavilions, fan areas with shade, and expanded parking areas.

**Lake Elbert Trail & Utility Improvements** 

This project will include 1.8 miles of new trail to complete the loop around Lake Elbert. The project also includes upgrades to water and sewer lines, storm inlets and pipes and an enhanced shoreline. It is scheduled to be completed in mid 2025.

Water Resource Facility

This multi-year project will commence in Fiscal Year 2025. The new facility will combine two wastewater treatment facilities into one and feature new technology and expanded capacity to meet current and projected 2045 wastewater flows.

**New Fire Stations Four & Five** 

Fire Station No. 4, located near Polk State College, includes a joint-use facility for Public Safety including Safe Neighborhoods and is planned to open late 2024. Fire Station No. 5, located at Lake Hartridge Nature Park, will begin construction in late 2025. The combined investment in FY 25 alone is nearly \$5 million.

Lake Howard Pedestrian Facilities & South Lake Howard **Nature Park Expansion** 

These projects, combined, enhance pedestrian safety, park access, and wetland restoration in the South Lake Howard area. New sidewalks will be added along the south side of Lake Howard, and the Nature Park will be expanded to further enhance lake quality and environmental protection.







#### BACKGROUND

In addition to the ongoing, routine communications between the City Manager's Office and the City Commission, it is my intent to also provide on a regular basis a summary report highlighting significant accomplishments and/or initiatives during the prior 3-month period. The goal is to provide this report quarterly during the City Manager Report portion of the regular City Commission Agenda. This is in no way intended to be a complete and exhaustive report on all of the meetings and actions of the City Manager's Office over the reporting period. Furthermore, I stand available to provide greater detail on any of the items noted or on other matters as may be desired by the City Commission.

# SIGNIFICANT ACTIONS / ACCOMPLISHMENTS / INITIATIVES - Q3 (JUL-SEP 2024):

## Strategic Planning

Responsible Government

Since December 2022, the City Manager's Office prioritized the development of 5-year strategic plan. After 18 months of focused energy on the task, the City's 5-year Strategic Plan was finalized in July 2024. The document was reviewed with the City Commission during the July 17, 2024 Agenda Review Session and was officially adopted via Resolution R-24-32 during the July 22, 2024 City Commission Meeting. Immediately following approval of the adopting resolution, staff procured and began distributing three versions of the Strategic Plan: one that includes the entire document and all background material; a staff version that highlights the goals and strategies along with the time frame for each strategic pillar; and a citizen version that focuses primarily on the strategic goals. The City Manager also held a series of nine meetings throughout the organization to present and review the Strategic Plan with every employee. Efforts are now underway to further weave the plan into the everyday operations and to make community presentations on its content and purpose.



## FY25 Budget

Responsible Government

The City Manager, in concert with members of the City's Department Directors, prepared the FY25 Budget and presented it to the City Commission during a special workshop held July 17, 2024. The City Commission considered the *Tentative Budget* during their regular meeting held July 22, 2024, at which time they set the *Tentative Millage Rate* at 6.5900 mills. The *Final Budget* totaling \$263.6 Million was officially adopted via unanimous approval of Ordinance O-24-44 on September 23, 2024.

# Utility Rate and Water/Sewer Connection Fee Adjustments

Responsible Government / Infrastructure

In response to infrastructural needs within the City's water and sewer operations and the associated 5-year capital improvement program, a Water and Sewer Fee Rate Study was commissioned via Raftelis. The Study identified rate adjustments necessary to meet the operational and capital needs of the systems in response to both facility age, and recent and projected population growth. New rates were presented to the City Commission via Ordinance O-24-41 and officially adopted during the September 10, 2024 City Commission Meeting. The new rates took effect October 1, 2024.

Raftelis also completed a study of the City's water and sewer connection fees. Special workshops on this singular issue were held August 21, 2024 and September 4, 2024. The City Commission approved increases in the connection fees via their unanimous approval of Ordinance O-24-42 during the September 10, 2024 City Commission Meeting. The new connection fees will take effect beginning January 1, 2025.

# **Expanded TDC Funding for Chain of Lakes Park**

Responsible Government / Quality of Life

In 2023, Polk County and the City entered into an Interlocal Agreement for Tourist Development Tax Funding towards renovations at the Chain of Lakes Complex. During design and permitting, additional site work was needed based on final exploratory work, floodplain compensation, and geotechnical issues. This increased the overall project cost from \$20 to \$24 M. Staff worked with the TDC and County staff to secure an additional \$2 M from the TDC, increasing their contribution from \$10 to \$12 M. This increase was approved by the TDC Board August 22, 2024, by the City Commission September 10, 2024, and by the Polk County BoCC September 17, 2024.

The City welcomed the third cohort to the City-U program, with the program officially kicking off August 20, 2024. With 30 citizens and staff enrolled, the program will meet eight times to give participants an inside view of what is involved in meeting the needs of Winter Haven citizens and businesses. The program has been slightly revamped so that it meets every week versus every other week in years past. The requirement of attending a City Commission meeting was also incorporated to help build a greater understanding of municipal governance and civics. A graduation ceremony will be held during the October 28, 2024 City Commission Meeting.

# **Chamber of Commerce Retreat**

Responsible Government / Economic Sustainability

The City Manager participated in the annual Chamber of Commerce Planning Retreat held July 11 and 12, 2024. This was a particularly important effort as the Chamber was in a transition period following the resignation of their most recent President / CEO. The City Manager worked collaboratively with other Board Members, Ex-Officio representatives, and Chamber staff to strategically plan for the coming year and anticipated challenges and opportunities.

# Historic Ritz Theatre / Theatre Winter Haven Use Agreement

Economic Sustainability / Responsible Government / Quality of Life

Closing on the purchase of The Historic Ritz Theatre (The Ritz) occurred August 5, 2024. Subsequently, the City Manager, in collaboration with staff from Parks, Recreation & Culture, successfully negotiated a Use Agreement and 1st Amendment between the City and Theatre Winter Haven for their long-standing use of the Chain of Lakes Park facilities and their new occupancy within The Ritz. The City Commission approved both of these August 12, 2024. Since these actions, the TWH staff has made significant improvements to The Ritz including seating, lighting, sound, and flooring. TWH has held their Perrot Awards event in the facility along with their first Tribute Tuesday program. More programs and events are planned for the coming months and into the 2025 calendar year.

#### BACKGROUND

ABC Properties, LTD, petitioner, requests the City assign Primary Mixed Use Hub Future Land Use and Commercial- Highway (C-3) zoning district to an annexed parcel. The property subject to this request, totaling 0.89± acres, is located at 250 Cypress Gardens Boulevard and contains a 9,088-square foot ABC Fine Wine and Spirits retail store built in 1975. The parcel was annexed into the City April 22, 2024. The petitioner does not plan to make any alterations to the existing store.

As these requests contain a small-scale Future Land Use amendment, review by the Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce) and other state and local agencies is not required.

#### SURROUNDING USES

The subject property is surrounded by an office building to the east; multi-family residential to the south; a Red Lobster restaurant to the west; and a Panda Express restaurant across Cypress Gardens Boulevard to the north.

#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

As the property is developed, no additional demands on public infrastructure are expected at this time. Should the property be redeveloped, a concurrency determination would be made at the time the property receives site plan approval and is redeveloped.

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#### COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Prior to annexation, the Polk County Future Land Use for the subject parcel was Linear Commercial Corridor (LCC). The requested Primary Mixed Use Hub Future Land Use is consistent with the developed use and the City designations in the area. The requested C-3 zoning district is consistent with the Primary Mixed Use Hub Future Land Use designation.

#### **NOTIFICATION**

All notification requirements for these requests were met.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no direct financial impact to the City with these requests.

These are requests initiated by an application by a private party. In accordance with Chapter 2024-145, Laws of Fla. (CS/CS/SB 1628 (2024)), ordinances initiated by an application by a private party are exempt from providing Business Impact Estimates.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

This is a routine land use and zoning assignment associated with normal operations of the City not specifically defined as a goal or strategy within the Strategic Plan. However, it is aligned with the Responsible Government Strategic Pillar.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Commission, at its October 1, 2024 regular meeting, voted to recommend approval of these requests. No members of the public spoke.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Staff's review of these requests yields the following conclusions:

- The assignment of Primary Mixed Use Hub Future Land Use and C-3 zoning district is consistent with the developed use and surrounding City designations; and
- As the property is already developed, no additional demands on public infrastructure are expected at this time.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Commission approve Ordinances O-24-49 and O-24-50.

#### BACKGROUND

ABC Properties, LTD, petitioner, requests the City assign Primary Mixed Use Hub Future Land Use and Commercial- Highway (C-3) zoning district to an annexed parcel. The property subject to this request, totaling 0.89± acres, is located at 250 Cypress Gardens Boulevard and contains a 9,088-square foot ABC Fine Wine and Spirits retail store built in 1975. The parcel was annexed into the City April 22, 2024. The petitioner does not plan to make any alterations to the existing store.

As these requests contain a small-scale Future Land Use amendment, review by the Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce) and other state and local agencies is not required.

#### SURROUNDING USES

#### **BACKGROUND**

E.R. Whitehead, petitioner, requests the City Commission annex one (1) parcel, totaling 8.64± acres, located at 75 Sage Road. SUBJECT: South Lake Howard Nature Park Expansion Design Build Phase 1 Recreation Elements

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City Commission awarded Whitehead Construction a Design-Build Contract and Design Phase Proposal for the South Lake Howard Nature Expansion (RFQ-23-41) on February 26, 2024. The primary purpose of the project is to update and expand the stormwater treatment within the area and develop complimentary recreational elements in and around the new stormwater features.

The project has been carefully planned with extensive survey and exploratory work which took longer than anticipated based on site conditions. The project has been divided into three major phases. The purpose of the phasing is related to specific grant funding requirements for phases 1 and 2. The phasing is generally broken down as follows:

Phase I: First phase of recreation elements associated with a Florida Recreation and Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) Grant. These elements include the following: Nature Trail; paved exercise trail; playground; picnic area; outdoor classroom; frisbee golf hole; kayak launch (lakeside); fishing pier (lakeside); trailhead/parking area.

Phase 2: Stormwater & wetland infrastructure associated with a Heartland Headwaters Grant and remaining recreational elements such as trails, boardwalks and frisbee golf course.

Phase 3: Proposed Nature Education Building.

The Phase 1 elements and associated grants must be online and open by the end of April 2025. To ensure that the grant requirements are met and associated funding received, staff is proposing an authorization for construction of Phase 1 at the present time. The funding associated with Phase 2 requires that the stormwater components be completed at the end of 2025. This phase is currently in permitting and is expected to be ready for construction in 4-6 months' time, providing enough time to construct. Phase 3 is currently being evaluated

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for feasibility. All three phases have been planned around a footprint for Phase 3, should the City elect to build it. Until such time that is developed, it will serve as additional greenspace.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Whitehead Construction has submitted a proposal for the Phase 1 FRDAP Elements at a total cost of \$739,509. Funding for this is available from the following funding sources:

- \$200,000 FRDAP Match (within City Budget in special trust from former CSX contribution)
- \$339,509 within General Fund Balance Proceeds
- Total \$739,509

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the Phase 1 FRDAP Elements Proposal from Whitehead Construction and project budget as outlined within this Fact Sheet and authorize the City Manager to sign all documents and take all necessary actions related thereto.



#### **BACKGROUND**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) requires a Request for Temporary Closing/Special Use of State Road Form to be submitted along with a map and documenting City Commission action approving the requested closure.

The Jewett Alumni Association will host a parade on Saturday, December 21, 2024, with street closures beginning at 9:30 a.m. The parade is scheduled to start at 10:00 a.m. and is expected to conclude by 12:00 p.m. The parade will commence at Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church, traveling north on 2nd Street to Avenue O. From there, the route will continue west on Avenue O to 1st Street, where it will head north, proceeding to MLK Boulevard. The parade will then travel east on MLK Boulevard to Lake Maude Drive, concluding at the Rueben Williams Sports Complex. Detour routes are identified for the closure period.

Additionally, The Neighborhood Service Center, Inc. will host the annual 46<sup>th</sup> Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Parade on Saturday, January 18, 2025. The parade will begin at the Rueben Williams Sports Complex and proceed as follows: traveling north on Lake Maude Drive to MLK Boulevard, turning south on Lake Silver Drive, then heading west on South Lake Silver Drive, and concluding at MLK Park. This route requires closures of all traffic on Lake Maude Dr., MLK Boulevard, and 1<sup>st</sup> St (FDOT Road) until the parade participants have exited the roadway. Road closures are scheduled to begin at 9 a.m. and will conclude no later than 12 p.m. Detour routes are identified for the closure period.

Street closures along these routes will be in effect to ensure the safety of participants and spectators, with clearly marked detour routes established to redirect traffic during the event.



#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

Total cost for the nine vehicles is \$655,156.09. There is presently \$69,652.86 available in the Capital Depletion Fund for the replacements vehicles, with the remaining \$588,035.00 included in the approved Fiscal Year 2024/2025 budget.

SUBJECT: Uncollected Accounts Receivable

#### **BACKGROUND**

At the conclusion of each fiscal year, accounts with balances that have remained delinquent for one year are removed from the active receivable reports, following City Commission approval.

Fiscal Year 2024 delinquent balances are as follows:

Utility Billing\$269,028.69Miscellaneous Billing11,250.89Total Delinquent Accounts\$280,279.58

Utility Billing – The Utility system bills customers monthly for water, wastewater, solid waste, and stormwater services utilized the previous month. An account becomes delinquent 21 days from the billing date. If a balance remains unpaid seven days after the next month's bill is created, the account is scheduled for service interruption.

The write-off for Utility Billing increased \$114,186.52 over prior year. Factors that attributed to this increase are solid waste (garbage) only accounts, residential accounts with leaks and delayed payments, and a few high past due accounts with delayed turn offs. Keep in mind that the City's service territory has expanded in the last few years. Currently, delinquent accounts are 0.41% of total Utility sales.

The removal of delinquent balances does not forgive the debt. City policy requires returning Utility customers to pay all outstanding balances before any new service is provided. In FY 2024, \$18,604.73 was collected from accounts written off in prior years. Staff identified these collections by matching social security numbers to closed accounts.

Miscellaneous Billing – This billing system invoices customers for various fees or reimbursements such as damaged property, lease agreements, and retiree insurance. Requesting Departments monitor

outstanding balances and make collection attempts. A total of \$10,000.00 of Miscellaneous Billing is due to an outstanding School Board Facility Use agreement. Communication is ongoing with the School Board.

Customer Service makes considerable attempts to collect outstanding payments on past due Utility accounts. Staff is in the process of evaluating the effectiveness and efficiency of the current collection policy, with focus on the leak policy, solid waste collections, and diligent oversight of current pay plans. Contracting with a collection agency will also be evaluated.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The write off of uncollected accounts will be reflected in the appropriate General, Utility and Internal Service Funds for a total of \$280,279.58.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Commission authorize removal of accounts uncollected for longer than one year from the active receivable registers.

SUBJECT: Kimley-Horn Design Services for Roosevelt Drive Complete Street Project

#### **BACKGROUND**

On January 10, 2022, The City Commission adopted Resolution R-22-02 supporting the submission of a Transportation Alternative Project Grant application to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for funding to reconstruct and complete a 950 foot segment of Roosevelt Drive from Cypress Gardens Blvd to Register Road. The project will include construction of two, 11 foot lanes between Cypress Gardens Blvd and Register Road, a minimum of 5-foot-wide sidewalks on one side of the roadway, installation of raingardens and landscaping.

FDOT awarded a \$927,935 grant to the City for the purpose of funding a portion of these imporvements. The City is required to fund the projects design and any construction costs exceeding \$927,935.

Kimley Horn and Associates, who have designed a number of FDOT funded projects for the City, have been selected for this project. Kimley Horn is on the master contining contract, awareded via RFQ-20-01. A construction cost estimate will be prepared by Kimley Horn during the design phase of the project, and construction is not anticipated to exceed the \$7,500,000 CNNA threshold. Staff has worked with Kimley Horn to produce a consulting engineering agreement proposal that includes the following general services:

- Survey work
- Geotechnical work
- Attendance at Monthly Progress Meetings
- Permitting Assistance
- Preparation of 30%, 60%, 90%, and 100% design plans for submittal to FDOT
- Preparation of construction bidding documents

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The design timeline aligns with the agreement with FDOT, with final approved plans anticipated to be ready for construciton by early summer 2025.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

- Pillar: Infastructure
- Goal: 3.2 Take a comprehensive approach to transportation planning and maintenance of transportation assets.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

Kimley Horn's lump sum fee for design services is \$145,656 and will be funded out of the transportation fund for FY 24/25.


#### RECOMMENDATION

## CONSULTING ENGINEERING AGREEMENT FOR: Roosevelt Drive Extension and Enhancements

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this document is to describe the scope of work and the responsibilities of Kimley-Horn and the CITY, for the preparation of construction documents for complete street design enhancements for Roosevelt Drive for the City of Winter Haven. The proposed improvements are focused on enhancing multimodal safety, connectivity, and accessibility while upgrading the existing street network to accommodate various modes of transportation better.

The limits of the improvements are identified below:

 From the intersection of SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) to Register Road. A distance of approximately 910 ft.

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

#### Task 1 - Complete Street Design Improvements

Kimley-Horn will prepare a set of construction documents as described below. This scope of work consists of roadway, drainage, sidewalk, irrigation sleeves, utility coordination, and signing and marking design needed to prepare a set of complete street construction documents. The anticipated typical section will consist of 11-ft. travel lanes, 6-ft. rain garden along the north side of the road, 6-ft wide sidewalk along the north side, and a 12-ft wide shared-use path along the south side. The right-of-way width is 60 feet throughout the corridor.

#### A. General/Project Administration

Project administration activities will be undertaken throughout the project duration and will consist of the following:

- 1. Project Setup: Kimley-Horn will establish project files, project work plan, scheduling, and initiation of our accounting system.
- 2. Kick-off Meeting: Kimley-Horn will participate in a kick-off meeting with the CITY and the project team.
- 3. Monthly Progress Meetings: On a monthly basis, Kimley-Horn will have phone conferences with the CITY to review the progress of work, conduct project reviews, and coordinate with utility companies. Kimley-Horn will maintain the project schedule and review/update the schedule at each progress meeting. Six (6) monthly meetings are budgeted for this project.
- 4. Progress Reports and Invoices: Kimley-Horn will prepare a monthly progress report to be included with the monthly invoice.
- 5. Coordination with adjacent businesses and residences: Kimley-Horn will attend one (1) public meeting and provide graphic boards for presentation.



#### B. Complete Street Construction Documents

Kimley-Horn will prepare Complete Street construction documents on 11"x17" sheets depicting the needed Complete Street improvements. The Complete Street improvement design plans will consist of the following sheets:

- 1. Key Sheet.
- Typical Sections A typical Complete Street section will be developed for Roosevelt Drive as necessary. One (1) typical section is anticipated for the entire segment, from SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) to the new connection at Register Road. The proposed pavement design will be identified on the roadway typical section.
- 3. General Notes.
- 4. **Roadway Plan Sheets** The plan sheets will detail geometric design requirements, covering curb and gutter installations, roadway drainage, pavement reconstruction and resurfacing, and turnouts for intersecting streets/driveways. The plans will also show the 6-ft concrete sidewalk on the north side and the 12-ft shared-use path on the south side.
- Driveway Details Where necessary, driveway detail sheets will include information depicting the limits of driveway reconstruction, and grading information for accommodation of the existing commercial driveway connections.
- Roadway Cross Sections Where necessary, cross sections will include information depicting
  the limits of reconstruction and other information. It is anticipated that a minimum of 20 sections
  will be provided, one every 50 ft.
- 7. **Traffic Control Plan** Kimley-Horn will design a safe and effective (Level I) Traffic Control Plan, consisting of notes and details, to move vehicular and pedestrian traffic during construction.
  - Maintenance of Traffic requirements for the construction of this project will be provided through the use of typical sections, plans, general notes and reference to the appropriate FDOT Design Standard. In addition, a conceptual MOT phasing plan depicting detour routes and phase segments of pavement lane closures and traffic shifts will be prepared.
- Erosion Control Plans Erosion control plans will be prepared depicting site specific erosion control measures, as well as general notes, details, and quantities for additional erosion control measures that may be needed depending on site conditions. It is anticipated that the preparation of a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) may not be required.
- 9. **Utility Adjustment Plans** Based on information provided by the various utility providers in the corridor, proposed utility adjustments will be detailed in plan view on these sheets, as necessary.
- 10. Submittals Kimley-Horn will submit up to five (5) copies of the Complete Street construction documents at 60% and 100% completion stage to the CITY for review and comment. In addition, Kimley-Horn will submit two (2) copies of the roadway plans at 60%, 100% stages to affected utility companies, as necessary. An Opinion of Probable Construction (OPC) cost will be submitted with the 60%, 100%, and Final submittal for the City's review and comment. An electronic copy will also



be provided at each phase submittal.

#### C. Utility Coordination

Kimley-Horn will coordinate the proposed design with the affected utility companies within the project limits in order to minimize utility conflicts. The individual utility owners will locate/designate their existing utilities within the project limits.

Each utility provider will be responsible for the design of their respective utilities for this project. These designs will be provided to Kimley-Horn by the utility provider in CADD format for inclusion into the Improvement Plans for this project. Kimley-Horn will be responsible for coordinating with the utility providers for the proposed construction elements such that utility conflicts are minimized or avoided.

Kimley-Horn will provide electronic PDF files of plans to the utility owners at the 60% and 100% submittals. Kimley-Horn cannot be responsible for the accuracy of the CADD files after they are provided to the Utility owners, if requested. Kimley-Horn will, prior to and during design, obtain available data from the Utility Owners that may be needed to determine the actual location and depth of the underground utilities. Kimley-Horn will prepare for and attend one (1) utility coordination meeting.

#### D. Signing and Marking Plans

Signing and pavement marking plan sheets, details, and General Notes sheet will be provided in accordance with City and MUTCD standards.

The plan set will include the following sheets and prepared as a component set of plans:

- 1. Notes and tabulation of quantities,
- 2. Signing and Pavement Marking plans,

#### E. Surveying

The ENGINEER will subcontract with a registered professional land surveyor ("LAND SURVEYOR") to provide surveying services as described below:

- Survey Control Horizontal/Vertical: The LAND SURVEYOR will establish horizontal and vertical control on the proposed corridor and set 2 benchmarks and control points along said route using the datum as specified by the design.
- 2. Records Research: The LAND SURVEYOR will obtain information from the Polk County Property Appraiser's Office, Polk County Clerk of Courts, FDOT, and Bureau of Land Management to acquire record evidence of parcel ownership, existing right-of-way limits for Roosevelt Drive within the limits defined above and intersecting roadways, certified corner records and horizontal and vertical control and shown on a plan sheet file and in CADD.
- 3. Base Map Digital Control File: The LAND SURVEYOR will create a master horizontal control file to be utilized throughout the planning and design of the roadway alignment. This map will include the location of the existing right-of-way lines for those portions of intersecting roadways that fall within the project limits. These right-of-way lines together with the boundary lines and controlling monuments for the ownership entities will serve as the base geometry for the project.



4. Route Survey and Topography: The LAND SURVEYOR will obtain cross-section elevations at 50-foot intervals along the route and extend a distance of 20 feet right and 20 feet left of the right of way line. Above ground improvements, including trees lying within 10 feet either side of the proposed right of way line will be located. Surface evidence of underground utilities, including valves and manholes, will be located. Invert elevations and pipe sizes will be obtained on all structures along the proposed route.

#### F. Geotechnical Explorations

Kimley-Horn will subcontract with a geotechnical subconsultant ("Geo-Tech") to provide geotechnical investigations for the project.

Geo-Tech's scope of services for this project will consist of the following:

- 1. Four (4) Pavement cores spaced every 150 ft. along the corridor.
- 2. Five (5) soil borings to depths of six (6) feet below existing grade in the existing roadway right-of-way. Soil borings will be performed on two-hundred (200) foot centers in alternating sides of the roadway to classify existing road base and ground water elevation.

Samples will be recovered from the roadway soil borings per ASTM standards and returned to the laboratory for visual classification per the AASHTO Classification Group System. A report will be issued, to the City and EOR, presenting the findings, evaluations and recommendations to aid in the design of the proposed roadway expansion.

#### Task 2 - Complete Street Permitting and Bid Assistance

#### A. Permitting Assistance

Kimley-Horn will prepare and submit the following permit applications:

- 1. Florida Department of Transportation (Construction Agreement).
- 2. Southwest Florida Water Management District Environmental Resource Permit (Exemption) One (1) exemption letter request will be prepared accounting for the revised conditions proposed by the proposed improvements. A letter of exemption is anticipated for the project given the overall proposed safety improvement for the project and the fact that additional roadway capacity is not being added to the facility. Permitting services beyond the requirements for a letter mod as required by the SWFWMD will be compensated as additional services.
- 3. Meetings and Coordination Kimley-Horn will attend one (1) pre-application meeting with SWFWMD to verify permitting requirements and procedures.

Kimley-Horn will submit the required number of plans and supporting documentation to provide a complete permit application. Kimley-Horn will respond to Requests for Additional Information (RAI) and address permitting agency review comments associated with this scope of services as appropriate.

#### B. Bid Documents and Assistance

This AGREEMENT consists of the scope of services necessary to prepare the Project for competitive bidding by construction contractors. It specifically does not include Construction Engineering Inspection



(CEI) services or geotechnical materials testing during construction of the project. It is anticipated that a separate AGREEMENT for those services will be prepared at a future date.

#### **Bidding Assistance**

1. Bid Document Preparation and Contractor Notification. The ENGINEER will prepare and assemble construction bidding documents, including specifications for the subject Work and the construction contract, based on "Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract" (EJCDC No. C-700) prepared by the Joint Contract Documents Committee. The ENGINEER will coordinate with City of Winter Haven Purchasing staff to support the issuance of bid packages for the submittal of quotations to perform the work and conduct one (1) pre-bid meeting with potential bidders. The ENGINEER will tabulate the bids received and evaluate the compliance of the bids received with the bidding documents. The ENGINEER will prepare a written summary of this tabulation and evaluation and attend one (1) Selection Committee meeting with representatives from City of Winter Haven to discuss selection of the successful contractor.

#### **PROVISIONS FOR WORK**

#### A. Governing Regulations

The services performed by Kimley-Horn will be in compliance with all applicable CITY and FDOT Standards Guidelines. The current edition, including updates, of the following References and Guidelines will be used in the performance of this work.

- 1. FDOT Manual of Uniform Minimum Standards for Design, Construction and Maintenance for Streets and Highways, Green Book (Current Edition).
- AASHTO's "A Policy on Geometric Design of Highways and Streets".
- 3. FDOT Design Standards.
- 4. FDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
- 5. Florida Manual on Uniform Traffic Studies (MUTS).
- 6. Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
- 7. AASHTO Guide for Bicycle Facilities Design.
- 8. SWFWMD ERP guidelines.

#### **ADDITIONAL SERVICES**

#### A. Payment for Additional Services

Any professional services not specifically listed in the above Scope of Services are not included in the contracted fees. Should the CITY desire any services beyond those specified, Kimley-Horn will prepare a fee, scope and schedule for the work at the time the services are requested.

#### **SCHEDULE**

Kimley-Horn will provide the above Scope of Services as expeditiously as possible to meet a mutually agreed upon schedule. A project schedule will be developed and discussed at the first progress meeting. The project schedule will be maintained throughout the performance of the scope of services.



#### **FEE**

Kimley-Horn will perform the services described in Tasks 1 through 2 of the Scope of Services for the Lump Sum fees listed below. In addition to the lump sum fee, a time and material task (Totaling \$10,000.00) has been included to provide for additional design services that may become necessary due to deviations in assumptions made during project scoping process. SUBJECT: Motor Pool Roof Replacement

#### BACKGROUND

The roof at the Motor Pool facility was severely damaged by Hurricane Milton in early October. After inspection, it was determined that the roof must be fully replaced to ensure the building's safety and functionality.

Facilities Maintenance obtained two quotes for the replacement. F.E.C. Roofing, a trusted vendor with whom we've previously worked, provided the lowest bid at \$215,504.

An emergency purchase justification was submitted to and approved by the City Manager. A purchase order for \$215,504 has been issued to F.E.C. Roofing, and facilities staff is scheduling work to begin.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The total cost for the roof replacement is \$215,504, as quoted by F.E.C. Roofing, This includes all materials, labor, and associated costs necessary to complete the project. This project is being submitted through insurance as well as FEMA for potential reimbursement.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

This is a routine item associated with normal operations of the City not specifically defined as a goal or strategy within the Strategic Plan. However, it is aligned with the Responsible Government pillar.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Commission ratify this action and authorize the City Manager to issue a purchase order in the amount of \$215,504 to F.E.C. Roofing for the replacement of the Motor Pool roof, and to take any further necessary actions.

Housing Advisory Committee.

#### BACKGROUND

The City Commission adopted Ordinance O-17-14 March 13, 2017 to establish the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC) membership criteria in accordance with Florida Statute §420.9076. Ordinance O-17-14 requires the Committee to consist of at least eight but not more than eleven committee members consisting of one representative from at least six of the categories below:

- 1. A citizen who is actively engaged in the residential home building industry in connection with affordable housing.
- 2. A citizen who is actively engaged in the banking or mortgage banking industry in connection with affordable housing.
- 3. A citizen who is a representative of those areas of labor actively engaged in home building in connection with affordable housing.
- 4. A citizen who is actively engaged as an advocate for low-income persons in connection with affordable housing.
- 5. A citizen who is actively engaged as a for-profit provider of affordable housing.
- 6. A citizen who is actively engaged as a not-for-profit provider of affordable housing.

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- 7. A citizen who is actively engaged as a real estate professional in connection with affordable housing.
- 8. A citizen who actively serves on the local planning agency pursuant to F.S. 163.3174. If the local planning agency is comprised of the governing board of the county or municipality, the governing board may appoint a designee who is knowledgeable in the local planning process.
- 9. A citizen who resides within the jurisdiction of the local governing body making the appointments.
- 10. A citizen who represents employers within the jurisdiction.
- 11. A citizen who represents essential services personnel, as defined in the local housing assistance plan.

The duties of the Committee are to review the existing policies and procedures, ordinances, land development regulations, and the City's comprehensive plan as they pertain to the provision of affordable housing. The Committee must then recommend specific actions or initiatives to encourage or facilitate affordable housing while protecting the ability of the property to appreciate in value.

Elizabeth Davis has been the designated Winter Haven Planning Commission representative since November, 2023. Earlier this fall, Elizabeth Davis submitted her resignation from the Planning Commission which also leaves her seat on the AHAC vacant. At their November 5, 2024 regular meeting, the Planning Commission approved Ed Smith to fill the seat on the AHAC vacated by Ms. Davis.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

This is an appointment to the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee and is not specifically defined as a goal or strategy in the Strategic Plan. However, it is generally aligned with the Responsible Government Pillar.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no direct financial impact associated with this request.



#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Commission approve Resolution R-24-52 appointing Ed Smith to the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee as the representative from the Winter Haven Planning Commission.

Road, South. The area covered by this request is 6.02± acres.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Paul William Schulz Revocable Trust, petitioner, requests the City rezone a portion of parcel from Planned Unit Development (PUD) zoning district to Single Family Residential- Large Lot (R-1) zoning district. The area subject to this request is a portion of a Planned Unit Development subject to PUD Ordinance O-20-19. The property that is the subject of this request is located at 4020 Country Club Road, South, is approximately 6.02± acres, and contains the vacant Outback Oasis event venue and associated pavilion, restrooms, and pond. Current PUD Ordinance O-20-19 allows for up to a 5,000-square foot event venue or clubhouse depicted in the conceptual plan on the subject property.

The petitioner proposes to remove the commercial use provided in the PUD which is the subject of Ordinance O-20-19 and return/rezone that approximate 6.02 acre area to residential use permitted by the R-1 zoning district with this request. The petitioner intends to develop the approximate 6.02 acre parcel with estate size lots comparable to the surrounding parcels. The R-1 zoning district allows up to three (3) dwelling units per acre. Based on the 6.02± acres, a theoretical maximum of 18 single-family units could be developed; however, when R-1 development standards, infrastructure requirements, and the existing pond located on the parcel are considered, it would be unlikely for the subject property to be developed at the maximum permitted density. All other adjacent property (not subject to the rezoning request) shall remain subject to the PUD zoning district established by Ordinance O-20-19.

#### SURROUNDING USES

The subject property is surrounded by single-family residential to the east, south, and west, and single-family residential across Country Club Road to the north.

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#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

The table below outlines the maximum potential demands on supporting infrastructure for the maximum theoretical development of 18 single-family units.

Based on the numbers in the table above, there is sufficient potable water, wastewater, and roadway capacity available to support the maximum potential development of the subject property under the requested zoning designation. However, a final concurrency determination shall be made at the time the property receives site plan approval and is developed.

Public school availability is highly variable due to frequent changes in school enrollments over the course of a year; therefore, available capacity is determined by the Polk County Public Schools at the time of final platting for subdivisions. Availability can be met by having capacity at the zoned schools or an adjacent zoned school as permitted under State Statute. Based on the maximum potential for up to 18 single-family units, up to 4 elementary, 2 middle, and 3 high school seats may be required.

#### COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The current adopted Future Land Use on the property is Neighborhood Suburban. The requested R-1 zoning district is consistent with the Neighborhood Suburban Future Land Use designation.

#### NOTIFICATION

All public notification requirements for this request were met.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT



There is no direct financial impact to the City with this request.

This request is initiated by an application by a private party. In accordance with Chapter 2024-145, Laws of Fla. (CS/CS/SB 1628 (2024)), ordinances initiated by an application by a private party are exempt from providing Business Impact Estimates.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

This is a routine zoning amendment associated with normal operations of the City not specifically defined as a goal or strategy within the Strategic Plan. However, it is aligned with the Economic Sustainability Strategic Pillar.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Commission, at its November 5, 2024 regular meeting, voted to recommend approval of this request. No members of the public spoke.

#### CONCLUSION

Staff's review of the petitioner's request yields the following conclusions:

- The requested R-1 zoning district is compatible with the immediate surrounding uses and also the City designations in the Country Club Road corridor;
- The requested R-1 zoning district is consistent with the Neighborhood Suburban Future Land Use assigned to the property; and
- This request will likely result in a potential decrease in public infrastructure demands by removal
  of the commercial event venue/clubhouse from PD-20-19 and the lands that are zoned PUD
  zoning district by Ordinance O-20-19; and additionally, at this time, there is sufficient capacity to
  support the maximum potential development under the requested R-1 zoning district.



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




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**Aerial Map** 0-24-53

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WINTER HAVEN, FLORIDA, BY REZONING ONE (1) PARCEL FROM PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT (PUD) ZONING DISTRICT TO SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL- LARGE LOT (R-1) ZONING DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (General Location: 4020 Country Club Road, South. The area covered by this request is 6.02± acres.)

WHEREAS, there has been a request to rezone the property depicted below, and;

WHEREAS, the action will further the general health, safety, and welfare and be a benefit to the City as a whole, and;

WHEREAS, the requested rezoning is consistent with the Future Land Use Element of the Winter Haven Comprehensive Plan.


WHEREAS, the request implements requirements contained in Part II, Chapter 163 of Florida Statutes, and therefore is exempt from requiring a Business Impact Estimate as set forth by Chapter 2023-309, Laws of Fla. (CS/CS/SB 170 (2023)).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF WINTER HAVEN, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Chapter 21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Winter Haven, Florida, is hereby amended to rezone that land, depicted in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance, from Planned Unit Development (PUD) zoning district to Single Family Residential- Large Lot (R-1) zoning district.
- 2. This Ordinance shall not be codified, but the City Clerk shall retain this Ordinance as a permanent record of action taken by the City Commission of the City of Winter Haven.
- 3. The correction of typographical and/or scrivener's errors which do not affect the intent may be authorized by the City Manager or designee, without need of public hearing, by filing a corrected or recodified copy of same with the City Clerk.
- 4. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed but only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect. Provided further that the provisions of Ordinance O-20-19 establishing a PUD zoning district on lands adjacent to the land depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto shall remain in full force and effect and is not intended to be repealed by the adoption and passage of this Ordinance.
- 5. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the effective date; however, that such change shall first be noted on the official zoning map of the City of Winter Haven.

SUBJECT: Ordinance O-24-54: Request by the Peace Creek Village Community Development

District to expand the boundaries of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District. General Location: The area covered by this request is generally located south of Old Bartow/Lake Wales Road and west of Old Bartow

Road. The area covered by this request is 84.75± acres.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Peace Creek Village Community Development District (CDD) has filed a petition with the City requesting to expand the boundaries of the CDD as permitted by Chapter 190.005(2), Florida Statutes. The CDD was established October 23, 2023, and presently consists of approximately 95.38± acres generally located north of Old Bartow Lake Wales Road and east of McClean Road. The Annabelle Estates Subdivision, totaling 324 building lots and 12 common lots, is located within the CDD and is presently under construction.

The proposed expansion of the CDD is located south of Old Bartow/Lake Wales Road and west of Old Bartow Road and contains approximately 84.75± acres. The area will be developed as the Reserve at Lake Parker Subdivision with approximately 336 building lots. With inclusion of the expanded area, the total area of the Peace Creek Village CDD will be approximately 180.13± acres.

Chapter 190 of Florida Statutes allows a developer to petition to establish or expand a CDD for the purpose of managing the provision of infrastructure improvements and public services, including funding. The Peace Creek Village CDD consists of a five (5) member Board of Supervisors (CDD Board) having the authority to oversee the installation of infrastructure improvements, secure financing, and to levy non ad valorem special assessments on future property owners within its boundaries. All meetings are open to the public and are subject to all applicable Government in the Sunshine laws.

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The petitioner has submitted a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs for the Peace Creek Village CDD expansion area. The Statement indicates the total infrastructure costs are estimated at \$16,312,557, and will be financed through District bonds. Based on the Statement, the State of Florida, Polk County, and the City of Winter Haven will not incur any costs relating to the establishment of the CDD, nor per Chapter 190 F.S., will any debts incurred by the CDD become debts of the City, County, or State of Florida. Since the land area of the CDD is an independent unit of government and issues its own bonds, the CDD will not have any effect on the bonding capacity of the City, County, or State of Florida. The CDD is required to adopt and submit a budget for its operations to the City on an annual basis. The City will have an opportunity to comment on the CDD's budget prior to its adoption by the Board.

Water, sewer, and reuse infrastructure will be maintained by the City while all internal roadway and drainage infrastructure will be maintained by the CDD. In the event the CDD is terminated, the City will not be required to accept ownership or maintenance of road rights-of-way, stormwater management and drainage systems, and street lighting without express written consent.

Pursuant to Section 190.012(2)(a) and (d), the petitioner is requesting consent to exercise special powers relating to the provision of parks and facilities for indoor and outdoor recreation, cultural, and educational uses; and security.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT/BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT:

There is no direct financial impact to the City with this request.

This request has been initiated by an application by a private party and involves a CDD. In accordance with Chapter 2024-145, Laws of Fla. (CS/CS/SB 1628 (2024)), ordinances initiated by an application by a private party and that involve the establishment of a CDD are exempt from providing Business Impact Estimates.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

This is a request to expand the boundaries of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District associated with normal operations of the City not specifically defined as a goal or strategy within the Strategic Plan. However, it is aligned with the Responsible Government Strategic Pillar.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Commission approve Ordinance O-24-54.



#### ORDINANCE NO. 0-24-54

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WINTER HAVEN, FLORIDA AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. O-23-57, WHICH ESTABLISHED THE PEACE CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, TO EXPAND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PEACE CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 190, FLORIDA STATUTES (2024); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR ADMINISTRATIVE CORRECTION OF SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2023, the City Commission (the "Commission") of the City of Winter Haven, Florida (the "City") approved Ordinance No. O-23-57 (the "Establishing Ordinance"), effective October 23, 2023, establishing the Peace Creek Village Community Development District (the "District") pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City received the District's Petition to Expand the Boundary of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District (the "Petition"), which Petition is in compliance with the provisions of Section 190.046, Florida Statutes (2024); and

WHEREAS, all interested persons and affected units of general-purpose local government were afforded an opportunity to present oral and written comments on the Petition at a duly noticed public hearing conducted by the Commission on December 9, 2024, pursuant to Section 190.046(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2024); and

WHEREAS, the additional property to be added to the District's boundaries (the "Expansion Parcel") is owned by Winterlake PH LP and by Lake Wales Common LP and they have provided written consent to authorize the addition of the Expansion Parcel to the District's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has considered the record established at the duly noticed public hearing and has considered the statutory factors set forth in Section 190.005(1)(e), Florida Statutes (2024), in making its determination to grant or deny the Petition; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, pursuant to the information contained within the Petition and based on an investigation conducted by City staff and otherwise being fully advised as to the facts and circumstances contained within the Petition, finds that the statutory factors under Section 190.005(1)(e), Florida Statutes (2024) have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the information stated herein and, in the Petition, and upon consideration of the record established at the duly noticed hearing, the Commission has decided to grant the District's Petition; and

WHEREAS, the District, as amended, will constitute a timely, efficient, effective, responsive, and economic way to deliver community development services in the area described in the Petition; and

WHEREAS, the District, as amended, shall not act to amend any land development approvals governing the land to be included within the District; and

WHEREAS, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the Peace Creek Village Community Development District, as created by general law and by Ordinance No. O-23-57, will be duly and legally authorized to exist on the proposed property and to exercise all of its general and special powers as limited by law and by Ordinance No. O-23-57, including within the Expansion Parcel.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF WINTER HAVEN, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Boundaries</u>. The City hereby grants the District's Petition, and the boundaries of the District are modified to include the metes and bounds description of the Expansion Parcel, comprising approximately 84.747 acres, more or less, as described in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The District boundaries as amended by adoption of this Ordinance are described in Exhibit 2 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference and shall encompass approximately 180.147 acres of land, more or less.

Section 2. <u>City Findings</u>. The City, pursuant to the information contained within the Petition and an investigation conducted by City staff and otherwise being fully advised as to the facts and circumstances contained within the Petition, finds as follows:

- (1) The statements within the Petition are true and correct; and
- (2) The Petition is complete in that it meets the requirements of Section 190.046, Florida Statutes (2024); and
- (3) The appropriate City staff have reviewed the Petition of the District on the proposed lands to be included within the District and have advised the Commission that said Petition is complete and sufficient; and
- (4) Amendment of the District boundaries and all land uses and services planned within the District, as amended, are not inconsistent with applicable elements or portions of the adopted State Comprehensive Plan or the applicable and effective local comprehensive plans; and
- (5) The area of land to be included within the District is of sufficient size, is sufficiently compact, and is sufficiently contiguous to be developed as one functional, interrelated community; and
- (6) The District, as amended, is the best alternative available for delivering community development services and facilities to the area that will be served by the District; and
- (7) The community development services and facilities of the District, as amended, will not be incompatible with the capacity and uses of existing local and regional community development services and facilities; and

(8) The area that will be served by the District, as amended, is amenable to separate special-district government.

Section 3. <u>Authority</u>. This Ordinance is adopted in compliance with and pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (2024).

Section 4. <u>Conflicts</u>. All Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, superseded and repealed. Provided, however, that all of the terms of Ordinance No. O-23-57 adopted by the Commission on October 23, 2023 are expressly affirmed and shall remain in full force and effect and be applicable for that Expansion Parcel described in Exhibit 1 a? ached hereto and incorporated herein by reference and the Expansion Parcel shall be subject to all of the provisions of Ordinance No. O-23-57 which are expressly affirmed herein.

Section 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof, is finally determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed severable and the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect provided that the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision is not material to the logical and intended interpretation of this Ordinance.

Sec? on 6. <u>Administra?ve Correc?on of Scrivener's Errors</u>. The correc?on of typographical and/or scrivener's errors which do not affect the intent may be authorized by the City Manager or his or her designee, without need of a public hearing, by filing a corrected or re-codified copy of same with the City Clerk.

Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage at second reading after public hearing.

# PETITION TO EXPAND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PEACE CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

Petitioner, Peace Creek Village Community Development District (hereafter, the "District"), a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, and the City of Winter Haven (the "City") Ordinance No. O-23-57 (the "Ordinance"), and located within the City, hereby petitions the City Commission of the City of Winter Haven, Florida, pursuant to the "Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980," Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, and specifically Section 190.046(1)(b), *Florida Statutes*, to adopt an amendment to the Ordinance to add approximately 84.747 acres, more or less, to the District. In support of this Petition, Petitioner states as follows:

- 1. <u>History and Basis for Petition.</u> On October 23, 2023, upon petition by Enright Real Property Company, LLC, the City Commission of the City, adopted Ordinance No. O-23-57, establishing the District effective the same date. The District currently comprises approximately 95.4 acres of land as identified in the Ordinance (the "**Existing District**"). The current members of the Board of Supervisors of the District were duly elected at a landowners' election held on December 15, 2023 (the "**Board**").
- 2. <u>Location and Size.</u> The District currently consists of land located within the City. The Boundary Amendment Parcel (hereinafter defined), is located entirely within the City. **Exhibit 1** depicts the general location of the Existing District and the Boundary Amendment Parcel. The metes and bounds and legal description of the current District is provided in **Exhibit 2**. The metes and bounds description of the land proposed to be added to the District (the "**Boundary Amendment Parcel**"), is set forth in **Exhibit 3**. After expansion, the District will encompass a

total of approximately 180.147 acres of land, more or less. The metes and bounds and legal description of the proposed District boundary after the expansion are set forth in **Exhibit 4** (the "Amended District").

- 3. <u>Landowner Consent.</u> The District has written consent to amend the boundary of the District from the owners of the Boundary Amendment Parcels. Documentation of the consents are contained in **Composite Exhibit 5**. The favorable action of the Board of Supervisors of the District also constitutes consent for all of the landowners currently within the District pursuant to Section 190.046(1)(g), *Florida Statutes*, and is evidenced by the District's adoption of Resolution 2025-01 (Exhibit 6).
- 4. <u>Future Land Uses.</u> The designation of future general distribution, location and extent of the public and private land uses proposed for the area to be added to the District by the future land use plan element of the City of Winter Haven Comprehensive Plan are shown on **Exhibit 7**. Expansion of the District in the manner proposed is not inconsistent with the adopted City of Winter Haven Comprehensive Plan. Furthermore, all development within the Amended District will continue to be subject to the same development regulation, permitting requirements and zoning as required by the State of Florida, the County and the City following Expansion of the District's boundaries.
- 5. <u>Major Water and Wastewater Facilities</u>. There are currently no existing sanitary sewer and water distribution systems for the Boundary Amendment Parcel. **Exhibit 8** shows the major trunk water mains, sewer interceptors and outfalls within the Existing District, as well as the proposed drainage patterns within the Boundary Amendment Parcel.
- 6. <u>District Facilities and Services; Debt Assessments.</u> The District is presently expected to finance, construct, and install improvements and facilities to benefit the lands within

the Amended District in a single phase commencing in 2025. **Exhibit 9** describes the types of facilities the District presently expects to finance, construct, and install, as well as the entities anticipated for future ownership, operation, and maintenance. The estimated costs of construction are also identified in **Exhibit 9**. Actual construction timetables and expenditures will likely vary, due in part to the effects of future changes in the economic conditions upon costs such as labor, services, materials, interest rates, and market conditions.

- 7. <u>Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs.</u> **Exhibit 10** is the Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs ("SERC") prepared in accordance with the requirements of Section 120.541, *Florida Statutes*. The SERC is based upon presently available data. The data and methodology used in preparing the SERC accompany it.
- 8. <u>Authorized Agent.</u> Jennifer Kilinski of Kilinski Van Wyk PLLC, serves as counsel to the Petitioner. Copies of all correspondence and official notices should be sent to:

- 9. <u>Filing Fee.</u> Upon the filing of this Petition, the District submitted a copy of this Petition together with **Exhibits 1 through 10** and paid a filing fee to the City as required pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*.
- 10. This petition to expand the boundary of the Peace Creek Village Community

  Development District should be granted for the following reasons:
- a. Amendment of the District and all land uses and services planned within the District as amended are not inconsistent with applicable elements or portions of the adopted State Comprehensive Plan, the Polk County Comprehensive Plan, or the City Comprehensive Plan.

- b. The District as amended will be of a sufficient size and will be sufficiently compact and contiguous to be developed as one functional and interrelated community.
- c. Existence of the Amended District will prevent the general body of taxpayers in the City from bearing the burden for installation of the infrastructure and the maintenance of certain facilities within the development encompassed by the Amended District. The District is the best alternative available for delivering community development services and facilities to the Expansion Parcels within the Amended District without imposing an additional burden on the general population of the local general-purpose government. The proposed amendment of the District will allow for a more efficient use of resources.
- d. The District, as amended, is the best alternative available for delivering community development services and facilities to the Boundary Amendment Parcel.
- e. The community development services and facilities of the District, as amended, will not be incompatible with the capacity and use of existing local and regional community development services and facilities.
- f. The Boundary Amendment Parcel is amenable to separate special-district government.


WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests the City Commission of the City of Winter Haven, Florida to:

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PEACE CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DIRECTING THE CHAIRPERSON, VICE CHAIRPERSON AND DISTRICT STAFF TO FILE A PETITION WITH THE CITY OF WINTER HAVEN, FLORIDA, REQUESTING THE ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE DISTRICT'S BOUNDARIES, AND AUTHORIZING SUCH OTHER ACTIONS AS ARE NECESSARY IN FURTHERANCE OF THE BOUNDARY AMENDMENT PROCESS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (the "Act"), and Ordinance No. 2023-57, adopted by the City Commission of the City of Winter Haven, Florida, on October 23, 2023 (the "Ordinance"), and being situated within the City of Winter Haven, Florida (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the District is authorized to construct, acquire, operate and maintain infrastructure improvements and services; and

WHEREAS, the District presently consists of approximately 95.38 acres of land, more or less, as more fully described in the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, ERPC Peace Creek, LLC, an owner of certain lands within the District, including those lands anticipated to be annexed into the District (the "Developer"), has approached the District and requested the District petition to amend its boundaries to add approximately 88.584 acres of land, more or less, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit A (the "Expansion Parcel"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed boundary amendment is in the best interests of the District and the area of land within the proposed amended boundaries of the District will continue to be of sufficient size, sufficiently compact, and sufficiently contiguous to be developable as one functionally related community; and

WHEREAS, addition of the Expansion Parcel in Exhibit A to the District is not inconsistent with either the State or local comprehensive plans; and

WHEREAS, the area of land that will lie in the amended boundaries of the District continues to be amenable to separate special district government; and

WHEREAS, in order to seek a boundary amendment pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, the District desires to authorize District staff, including but not limited to legal, engineering, and managerial staff, to provide such services as are necessary throughout the pendency of the boundary amendment process; and

WHEREAS, the retention of any necessary consultants and the work to be performed by District staff may require the expenditure of certain fees, costs, and other expenses by the District as authorized by the District's Board of Supervisors (the "Board"); and

WHEREAS, the District desires to petition to amend its boundaries in accordance with the procedures and processes described in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, which processes include the preparation of a petition to the City, and such other actions as are necessary in furtherance of the boundary amendment process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PEACE CREEK VILLAGE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

**SECTION 1.** The recitals stated above are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated into and form a material part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2. The Board hereby directs the Chairperson and District staff to proceed in an expeditious manner with the preparation and filing of a petition and related materials with the City to seek the amendment of the District's boundaries to add the lands depicted in Exhibit A, pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and authorizes the prosecution of the procedural requirements detailed in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, for the amendment of the District's boundaries.

SECTION 3. The Board hereby authorizes the District Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, District Manager and District Counsel to act as agents of the District with regard to any and all matters pertaining to the petition to the City to amend the boundaries of the District.

**SECTION 4.** This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage.





#### STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS

#### 1.0 Introduction

#### 1.1 Purpose and Scope

This Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs ("SERC") supports the petition to amend the boundaries of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District ("District"). The District was established by Ordinance No. O-23-57, passed by the City Commission of the City of Winter Haven, Florida on October 23, 2023. The current size of the District is approximately 95.4 +/- acres and the District is located entirely within the City of Winter Haven, Florida (the "City"). The petition to amend the boundaries of the District seeks to add approximately 84.747 +/- acres located in the City to the District ("Amendment Area"). After the amendment, the District will be projected to contain approximately 180.147 +/- acres and is planned to be developed with a total of 660 residential dwelling units. The limitations on the scope of this SERC are explicitly set out in Section 190.002(2)(d), Florida Statutes ("F.S.") (governing District establishment) as follows:

"That the process of establishing such a district pursuant to uniform general law be fair and <u>based only on factors material to managing and financing the service delivery function of the district, so that any matter concerning permitting or planning of the <u>development is not material or relevant</u> (emphasis added)."</u>

#### 1.2 Overview of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District

The District is designed to provide public infrastructure, services, and facilities along with operation and maintenance of the same to a master planned residential development currently anticipated to contain a total of approximately 660 residential dwelling units following the amendment of the District's boundaries.

A community development district ("CDD") is an independent unit of special purpose local government authorized by the Act to plan, finance, construct, operate and maintain community-wide infrastructure in planned community developments. CDDs provide a "solution to the state's planning, management and financing needs for delivery of capital infrastructure in order to service projected growth without overburdening other governments and their taxpayers." Section 190.002(1)(a), F.S.

A CDD is not a substitute for the local, general purpose government unit, i.e., the City or County in which the CDD lies. A CDD does not have the permitting, zoning or policing powers possessed by general purpose governments. A CDD is an alternative means of financing, constructing, operating and maintaining public infrastructure for developments, such as Peace Creek Village.

#### 1.3 Requirements for Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs

Section 120.541(2), F.S., defines the elements a statement of estimated regulatory costs must contain:

(a) An economic analysis showing whether the rule directly or indirectly:

1. Is likely to have an adverse impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, or private sector investment in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule;

- 2. Is likely to have an adverse impact on business competitiveness, including the ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule; or
- 3. Is likely to increase regulatory costs, including any transactional costs, in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the rule.
- (b) A good faith estimate of the number of individuals and entities likely to be required to comply with the rule, together with a general description of the types of individuals likely to be affected by the rule.
- (c) A good faith estimate of the cost to the agency, and to any other state and local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed rule, and any anticipated effect on state or local revenues.
- (d) A good faith estimate of the transactional costs likely to be incurred by individuals and entities, including local government entities, required to comply with the requirements of the rule. As used in this section, "transactional costs" are direct costs that are readily ascertainable based upon standard business practices, and include filing fees, the cost of obtaining a license, the cost of equipment required to be installed or used or procedures required to be employed in complying with the rule, additional operating costs incurred, the cost of monitoring and reporting, and any other costs necessary to comply with the rule.
- (e) An analysis of the impact on small businesses as defined by s. 288.703, and an analysis of the impact on small counties and small cities as defined in s. 120.52. The impact analysis for small businesses must include the basis for the agency's decision not to implement alternatives that would reduce adverse impacts on small businesses. (the City of Winter Haven, according to the Census 2020, has a population of 49,219; therefore, it is not defined as a small city for the purposes of this requirement.)
- (f) Any additional information that the agency determines may be useful.
- (g) In the statement or revised statement, whichever applies, a description of any regulatory alternatives submitted under paragraph (1)(a) and a statement adopting the alternative or a statement of the reasons for rejecting the alternative in favor of the proposed rule.

Note: the references to "rule" in the statutory requirements for the Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs also apply to an "ordinance" under section 190.005(2)(a), F.S.

- 2.0 An economic analysis showing whether the ordinance directly or indirectly:
  - 1. Is likely to have an adverse impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, or private sector investment in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance;
  - 2. Is likely to have an adverse impact on business competitiveness, including the ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance; or
  - 3. Is likely to increase regulatory costs, including any transactional costs, in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance.

The ordinance amending the boundaries of the District is not anticipated to have any direct or indirect adverse impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, private sector

investment, business competitiveness, ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation. Any increases in regulatory costs, principally the anticipated increases in transactional costs as a result of imposition of special assessments by the District on the Amended Area will be the direct result of facilities and services provided by the District to the landowners within the Amendment Area. However, as property ownership in the District is voluntary and all additional costs will be disclosed to prospective buyers prior to sale, such increases should be considered voluntary, self-imposed and offset by benefits received from the infrastructure and services provided by the District.

## 2.1 Impact on economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, or private sector investment in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance.

The sole reason for the amending of the District's boundaries is to provide public facilities and services to support the development of a new, master planned residential development. The development of the larger, approximately 180.147 +/- acres, parcel will promote local economic activity, create local value, lead to local private sector investment and is likely, at least in the short term, to support local private sector employment and/or lead to local new job creation to a degree likely higher than that of a smaller, pre-amendment, approximately 95.4 +/- acre, parcel contained within the existing District boundaries.

Amending the boundaries of the District will allow it to plan, fund, implement, operate and maintain, for the benefit of the landowners within the amended and larger District, various public facilities and services for a larger-sized development. Such facilities and services, as further described in Section 5, will allow for the development of the land within the amended District. The provision of District's infrastructure and the subsequent development of land will generate private economic activity, economic growth, investment and employment, and job creation. The District intends to use proceeds of indebtedness to fund construction of public infrastructure, which will be constructed by private firms, and once constructed, is likely to use private firms to operate and maintain such infrastructure and provide services to the landowners and residents of the amended and larger District. The private developer of the land in the amended and larger District will use its private funds to conduct the private land development and construction of an anticipated approximately 660 residential dwelling units, the construction, sale, and continued use/maintenance of which will involve private firms. While similar economic growth, private sector job creation or employment, or private sector investment could be achieved without amending the District's boundaries by the private sector alone, the fact that the amendment of the District's boundaries is initiated by the private developer means that the private developer considers the amendment of the District's boundaries and continued operation of the District as beneficial to the process of land development and the future economic activity taking place within the amended and larger District, which in turn will lead directly or indirectly to economic growth, likely private sector job growth and/or support private sector employment, and private sector investments.

# 2.2 Impact on business competitiveness, including the ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance.

When assessing the question of whether the amending of the boundaries of the District is likely to directly or indirectly have an adverse impact on business competitiveness, including the ability of persons doing business in the state to compete with persons doing business in other states or domestic markets, productivity, or innovation, one has to compare these factors in the presence and in the absence of the amended District boundaries in the development. When the question is phrased in this manner, it can be

surmised that the amendment of the District's boundaries is likely to not have a direct or indirect adverse impact on business competitiveness, productivity, or innovation versus that same development without the amended and larger District. Similar to a purely private solution, District contracts will be bid competitively as to achieve the lowest cost/best value for the particular infrastructure or services desired by the landowners, which will insure that contractors wishing to bid for such contracts will have to demonstrate to the District the most optimal mix of cost, productivity and innovation. Additionally, the amendment of the District's boundaries for the development is not likely to cause the award of the contracts to favor non-local providers any more than if there was a smaller District. The amended and larger District, in its purchasing decisions, will not vary from the same principles of cost, productivity and innovation that guide private enterprise.

### 2.3 Likelihood of an increase in regulatory costs, including any transactional costs, in excess of \$1 million in the aggregate within 5 years after the implementation of the ordinance.

The amendment of the District's boundaries will not increase any regulatory costs of the State or the City by virtue that the District has already been established and amending its size does not change the regulatory requirements that the District will be subject to after the initial review of the petition to amend its boundaries by the City and approval of such petition by the City. As described in more detail in Section 4, the District will pay a one-time filing fee to the City to offset any expenses that the City may incur in the processing of this petition to amend the District's boundaries.

The amending of the District's boundaries will, however, directly increase regulatory costs to the landowners within the Amendment Area. Such increases in regulatory costs, principally the anticipated increases in transactional costs as a result of likely imposition of special assessments and use fees by the District, will be the direct result of facilities and services provided by the District to the landowners within the Amendment Area. However, as property ownership in the District is completely voluntary, all current property owners within the Amendment Area must consent to the amendment of the District's boundaries and the likelihood of additional transaction costs, and all initial prospective buyers will have such additional transaction costs disclosed to them prior to sale, as required by State law. Such costs, however, should be considered voluntary, self-imposed, and as a tradeoff for the service and facilities provided by the District. As to the anticipated amount of the transactional costs in the aggregate within 5 years, they are anticipated to not exceed \$5,000,000.

# 3.0 A good faith estimate of the number of individuals and entities likely to be required to comply with the ordinance, together with a general description of the types of individuals likely to be affected by the ordinance.

The proposed amended District will serve land that comprises an approximately 180.147 +/- acres master planned residential development currently anticipated to contain a total of approximately 660 residential dwelling units, although the development plan can change. Assuming an average density of 3.5 persons per residential dwelling unit, the estimated residential population of the proposed District at build out would be approximately 2,310 +/- and all of these residents as well as the landowners within the District will be affected by the ordinance. The City and certain state agencies will not be affected by or required to comply with the ordinance as more fully discussed hereafter.

## 4.0 A good faith estimate of the cost to the agency, and to any other state and local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed ordinance, and any anticipated effect on state or local revenues.

There is no state agency promulgating any rule relating to this project and there is no anticipated effect of

the ordinance amending the District's boundaries on state or local revenues.

#### 4.1 Costs to Governmental Agencies of Implementing and Enforcing Ordinance

Because the result of adopting the ordinance is the amendment of the boundaries of an existing independent local special purpose government, there will be no additional enforcing responsibilities of any other government entity, but there will be various implementing responsibilities which are identified with their costs herein.

#### State Governmental Entities

Amending the boundaries of an already existing independent local special purpose government will result in no costs to any State governmental entities to implement and enforce the proposed amended and enlarged District.

#### The City of Winter Haven, Florida

The existing District as well as the Amendment Area are both located within the City of Winter Haven, Florida. The City and its staff may process, analyze, conduct a public hearing, and vote upon the petition to amend the boundaries of the District. These activities will absorb some resources; however, these costs incurred by the City will be modest for a number of reasons. First, the City approved ordinance establishing the District in 2023 and that petition possessed much information about the District and City staff should be generally familiar with the District. Second, review of the petition to amend the boundaries of the District does not include analysis of the project itself. Third, the petition itself provides much of the information needed for a staff review. Fourth, the City already possesses the staff needed to conduct the review without the need for new staff. Fifth, there is no capital required to review the petition. Sixth, the potential costs are offset by a filing fee included with the petition to offset any expenses the City may incur in the processing of this petition. Finally, the City already processes similar petitions, though for entirely different subjects, for land uses and zoning changes that are far more complex than the petition to amend the boundaries of a community development district.

Further, there will be no increase in the very small annual costs to the City, because of the amendment of the District's boundaries. The District is an independent unit of local government. The only annual costs the City faces, which will not change with the amendment of the District's boundaries, are the minimal costs of receiving and reviewing the various reports that the District is required to provide to the City, or any monitoring expenses the City may incur if it maintains a monitoring program for this District.

#### 4.2 Impact on State and Local Revenues

Adoption of the proposed ordinance will have no negative impact on state or local revenues. The District is an independent unit of local government. It is designed to provide infrastructure facilities and services to serve the development project and it has its own sources of revenue. No state or local subsidies are required or expected.

Any non-ad valorem assessments levied by the District will not count against any millage caps imposed on other taxing authorities providing services to the lands within the District. It is also important to note that any debt obligations the District may incur are not debts of the State of Florida or any other unit of local government. By Florida law, debts of the District are strictly its own responsibility.

# 5.0 A good faith estimate of the transactional costs likely to be incurred by individuals and entities, including local government entities, required to comply with the requirements of the ordinance.

Table 1 provides an outline of the various facilities and services the proposed District may provide. Financing for these facilities is projected to be provided by the District.

Table 2 illustrates the estimated costs of construction of the capital facilities, outlined in Table 1. Total costs of construction for those facilities that may be provided are estimated to be approximately \$16,312,557. The District may levy non-ad valorem special assessments (by a variety of names) and may issue special assessment bonds to fund the costs of these facilities. These bonds would be repaid through non-ad valorem special assessments levied on all developable properties in the District that may benefit from the District's infrastructure program as outlined in Table 2.

Prospective future landowners in the proposed District may be required to pay non-ad valorem special assessments levied by the District to provide for facilities and secure any debt incurred through bond issuance. In addition to the levy of non-ad valorem special assessments which may be used for debt service, the District may also levy a non-ad valorem assessment to fund the operations and maintenance of the District and its facilities and services. However, purchasing a property within the District or locating in the District by new residents is completely voluntary, so, ultimately, all landowners and residents of the affected property choose to accept the non-ad valorem assessments as a tradeoff for the services and facilities that the District will provide. In addition, state law requires all assessments levied by the District to be disclosed by the initial seller to all prospective purchasers of property within the District.

A CDD provides the property owners with an alternative mechanism of providing public services; however, special assessments and other impositions levied by the District and collected by law represent the transactional costs incurred by landowners as a result of the establishment of the District. Such transactional costs should be considered in terms of costs likely to be incurred under alternative public

and private mechanisms of service provision, such as other independent special districts, City or its dependent districts, or City management but financing with municipal service benefit units and municipal service taxing units, or private entities, all of which can be grouped into three major categories: public district, public other, and private.

With regard to the public services delivery, dependent and other independent special districts can be used to manage the provision of infrastructure and services, however, they are limited in the types of services they can provide, and likely it would be necessary to employ more than one district to provide all services needed by the development.

Other public entities, such as cities, are also capable of providing services, however, their costs in connection with the new services and infrastructure required by the new development and, transaction costs, would be borne by all taxpayers, unduly burdening existing taxpayers. Additionally, other public entities providing services would also be inconsistent with the State's policy of "growth paying for growth".

Lastly, services and improvements could be provided by private entities. However, their interests are primarily to earn short-term profits and there is no public accountability. The marginal benefits of tax-exempt financing utilizing CDDs would cause the CDD to utilize its lower transactional costs to enhance the quality of infrastructure and services.

In considering transactional costs of CDDs, it shall be noted that occupants of the lands to be included within the District will receive three major classes of benefits.

First, those residents in the District will receive a higher level of public services which in most instances will be sustained over longer periods of time than would otherwise be the case.

Second, a CDD is a mechanism for assuring that the public services will be completed concurrently with development of lands within the development. This satisfies the revised growth management legislation, and it assures that growth pays for itself without undue burden on other consumers. Establishment of the

District will ensure that these landowners pay for the provision of facilities, services and improvements to these lands.

Third, a CDD is the sole form of local governance which is specifically established to provide District landowners with planning, construction, implementation and short and long-term maintenance of public infrastructure at sustained levels of service.

The cost impact on the ultimate landowners in the development is not the total cost for the District to provide infrastructure services and facilities. Instead, it is the incremental costs above, if applicable, what the landowners would have paid to install infrastructure via an alternative financing mechanism.

Consequently, a CDD provides property owners with the option of having higher levels of facilities and services financed through self-imposed revenue. The District is an alternative means to manage necessary development of infrastructure and services with related financing powers. District management is no more expensive, and often less expensive, than the alternatives of various public and private sources.

### 6.0 An analysis of the impact on small businesses as defined by Section 288.703, F.S., and an analysis of the impact on small counties and small cities as defined by Section 120.52, F.S.

There will be little impact on small businesses because of the establishment of the District. If anything, the impact may be positive because the District must competitively bid all of its contracts and competitively negotiate all of its contracts with consultants over statutory thresholds. This affords small businesses the opportunity to bid on District work.

the City of Winter Haven has a population of 49,219 according to the Census 2020 conducted by the United States Census Bureau and is therefore not defined as a "small" city according to Section 120.52, F.S.

#### 7.0 Any additional useful information.

The analysis provided above is based on a straightforward application of economic theory, especially as it relates to tracking the incidence of regulatory costs and benefits. Inputs were received from the Petitioner's Engineer and other professionals associated with the Petitioner.

In relation to the question of whether the Peace Creek Village Community Development District with amended boundaries is the best possible alternative to provide public facilities and services to the project, there are several additional factors which bear importance. As an alternative to an independent district, the City could establish a dependent Special District for the Amendment Area or establish an MSBU or MSTU. Either of these alternatives could finance the improvements contemplated in Tables 1 and 2 in a fashion similar to the proposed District with amended boundaries.

There are a number of reasons why a dependent district is not the best alternative for providing public facilities and services to the portion of Peace Creek Village development that is not currently located within the District. First, a portion of the Peace Creek Village development is already located within the Peace Creek Village Community Development District, an existing District that was established specifically to serve a portion of the Peace Creek Village development. It would be inefficient to have a portion of the Peace Creek Village development provided with improvements and services by the existing District, while another portion provided with improvements and services by a dependent Special District, MSBU or MSTU.

Second, unlike a CDD, this alternative would require the City to administer the project and its facilities and services. As a result, the costs for these services and facilities would not be directly and wholly attributed to the land directly benefiting from them, as the case would be with a CDD. Administering a project of the size and complexity of the development program anticipated for the Peace Creek Village development is a significant and expensive undertaking.

Third, a CDD is preferable from a government accountability perspective. With a CDD, residents and landowners in the District would have a focused unit of government ultimately under their direct control. The CDD can then be more responsive to resident needs without disrupting other City responsibilities. By contrast, if the City were to establish and administer a dependent Special District, MSBU or MSTU for the Amendment Area, then the some of the residents and landowners of the Peace Creek Village development would take their grievances and desires to the City Commission meetings, and some others to the CDD Board, leading to confusion as to the which party is responsible for what area.

Fourth, any debt of an independent CDD is strictly that District's responsibility. While it may be technically true that the debt of a city-established, dependent Special District is not strictly the City's responsibility, any financial problems that a dependent Special District may have may reflect on the City. This will not be the case if a CDD is established.

Another alternative to a CDD would be for a Property Owners' Association (POA) to provide the infrastructure as well as operations and maintenance of public facilities and services for that portion of the Peace Creek Village development that would not be within the CDD. A CDD is superior to a POA for a variety of reasons. First, unlike a POA, a CDD can obtain low-cost funds from the municipal capital markets. Second, as a government entity a CDD can impose and collect its assessments along with other property taxes on the City's real estate tax bill. Therefore, the District is far more assured of obtaining its needed funds than is a POA. Third, the proposed District is a unit of local government. This provides a higher level of transparency, oversight and accountability. Finally, it would be inefficient to have a portion of the Peace Creek Village development that is within the CDD provided with improvements and services by the existing District, while another portion provided with improvements and services by a POA.

# 8.0 A description of any regulatory alternatives submitted under section 120.541(1)(a), F.S., and a statement adopting the alternative or a statement of the reasons for rejecting the alternative in favor of the proposed ordinance.

No written proposal, statement adopting an alternative or statement of the reasons for rejecting an alternative have been submitted.

Based upon the information provided herein, this Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs supports the petition to amend the boundaries of the Peace Creek Village Community Development District.

SUBJECT: Grant & Aid Application Review Committee Recommendations for the FY26 Cycle

#### **BACKGROUND**

On November 1, 2024 the Grant & Aid Application Review Committee (GAARC) met in City Hall to discuss the Grant and Aid Process. This meeting was properly noticed by the City Clerk. The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the following changes to the process:

- Update the application timeline to allow for an opportunity for applicants to submit corrections if any requirements were not met. This would consist of a two-week application window, two-weeks for staff review, and two-weeks for applicants to correct errors.
- Eliminate the \$40,000 Single-Initiative funding category.
- Request clarification from the City Commission on how to address funding requests from schools and other organizations with established foundations.
- Request clarification from the City Commission on their desires regarding funding levels for legacy agencies prior to the next review cycle. These agencies include Winter Haven Public Education Partnership (\$20,000), Girls Inc. (\$20,000), the Neighborhood Service Center (\$20,000), the Boys & Girls Club of Polk County (\$45,000), Meals on Wheels (\$20,000), and the Haley Center (\$20,000).

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no financial impact for this item.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN ALIGNMENT

• This is a routine purchase associated with normal operations of the City not specifically defined as a goal or strategy within the Strategic Plan. However, it is aligned with the Economic Sustainability Strategic Pillar.

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#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the first two recommendations, provide direction on how to proceed with funding requests from schools and other established foundations prior to the next application training (January 2025), and provide direction on the funding of legacy applicants upon future receipt of applications from those agencies.

#### 3. REVIEW OF PROCESSES & PROCEDURES

City Manager T. Michael Stavres gave an overview of the work that has been completed to-date and the goals of today's meeting.

Director of Public Affairs & Communication Katrina Hill provided an overview of recommendations staff brought forward to improve the process.

The committee discussed an option to revise the application window from four weeks to two weeks followed by a two-week review period, followed by a two-week period to allow applicants to rectify any issues.

City Manager T. Michael Stavres clarified the difference between Not-for-Profit agencies, Community Partners, and Service Delivery Partners. The committee then discussed legacy agencies. Legacy agencies are those that historically funded by the City for many years, sometimes at very high levels. Staff will get confirmation of the agencies the City Commission wants to maintain funding at high levels for specific agencies.

Legacy agencies were identified as PEP (\$20k), Girls Inc., the Neighborhood Service Center (\$20k), Boys & Girls Club of Polk County (\$45k), Meals on Wheels (\$20k), and the Haley Center (\$20k). Once applications received.

Discussion was held on the \$40k Single Initiative funding opportunity. The group arrived at a consensus of removing the category from this process.

Discussion was held around the possibility of creating a scoring matrix to determine eligibility. The group consensus was to move forward with the current evaluation process.

Discussion was held around funding out to agencies who receive funding via tax or foundation sources. This could include organizations with their own foundation (such as a hospital or school) and those that receive tax or public funding (such as a public school). The discussion included projects that would be exclusive to a single organization and not open to the larger community. The City Manager plans to ask the commission for clarification on how they feel about this and will provide clarity back to the GAARC.

The City Manager proposed eliminating the printed binder of applications and instead checking out technology that would allow them to review applications. Binders will be made for those who wish to use them.

Discussion was held around the application itself. Staff will follow up with committee members on specific suggestions.

Motion by Dr. Steve Negley to make the following changes:

- Timeline change from four weeks to two-weeks, followed by a two-week staff review, followed by a two-week grace period for applicants to correct any errors.
- Clarification on the Commission's desires regarding the Legacy agencies.
- Eliminate the \$40k Single Initiative category.
- Seeking clarification on how to address schools and other established foundations from the Commission.

Seconded by Melinda Kalogridis.

Motion carried 5-0

The committee discussed whether or not they will commit to remaining on the committee for at least one more term. Dr. Steve Negley will be stepping down, and Commissioner Dollison will provide a recommendation for appointment. The rest of the committee members will remain on the committee.
